Succulents were very popular in the 70's and once again their ease of growth has made them a star in the plant world. Besides being very collectible with so many varieties now available, they are EASY. Most like good light or even full sun and very little water. Remember to use them in containers on the deck, porch or patio and they are especially useful in those "hard to reach with the hose" places where you need a little botanical beauty. I have an urn in the center of the back garden that is not easy to get water to. A big agave is the perfect answer. Best grown in good draining pots, forget the saucer under succulent containers as they do not want to stand in water. Their texture and form make them ideal to set among other pots to add variety to your container plantings. Succulents are easy to overwinter in an above freezing area and make outstanding specimens for your patio in a short amount of time.

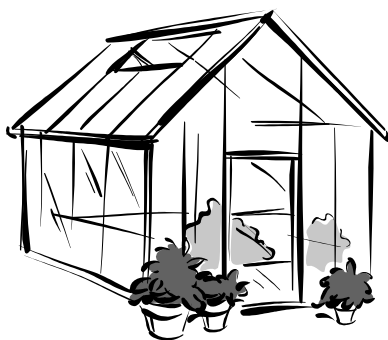

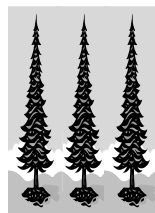

While You Are In The Area...

Vintage Hill Farm is located in the Boone's Lick area of central Missouri, a virtually undiscovered haven for the tourist. People here are friendly, prices are reasonable, and there are so many beautiful things to do while here. Why not take an extra day or two?

A couple of favorites: Just up the road, then left on 187, is the Boone's Lick State Historic Site. Trails wind down to the spring where Daniel Boone's sons boiled water from the salty springs in huge pots to make salt. If you head back to Highway 87 and North you will find Glasgow. The Rolling Pin Bakery is one of the finest eateries of this quaint and scenic little river town. East is Fayette, our county seat, with the historic courthouse square. Fayette is also home to Central Methodist University and the Ashby Hodge Art Gallery, (660) 248-3391. Be sure to eat at Emmett's Kitchen and Tap (660) 248-3363 on the square.

Complete the circle back to New Franklin and stock up at a real quality small town butcher shop, Jennings Premium Meats (800) 210-6425. Do not miss Snoddy's Store, since 1924, on your way back. It is one of the few remaining family owned small general stores. Just a few feet east of there is the Rivercene B&B. This historical masterpiece has rooms available at www.rivercene.com. Across the bridge, over the Missouri River, is historic Boonville. Just on your left is the meticulously restored Hotel Frederick, www.hotel frederick.com (660)-882-2828. Main Street is full of shops, a fantastic antique mall, small restaurants and a nearby casino. Plan to spend some time wandering among the plants and parks of downtown.

Just 20 minutes east is the charming old town of Rocheport. Check out rocheport.com for the complete list. You can stay at the Yates House B&B (573) 698-2129 and they will give you the details of the many fine antique shops while you stroll through their beautiful walled gardens. Richard Saunders Antiques (573) 698-3765 has a great courtyard garden in a beautiful old brick home that should be visited. If antiquing is your thing, White Horse Antiques is a must see also. Have a great dinner at Les Bourgeois Winery and Bistro (573) 698-2300 just a few miles out of town on the river bluffs. The view is as tantalizing as the food and is a great place to watch a sunset while overlooking the river.

Head west to visit Arrowrock and Blackwater. Arrowrock has a state historic site as well as many interesting shops and buildings. The Lyceum Theatre is a great way to spend an evening. Stay at the Arrow Rock Bed and Breakfast (660)-837-3280. Plan on touring award winning Blackwater's revitalized main street that serves as an example for many small towns to follow. The endearing people who have worked for this are a great example of the overwhelming good and beauty that can come from having your heart in the right place. Along with antique shops, there is the Chateau Garden located in what was a vacant storefront on Main Street. Enjoy elegant overnight surroundings at The Iron Horse Inn (660) 846-3001 or have a relaxing meal at the Iron Horse Restaurant.

If heading home takes you eastward, we are only 30 minutes from Columbia. From daylight to dark stop off at Shelter Gardens just off Broadway. The University of Missouri has been designated a Botanic Garden. The campus is alive with great plantings, including some innovative tropicals and annuals, many from Vintage Hill Farm.

Along with bringing unusual plants to life, Vintage Hill also has a few resident "rescue" parrots. The greenhouse environment is ideal for their living of the good life. If the weather is cool or cloudy you may notice Highland Cattle in the pastures. Currently about 25 head make their home here as the work of preserving this grand old breed continues. A total of three Corgis patrol the farm for crumbs and just in case something needs to be herded, as Brook, the Bernese Mountain dog, keeps her eye on Jeff. Horses remain an integral part of life at Vintage Hill with a foal due this year and another youngster going under saddle this fall. Regular dressage clinics are held thru the year to bring top clinicians to the riders of the Midwest. Check out www.vintagehill.com for more information about horses and cattle.
