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Introduction

Hybridizers in the United States are working in *all* the daffodil divisions, and have made many significant improvements in form and color. They are also creating different colors in some of the divisions that have had limited color in the past. In no other country is the great diversity of fine quality new daffodils so evident.


This review of newer standards and intermediates is arranged by division to showcase the extensive variety of distinctive flowers being produced in nearly every division by American hybridizers.

Though the work of a few professional breeders is more evident, the program contains images from 18 different hybridizers, many of them amateurs. The Mitsch-Havens dynasty, now in its 78th year, has led the way to many advances in the upper divisions, as well as in the so-called "first four."

Others, such as Sid DuBose, Steve Vinisky and John Reed, though they have not had so many years of breeding behind them, are up-to-the-minute with their new flowers.

America's most noted amateur, Bill Pannill, has produced many flowers that, though they may no longer be called "new," have yet to be surpassed in their class, so are included here. The dates shown are registration dates, which are often much earlier than the date of commercial introduction.






Cyclamineus Daffodils

Cyclamineus Daffodil Cultivars

Characteristics of *N. cyclamineus* clearly evident: one flower to a stem; perianth segments significantly reflexed; flower at an acute angle to the stem, with a very short pedicel (neck)








Tazetta Daffodils

Tazetta Daffodil Cultivars

Characteristics of the *N. tazetta* group predominant: usually three to twenty flowers to a stout stem; leaves broad; perianth segments spreading, not reflexed; flowers fragrant




Poeticus Daffodils

Poeticus Daffodil Cultivars

Characteristics of the *N. poeticus* group predominant: usually one flower to a stem; perianth segments pure white; corona usually disc-shaped, with a green or yellow center and a red rim; flowers fragrant




Split Corona Daffodils

Division 11

Corona split usually for more than half it's length



a) Collar Daffodils, with the corona segments opposite the perianth segments; the corona segments usually in two whorls of three.



b) Papillon Daffodils, with the corona segments alternate to the perianth segments; the corona usually in a single whorl of six.
