



Because we generate our labels in house, they can include your logos and font preferences, retail prices, bar codes, SKUs, and much more. Our labels can be quickly modified to accommodate your preferences. If you would like additional labels with your order(s) to use for signage, let us know. They will be provided at no charge.

We also have 3.25" x 8", full color, theme specific labels (edible, natives, butterfly, hummingbird, deer resistant, etc). By providing these larger, showier labels to be used on an endcap or themed display, we hope to enhance your marketing efforts.





We first launched our website (www.smithsgardensinc.com) in 2010 to better serve our customers, but quickly realized that it could be used as a source of information and ideas for the home gardener, that would hopefully inspire them to buy more plants from you. On the "Homeowners" side of the website we have many educational tools available, including our catalog (without pricing), locations of the garden centers that sell our plants, and growing tips for plants with different garden requirements, such as: average soil in full sun or wet/poor soil in the shade.







#### Agastache

Agastache is a genus of about 30 aromatic species native to central and eastern Asia, Mexico, and the United States. Careful breeding and selection have given us new, colorful varieties that offer exceptional garden performance and a long season of bloom. Flowers are attractive to bees, hummingbirds, and butterflies, while the fragrant leaves are distasteful to deer and rabbits. In full sun and well-drained soil, they happily shrug off summer heat and early frosts. However, they are very susceptible to root rot during winter and require sharp drainage for over wintering success.

Tango produces an abundance of bright orange creamsicle colored, flower spikes that rise above clean, grey-green foliage from midsummer into fall. Exhibits excellent disease resistance.





Ajuga forms a dense mat of foliage, up to 6" tall, that always seems to look neat and fresh. In many cases, the leaves are colored with shades of purple, white, silver, cream, or pink. Individual plants grow as a rosette, but they intertwine to form a solid carpet that withstands light foot traffic. Flower spikes adorn plants from late spring to early summer. Ajuga is a great groundcover for part to full shade.

- pyramidalis 'Metallica Crispa' a clump forming Ajuga with short runners. Leaves are scrunched, shiny, and metallic purple. Short spikes of purple-blue flowers appear in late spring.
- reptans 'Blueberry Muffin' A faster growing sport of A. 'Chocolate pp# 22,092 Chip' with thicker, more weather resistant foliage. Dark bronze new growth and blueberry-blue flowers on 8" spikes.
- r. 'Burgundy Glow' features tricolored foliage (white, pink and green) and blue flowers on 6" spikes in late spring
- r. 'Pink Lightning' soft, mint-green leaves with a distinct creamy white edge. Bubblegum pink flower spikes rise above the carpet of variegated leaves in early May. A sport of Purple Torch discovered and introduced by Sunny Border Nursery.

Fantastic perennials for shaded areas, they provide dramatic color in the fall garden. Blooming in September, the delicate, upward-facing flowers come in shades of white and pink and are held well on long stems above the dark green palmate foliage. Always eye catching, Japanese Anemones add a unique form and texture to the garden. The taller varieties may require staking when in flower, but those two feet or less generally don't. They will perform equally well in sun if provided consistent moisture.



Loreley' - rosy-pink flowers with broad, overlapping petals. The darker pink edges accentuate the petals making them look very ruffled; 40" tall

'Lucky Charm' - leaves start off deep purple and change to dark green with a lighter violet back. Flowers are deep rich pink with very dark purple stems; 36" tall



Pocahontas' - dwarf plant with frilly, double pink flowers, blooms a little earlier, beginning in late July; 18-24" tall ppaf

Wild Swan™ ('Macane001') - selected from a group of seedlings pp# 23,132 derived from five different parents which included A. rupicola as a female parent. The precise parentage is difficult to pin down but involves both early and late flowering types. Wild Swan™ was chosen as the pick of a small group of seedlings by Elizabeth MacGregor at her nursery in Kirkcudbright, Scotland, where it has been on trial for ten years. This exceptional hybrid offers continuous and prolific flowering from June until frost, well beyond that of the Japanese hybrid cultivars, a very unique trait!

Silky Deep Red Milkweed **\*\*** \*

Also called Blood Flower, this annual Milkweed is native to South America. Showy flowers are deep red with a yellow hood, appearing in late spring and continuing until early fall. The new growth of Silky Deep Red has a lovely bronze cast. It has a much longer flowering time than the perennial milkweeds. Blooms are followed by long narrow seed pods, typical of the milkweed family.



This native Milkweed typically grows 3-4' tall on thick, upright stems. Blooming in June and July, it features fragrant, light pink flowers that smell like honey. These are followed by prominent, warty seed pods which split open when ripe releasing their silky-tailed seeds for dispersal by the wind. Once commonly seen along roadsides and fields, this native plant is becoming scarce due to the widespread use of herbicides (Round-Up) on genetically modified farm crops and habitat destruction.

For best overwintering success, choose a site that is well-drained, and cover the crown in a thick layer of mulch to insulate the plant during the winter.

Lily of the Valley

This old fashioned perennial bears fragrant, white, bell-shaped flowers in early spring set off against clean, green foliage. Lily-of- the-Valley prefers part shade and moist, fertile soils, however it does well in full sun, forming a dense, weed free groundcover that is surprisingly drought tolerant. All parts of this plant are poisonous, which makes it very deer resistant.

### Coreopsis

Valued for their dependable nature and colorful, daisy-like flowers, Coreopsis are low maintenance, drought tolerant, and long blooming. Native to US prairies, the flowers attract butterflies and their seeds are enjoyed by Goldfinch and other birds. There is a lot of variety among Coreopsis, including broadleaf vs threadleaf, tall vs short, and flower colors including pinks, reds, yellows, oranges, whites, and bi-colors. Most Coreopsis are clump forming, holding their flowers on tall stems, above the foliage making them good cut flowers.

Coreopsis should be sited in full sun and average garden soils with good winter drainage. And don't over fertilize, or you'll have tall, leggy plants that tend to flop over. Dead-heading will keep the plants tidy and promote re-bloom, however leave some seed heads for the birds in fall and winter.
