## Antique Roses, Old Garden Roses, Older Classifications, and Species Roses

Antique Roses include those classifications in existence prior to the first Hybrid Tea in 1867. They are known for their history, old-fashioned charm, fragrance, hardiness and vigor. Some are rebloomers, but many have a very long single bloom period in early summer. These should be pruned after blooming, not before. Hybrid Musk roses are informally included here among the Antiques, even though they did not arrive until 1897.

AUSTRIAN COPPER	4-6'	RED- ORANGE	R. foetida bicolor, 'Turkish Rose'. Species; before 1590. Single blooms of brightest orange-red, yellow reverse. A graceful, arching plant, quite prickly, with a spectacular show of blooms once in early summer. Attracts hummingbirds.	3
BALLERINA	3.5'	PALE PINK	Peppermint Rose'. Hybrid Musk; Bentall, UK, 1937. Sprays of small pink and white blooms cover this airy shrub, which can be encouraged to tumble up and over a fence. Repeats. Compliments dark purple Clematis 'jackmanii'. ARS rating 8.5. Charming!	5
CHARLES DE MILLS	3'	MAUVE	Bizard Triumphant', Gallica. Netherlands, before 1786. Big show of deepest pink, very double blooms for several weeks in early summer. Petals darken and intensify with age. Named for an early director of the East India Company. ARS rating 8.3.	4b
CHESTNUT ROSE	6'	PINK	Colvill, United Kingdom, before 1825. Domesticated from a species rose collected in China, this rose was sold in a nursery that was established in 1783 and introduced generations of Londoners to exotic plants. Blowzy double blooms, lovely hips reminiscent of chestnut burrs. Light yet delectable fragrance.	6a

DOORENBOS SELECTION	2-3'	RED	Hybrid spinosissima; the Netherlands, before 1820. Deep magenta-red, single blooms in clusters with fluffy yellow stamens surrounding a yellow-green eye. Blooms heavily for several weeks in early summer. Prickly canes; airy, fern-like foliage. Victoria grows it in her yard. An unusual and dramatic addition to the garden! Own root. Very limited quantity.	4
PALATINA MUSCOSA	3-5'	DEEP PINK	Schmitz, Canada, 2005. A hybridized Moss rose, with romantic, full blooms. Luscious scent of old rose with citrus tones. Blooms once a season. Very limited quantity.	5b
REPEATING SWAMP ROSE	4-5'	PINK	Species, unknown. An unusual, wild hippie, comfortable in damp soil and part sun. Few thorns, attractive airy shrub. Recurrent blooms.	5
ROSA GLAUCA	5'	PALE PINK	Redleaf Rose.' Species, Central Europe. The highlight of this stunning rose is its deep purple, glaucous foliage with a bluish tinge. Sets clusters of urn-shaped hips that turn orange in the fall. Graceful vase shaped plant, lovely with deep purple salvias. One of Victoria's favorites in her garden, stunning outside the Garfield Park Conservatory. ARS 8.9.	2b
ROSA PALUSTRIS	3-8'	PINK	Swamp Rose.' Species. Petite, single petal beauty! ARS rating 8.1. Very limited quantity.	4
ROSE DE RESCHT	3-4'	FUCHSIA	Portland; Lindsay, Iran, 1930. Perfectly formed cushiony blooms of deep magenta, cloaked in bright green foliage. Strong, damask fragrance, tolerates some shade, and reblooms. Great source of essential rose oil used in perfume. Thought originally from the Persian (Iran) city of Rescht and brought to Europe in 1949. ARS rating 8.7. A favorite of ours for many years.	4b
ULRICH BRUNNER FILS	5-8'	DEEP PINK	Hybrid Perpetual; Levet, France, 1881. Cerise blossoms fade quickly to rose and pink, releasing a good measure of fragrance. Canes can be quite long and vertical, so this is a good candidate for training along a fence. It's silky and delicious! ARS rating 8.1	6b

## English Roses

**This unofficial classification within the Shrub Roses includes those roses hybridized by David Austin of Shropshire, England, one of the world's best-known and best-loved breeders. Beginning in the 1960's, Mr. Austin set out to cross antique roses with modern Floribundas and Hybrid Teas, combining modern color and vigor with old-fashioned faces and fragrance. # Climbing Roses

Climbing roses have long canes that are flexible when new, allowing them to be trained on a wall, fence, arbor, or other garden feature. Climbers bloom their best when trained out and up. They need not be heavily pruned; remove deadwood, trim back longest canes by 12" or so, and cut back lateral side shoots to 6-8".  
**Ramblers are extremely vigorous, reaching 15'-30', and are suitable for covering large areas.**

## Floribunda Roses

**Floribundas share the elegant flower form of the Hybrid Tea with the vigorous cluster-flowering habit of the polyantha roses. They originated in 1909 with 'Gruss An Aachen'. Floribundas are upright and bushy in habit, cloaked almost continuously in clusters of blooms. Prune floribundas severely in early spring, as you would a Hybrid Tea. Deadhead regularly to promote rapid rebloom.**

DAMES DE CHENONCEAU	3-5'	PINK	G. Delbard, France, 2002. Large, very double blooms of pink with apricot shading. Strong, unusual fragrance of anise and citrus. The rose is named after the "ladies' Chateau" of Chenonceau, just south of Paris. Chenonceau was the residence of the wives and mistresses of several French kings during the 16th and 17th centuries. Limited quantity available.	5
DAY BREAKER	2-3'	APRICOT	Fryer, UK, 2004. Absolutely gorgeous! Clusters of hybrid tea shaped, yellow blooms mature to apricot flushed pink. Deep green, glossy foliage. AARS winner 2004, ARS rating 8.0.	5


