Graham Fear

Welcome to our November issue. Another great meeting in October I'm told, while I was tripping around NSW in our caravan. Barry, the committee and helpers ran some very successful demonstrations and an auction. Thanks to all who brought in plants and flasks for the auction and helped with the demonstrations. A special thanks to Barry for running the meeting. It's getting harder to not only get good guest speakers, but in the last few months we have had some of them pull out at the last moment. Unfortunately, there is not a great deal we can do about it. To find another speaker at short notice is even more difficult. Be assured we will be trying our hardest to get guest speakers next year, but there may be times when it just can't be done. Please bear with us, and if we need to substitute a meeting with some other entertainment, be assured that we will have tried our best to get replacement speakers.

We are still hopeful of running a national show next year. The problem is finding a venue that can be used for three days over a weekend. In most cases, some form of sport is in play at the venue, or close by. Our past venue at Noarlunga cannot be booked until the new year, and any subsidy from the Council cannot be applied for until the new year. It does leave us a bit between the rock and a hard place on what to do, and where to go.

We also need to make sure we do not clash with other State's shows, and who from interstate will be attending. It is no use having another glorified S.A. show before or after our winter show, if we cannot get good representation from the other states. It is also a problem if we cannot get a subsidy from the council, and if we shifted venues we would have to apply to another council or board for some assistance. Without a subsidy it would be very difficult to run a show without losing money. The committee is working hard towards running a national show next year, if we can find the right venue and the right timing.

It looks like the late flowering season is continuing, and we should have many plants on show at the November meeting. I have found the same thing, as I have two Cricket Invincible plants that normally are finishing by November, but this year some spikes are still opening, and the majority have still got another foot or so in length to grow. The spike count is good though, with one having 30+ spikes and the other **just** 26.

Don't forget the dinner at the next meeting (5.30pm for a 6.00pm sit down). It would be appreciated if anyone arriving by 5.30 could help us set up the tables. The club is subsidising the meal for you by a reasonable amount, so at \$20 a head, it should be a very good night to be had for all. If you cannot come for the dinner, please come along before 8.00pm for an exciting meeting. There will be no Beginner's Group meeting prior to the meeting, but a Beginner's table or two will be set aside if you wish sit together. Bring along any plants for judging as normal. There will be no single flower competition for the November meeting.

Cym. Cherry Shower The Cymbidium with three Names

How can the same cross be registered with three different names? Impossible one might think, but given the research, not only possible but it has happened in the case of Cym. Cherry Shower 'Not Peace'

(Inasa x Cherry Cola). These multiple registrations can be attributed to four factors:

- 1. Clerical error in data transfer by a commercial nursery.
- 2. Specific growing practices of a commercial nursery.
- 3. Inexperience and questionable advice in registering a grex with the RHS.
- 4. Rule of the RHS allowing registration of a grex with no known parents.

It all began in November of 2005 when a very attractive Cymbidium plant was purchased at Costco by a long time, hobbyist grower in Northern California. The plant had a standard Gallup & Stribling tag giving the name Cym. Sussex Court 'Not Peace' and the ID number (ID #1246). The hobbyist contacted G&S to determine the parentage when he visited the nursery in March of 2006. Curiously, they discovered that the parentage was listed the same as Cym. Sussex Dawn but genetically incorrect as the flower was most definitely not an alba in color. It was finally determined by the personnel at G&S that an error had probably occurred when the G&S records were being transferred from the hand written Stud Book to the new computer files. It was apparent that the incorrect parents from the line below had been copied to this plant in error. Therefore, there were no listed parents for the plant sold as Cym. Sussex Court 'Not Peace'.

To further confuse the issue, Gallup and Stribling had two practices which were well known to those familiar with the nursery. Firstly, they tended to put two mericlone plantlets in a pot when they were first potted. As the plant matured and was further potted on, these plantlets virtually 'grew together', giving the appearance of a larger plant more quickly. Secondly, they had the practice of naming all their mericlone releases but delaying the registration of them with the RHS.

When the mericlones of Cym. Sussex Court 'Not Peace' were released in 2005-06 season, another commercial grower purchased a plant directly from the G&S nursery. When it first bloomed, one original plantlet had developed a peloric mutation of the petals. The owner of the nursery immediately mericloned the mutation of the mericlone Cym. Sussex Court 'Not Peace'. Not aware of the 2-plant potting practices of G&S, the owner was led to believe he had "personally created" a new plant when in fact, one of the two original plantlets had simply bloomed peloric. Between 2005 and 2011 more peloric mutations emerged at G&S and were obtained by other sellers. (This also happened when G&S mericloned Cym. Strathdon 'Cooksbridge Noel' circa 1990 and the peloric mutation now known as 'Cooksbridge Fantasy' appeared in many of the plants.)

The third and fourth factors involve the RHS which allows plants with unknown parents to be registered. On 12/22/11 M. Sagisi registered one of these mutations as Cym. Fil-American Beauty on the same date as Sussex Court was registered by an unknown registrant and originator, not by G&S where the plants originated. A coincidence? The error here is that a peloric mutation of a flower does not change the parents, known or unknown, and a mutation of the flowers should not allow the same plant to be registered as a different grex, which the RHS rules unfortunately allowed for in this case. Many cultivar names have been changed to reflect mutations in other grexes but the plants with the same parentage are not registered under a new grex, for example.

Cym. Strathdon 'Cooksbridge Fantasy' a petal peloric mutation from Strathdon 'Cooksbridge Noel' Cym. Pia Borg 'Flash' a feathered mutation from Pia Borg 'Tyson'

Perhaps if the registrant had been given a better understanding of the RHS registration process or had contacted G&S, the peloric mutations would have been sold at that time as Cym. Sussex Court 'Fil- American Beauty' with parents unknown. Even though the grex Cym. Sussex Court had not been registered, in all probability; someone would have done so eventually.

But the most convincing information concerning the identity of this plant comes from the research of two well-known, Cymbidium hybridizers, Loren Batchman and Andy Easton, who jointly agreed given the time line and plant characteristics, that the actual grex was most probably Cym. Cherry Shower. They determined it to be the New Horizon cross, one of several crosses NH supplied to G&S at the time. As a result, most hobbyists are now currently using that grex name with the cultivar 'Not Peace' for the standard peloric form. However, there is definite variability in the color intensity and peloric markings on the mericlones in circulation. Are these truly different enough to deserve new cultivar names or only a reflection of cultural differences of the peloric form? Time will tell.

Perhaps I would not have attempted this task if the peloric form of Cym. Cherry Shower not had the charm and distinction it has, and as a proven parent, what genes it carries if any, for the petal peloric trait. — W. Caughlan.

I hope you enjoyed the above article. Thanks to Weegie Caughlan from the USA, for allowing me to print it. I personally was most impressed with this article, as I saw that it is being successfully used in breeding petal peloric plants in good percentages by the Casa de las Orquideas nursery (USA). The plant on page 14 of this magazine is Strathdon 'Cooksbridge Fantasy' x Cherry Shower 'No Péace'. We will present a very interesting Powerpoint presentation from Weegie, at


