

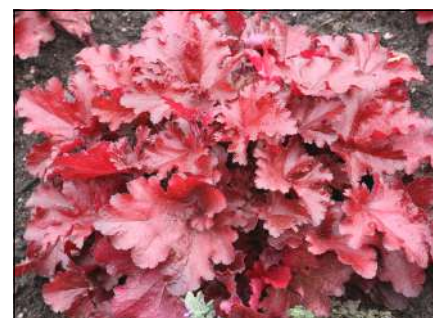

This means the flower color will vary plant to plant, from rich shades of toasts red, golden yellow, near-fluorescent orange, magenta, and even a stray white here and there. Cheyenne Spirit blooms from June to September. Though the height of each color varies slightly, they are all very well-branched, bushy plants. No expect the seedlings to continue to produce mixed colors. Most other echinaceas will re-seed purple no matter the color of their parent.

This variety is very resistant to powdery mildew but still should be grown in part sun with good aeration and moist garden soil.

Native to wetlands of eastern Asia, Acorus is a marginal aquatic perennial that features a grass-like, linear leaf blades that fan outward. Tufts will slowly spread over time by rhizomes to form a dense groundcover. Plants thrive in wet soils and dry spells may cause leaf tips to brown. Tiny, yellow-green flowers bloom from spring to early summer. When pinched or bruised, its leaves emit a fresh citrus scent. Ogon is a dwarf variety with variegated leaf blades striped in yellow and green.

Deep violet-blue flower spikes are held above bright green foliage. The flower spikes are long, wide, and extremely showy. Flowers are attractive to pollinators, while the fragrant leaves are distasteful to deer and rabbits. In full sun and well-drained soil, they happily shrug off summer heat and early frosts. However, Agastache are very susceptible to root rot during winter and require sharp drainage for over wintering success.

Blue Fortune is a pollinator magnet! Lavender blue flower spikes cover the plant from mid-summer to early fall. Bred and selected by Gert Fortgens of the Arboretum Trompenberg, in Rotterdam. Blue Fortune is a hybrid of species native to the US and Korea, A. foeniculum x A. rugosa.

Purple Haze is a shrubby looking perennial with shiny green, licorice-scented foliage that produces long spikes of smoky violet-blue flowers from early summer until September. Flowers are a darker blue than A. 'Blue Fortune' due to the black calyxes. The leaf petioles and stems will pick up a purple color with cooler fall temperatures. The stems hold up well into the winter giving several more months of interest. Agastache are very susceptible to root rot during winter and require sharp drainage for over wintering success.

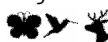

Ajuga forms a dense mat of foliage, up to 6" tall, that always seems to look neat and fresh. In many cases, the leaves are colored with shades of purple, white, silver, cream, or pink. Individual plants grow as a rosette, but they intertwine to form a solid carpet that withstands light foot traffic. Flower spikes adorn plants from late spring to early summer. Ajuga is a great groundcover for part to full shade.

'Burgundy Glow' - features tricolored foliage (white, pink and green) and blue flowers on 6" spikes in late spring

'Pink Lightning' - soft, mint-green leaves with a distinct creamy white edge; bubblegum pink flower spikes rise bloom in early May. A sport of A. 'Purple Torch' discovered and introduced by Sunny Border Nursery.

This lovely mounding ground cover produces soft, scalloped gray-green leaves with finely serrated edges, and shimmering white pubescence. Tiny yellow flowers are held above the foliage in sprays and are a good cut flower. A daintier plant than A. mollis that combines wonderfully with small hostas.

Compared to other Alliums, Millenium is well-behaved in the garden and does not reseed. Allow foliage to go yellow after flowering to store as much energy as possible in the bulbs for the following year's growth. **PPA Perennial Plant of the Year 2018!**

## Asclepias & Monarchs

Commonly known as Butterfly Weed or Milkweed, Asclepias are the sole food source for Monarch caterpillars. Known for the incredible mass migration that brings millions of them to California and Mexico each winter, North American monarchs are the only butterflies that make such a massive journey—up to 3,000 miles. Only monarchs born in late summer or early fall make the migration, and they make only one round trip. By the time next year's winter migration begins, several summer generations will have lived and died and it will be the great grandchildren of last year's migrators that make the trip. Yet somehow these new generations know the way, and follow the same routes their ancestors took—sometimes even returning to the same tree. Scientists are concerned about the eastern population of monarchs, which summer east of the Rocky Mountains. This group is occurring in ever smaller numbers, and its survival is threatened by reduced acreage of milkweeds and nectar sources in their summer home. To do our part to help the Monarchs, we are offering 3 species of Milkweed for 2018.

## Coreopsis

Valued for their dependable nature and colorful flowers, Coreopsis are low maintenance, drought tolerant, and long blooming. Native to US prairies, the flowers attract butterflies and their seeds are enjoyed by Goldfinch and other birds. There is an incredible amount of variety among Coreopsis, including broadleaf vs threadleaf, tall vs short, and flower colors including pinks, reds, yellows, oranges, whites, and bi-colors. Most Coreopsis are clump forming, holding their flowers on tall stems, above the foliage making them good cut flowers.

Coreopsis should be sited in full sun and average garden soils with good winter drainage. Don't over fertilize, or you'll have tall, leggy plants that tend to flop over. Deadheading will keep the plants tidy and promote re-bloom, however leave some seed heads for the birds in fall and winter.

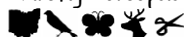

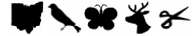

## HOSTA

Perfect for the beginning gardener, hostas are tough, long-lived plants that perform despite neglect. But, for those of us that love plants, Hostas respond wonderfully to amended soils and high fertility, rewarding the attentive gardener profusely. Though not commonly used as such, hostas are a wonderful nectar source for hummingbirds. We are listing 63 cultivars of hosta for 2018, and an additional 12 varieties that are under evaluation. If you don't see something you're interested in, please call.

We are frequently asked how large a particular hosta will get. The size and growth rate of a hosta greatly depends on sunlight, soil type, moisture, and fertility. The best benchmark to use on how large a hosta will grow is to observe other hostas in the area and note their size categories.

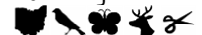

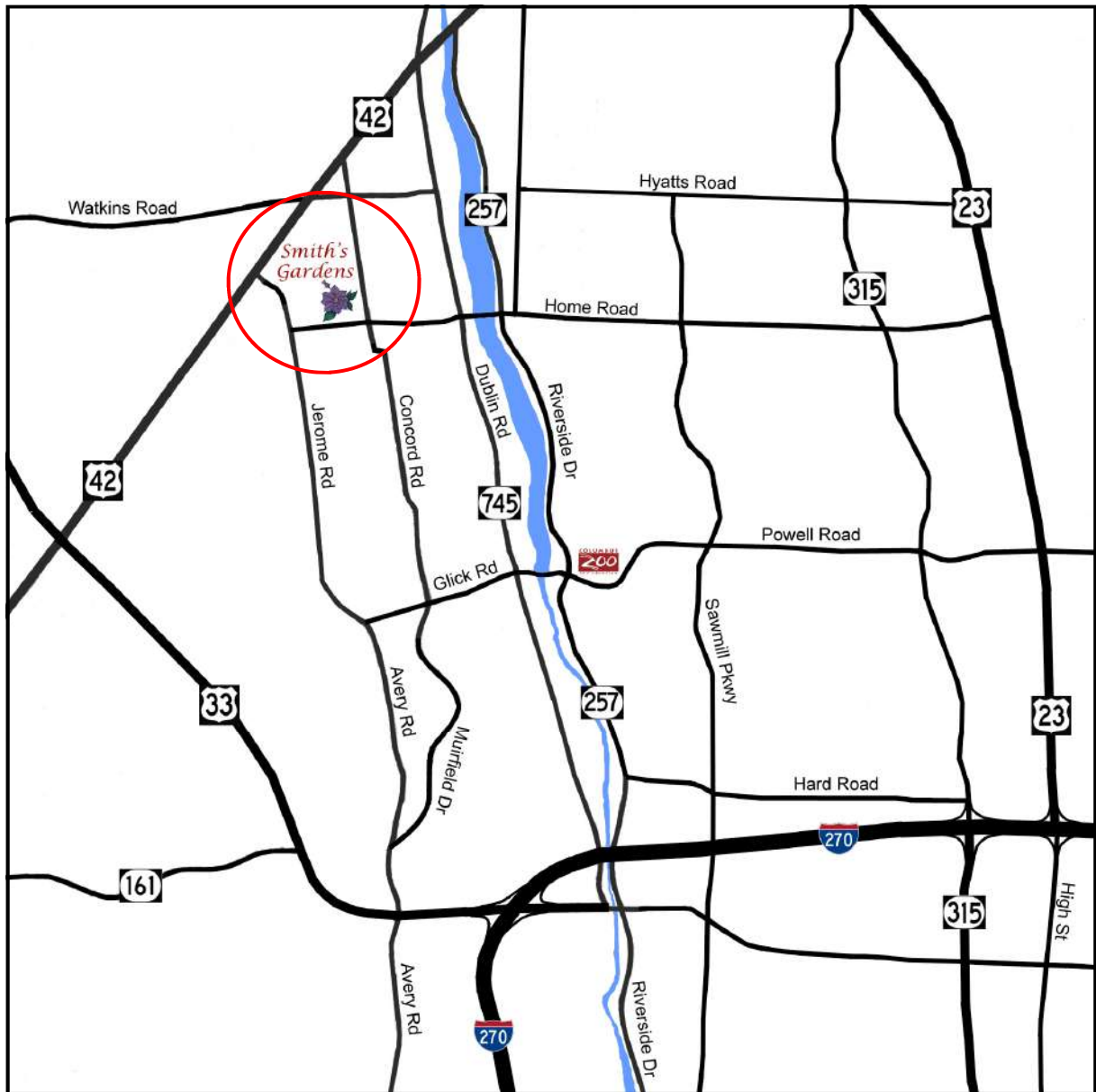
