Tufts will slowly spread over time by rhizomes to form a dense groundcover. Plants thrive in wet soils and dry spells may cause leaf tips to brown. Tiny, yellowgreen flowers bloom from spring to early summer. When pinched or bruised, its leaves emit a fresh citrus scent. Ogon is a dwarf variety with variegated leaf blades striped in yellow and green.

Fantastic perennials for shaded areas, they provide dramatic color in the fall garden. Blooming in September, the delicate, upward-facing flowers come in shades of white and pink and are held on long stems well above the dark green palmate foliage. Always eye catching, Japanese Anemones add a unique form and texture to the garden. The taller varieties may require staking when in flower, but those two feet or less generally don't. They will perform equally well in sun if provided consistent moisture.

## Asclepias \& Monarchs

Commonly known as Butterfly Weed or Milkweed, Asclepias are the sole food source for Monarch caterpillars. Known for the incredible mass migration that brings millions of them to California and Mexico each winter, North American monarchs are the only butterflies that make such a massive journey-up to 3,000 miles. Only monarchs born in late summer or early fall make the migration, and they make only one round trip. By the time next year's winter migration begins, several summer generations will have lived and died and it will be the great grandchildren of last year's migrators that make the trip. Yet somehow these new generations know the way, and follow the same routes their ancestors took-sometimes even returning to the same tree. Scientists are concerned about the eastern population of monarchs, which summer east of the Rocky Mountains. This group is occurring in ever smaller numbers, and its survival is threatened by reduced acreage of milkweeds and nectar sources in their summer home. ## Coreopsis

Valued for their dependable nature and colorful flowers, Coreopsis are low maintenance, drought tolerant, and long blooming. Native to US prairies, the flowers attract butterflies and their seeds are enjoyed by Goldfinch and other birds. There is an incredible amount of variety among Coreopsis, including broadleaf vs threadleaf, tall vs short, and flower colors including pinks, reds, yellows, oranges, whites, and bi-colors. Most Coreopsis are clump forming, holding their flowers on tall stems, above the foliage making them good cut flowers.

Coreopsis should be sited in full sun and average garden soils with good winter drainage. Don't over fertilize, or you'll have tall, leggy plants that tend to flop over. Deadheading will keep the plants tidy and promote re-bloom, however leave some seed heads for the birds in fall and winter.

Perfect for the beginning gardener, hostas are tough, long-lived plants that perform despite neglect. But, for those of us that love plants, Hostas respond wonderfully to amended soils and high fertility, rewarding the attentive gardener profusely. Though not commonly used as such, hostas are a wonderful nectar source for hummingbirds. We are listing 63 cultivars of hosta for 2018, and an additional 12 varieties that are under evaluation. We are frequently asked how large a particular hosta will get. The size and growth rate of a hosta greatly depends on sunlight, soil type, moisture, and fertility. The best benchmark to use on how large a hosta will grow is to observe other hostas in the area and note their size categories.
