Gray Sedum



Drought tolerant and so easy to grow! Great in a sunny window with little care or attention.

Sedum griseum

- <u>Use:</u> A nice, bushy centerpiece for a succulent dish garden, or by itself as an addition to your indoor succulent collection. A silvery green with delicate foliage and a frosted appearance. The young leaves feature farina, a powdery wax. To complete the frosted look, it produces snow white flowers in late summer. Requires little water or maintenance. Can be overwintered in a sunny window or kept as a house-plant.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Needs to be planted in full sun in well-drained soil. It will tolerate most soil types and is drought resistant.
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows to 8" tall and can spread to form a colorful low-growing matt to 20" across. They grow long, sprawling stems and take well to pruning every couple years. Just re-stick trimmed stems into fresh soil to re-root.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 10+; Houseplant our outdoors when temps above 50 degrees.
- **Foliage**: Deciduous. The fine, silvery-grey needle-like leaves contrast well with other succulents.
- <u>Flower:</u> White, 5 petaled, star-like flowers in late winter.
