





This classic hybrid monkshood dates back to England circa 1898. It features panicles of hooded, dark violet blue flowers in July and August atop thick, rigid, leafy stems. All parts of this plant are poisonous.

Native to wetlands of eastern Asia, Acorus is a marginal aguatic perennial that features a grass-like, linear leaf blades that fan outward. Tufts will slowly spread over time by rhizomes to form a dense groundcover. Plants thrive in wet soils and dry spells may cause leaf tips to brown. Tiny, yellowgreen flowers bloom from spring to early summer. When pinched or bruised, its leaves emit a fresh citrus scent. Ogon is a dwarf variety with variegated leaf blades striped in yellow and green.

Deep violet-blue flower spikes are held above bright green foliage. The flower spikes are long, wide, and extremely showy. Flowers are attractive to pollinators, while the fragrant leaves are distasteful to deer and rabbits. In full sun and well-drained soil, they happily shrug off summer heat and early frosts. However, Agastache are very susceptible to root rot during winter and require sharp drainage for over wintering success.

Blue Fortune is a pollinator magnet! Lavender blue flower spikes cover the plant from mid-summer to early fall. Bred and selected by Gert Fortgens of the Arboretum Trompenberg, in Rotterdam. Blue Fortune is a hybrid of species native to the US and Korea, A. foeniculum x A. rugosa.

Purple Haze is a shrubby looking perennial with shiny green, licoricescented foliage that produces long spikes of smoky violet-blue flowers from early summer until September. Flowers are a darker blue than A. 'Blue Fortune' due to the black calyxes. The leaf petioles and stems will pick up a purple color with cooler fall temperatures. The stems hold up well into the winter giving several more months of interest. Agastache are very susceptible to root rot during winter and require sharp drainage for over wintering success.

Ajuga forms a dense mat of foliage, up to 6" tall, that always seems to look neat and fresh. In many cases, the leaves are colored with shades of purple, white, silver, cream, or pink. Individual plants grow as a rosette, but they intertwine to form a solid carpet that withstands light foot traffic. Flower spikes adorn plants from late spring to early summer. Ajuga is a great groundcover for part to full shade.

'Burgundy Glow' - features tricolored foliage (white, pink and green) and blue flowers on 6" spikes in late spring

'Pink Lightning' - soft, mint-green leaves with a distinct creamy white edge; pp# 22,255 bubblegum pink flower spikes rise bloom in early May. A sport of A. 'Purple Torch' discovered and introduced by Sunny Border Nursery.

This lovely mounding ground cover produces soft, scalloped gray-green leaves with finely serrated edges, and shimmering white pubescence. Tiny yellow flowers are held above the foliage in sprays and are a good cut flower. A daintier plant than A. mollis that combines wonderfully with small hostas.

Allow foliage to go yellow after flowering to store as much energy as possible in the bulbs for the following year's growth. *PPA Perennial Plant of the Year 2018!*

Fantastic perennials for shaded areas, they provide dramatic color in the fall garden. Blooming in September, the delicate, upward-facing flowers come in shades of white and pink and are held on long stems well above the dark green palmate foliage. Always eye catching, Japanese Anemones add a unique form and texture to the garden. The taller varieties may require staking when in flower, but those two feet or less generally don't. They will perform equally well in sun if provided consistent moisture.

- 'Honorine Jobert' discovered in 1858 in Verdun, France, this remains an outstanding selection. A vigorous, compact cultivar featuring large, snow white flowers with yellow center stamens; 36-48" tall. 2016 Perennial Plant of the Year™
- 'Lucky Charm' leaves start off deep purple and change to dark green with a lighter violet back. Flowers are deep rich pink with very dark purple stems; 36" tall
- 'Pamina' hot pink, semi-double, upward facing flowers in September; 18-24" tall

Deadheading spent flowers will help with perennializing. Sap can irritate skin.

Asclepias & Monarchs

Commonly known as Butterfly Weed or Milkweed, Asclepias are the sole food source for Monarch caterpillars. Known for the incredible mass migration that brings millions of them to California and Mexico each winter, North American monarchs are the only butterflies that make such a massive journey—up to 3,000 miles. Only monarchs born in late summer or early fall make the migration, and they make only one round trip. By the time next year's winter migration begins, several summer generations will have lived and died and it will be the great grandchildren of last year's migrators that make the trip. Yet somehow these new generations know the way, and follow the same routes their ancestors took—sometimes even returning to the same tree. Scientists are concerned about the eastern population of monarchs, which summer east of the Rocky Mountains. This group is occurring in ever smaller numbers, and its survival is threatened by reduced acreage of milkweeds and nectar sources in their summer home. To do our part to help the Monarchs, we are offering 3 species of Milkweed for 2018.

Height: 3-5' Exposure: full sun

A hassle-free perennial with compact clusters of vanilla scented, rose pink flowers from mid-summer to early fall. Dried seed pods are interesting and are frequently used in dry arrangements. The long stems are wonderful for cutting. Prefers moist soil. This variety is a food source for both larval and adult Monarch butterflies.

Common Milkweed

This native Milkweed typically grows 3-4' tall on thick, upright stems. Blooming in June and July, it features fragrant, light pink flowers that smell like honey. These are followed by prominent, warty seed pods which split open when ripe releasing their silky-tailed seeds for dispersal by the wind. Once commonly seen along roadsides and fields, this native plant is becoming scarce due to the widespread use of herbicides (glyphosate) on genetically modified farm crops, and habitat destruction. Monarch caterpillars clearly prefer Common Milkweed for dinner over Swamp Milkweed or Butterfly Weed.

This tough, drought tolerant native produces eye-catching orange flowers in summer that attract many varieties of butterflies, especially Monarchs. The dried seed pods are interesting in shape and are frequently used in dry arrangements. This species requires sharply drained soils. Primarily a nectar source rather than a caterpillar food source.







Perfect for the beginning gardener, hostas are tough, long-lived plants that perform despite neglect. But, for those of us that love plants, Hostas respond wonderfully to amended soils and high fertility, rewarding the attentive gardener profusely. Though not commonly used as such, hostas are a wonderful nectar source for hummingbirds. We are listing 63 cultivars of hosta for 2018, and an additional 12 varieties that are under evaluation. We are frequently asked how large a particular hosta will get. The size and growth rate of a hosta greatly depends on sunlight, soil type, moisture, and fertility. The best benchmark to use on how large a hosta will grow is to observe other hostas in the area and note their size categories.
