Corydalis BLUE LINE Syn: Corydalis hybrid 'Couriblue'





Height: 40cm Spread: 60cm









FEATURES:

- A long and prolific display of spur-shaped, metallic blue flowers can be produced from spring through to autumn.
- Ornamental, soft fern-like foliage.
- Ideal for bright colour in low light areas.

SUGGESTED USES:

- Great for modern pot or planter displays.
- Edging shaded paths, water features/ponds.
- •Small or narrow spaces.

CARE:

Grows well in most soil types which are moist but well draining. Easy to grow but should be given protection from hot afternoon sun. No pruning is generally required other than to tidy if needed. In very cold regions the plant may become herbaceous to return with vigour in the spring.

Apply a slow release fertiliser during spring. Mulch well to help retain moisture during dry periods.

The genus name of Corydalis comes from the Greek korydalis, meaning 'crested lark' - inspired by the shape of the flowers. The genus contains around 470 species with around 360 of these native to regions of China. Plant C. 'Blue Line' in a container for adding terrific colour to low light zones such as under patio roof or balcony as well as shady path ways. In garden beds it makes a charming companion for other shade tolerant plants such as Pulmonaria 'Electric Blue', Anenomes 'Pamina' and 'Queen Charlotte' and Iberis 'Winter Glow'. Underplant with the ground covering Campanula 'Resholdts' Variety' and create a foil to back display using the taller growing Plectranthus 'Mona Lavender'.
