Please note that if a red X is placed on yur address label you are due to renew your ADS membership. I did this as a reminder so that you will not miss out on the next ADS Journal which is aiming more toward a broad spectrum of interest.

Despite the early bloom followed by rain, wind and hail, the Midwest Region hosted six (6) shows. It was a first and a plus when the Kentucky Daffodil Society joined with the Daffodil Growers South for a joint show. As could be expected, with the National Convention in late April, local societies were forced to schedule all in the same week. Members support all shows so CODS graciously canceled giving us two days to catch up and prepare for the Midwest Regional Show at Kingwood. Charles Applegate chaired the Regional Show and won the Mary Knierim Award. This award requires 3 stems each of 6 cultivars color coded white. He won with Green Ice 2 W-GWW, Glenside 2 W-GWW, Marango 2 W-W, Silver Convention 1 W-W, Panache 1 W-W, Pitchroy 2 W-GWW. Tag Bourne won the William G. Pannill Trophy with the best standard daffodil, Sunday Chimes 5 W-W.

It was good to see so many of you at the National Convention in Indianapolis. Hoosier Hospitality reigned as Phyllis Vonnegut, convention chair, lead the way with warmth and graciousness. Even with the members feeling that they were bloomed out prior to the National Convention we managed to staged a quailty show. A BIG THANK YOU to Helen Trueblood, for serving as the general show chairman, and also to her commitee members. Note the enclosed National Show Report and you will find that out of the 29 ADS Awards given, 20 went home with midwest region members. It was a pleasant surprise to find on Saturday morning that we would tour the gardens of Mrs. Goethe Link, Mr. & Mrs. Douglas Clarke and Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert Daniels sans rain. Preparing for members to tour ones grounds requires hours of prepartion and I believe I speak for all when I say YOU ARE APPRECIATED. Workshops covered divisions 5-8 & 11 as well as miniatures and landscaping. Saturdays banquet speaker, John Reed, spoke on the pros and cons of midwest hybridizing. The trade (commercial) exhibitors brought magnificent blooms. Their displays of seedlings and new cultivars exceeded ones greatest expectations. It was a beautiful convention - an educational experience! I look forward to next year, when once again, it will be held in the Midwest Region - Columbus, Ohio. More about this convention in the next newsletter.

The next major meeting to place on your calender is the Midwest Regional Meeting to be held at Cox Arboretum on October 26, 1991. We will be priviledged to have as our featured speaker the First Vice President of the American Daffodil Society, Mr. Richard T. Ezell. SECOND ANNUAL CINCINNATI FLOWER AND GARDEN SHOW

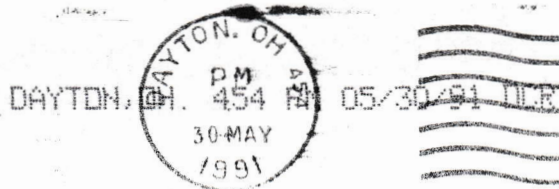
The second annual Cincinnati Flower and Garden Show was held Friday through Sunday, April 26-28, 1991, at Ault Park. An estimated 42,000 people saw the show which was held in tents ala the Chelsea Flower Show in London. Again this year, ADS has had a prominent exhibit at the show. We had sixteen feet of 3-tiered table space and had over 125 cultivars on display throughout the three days. The majority of blooms came from Handy Hatfield's garden, with some season-ending poeticus from local gardens. The Macneales and the Gripshovers had set up tables and background on Wednesday, and a hardy band of stagers--Peggy Macneale, Tom Stettner, Jr., Connie Rose, Helen Smith, and I; and label-writers Dalton Battin, Neil Macneale, and Linda Wallpe--arrived early Thursday morning and had all the flowers staged by noon when judging of exhibits began.

When we arrived on Friday, we were pleased to see we had been awarded a Silver Medal Certificate. Peggy, Tom and I shared the hours the show was open and answered many questions about daffodils, from the old, familiar "What's the difference between a daffodil and a narcissus?" to "Why don't mine bloom?" By Sunday, many of the blooms were looking tired--and so were we!--but it was well worth the effort involved. John Bloomstrom (with daughter Gretchen) was there to help dismantle, and he, Paul, and I had it down in record time. This show is well worth seeing, and if you have the opportunity to attend next year, I heartily recommend it.
