ONOCLEA SENSIBILIS

Common Name: Sensitive Fern

This fern features long-stalked, deeply pinnate, bright green, vegetative (sterile) fronds with leathery, triangular leaflets which have distinctively netted veins. Shorter, erect, woody-like fertile fronds typically brown up (hence the "sensitive") in late summer and persist throughout the remaining season and winter.

OSMUNDA CINNAMOMEA

Common Name: Cinnamon Fern

(Syn: Osmundastrum cinnamomeum) Stately, erect cinnamon colored arching fronds. Adapts very well to boggy soils but can also tolerate moist soils. Separate sporebearing, stiff, fertile fronds appear in early spring and quickly turn brown.
