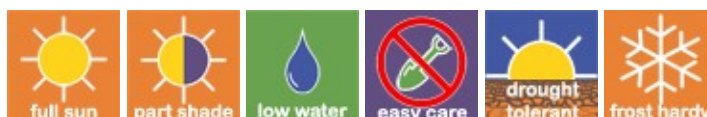
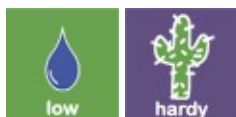
Correa decumbens

Spreading correa

A low growing shrub spreading to 1.5m but rarely taller than 30cm. Winter flowering with erect, tubular red flowers.



water hardiness

bird attracting
shady gardens

origin	South Australia
cultural notes	Grow full sun or part shade in well drained soil.
maintenance	Prune to maintain shape.
tolerates	Frost and drought tolerant.
flowering season	Winter, year-round depending on climate.
flower colour	Red tubular flowers held erect (unlike most Correas).
foliage colour	Leaves are dull green and have a leathery appearance.
width	up to 1.5m
height	up to 0.3m
plant spacing	200cm apart
recommended uses	Useful for empty spaces under large trees, in rockeries or in planting tubs, elevating the flowers for greater visibility.
