

aving been asked about my 'retirement' after Chelsea I thought you might like to see one of the growing grandsons with the growing plants. The species peony collection is also growing and we hope to have sufficient to offer more varieties soon. Things never stand still and one of the consequences of not doing Chelsea is that we no longer need some of the large show plants so this year we are able to offer the evergreen Dianella tasmanica (page 12) with its extraordinary blue

Some of our plants did not enjoy the wonderful summer as much as we did but the **Schizostylis** were an eye opener. They are stream side plants from southern Africa so we think of them as wanting dampish soils but forget that they experience seasonal rainfall and very hot summers. They literally blossomed and are still in full flower as I write this in mid November. They are perfect to keep the interest going into autumn I grow them in my dry ditch with iris and hostas. Another star of late autumn are the clumps of Acidanthera (page 18) in sole possession of the border now the dahlias have collapsed. Planted to fill the tulip gaps they are still flowering magnificently nearly 3 months after they started.

Most of the summer flowering bulbs originate in S Africa and all were particularly good this year with our Agapanthus collection (image page 4) really excelling itself. We do not sell young plugs, all the deciduous

varieties are grown in an open field so we know they are hardy and we lift plants for sale. There are many more varieties on the website.

We are also offering one of the best new Crocosmia Paul's Best Yellow (page 8) and the superb and aptly named 'Hell Fire'. Our Dieramas (page 12) also bounced back from the cold winter 2 years ago and flowered fit to burst.

Here's hoping for another glorious summer – it also helps with the weeding!

AGAPANTHUS (African Lily)

Easy, trouble-free perennials forming large clumps of narrow leaves and round heads of flowers in late summer. Feed in spring with Tomorite. **Many more varieties** will be found on our website.

NOTE: We sell mature plants NOT plugs and although most have flowered here they may not flower in the first year after moving; they need time to settle.

DECIDUOUS VARIETIES FOR BORDERS OR POTS

These are **deciduous** with clumps of narrow leaves and are free flowering. They are fully hardy in well drained soil in full sun. Established plants flower best. A winter mulch is beneficial in cold areas. Protect from frost if grown in pots.

BEN HOPE

One of the excellent 'Royal' series, producing masses of well shaped, mid blue flowers. One of the earliest to flower. Good front of border plant. 36" July £5.50 each: 3 = £14.50

EVERGREEN VARIETIES FOR CONTAINERS

Evergreen varieties are best grown in pots which are kept frost free. They produce fewer but larger flower heads and have large, leek-like clumps of leaves. They are all large mature plants.

ALLIUM

We offer here semi-evergreen varieties which prefer to be planted at this time of the year. The onion smell only occurs when the leaves are bruised. They are all easy to grow in light, well drained soil and full sun. Clump forming.



CERNUUM (Nodding Onion)

An attractive plant with nodding umbels of mid pink flowers. Useful for the late summer border. 15" July-Aug 5 = £4.00

These attractive and unusual relations of our own Lords and Ladies are becoming increasingly popular. They are quite hardy and require a cool soil that does not dry out. A covering of bracken is beneficial in cold areas. The 'flower' is in fact the spathe, the true flower being inside it.

♥ CANDIDISSIMUM

A quite outstanding Chinese species with white flower spathes broadly striped with pink. Prefers a sunnier position than the rest.


Hardly a small bulb but we are regularly asked for these popular summer flowering bulbs from S Africa. Plant in full sun with the neck of the bulb above the soil. They will look dreadful in the winter but resist the temptation to tidy up until the new leaves start to poke through in the spring.

\mathbb{Y} X POWELLII ALBUM

The huge bulb produces large clusters of long leaves and a succession of white, trumpet shaped flowers in mid-summer. Clump forming – my enormous one produced 26 stems this year! 3' Aug-Sept £7.00 each

CROCOSMIA

Once included under Montbretia, these plants appreciate a little humus on planting and prefer shade for at least part of the day. They do not flower well in hot dry conditions or deep shade. Excellent for extending the season into late summer.

CANARY BIRD

We found a stock of this lovely deep golden Crocosmia in a local garden. Although we know no more of its history than its name, it is a very fine plant. 24" Aug-Sept 3 = £4.50; 10 = £13.75

CITRONELLA

CYCLAMEN

Hardy Cyclamen in general are far better planted as growing plants than as dormant bulbs. Due to the fragility of their leaf stalks we prefer to despatch late in their growing season when they are naturally dying back. All tubers are dug daily for immediate despatch. All Cyclamen require a humus-rich soil that is well drained. They are summer dormant — an annual top dressing of bone meal and leaf mould or composted bark is beneficial. All varieties have distinctive leaves which are very variable and give great interest in the garden, both before and after the flowers appear. Except for Cyclamen repandum (see description) they should be planted with the tops of the tubers one inch below the soil surface. They prefer to be planted as under:

Lilies require a fertile well-drained soil with an uninterrupted supply of moisture while they are growing. They should be planted 6"-8" deep. 




