

TERMS OF SALE

1. Unless specifically otherwise agreed, all products are sold ex seller's warehouse, Holland, and travel throughout at buyer's risk and expense.
2. If products are sold ex seller's warehouse, the cost of cases, of packing and of Netherlands phytopathological inspection, and of any freight, forwarding, insurance, export and import charges, shall be for buyer's account. These charges shall be due and payable on arrival of the goods at United States or Canadian port. Unless otherwise instructed, the seller will arrange for transportation and for ordinary insurance coverage to destination.
3. Payment shall be due ninety (90) days from date of invoice; two per cent (2 %) discount will be allowed for payment within thirty (30) days from date on invoice.
4. The seller warrants the goods to be sound and healthy at time of shipment but does not otherwise warrant flowering- or other planting-, growing- or forcing results.
5. If at time of shipment, the buyer shall be in default in the payment of any account owing to any member of the Holland Bulb Exporters' Trade Sub-Group ("Ondervakgroep „Export van Bloembollen") or if the buyer's financial responsibility appears unsatisfactory to the seller, the seller may, at his option, cancel this order, as a whole or in part, provided that he shall promptly advise the buyer of any such cancellation; and the seller shall not be responsible for any damages whatsoever arising from such cancellation.
6. Total or partial failure of the general or of seller's crop, owing to frost, floods, or other natural causes, or loss or damage to seller's stocks by fire or any other cause beyond his control, preventing seller from fully performing the present and/or similar contracts, shall relieve the seller from the obligations under the present contract to a corresponding extent.
7. Whenever the terms of this order call for delivery f.o.b. any place or conveyance in the United States or Canada, the seller shall be required only to arrange for transportation and insurance to the point specified and the seller may, at his election, either prepay freight, insurance and/or other shipping charges, including import duty and arrange to collect same on delivery in a lump sum from the buyer or the buyer shall pay all such charges from warehouse Holland until arrival at such agreed place or conveyance in the United States or Canada. In either case buyer shall be permitted to deduct the charges paid by him to such agreed f.o.b. United States or Canada place or conveyance from the agreed f.o.b. United States or Canada prices.
Notwithstanding any agreement as to delivery at any point other than seller's warehouse, the goods shall in all cases be at buyer's risk from the time they leave the initial point of shipment.
8. All claims hereunder shall be deemed waived unless presented within eight (8) days after receipt of goods. Claims relating to damage to or condition of goods shall be accompanied by Lloyd's survey report or its equivalent, stating full particulars. In case of non arrival of goods at destination within a reasonable time after receiving advice of shipment from Holland, buyer shall notify the seller by telegraph.
9. Cancellation of this order or part thereof will only be accepted when buyer agrees to pay seller his loss of profit; changes in this order may be allowed only if both parties agree thereto.
10. These printed Terms of Sale cannot be altered nor departed from except by mutual consent in writing.
11. Payment should be made to our New-York office, M. v. Waveren & Sons, Inc., 101 West 31st Street, New York (N.Y.).
No cash discount on advance or charges or U.S. duties, no discount is enjoyed by us and none can be given.
12. All offers are made subject to being unsold.
13. Sellers are not liable for any damages due to insects or plant diseases.
14. Confiscatory action by foreign pathologists is considered for account of foreign buyers.
15. By placing orders, buyers are considered to agree with these terms.

GROW HYACINTHS ON GLASSES

HOW TO GROW PERFECT FLOWERS IN WATER

Growing bulbous plants indoors, in distilled or rain water, is a hobby which fills one with wonder and delight. It is always new, always thrilling. An occasional failure spurs one to a new start, never blaming the bulb or the plant, for one knows that if it was planted in soil outdoors, it would grow and bloom profusely. To start growing **Hyacinths in water**, one can buy suitable and attractive glasses, made for this purpose, but all sorts of jars, pots, small vases can be used. Care must be taken that the receptacles have a good base so that they cannot easily topple over when the plants are full grown.

The bulbs had best be bought from a reputable dealer in horticultural products and one should state that the Hyacinths are wanted for culture in water. This same dealer will gladly show you or sell you typical Hyacinth glasses. The best size of Hyacinthbulbs for water culture seems to be about 18 to 19 centimeters in circumference. One **can** use smaller bulbs, which produce smaller flowers. After November 20th one starts placing the bulbs on glasses. The latter should be rinsed and then filled with clean water. Before placing the bulb on the glass, it should be freed from all loose torn skins and the hollow in the base of the bulb, or root plate, must be freed from all dried roots, bits of soil, etc., so that no decay is likely to develop. A few strokes with a soft brush removes any loose dirt or dust. The bulbs are then placed on the glass so that the root plate is very close to the water but does not touch it. After a week or ten days, the glasses should be looked over and, if necessary, some water added, keeping it a $\frac{1}{8}$ of an inch below the bulb, because the root plate should remain fairly dry. The evaporating water dampens the root plate just enough to set the tiny root points in action, and soon one sees the roots being sent down deeper and deeper into the water. All this time the glasses have been kept in a **cool dark place**. On the floor in a cold corner of the cellar with a box over them to keep the light away, or in an airy, dark closet of an unheated room, the Hyacinths will make good roots and topgrowth. In a **warm room or warm closet** conditions for root-growth and top-growth are **unfavorable** and failure is often the result. If a good place is available, all that needs to be done is to look at the glasses once in a while to add some water, or if the water has become dirty by accident, to refresh it. If one follows these directions, failure to start bulbs growing nicely is practically impossible.

When the roots have reached the bottom of the glass, the topgrowth starts. A big fat promising bud begins to rise from the center of the bulb, usually about 6—8 weeks after the start of the culture. Now is the time to show patience and self control. For by this time real winter has come, impatience grows, and one is anxious to take the glasses from the cool dark place to the light and warmth. Just at this point a mistake can easily ruin the plan. The glasses can be transferred to a warm light place **only** when the buds are **from $2\frac{1}{2}$ to $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches above the bulb**. It is better to wait a little longer, than to apply light and heat too soon. All bulbs which one sees in homes, with the flower way down deep between the green leaves, making no progress, have been brought into light and heat too soon. As a result, the leaves grow, but the flower refuses to rise. **This „half result” is solely due to applying light and heat too soon.** If one leaves the glasses cool and dark until the buds, fat and yellow, are about 3 inches high, then the

flower is „out of the neck” of the bulb, and rises together with the leaves to form a perfect flowering plant. Success is then assured. What a delightful process to watch, this gradual “greening” of the yellow buds, the separating of the leaves, the rising flower spike with its neatly folded immature bells hugging the stem so closely. After a few days these bells, still green, assume a right angle position to the stem and then the appointed color, be it darkest blue or sweetest pink, gradually suffuses each petal, until the ever-new but ages-old miracle is completed. Not yet content apparently, with all it gives, in the second or third day the gorgeous Hyacinth emits a generous fragrance, alluring and distinct, never to be forgotten. It is astounding how long a Hyacinth bloom will last when grown in water. For water culture, the most satisfactory Hyacinth varieties are:


