Desert Shield gusts into Storm

Marines and sailors here, as well as the families of those who've heen deployed to Saudi Arabia, have watched closely over the past week as Operation Desert Storm has unfolded.
Wednesday morning, Defense Secretary Dick Cheney and Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Gen.

Colin Powell summed up the first week of operations during a press conference at the Pentagon.

This briefing came one week after President George Bush

addressed the nation from the Oval Office to announce what he terned as the beginning of military operations to "liberate Kuwait."

The president suid that evening that five months before, Saddam Hussein had started "this cruel war" against Kuwait; and now the battle to end the aggression had been joined by U.S. and allied forces. "This military action, taken in accord with United Nations Resolutions and with the consent of the United States Congress, follows months of constant and virtually endless

diplomatic activity on the part of the United Nations, the United States and many, many other countries."

"Now, the 28 countries with forces in the Gulf area have no choice but to drive Saddam from Kuwait by force."

Doing this, Cheney explained Wednesday, will not be easy. "The Iraqis and Saddam Hussein have a very large military force. Depending upon what criteria you use, certainly one of the largest in the world."

Earlier Wednesday, Vice

President Dan Quayle, while addressing servicemen and their families at Mayport Naval Station, Fla., addressed the task of winning the war.

"In 1930, Winston Churchill said, 'never, never, never, believe any war will be smooth and easy.' That was good advice then, and it's good advice today,' Quayle said.

"I wish I could tell you that this will be easily won, but I can't." Quayle said. "I wish I could tell you that your loved ones will be home tomorrow, but I can't."

He said be could, however,

guarantee that allied troops would be allowed to do the job they're capuble of.

"No one will be asked to fight with one hand tied behind their back in this war. This will not be another Vietnam. Allied forces will prevail," he added.
These words reiterated words President Bush had used in his speech the week before.

"Prior to ordering our forces into hattle," Bush said, "I instructed our military commanders to take every necessary step to prevail as quickly as possible and with the greatest degree of protection possible

for American and allied service-men and women.

Using a comprehensive hattle plan, explained Cheney, U.S. and allied forces began the operation Jan. 16 with a massive air assault to weaken Hussein's military force and to go after his arr assault to weaken Hussein's military force and to go after his offensive military capability. Cheney explained, however, that this can't be done completely in one week. It is an ongoing operation. More than 12,000 sorties have been flown, and allied forces have met with much

Families advised about media

With the Gulf crisis now a full-fledged war, families of deployed Marines and sallors have become increasingly desirable interview subjects for newspaper, radio and television journalists.

In past months, some Air Station family members have agreed to interviews once, only to find themselves the targets of continual media requests afterwards.

While family members are free to speak to the media, they also

have the right to turn down interview requests. While the media's interest is understandable, family members have a right to privacy and to courteous treatment by Journalists.

If you wish to be interviewed by the media, the Joint Public Affairs Office recommends fol-lowing certain guidelines to en-sure you aren't misused. These tips include:

Media members are not authorized aboard the Air Station

without the Public Affairs Offi-cer's approval and an escork. If approached by an unescorted journalist, immediately contact JPAO before agreeing to be in-

All interviews with the media should be coordinated through JPAO, which can pro-vide guidance.

Speak from personal experience only. Don't speak about military policies or views.

• Don't speak for "everyone." Clearly present yourself as some

one who can relay personal ex-periences as a family member, not as a "family member spokes-nerson"

Keep privileged correspon dence or conversation to yourself

• Don't speculate. Steer clear of all "what if" questions.

To contact the JPAO, call 257-5728, 5742 or 1348 during normal working hours. After working hours, you can call the Station Officer of the Day at 257-1823, or the Brigade Officer of the Day at 257-1290.

operations officer, individual
Marines and their familles
should be aware of individual protective measures.

A recently published memorandum from the Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, outlines individ-ual ant terrorism measures. Some of the information provided is detailed below.

While it is impossible for individuals to stop terrorists from

seeking targets to further their cause, people can make them-selves a less likely target by

taking certain precautions.
Usually terrorist attacks occur
while the victim is travelling to while the victim is traveling to or from work, or is at work. This does not mean, however, that military personnel or their families would not be targeted in their homes, or in their social and recreational environment. Each family member should

Each family member should be familiar with basic security procedures and techniques.

Travel safety tips:
• Attempt to blend into your

surroundings.
• Keep information about your

home, car, family, security efforts and activities known only by the immediate family, friends and security personnel, and only on a need to know basis. · Avoid routines while travel-

ing.

• When possible, travel in

• Avoid isolated roads, dan-ger areas, civil disturbances and crowds.

• Be alert and note anyone who appears to he following. Do not antagonize the individual; quickly move to a safe haven and report the incident.

• Keep emergency numbers

• Keep your command and family aware of your where-

Always keep your vehicle in good mechanical condition and your gas tank at least half full.

· Drive with car doors locked, windows closed, and secure your when unattended

· Never pick up hitchhikers or

strangers.
• Memorize the location of safe havens along your regular routes. Police and fire stations, or any busy place, are excellent

• Do not stop for accidents or other problems if you suspect the incident is a ruse. Drive away to a phone and call for assistance.

• Always use seat belts.
• On multi-lane highways, drive in the center lane to make it more difficult to force your

it more difficult to force your car to the curb.

• Avoid driving close behind other vehicles or in any situ-ation where you can be hoxed

•If you must leave your car keys with an attendant, leave only the ignition key.

Due to the current Desert Storm tempo of operations, it's anticipated that this mail restriction request to be necessary for the next two to three weeks. However, this will be reviewed as the situation changes.



Special considerations for children:

"Based on the reports we're getting from our pilots and the evidence of gun camera record-ings, the hombing missions are going well," Cheney said. He cautioned the media,

however, that a military opera-tion of this complexity and intensity "can not be scored every evening like a college track meet or hasketball tournament."

"We want to be certain that we don't rush down (to press briefings) with premature words of success. We are deliherately waiting until we have some confidence in the results of specific categories of targets."

Cheney warned that Hussein and his terrorist and military capabilities should not be underestimated.
"But he can not change the

"But he can not change the basic course of the conflict. He will be defeated," Cheney added. Cheney began his briefing by expressing words of thanks and

encouragement to the men and women of the Armed Forces currently serving in the gulf.

"We all feel a great deal of pride in the men and women of our Armed Forces that are carrying out these operations. It is an extremely complex and often dangerous undertaking and they have our admiration and our gratitude."

In the closing remarks of his speech, President Bush said: "To everyone listening or watching tonight: When the troops we've sent in finish their work, I'm determined to bring them home as soon as possible. Tonight, as our forces fight, they and their families are in our prayers.

"May God bless each and every one of them and the coalition forces at our side in the Gulf, and may he continue to bless our Nation, the United States of America."



Morale, Welfare, Recreation lives up to its name

Editor's note: The following story is first in a series that will cover issues concerning Morale Welfare and Recreation.

It is perhaps an unusual concept, but there's a definite business to maintaining military morale. If one phrase could sum it up, that would have to be "Morale, Welfare and Recreation."

Anyone who's been around a Marine Corps installation long enough to see the sun go down has undoubtedly dealt with at least some aspect of the morale machine.

machine.

That's because MWR, the abbreviation for Morale, Welfare and Recreation, encom-

fare and Recreation, encompasses just about every aspect of leisure activities aboard Navy and Marine bases and stations.

Imagine if a major depart ment store, yacht club, fitness centers, convenience stores, restaurants, a child care center and some club organizations joined forces with the parks and recreation division of a local community. While unheard of in the "civilian world," this peculiar team would just begin to resemble MWR.

MWR has not always been a combined team of diverse activities. The consolidation of morale efforts aboard military installa-

efforts aboard military installa

tions has only come about over the past three years. This Air Station began its transforma-tion only a year and a half ago. Time was when all recreation activities such as athletics and

Time was when all recreation activities such as athletics and youth recreation were an organization unto themselves. In those days, recreation activities received a great deal of funding from Congress.

Several services and goods which now come with a price used to be free. When the military budget axe began to swing in the late 1980s, however, recreation lost its arms and legs.

Congress told the armed services that the only way to save their recreation programs, as well as other quality of life activities, was to start operating in a business-like manner. That caused the military minds at Headquarters Marine Corps to establish MWR. It was based on the logic that through consolidation, operating costs would be decreased and money making operations such as exchanges could be used to costs would be decreased and money making operations such as exchanges could be used to help support the non-money makers like organized athletics programs; thus keeping the cost to Marines to a minimum.

While all Corps-wide MWR activities are linked to Headquarters Marine Corps' MWR Support Activity, the individual

bases and stations are in a sense franchised. This is to say that they are locally run by the installation commander, not Headquarters Marine Corps. Additionally, each installation is responsible for generating the majority of its own funds.

"The object of consolidation is to provide the installation commanders with the ways and means to earn revenues required to operate recreation activities," said a spokesman for the MWR Support Activity.

Air Station Commander Col. R.R. Critser, said this consolidation has been a godsend for Kaneobe Bay.

"You have to make use of the assets available to yon locally in a husiness-like manner, because the funds aren't there otherwise," Critser said. "I think we've done a pretty good job so far and things will probably improve as the system matures."

As the station commander, Critser maintains overall control of MWR, although it is directed by Walter Skierkowski, ar etired serviceman. Skierkowski has nearly 1,000 employees who make up his morale team. These people hold jobs ranging from cooks to caretakers and from managers to marketing directors. The people behind from managers to marketing directors. The people behind the scenes are as diverse as MWR itself.

It is these people that make the business run. MWR is indeed that a business. But it is a business with the unique mission of improving commu-

mission of improving commu-nity services.
All told, Kaneohe's MWR is a \$50 million business annu-ally. Profits from retail and service sales disappear quickly into the overall operating budget, however, explained Skierkowski. Most goes into recreation serv-ices.

Additionally, with so many Marines and sailors currently deployed, sales are way down, he said, and MWR is feeling the

deployed, sales are way down, he said, and MWR is feeling the pinch.


"This Christmas season was tough on a lot of American businesses because of talk about a recession. We were further affected by a big reduction in our clientele," Skierkowski said.

Many Marines may have noticed that over the past couple years, the percentage of savings at exchanges are less in relation to civilian competition. Skierkowski said this is because profits from the exchange are used to support recreation activities for Marines that would otherwise disappear.

While prices may have gon up in some cases, a Corps-wide MWR survey suggests that exchanges still offer the best See MWR/A-5

Skierkowski pointed out that in addition to the savings at the exchanges, patrons are also contributing to programs that directly enhance their own community because much of the profits support recreation and service programs.

While much of the appropriated (Congressional) funds supporting leisure activities were cut in the late '80s, some appropriated funding remains. These funds must be used for the specific purpose intended. In most cases, such funding only partially pays for the activity it supports. Remaining overhead comes out of MWR's budget from locally generated funds.

As Skierkowski explained, local funds are generated in a variety of ways. Primarily, these funds come from retail sales and service charges at various activities. Additionally, funding is raised through K-Bay's

recycling efforts and through business sponsorship.

Susan Miles, MWR director of marketing, explained that coordinating sponsors is an ongoing and demanding job. Sponsorship does not pay for daily activities, but rather special events such as the Windward Community Family Festival and Santa's Village.

"We couldn't possibly hold such high quality special events here without the support of sponsors, so we are always very grateful for their help," Miles said.

Skierkowski and Critser both expressed the belief that the creation of MWR is responsible for saving morale programs at a time when their future was seriously threatened by budget cuts. But, both also agree that there's progress still to be made.

"Ultimately, the success of MWR will depend upon how well we continually adapt to the needs and desires of our com-munity. Their support and patronage is crucial," said Skierkowski.

Next week, Hawaii Marine will look at future plans already in the works for MWR programs.

'Buy now, pay later' can bring bad credit blues

The majority of people who have bad credit did not start out looking for it. On the contrary, bad credit is something that just

One day they received their first credit card; The next day they were in debt up over their heads. In today's society of "buy now, pay later", it is more easy than ever to find yourself in debt.

What happens to you once you find yourself in debt? First of all, military personnel could find themselves facing a courtmartial for failure to pay a just debt (take a look at Article 134, Paragraph 71, of the Uniform Code of Military Justice). Although civilians are not faced with a federal criminal convic-tion fer failing to pay their debts, military personnel are. Under this article, the busy Marine shopper could find himself facing shopp could find himself facing a maximum sentence of a bad conduct discharge, forfeiture of all par and allowances and confinement for six months.

Whether or not your command decides to court-martial you, you (the debtor) still face the punish-ments the civilian system has waiting. One of the things the person, to whom you owe money, (the creditor) can do is to report

your inability to pay the amount to a credit bureau. The credit bureau would then relay the information that you have not paid your previous bills to any new creditors, who might be interested in your business. This bad credit would stay on the record for seven years from the date it was reported. Creditors are not very interested in dealing with people who have a bad credit with people who have a bad credit history. This could change your future shopping methods to CASH

Some creditors will then sell Some creditors will then sell your obligation to a collection agency. Although Hawaii has some strict laws controlling the actions of collection agencies, once involved the collection agency becomes a nuisance to you by harassing you at home and at work. You could be subjected to threatening phone calls and letters. Even your commanding officer might receive these notices. Whether or not the collection agency has the right to collection agency has the right to behave in this manner, you are the one who is harassed and embarrassed.

The most drastic step the creditor can take is to take you to court. Once the creditor wins a suit against you for the amount owed, he has what is referred to

as a "judgment" against you. With the judgment in hand, the with the judgment in hand, the creditor then can take several steps. One of which is to attach the judgment to any land or houses that you may own somewhat like having a second for third) mortgage on the property. Before you can own that property out right you will be required to pay off the judgment. If you fail to pay off the judgment, the creditor can foreclose on your home and leave you with nothing. Another thing the creditor can do is to obtain a writ of execution. Once a writ of execution is issued by court, the local sheriff goes to the debtor's home and attaches all personal property (i.e. your clothes, your jewelry, your washing machine, etc.). This property is then taken to a judgment sale. The proceeds first go to pay the expenses of first go to pay the expenses of the sheriff department and the left over proceeds then go to the judgement, the creditor sits around and waits until the debtor has something else of value. At which time, the creditor gets an-other writ of execution. Nor-mally, a judgment is valid for 20 years and in some places they can be "renewed" for up to another 20 years. This means that the creditor merely has to



Legally Speaking

Editor's note: The following article is made-up of excerpts from the Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service (IRS), Your Federal Income Tax. Publication 17, pages 4, 7 and 8. This material was compiled and edited by the Legal Services Center as guidance for filing income tax forms.

Who must file

If you are a citizen or resident of the United States or a resident of Puerto Rico, you must file a federal income tax return if you meet the filing require-ments for any of the following

- Individuals
- Dependents
 Self-Employed Persons
- Surviving Spouses, Execu-ors, Administrators, or Legal
- Representatives
 U.S. Citizens Living Abroad
 Sensidents of Puerto Rico

The filing requirements for these categories apply even if you do not owe tax.

Individuals in general
If you are a U.S. citizen or resident, your filing requirement depends on your gross income, your filing status, and your age. Gross Income includes all income you receive in the form of affiney, goods, property, and services that is not exempt from tax. Filing status is determined as of the last day of your tax year, which is December 31 for most taxpayers.

Filing requirements vary for most taxpayers. Generally, if you are a U.S. citizen or resident, you must file a tax return if your gross income for the year is at least as much as the amount shown for your filing status, age and gross income in the following table.

- For those single and under 5 \$5,300.00
- For those married, filing joint return, with both spouses under 65 9,550.00
- For those not living with spouse at end of year (or on date spouse died) 2,050.00
- . For those married, filing separate return, regardless age - 2,050.00
- For heads of household, under 65 6,800.00

Exceptions

Even if your income is less than the amount shown as your filing requirement, you must file a return if you owe any other taxes, such as:

- · Self-employment tax
- Social security tax
 Alternative minimum tax
 Tax on an IRA

Dependents

If you are a dependent the requirement to file a return depends on:

- · The amount of your earned or unearned income

 The amount of your gross
- (total) income

Tax help

- Whether you are single or married
- Whether you are 65 or older
 Whether you are blind

Responsibility of parent

a dependent child with taxable income cannot file an income tax return, a parent, guardian, or other legally responsible person must file it for the child. If the child cannot sign the return, the filer must sign the child's name followed by the words "By (your signa-fure), parent (or guardian) for minor child."

If a child's tax is not mid, the parent or guardian is liable for the income tax on salaries and wages of the child.

Resident aliens: If you are a resident allen for the entire year, you must file a tax return following the same rules that apply to U.S. citizens.

Nonresident aliens: If you are nonresident alien, the rules and tax forms that apply to you may be different from those that apply to U.S. citizens.

Dual-status taxpayers: If you were a resident alien for part of the tax year and a nonresi-dent alien for the rest of the year, you are a dual-status

taxpayer. Different rules apply for the part of the year you were a resident of the United States and the part of the year you were a nonresident.

Who should file

Even if you are not required to file, you should file a federal

- income tax return if:

 You had income tax with-
- held from your pay

 You qualify for the earned income credit

Which form to use

You must use one of three forms to file your returnForm 1040EZ, Form 1040A, or Form

If you are single, you may be able to use the simpler Form 1040EZ. You can use Form 1040EZ if all of the following

- · Your filing status is single · You are not 65 or older or
- blind
 You do not claim any de-
- Your taxable income is less than \$50,000.00 and is only from wages, salaries, tips, taxable scholarships and fellowships, and interest of \$400,00 or less
- · You do not itemize deductions, claim any adjustments to income or tax credits, receive

advance earned income credit payments, or owe any taxes other than the amount from the Tax Table
If you do not qualify to use

Form 1040EZ, you may be able to use Form 1040A. You can use Form 1040A if:

· Your income is only form wages, salaries, tips, IRA distri-butions, annuities and pensions, social security and railroad retirement henefits, taxable scholarships and fellowships, interest, dividends and unem-

- ployment compensation
 Your taxable income is less than \$50,000.00
- You do not itemize your deductions
 Your only deduction is for
- certain contributions to an IRA

 Your only credits are: the credit for child and dependent care expenses; the credit for the elderly or the disabled; and the earned income credit

If you do not meet all of the above requirements, you may want to claim itemized deductions, which you cannot claim on form 1040A. It may be to your advantage to file Form 1040 instead. You may pay less tax by filing form 1040 because you can take itemized deductions, adjustments to income, and some credits that you cannot take on Form 1040A or Form 1010EZ.





Navajo's troubled past leads him to shining future

As a young boy, he learned to fight for his heritage. As a man, that same drive has propelled him to success as a karate champ, a scholar, a mu-sician and a Marine.

Staff Sergeant Walter "Little Warrior" Hodge, a Navajo Indian from Leesburg, Fla., ramembers the tough years rowing up, but was determined rise above them.

"Because of my family's heri-ige, I chose to wear traditional tage, I chose to wear traditional Navajo clothing, headbands, doccasins and sometimes varior facial paints to school," said Hodge. "The children didn't seem to understand why I bressed that way, so they made fin of me and constantly picked fields with me." fights with me."

Hodge said his karate instructor worked extensively with him to help channel his anger into something positive.

Hodge travelled all over the United States to compete in more than 50 competitions and never lost a match.



USO's 50th anniversary marks history of support

WASHINGTON The United Services Organization celebrates its 50th Anniversary on Feb. 4. Responding to a call for action from President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1941, six nonprofit agencies pooled their resources to form a new organization the USO. The six civilian agencies were the Salvation Army, Young Men's Christian Association, Young Women's Christian Association, National Qatholic Community Services, National Traveler's Aid Association and the National Jewish Welfare Board.

Throughout World War II,
USO was the channel for USO was the channel for community participation in the war effort. In more than 3,000 communities, USO centers were established to become the Gl's "home away from home". Between 1940 and 1944, U.S. Toops grew from 50,000 to 12 pullion and their need for a variety of services grew accordariety of services grew accord-

with the United States entry into the Korean War, USO was on hand here and abroad. The ending of that conflict in 1953 had relatively little effect on decreasing need for USO serv-ices, more than 1 million service them here remained stationed hembers remained stationed plemoers remained stationed gbroad. In the absence of overt conflict, the early 1960s were a difficult time for military person-fiel. The GI had become a forgot-on figure and contributions to

the USO declined. A national ad hoc USO survey committee in 1963 reaffirmed the need for USO, "Not merely during war-time, but perhaps even more during peacetime."

USO played an especially USO played an especially important role for the troops in Vietnam, but in the early 1970s, with the ending of the draft, the question of the USO's mission resurfaced. In 1974 a report of United Way of America's Committee on National Agency Support questioned the need for continued financial support for the USO. United Way of America and 1001) Conducted a major review of USO programs and services. and services.

After making on-site visits to USO operations and milltary bases around the world, committee members concluded, "If there were no USO, another organization would have to be created ... isolation of the military from civilian influences is not, we believe, in the interest of this nation".

The study launched USO into a new era of peacetime service to the all-volunteer force. USO international headquarters was relocated from New York to Washington, D.C., and the USO was firmly established as an international agency serving the nation's armed forces around the global the globe.







K-Bay boxers slug way to top

Two Air Station Marine boxers

A local fighter by the name
of Joe Fredrico stood in Young's

"The first time I fought Joe "The first time I fought Joe he used his aggressive style of boxing and I tried to keep up with him," said Young. "The fight came down to a decision luckily I won. The second time I fought him, I took the fight to him. I stopped him in the second round."

Young, who dropped from featherweight to Bantam-weight, is confident he will take his weight class at the nutionals, but feels he must stay focused.

"There's a number of fights I must win before I actually fight for the national title," said Young. "I can't Just think about one fight."

That one fight he was talking about is with Sergio Reyes a Marine boxer said to be the world's best amateur Bantam-

"I think I'm one of the top fighters in the nation in my

weight class," said Young. "I know I will face him in the nationals. I'm ready physically and mentally."

The other half of the Kaneohebased Marine duo is Jones. Jones, attached to Brigade Service Support Detachment (BSSI)) is no newcomer to the boxing ring either. Having proved himself in the civilian arena by winning several local bouts, including the U.S. Amateur Boxing Championships in Waianae, he feels he is seasoned and ready for the title shot.

Jones has also fought on the All-Marine Boxing team as a 178-pound light heavyweight. He was also victorious in his fight at BYU. But, this win was quite different from Young's.

His fight was going to be against Edwin Troyloli, another local fighter from Hawaii. Once again, this was to be a rematch between the two.

In the state championships, Jones handily defeated Troyloli and was named "Outstanding Boxer." When the Hawaii regionals at BYU came around, an unexpected twist came with it for Jones.

According to Jones, Troyloli refused to fight him.

"He (Troyloli) came up to me and said he didn't want to fight me, because I would probably beat him again anyway," said Jones. Jones, quite amused about the whole deal, figured it was in Troyloli's best interest also.

Jones, who has been fighting for five years now, says he's very appreciative to the Marine Corps for allowing him to pursue his quest for hoxing.

"I'm dedicating my national hout to all of the Marines fighting in Operation Desert Storm," said Jones, "They are the real fighters and deserve all the glory."

Controlling game's pace is critical to both teams

The Bills and Glants have reached Super Bowl XXV by perfecting very different styles, and the winner may well be the team that gets over its big-game jitters and into character first.

What's scary about this game is that it could be decided in the first 15 minutes of the contest.

Buffalo's no-huddle offense gave both the Dolphins and Raiders fits, amassing 95 points in the two playoff games. Bills quarter-back Jim Kelly, in particular, has been on fire lately.

In the team's 51-3

conference championship victory over the Raiders last week, he completed 17 of 23 passes for 300 yards and two touchdowns.

If the Giants defense comes out tight, it could mean another offensive barrage by the Bills.
Look for Kelly to go deep early and test the Giants' secondary.

The Giants, on the other hand, will try to avoid a shoot-out by using ball control. They mixed the run and pass well in their 15-13 conference champion-ship victory over San Francisco last week, winning the battle of time possession 39 minutes to the 49ers' 21.

Giants' backup quarterback Jeff Hostetler, who's done a nice job filling in for the injured Phil Simms, is the key for New York's offense. So far in the playoffs, he's completed 25 of 44 passes for 293 yards, with two touchdowns

His strengths appear to be his ability to play error-free ball and avoid the rush, which has sustained many drives.

and no interceptions.

If New York keeps the score low and the ball out of Kelly's hands, Super Bowl XXV could be a "Giant success."

But the oddsmakers haven't been on the mark in the games leading up to the Super Bowl. The Bills were favored by seven points in their championship game against the Los Angeles Raiders, and the Glants were dismissed by many so-called experts as eight-point underdogs to the three-peat minded San Francisco 49ers

The Bills made all of their supporters look like geniuses when they demolished the Raiders, making the boys in silver and black look about as menacing as a bunch of Camp Fire Girls.


The Glants, incensed by rumors of their opponents already setting up camp in Tampa, proved just how wrong their detractors were when they defeated the 49ers.

The result is an all-East Coast match-up, which features two teams that routinely play in inclement weather meeting in the heart of the sunshine state for the football world championship.

The Giants have the second-ranked team in total defense along with being the eighth-best offensive team in the league. The Bills counter that by being ranked sixth in offense and eighth in defense.

Statistically speaking, the Bills have a slight edge on the offensive side of the line of scrimmage. But both defenses are strong.

The Giants ranked second in the league in total defense, giving up an average of 262.9 yards per game. The eighth-ranked Bills,

Coaches predict who will win

To find out what knowledgeable local football fans expect from the all-New York match-up in Super Bowl XXV, sports editor Edward McLaurin and sports writer Bill Mossman contacted four varsity high school football coaches from the Sun Press distribution areas for their opinions. Following are their comments on Sunday's big game.

Mark Kane - Castle

Mark Kane, Castle's varsity football coach. predicts a Super Bowl win by the New York Giants. Even with a back-up quarterback at the helm, Kane said, the Giants still should have the edge over the Bills.

"New York's got the defense and the experience to win the Super Bowl," he said. "Listen, if they can take it away from the 49ers, they can beat Buffalo.

"Plus, the momentum off the 49er game should help them," Kane added. "It'll be close, though."

Alex Kane - Kailua

Alex Kane of Kallua said he thinks defense will be the deciding factor, and New York will prevail because it will shut down the Buffalo passing and running aftack much better than the Raiders did. But Kane said he also doesn't expect a runaway.

"The Giants will win because of their de-fense," he said. "It's hard for anyone to move the ball consistently against them, and the Bills won't have as easy a time moving the ball as they did against the Raiders.

"I think the final score will be close, with the Giants winning by a field goal."

Darryl Smith - Kalaheo

Kalaheo head football coach Darryl Smith also expects a close game but with Buffalo on the winning end. Smith said the Bills' brawny quarterback and hurry-up

offense will make the difference.

They're both good teams, but I'm going with the Bills," he said. "It'll probably be a close game, but maybe Buffalo's no-huddle offense will confuse the Giant's defense.

'I also like quarterback Jim Kelly. He's built like a linebacker, but plays offense."

Gary Clark — Leilehua

Leilehua varsity coach Gary Clark said he believes the Super Bowl XXV victory will go to the Giants - and It won't be all that close. New York's seasoned veterans will draw on past Super Bowl experience to blunt Buffalo's

bid for a win, Clark said.
"I like the Giants, because they've been there before. Plus, they're a veteran team coming off a big win.

"The question for Buffalo Is: Can they do it again? (A 51thrashing of the Raiders.) I don't think so. I think the Giants will win by two touchdowns."
