# New Membership Approach by NCCS

The North Carolina Camellia Society is alarmingly faced with diminishing dues paying members. At its fall meeting it forthrightly faced this situation and concluded that the condition was at least partially the result of its failure to attractively present a membership campaign.

It concluded that each year, as the public became interested and enthused with the advent of beautiful blooming plants in gardens and attractively presented shows, the time was "ripe" to obtain new memberships and renewals from existing members, but that there was no thorough and complete approach to these interested people except through local clubs, groups and particularly spring shows. But in almost every community the spring show is relatively at the end of the camellia season with a renewal due the following January 1. Thus some of the members obtained in this fashion have felt cheated. To them the camellia year ended with the end of camellia blooming time. Most new members obtained at spring shows did not renew the following January.

So North Carolina Camellia Society has changed its membership year to conform to the camellia season and has adopted a membership solicitation and salesmanship program which it hopes will be more realistic and at-

tractive to prospective new members as follows:

1. The membership year shall be from July 1 through June 30. This coincides with the actual camellia season.

2. Campaigns for new members and for renewals will commence in June of each year, with all membership obtained through December 31 being for the current year as set forth in 1, above.

3. All memberships obtained at shows or otherwise after December 31, shall enroll the new members immediately as a paid up member through the remainder of that camellia year and through the new camellia year commencing the following July 1. This should increase the value of the memberships and encourage renewal because the new member is receiving a bonus rather than receiving a "short term" membership.

4. A limited supply of the latest issue of CAROLINA CAMELLIAS will be delivered by the executive secretary-treasurer to the membership chairman of the first camellia show so that a copy can be immediately given to each new member obtained at his show. This membership chairman will assume the responsibility of sending the remaining copies of CAROLINA CAMELLIAS to the membership chair-

man of the next succeeding camellia show, with additional copies to be furnished by the executive secretary-treasurer, should new memberships exhaust the supply. This procedure will continue through all camellia shows, with provision for conflicts. It is felt that a gift of the current issue of *CAROLINA CAMELLIAS* with each membership is better salesmanship than the promise of future issues. In

other words "a bird in the hand is worth (three) in the bush."

In addition to the foregoing the executive secretary-treasurer was instructed to send to each member of the board of directors a list of the 1967 memberships with an indication of those who had renewed their membership for 1968 with instructions to personally solicit those who had not renewed.

# The Beginner's Corner

I surely enjoyed the Fall Camellia Show on the weekend of October 26-27 in Columbia, S. C. Every year brings more exhibits and more attractive blossoms. This doesn't just happen; you are to be commended for making the best better.

I shall try to give you the result of our findings in improving upon the best. Let's begin with the soil. Camellias grow best in acid soil. The soils in most areas where camellias can be grown are acid enough for good growth. In some areas, however, the soil is too alkaline and acid must be added. If the soil is not acid enough, the leaves turn yellow and the plants grow slowly even though it has been adequately fertilized and watered. "Don't guess soil test"—The soil should actually be tested every year. Take care of the testing through your local county agents office.

To increase acidity apply powdered sulfur to the soil. Use 1 pound of sulfur per 100 square feet in sandy or loamy soil or 2 pounds per 100 square feet in clay soils. Water the sulfur into the soil. Repeat the application in 1 or 2 months if the plant fails to regain its normal color and growth.

## Fertilizing:

Generally speaking, camellias may need light fertilizing during the first growing season. Apply in the spring when the plants are beginning growth.

After the first growing season, or-

ganic matter usually furnishes enough nutrients to the plant. If the plants are making 6-8" of new growth a year, no fertilizer is needed. Over-fertilizing—a common practice—promotes loose, open growth that spoils the compact habit of the plant. Over-fertilizing also increases the susceptibility of the plants to winter injury.

One of the best fertilizers to use is cotton seed meal. It should be used over the root area at the rate of  $\frac{1}{2}$  to 1 pound per plant. Or use a fertilizer formulated especially for camellias. Apply them according to the directions on the package. Do not fertilize after July 1st. It is best to never use lawn fertilizer on camellias, because they are usually alkaline. The best time to fertilize is right after the blooming period.

## Mulching:

Apply mulch immediately after planting and maintain it continuously. Mulching reduces fluctuations in soil temperatures, conserves soil moisture and helps to prevent weeds and grass from growing.

For mulching use granulated peat, pine needles or old weathered sawdust. If the sawdust is not old, apply a small amount of nitrogen. Apply mulch 2-3" deep over the root zone from trunk of plant to tip of limbs.

## Watering:

If you maintain a good heavy mulch around your camellia plants, normal rainfall ordinarily provides sufficient

moisture. During droughts, however, the plants should be watered at weekly intervals. When you water, don't sprinkle—soak the ground thoroughly.

Now I'd like to mention winter injury and its prevention.

The first step in preventing winter injury to camellias is the selection of varieties adapted to your area. The second step is selection of a planting site that protects plants from winter sun and wind.

Even after you have selected a hardy variety and have planted in a favorable location, your plants may be winter injured by sudden cold weather or by soil freezing.

Though camellias are hardy to 10° when they are dormant, a sudden drop to below freezing temperatures

after warm fall weather may injure new growth and buds. If a sudden cold snap is forecast after warm weather, you can protect your camellias to some extent by covering them at night with cloth, plastic, or paper tents. Support the covering above the plants so it does not touch the plants. Remove the covering materials as soon as weather warms to normal.

When the soil freezes, leaves and stems of camellias cannot get water from the roots and the top of the plant may become dehydrated. However, if you maintain a good mulch on the soil surface, it will keep the soil from freezing too deeply.

I'll say again do not fertilize after July 1, because this affords new growth that is more subject to winter kill.

## *"Oh, Mercy, Where Do I Go From Here?"*

I truly believe that any man that takes up the growing up camellias will wind up being a better man for it, if he doesn't lose his religion in the meantime.

I further believe that a "Yankee" can become a better camellia grower than a southerner, as "Yankees" have always seemed to accept advice and information with a certain amount of skepticism; whereas a southerner, like myself, is always inclined to believe everything he is told, and I think that this has been my downfall.

This "thing" started with me about five years ago, when I bought my first camellias. I was "told" that all plants should be bare-rooted to get rid of that "mobile mud." Well, sir no sooner had I done that than half my plants took sick, stayed sick, and died. I then learned that there is a time and method for everything. They forgot to say that you should never bare-root in the spring.

The next year it was "suggested" that I use sand in the bottom of my containers for drainage. A call to the local sand man and I was soon in the sand business. A funny thing happened the following year; of the eight or ten plants that died that year, most of them had sand in the bottom for drainage. Root rot was the local camellia coroner's verdict. For each successive year, I went thru the cycle of rocks, then pine bark, and finally styrofoam.

As far as potting mixes are concerned, I guess I have used a completely different mix each year, depending on who I talked to last for their pet mix.

For some strange reason, my spraying program has been very stable. I guess I just failed to talk to many people about this phase of their program.

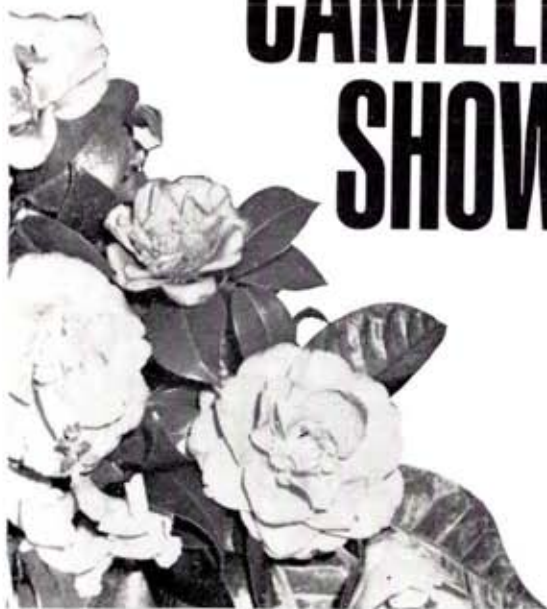
Considering all my other "variables", if you think I have been confused up to this point, sometime you should let me tell you about all the different fertilizer programs I have tried and changed. Never have I found as much difference of opinion among growers as I have when talking to them about their fertilizing. The thing that bugs me is how any plant can take so many different potting mixes, ph's, drainage, sprays, fertilizers and moisture and still come thru with such beautiful blooms each year. I guess the good ole camellia plant can just take it.

With all this confusion, is it any wonder that I say "Oh, mercy, where do I go from here?" Well, to tell you the truth, I have finally decided just where I do plan to go this year. I have decided what I think will be my best potting mix, my best fertilizing program, and the best drainage material for drainage. I plan to stick with it, come H-- or high water. Because, you see, I much prefer the "simple" life.

# Therapeutic Value of Sawdust

Everyone will agree that sawdust is a useful item to have around the house, or rather the garden. Some of us use it as an ingredient in potting soil, some use it for greenhouse floors, garden walks, insulating pots in the winter, mulch, and perhaps other uses.

I have become aware of one use which may be unknown to many camellia growers. At least, I have never seen anything in print about it, and I have searched the yearbooks back to 1947. That is, to cure sick camellias.

One of our well known growers has stated that he has never yet seen a sick camellia recover. I would say that it depends on what the ailment is. I cannot afford to throw away a camellia just because it looks "peak-ed", and I wouldn't if I could. When one of mine gets sick, I nurse it and pet it like a sick baby. I remember one Done that took 4 years to die. Maybe it's a good thing they don't have doctors for camellias, many of us would spend too much money on doctor's bills.

The therapeutic value of sawdust was first brought to my attention by Dr. Newton Smith. He pointed to a group of 6 or 8 camellias growing out of a small pile of sawdust and said, "See those healthy looking plants, if you had seen them when I put them in that sawdust, you wouldn't have given ten cents for the lot."

They did look healthy — glossy medium green leaves, plenty of new growth, even a respectable display of buds. He went on to tell me that they were a group of sick plants that he had planted in sawdust, more as a last resort than anything else. They certainly were not sickly looking when I saw them.

I did not have an opportunity to try this until this past winter. In an out-of-state nursery I found 4 large plants, none less than 6 feet tall, growing in 1 gallon cans. They did not look very healthy, but I bought them anyway, believing that repotting them would work miracles.

Well, I repotted them, but the miracles were not forthcoming. They started dropping leaves one by one and the limbs started dying from the top down. I kept cutting back and cutting back. When they got down to about half their original size, I had become desperate. I remembered the camellias in the sawdust pile. I got some 60 year old sawdust, and repotted my dying friends, barerooted.

It didn't take long for them to respond. The leaves stopped falling and took on a healthier sheen. New growth started at many terminals. Latent buds on the trunks came to life. I now have 4 very healthy plants ready to set into my regular potting soil when they become dormant.

I know what the roots look like too. I found out by accident. I trans-

planted a smaller 'BETTY SHEFFIELD' into sawdust shortly after these 4 mentioned above. After about 4 months in the sawdust, the container got knocked off a table and sawdust went everywhere. The roots of the 'BETTY' were the very picture of health—long white roots in a veritable mass.

I do not claim that sawdust will cure all maladies with which camellias are afflicted, but I do believe it will cure most ailments stemming from root trouble. It wouldn't help in the case of dieback though.

One word of caution—sawdust does

not have much, if any, food value. A constant source of nutrients must be provided. This is easy: a once-a-month application of any good camellia fertilizer mixed with an equal amount of cottonseed meal, applied sparingly, should suffice.

Try transplanting into pure sawdust the next time you find one of your plants suffering from you know not what. Maybe you'll become as sold on sawdust as I am.

I used 75% Phalton, dipped every instrument I used in it, soaked the sand in it, dipped my hands in it each time I grafted and dipped each scion. I used gallon glass jars which were washed with real hot water and placed over each graft. Yep! Too much tender loving care.

I have completed thirty July grafts the way my friend did it. Wish me luck cause if I fail this time I will buy mine from a person crazier than I am.

# Abstraction—What Is It?

We hear quite a lot today about "new trends", the "modern", and "abstract" in flower arrangement. In recent discussions we have dipped into what some of the writers and floral artists tell us on the subject. Let us now consider briefly the *abstract*. This type of floral art brings forth reactions that are as diverse as the poles. Many people are critical because to them it is downright ugly. To those who are enthusiastic it gives an opportunity for creative designing without rules and regulations. It is a break from the comfortable familiar, and expressing "the same old thing" to a new way of expressing one's own personal experiences and emotions.

Historically, abstraction in art is as old as art itself, for there is a degree of the abstract in all artistic work. Consider the drawings and primitive sculpture of the cave man. From earliest times man used as symbols for visual reality, abstract shapes, as the circle, the spiral, and many others. In combining these he created new images. So today inspiration for abstract designs can come from anywhere and everywhere—perhaps a floating cloud, the flutter of wings, a fallen tree, the super-structures of our day, and plant materials themselves. The abstract designer works with sense experiences. He or she must

search, seek, and explore into the "regions of the intellectually and spiritually mysterious." He must learn to "entertain new ideas, new directions, and harness new sensations."

Just what does abstraction mean? The dictionary states that it is a "withdrawing from, a taking away by the mind", and "a quality apart from an object, or idea that possesses it." Another definition is that it is "absorption or absence of the mind"—to some viewers of some abstracts, a very apt description!

In connection with abstract art we often hear the expressions, "non-objective" and "subjective." Pure abstraction rejects all things recognizable. This is non-objective art. It begins and ends in the mind of the artist, and has no subject beyond the organization of lines, shapes, forms, and areas of color and texture. It is "an art of balance, of purity and serenity, devoid of any troubling subject matter." On the other hand expressive art, or "subjective", has a subject other than design relationships. The designer is freely expressing an emotion or sensation. He is expressing how he feels about his subject. It is his impression of a strongly felt mood, an experience, object, or scene.

What are some of the characteristics of abstract flower arrangement? Pure abstraction in floral art is rarely achieved because most plant material is recognizable, but the designer can arrive at "near abstract" since he is free to distort, bend, twist, cut and skeletonize plant material so that it takes on an abstract quality. Bold, strong dynamic forms are used. There is very strong emphasis on space. The design is kept simple. Rae Goldson expresses it, "Less is More". The fewer the materials used the more the design has to offer—in other words, restraint. Focal areas are avoided. Dramatic designs, emphatic lines, strong structure and silhouettes are characteristic. Unusual textures play a large part. In color bright hues are used in materials and neutral,

earthy tones in containers, so that the latter will not compete with the design. Products of industry can be used, but as flower arrangers we should always incorporate plant material. One floral artist writes, "Some abstract designs like some modern art in striving to be 'modern' become grotesque. Herein, I believe, lies the true challenge—to keep striving until one achieves *beautiful abstract*."

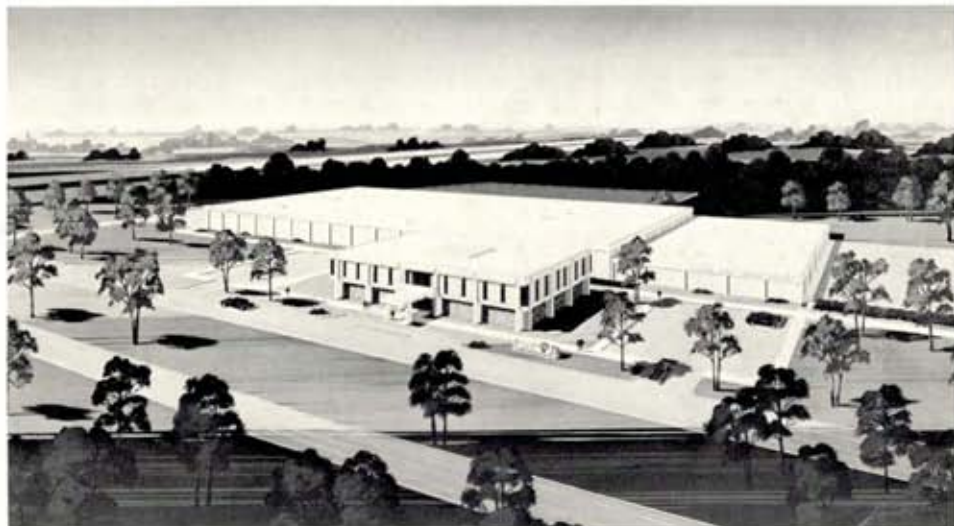
