## Desert Shield gusts into Storm

Marines and sailors here, as well as the families of those who've been deployed to Saudi Arabia, have watched closely over the past week as Operation Desert Storm has unfolded.

Wednesday morning, Defense Secretary Dick Cheney and Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Gen. Colin Powell summed up the first week of operations during a press conference at the Pentagon.

This briefing came one week after President George Bush

addressed the nation from the Oval Office to announce what he termed as the beginning of military operations to "liberate Kuwait."

The president said that evening that five months before, Saddam Hussein had started "this cruel war" against Kuwait; and now the battle to end the aggression had been joined by U.S. and allied forces.

"This military action, taken in accord with United Nations Resolutions and with the consent of the United States Congress, follows months of constant and virtually endless

diplomatic activity on the part of the United Nations, the United States and many, many other countries."

"Now, the 28 countries with forces in the Gulf area have no choice but to drive Saddam from Kuwait by force."

Doing this, Cheney explained Wednesday, will not be easy. "The Iraqis and Saddam Hussein have a very large military force. Depending upon what criteria you use, certainly one of the largest in the world. Some have said the fourth largest in the world."

Earlier Wednesday, Vice

President Dan Quayle, while addressing servicemen and their families at Mayport Naval Station, Fla., addressed the task of winning the war.

"In 1930, Winston Churchill said, 'never, never, never, believe any war will be smooth and easy.' That was good advice then, and it's good advice today," Quayle said.

"I wish I could tell you that this will be easily won, but I can't," Quayle said. "I wish I could tell you that your loved ones will be home tomorrow, but I can't."

He said he could, however,

guarantee that allied troops would be allowed to do the job they're capable of.

"No one will be asked to fight with one hand tied behind their back in this war. This will not be another Vietnam. Allied forces will prevail," he added.

These words reiterated words President Bush had used in his speech the week before.

"Prior to ordering our forces into battle," Bush said, "I instructed our military commanders to take every necessary step to prevail as quickly as possible and with the greatest degree of protection possible

for American and allied servicemen and women.

Using a comprehensive battle plan, explained Cheney, U.S. and allied forces began the operation Jan. 16 with a massive air assault to weaken Hussein's military force and to go after his offensive military capability. Cheney explained, however, that this can't be done completely in one week. It is an ongoing operation. More than 12,000 sorties have been flown, and allied forces have met with much success.

## Terrorism: Keep eyes, ears open

The plea by Iraqi leader Saddam Hussein that all terrorists strike out at American and allied interests has made anti-terrorism an immediate international issue.

As a result, American military installations world-wide are tightening the screws on security, as are all facets of the nation's multi-levelled anti-terrorism network.

According to 1stLt. James Byrne, Provost Marshal's Office operations officer, individual Marines and their families should be aware of individual protective measures.

A recently published memorandum from the Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, outlines individual anti-terrorism measures. Some of the information provided is detailed below.

While it is impossible for individuals to stop terrorists from seeking targets to further their cause, people can make themselves a less likely target by taking certain precautions.

Usually terrorist attacks occur while the victim is travelling to or from work, or is at work. This does not mean, however, that military personnel or their families would not be targeted in their homes, or in their social and recreational environment.

Each family member should be familiar with basic security procedures and techniques.

Travel safety tips:

• Attempt to blend into your surroundings.

• Keep information about your home, car, family, security efforts and activities known only by the immediate family, friends and security personnel, and only on a need to know basis.

• Avoid routines while traveling.

• When possible, travel in groups.

• Avoid isolated roads, danger areas, civil disturbances and crowds.

• Be alert and note anyone who appears to be following. Do not antagonize the individual; quickly move to a safe haven and report the incident.

• Keep emergency numbers handy.

• Keep your command and family aware of your whereabouts.

• Always keep your vehicle in good mechanical condition and your gas tank at least half full.

• Drive with car doors locked, windows closed, and secure your car when unattended.

• Never pick up hitchhikers or strangers.

• Memorize the location of safe havens along your regular routes. Police and fire stations, or any busy place, are excellent havens.

• Do not stop for accidents or other problems if you suspect the incident is a ruse. Drive away to a phone and call for assistance.

• Always use seat belts.

• On multi-lane highways, drive in the center lane to make it more difficult to force your car to the curb.

• Avoid driving close behind other vehicles or in any situation where you can be boxed in.

• If you must leave your car keys with an attendant, leave only the ignition key.

## Families advised about media

With the Gulf crisis now a full-fledged war, families of deployed Marines and sailors have become increasingly desirable interview subjects for newspaper, radio and television journalists.

In past months, some Air Station family members have agreed to interviews once, only to find themselves the targets of continual media requests afterwards.

While family members are free to speak to the media, they also

have the right to turn down interview requests. While the media's interest is understandable, family members have a right to privacy and to courteous treatment by journalists.

If you wish to be interviewed by the media, the Joint Public Affairs Office recommends following certain guidelines to ensure you aren't misused. These tips include:

• Media members are not authorized aboard the Air Station

without the Public Affairs Officer's approval and an escort. If approached by an unescorted journalist, immediately contact JPAO before agreeing to be interviewed.

• All interviews with the media should be coordinated through JPAO, which can provide guidance.

• Speak from personal experience only. Don't speak about military policies or views.

• Don't speak for "everyone." Clearly present yourself as some

one who can relay personal experiences as a family member, not as a "family member spokesperson."

• Keep privileged correspondence or conversation to yourself.

• Don't speculate. Steer clear of all "what if" questions.

To contact the JPAO, call 257-5728, 5742 or 1348 during normal working hours. After working hours, you can call the Station Officer of the Day at 257-1823, or the Brigade Officer of the Day at 257-1290.

doors and the garage closed and locked.

- Keep all accessible windows closed and locked.
- Keep house keys separate from car keys and maintain accountability.
- Change locks if keys are compromised.
- Never open doors to unscheduled repairmen or strangers.
- Verify all repair and delivery men when not recognized.
- Do not accept unsolicited packages.
- Don't talk to prank callers as it only encourages them.

- Develop a family dress code, so that family members can warn each other when they are in danger.
- Brief all family members thoroughly on emergency procedures.

Be suspicious and inquisitive about:

- Strangers, especially those carrying suitcases or other containers.
- Unidentified vehicles around the installation or your home.
- Abandoned parcels or suitcases or any unusual activity.
- Unexpected or peculiar deliveries or service people coming to your house.
- Strangers taking pictures or using video equipment from unlikely vantage points and/or focusing on high value terrorist targets.
- People wearing unusually heavy or bulky clothing.

A package or letter should be treated as suspect in the following circumstances:

- No return address.
- Excessive postage.

• Mailed from a foreign country.

- Badly typed or written.
- Misspelled words.
- Addressed to title only.
- Wrong title or name.
- Restrictive markings, such as For Eyes Only or Personal.
- Rigid or bulky.
- Lopsided.
- Oily stains on the wrapping.
- Protruding wires.
- Strange almond-like odor.
- Irregular shape, soft spots, or bulges.
- Buzzing or ticking noise or a sloshing sound.

• If you have any reason to believe a letter or parcel is suspicious, don't open the article. Leave the immediate area and call the local police department (military police on Station) for assistance.

Special considerations for children:

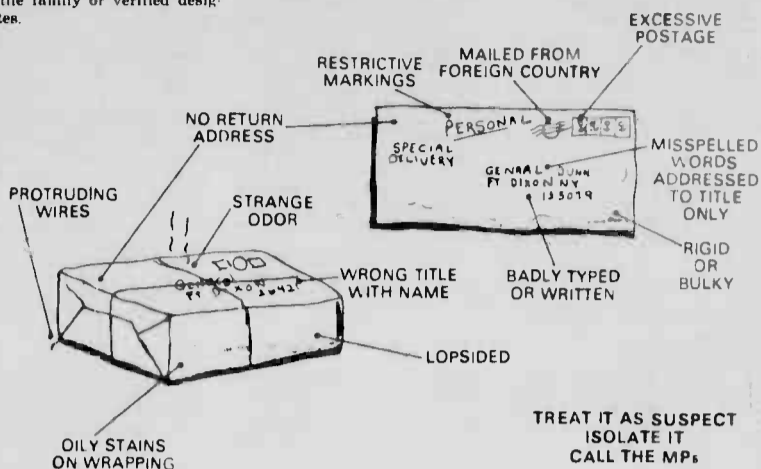
- Advise them to avoid isolated streets and strangers, to travel and play in groups and to keep family members informed of their whereabouts.
- Ensure that school officials will only release your children to responsible known members of the family or verified designates.

- Do not permit your children to ride public transportation alone.
- Have children escorted to and from school if possible.
- Never leave young children at home unattended.

If you observe these simple

precautions, the chance of being selected as a victim are said to be greatly reduced. Look at it like this:

"When you are hungry, it is foolish to hunt a tiger when there are plenty of sheep to be had."

drawn up set of military targets that forces will continue to go after over the course of the next several days and weeks.

"We started knocking out command and control, with his communications facilities, his air defense units and radars, his airfields, and his Scud missile launchers," Cheney said. "We've gone after the factories where Iraq has produced chemical and biological weapons, and until recently where they've continued working on nuclear weapons. We've also gone after the mainstay of Saddam's land forces, the Republican Guard units located near the Iraqi-Kuwaiti border."

Cheney said these are all predetermined targets and great care has gone into ensuring that weapons are fired only on these targets under the correct conditions.

"Based on the reports we're getting from our pilots and the evidence of gun camera recordings, the bombing missions are going well," Cheney said.

He cautioned the media, however, that a military operation of this complexity and intensity "can not be scored every evening like a college track meet or basketball tournament."

"We want to be certain that we don't rush down (to press briefings) with premature words of success. We are deliberately waiting until we have some confidence in the results of specific categories of targets."

Cheney warned that Hussein and his terrorist and military capabilities should not be underestimated.

"But he can not change the basic course of the conflict. He will be defeated," Cheney added.

Cheney began his briefing by expressing words of thanks and

encouragement to the men and women of the Armed Forces currently serving in the gulf.

"We all feel a great deal of pride in the men and women of our Armed Forces that are carrying out these operations. It is an extremely complex and often dangerous undertaking and they have our admiration and our gratitude."

In the closing remarks of his speech, President Bush said: "To everyone listening or watching tonight: When the troops we've sent in finish their work, I'm determined to bring them home as soon as possible. Tonight, as our forces fight, they and their families are in our prayers."

"May God bless each and every one of them and the coalition forces at our side in the Gulf, and may he continue to bless our Nation, the United States of America."

# Morale, Welfare, Recreation lives up to its name

It is perhaps an unusual concept, but there's a definite business to maintaining military morale. If one phrase could sum it up, that would have to be "Morale, Welfare and Recreation."

Anyone who's been around a Marine Corps installation long enough to see the sun go down has undoubtedly dealt with at least some aspect of the morale machine.

That's because MWR, the abbreviation for Morale, Welfare and Recreation, encompasses just about every aspect of leisure activities aboard Navy and Marine bases and stations.

Imagine if a major department store, yacht club, fitness centers, convenience stores, restaurants, a child care center and some club organizations joined forces with the parks and recreation division of a local community. While unheard of in the "civilian world," this peculiar team would just begin to resemble MWR.

MWR has not always been a combined team of diverse activities. The consolidation of morale efforts aboard military installa-

tions has only come about over the past three years. This Air Station began its transformation only a year and a half ago.

Time was when all recreation activities such as athletics and youth recreation were an organization unto themselves. In those days, recreation activities received a great deal of funding from Congress.

Several services and goods which now come with a price used to be free. When the military budget axe began to swing in the late 1980s, however, recreation lost its arms and legs.

Congress told the armed services that the only way to save their recreation programs, as well as other quality of life activities, was to start operating in a business-like manner.

That caused the military minds at Headquarters Marine Corps to establish MWR. It was based on the logic that through consolidation, operating costs would be decreased and money making operations such as exchanges could be used to help support the non-money makers like organized athletics programs; thus keeping the cost to Marines to a minimum.

While all Corps-wide MWR activities are linked to Headquarters Marine Corps' MWR Support Activity, the individual

bases and stations are in a sense franchised. This is to say that they are locally run by the installation commander, not Headquarters Marine Corps. Additionally, each installation is responsible for generating the majority of its own funds.

"The object of consolidation is to provide the installation commanders with the ways and means to earn revenues required to operate recreation activities," said a spokesman for the MWR Support Activity.

Air Station Commander Col. R.H. Critser, said this consolidation has been a godsend for Kaneohe Bay.

"You have to make use of the assets available to you locally in a business-like manner, because the funds aren't there otherwise," Critser said. "I think we've done a pretty good job so far and things will probably improve as the system matures."

As the station commander, Critser maintains overall control of MWR, although it is directed by Walter Skierkowski, a retired serviceman. Skierkowski has nearly 1,000 employees who make up his morale team. These people hold jobs ranging from cooks to caretakers and from managers to marketing directors. The people behind the scenes are as diverse as MWR itself.

It is these people that make the business run. MWR is indeed that a business. But it is a business with the unique mission of improving community services.

All told, Kaneohe's MWR is a \$50 million business annually. Profits from retail and service sales disappear quickly into the overall operating budget, however, explained Skierkowski. Most goes into recreation services.

Additionally, with so many Marines and sailors currently deployed, sales are way down, he said, and MWR is feeling the pinch.

"This Christmas season was tough on a lot of American businesses because of talk about a recession. We were further affected by a big reduction in our clientele," Skierkowski said.

Many Marines may have noticed that over the past couple years, the percentage of savings at exchanges are less in relation to civilian competition. Skierkowski said this is because profits from the exchange are used to support recreation activities for Marines that would otherwise disappear.

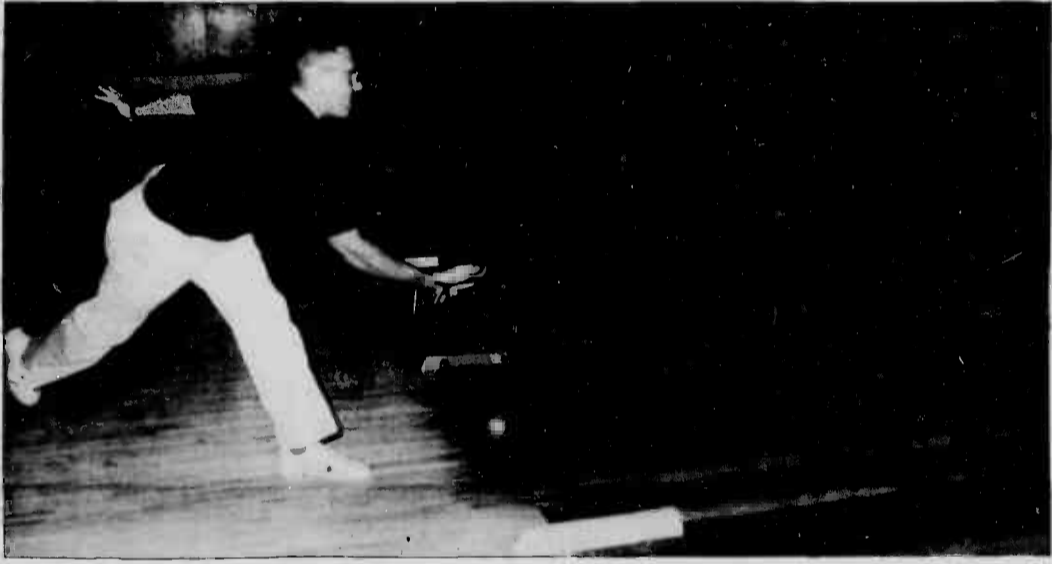
While prices may have gone up in some cases, a Corps-wide MWR survey suggests that exchanges still offer the best

MWR/From A-4 buy. According to the survey, which compared 225 items against the lowest priced civilian competition, exchange items were an average of 14 to 15 percent lower once state sales tax was added to products at civilian stores.

Skierkowski pointed out that in addition to the savings at the exchanges, patrons are also contributing to programs that directly enhance their own community because much of the profits support recreation and service programs.

While much of the appropriated (Congressional) funds supporting leisure activities were cut in the late-'80s, some appropriated funding remains. These funds must be used for the specific purpose intended. In most cases, such funding only partially pays for the activity it supports. Remaining overhead comes out of MWR's budget from locally generated funds.

As Skierkowski explained, local funds are generated in a variety of ways. Primarily, these funds come from retail sales and service charges at various activities. Additionally, funding is raised through K-Bay's

recycling efforts and through business sponsorship.

Susan Miles, MWR director of marketing, explained that coordinating sponsors is an ongoing and demanding job. Sponsorship does not pay for daily activities, but rather special events such as the Windward Community Family Festival and Santa's Village.

"We couldn't possibly hold such high quality special events here without the support of sponsors, so we are always very grateful for their help," Miles said.

Skierkowski and Critser both expressed the belief that the creation of MWR is responsible for saving morale programs at a time when their future was seriously threatened by budget cuts. But, both also agree that there's progress still to be made.

"Ultimately, the success of MWR will depend upon how well we continually adapt to the needs and desires of our community. Their support and patronage is crucial," said Skierkowski.

Next week, *Hawaii Marine* will look at future plans already in the works for MWR programs.

# 'Buy now, pay later' can bring bad credit blues

The majority of people who have bad credit did not start out looking for it. On the contrary, bad credit is something that just happened.

One day they received their first credit card; The next day they were in debt up over their heads. In today's society of "buy now, pay later", it is more easy than ever to find yourself in debt.

What happens to you once you find yourself in debt? First of all, military personnel could find themselves facing a courtmartial for failure to pay a just debt (take a look at Article 134, Paragraph 71, of the Uniform Code of Military Justice). Although civilians are not faced with a federal criminal conviction for failing to pay their debts, military personnel are. Under this article, the busy Marine shopper could find himself facing a maximum sentence of a bad conduct discharge, forfeiture of all pay and allowances and confinement for six months.

Whether or not your command decides to court-martial you, you (the debtor) still face the punishments the civilian system has waiting. One of the things the person, to whom you owe money, (the creditor) can do is to report

your inability to pay the amount to a credit bureau. The credit bureau would then relay the information that you have not paid your previous bills to any new creditors, who might be interested in your business. This bad credit would stay on the record for seven years from the date it was reported. Creditors are not very interested in dealing with people who have a bad credit history. This could change your future shopping methods to CASH only.

Some creditors will then sell your obligation to a collection agency. Although Hawaii has some strict laws controlling the actions of collection agencies, once involved the collection agency becomes a nuisance to you by harassing you at home and at work. You could be subjected to threatening phone calls and letters. Even your commanding officer might receive these notices. Whether or not the collection agency has the right to behave in this manner, you are the one who is harassed and embarrassed.

The most drastic step the creditor can take is to take you to court. Once the creditor wins a suit against you for the amount owed, he has what is referred to

as a "judgment" against you. With the judgment in hand, the creditor then can take several steps. One of which is to attach the judgment to any land or houses that you may own -- somewhat like having a second (or third) mortgage on the property. Before you can own that property out right you will be required to pay off the judgment. If you fail to pay off the judgment, the creditor can foreclose on your home and leave you with nothing. Another thing the creditor can do is to obtain a writ of execution. Once a writ of execution is issued by court, the local sheriff goes to the debtor's home and attaches all personal property (i.e. your clothes, your jewelry, your washing machine, etc.). This property is then taken to a judgment sale. The proceeds first go to pay the expenses of the sheriff department and the left over proceeds then go to the judgement, the creditor sits around and waits until the debtor has something else of value. At which time, the creditor gets another writ of execution. Normally, a judgment is valid for 20 years and in some places they can be "renewed" for up to another 20 years. This means that the creditor merely has to wait for you to come into some money.

# Navajo's troubled past leads him to shining future

As a young boy, he learned to fight for his heritage. As a man, that same drive has propelled him to success as a karate champ, a scholar, a musician and a Marine.

Staff Sergeant Walter "Little Warrior" Hodge, a Navajo Indian from Leesburg, Fla., remembers the tough years growing up, but was determined to rise above them.

"Because of my family's heritage, I chose to wear traditional Navajo clothing, headbands, moccasins and sometimes warrior facial paints to school," said Hodge. "The children didn't seem to understand why I dressed that way, so they made fun of me and constantly picked fights with me."

Hodge said although he was only about six years old and small for his age at the time, he felt fighting was wrong, but was compelled to defend himself so he took karate lessons.

Hodge said his karate instructor worked extensively with him to help channel his anger into something positive.

"After I got my black belt, I understood what the art was all about and used it only as a means of self-defense but I knew how far to go with it," Hodge said. "I loved school and was determined that I wasn't going to get bullied out of a good education."

Hodge travelled all over the United States to compete in more than 50 competitions and never lost a match.

Hodge, a 1981 graduate of Bethune Cookman College in Daytona Beach, Fla., has various degrees of belts in several styles of self-defense. All of his military ranks in the U.S. Marine Corps have been meritorious promotions.

Reflecting back on his accomplishments, Hodge said throughout his life, he worked long hours at odd jobs to help pay for his education, and studied hard to assure himself of a secure future.

Hodge graduated from Leesburg Senior High in 1976 and entered Bethune Cookman College on a partial music scholarship, where he minored in music performance and majored in secondary education as a music teacher.

Hodge also found time to work for the Volusia County School Board near his college, where he taught 8th and 9th graders from 1979-81.

"I was lucky that I had understanding parents," Hodge said. "They were always there in case I ever needed them."

After graduating from college with a Bachelor of Arts degree in music, Hodge joined the Marine Corps in December 1981 under the Delayed Entry Program.

Hodge reported to boot camp at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C. during January 1982 where he was assigned to Platoon 1014.

Once again, Hodge displayed his versatile demeanor.

While participating in the Confidence Course, Hodge observed a fellow recruit falling from the A-frame. Without regard for his own safety, Hodge caught the recruit, but received a hairline fracture in his left leg.

With a determination to become a Marine, Hodge fought back.

"I didn't let the doctors or my drill instructors know how sick

I was," said Hodge. "I started a personal exercise program, endured the pain and was later returned to my original platoon in the 1st Battalion."

Hodge continued on his road to excellence when he graduated from boot camp as a meritorious private first class. He was then assigned to Postal School in the Defense Information School at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind.

After completion of the school, he was sent to the 3rd Force Service Support Group on Okinawa, Japan, where he spent his first eight months on field exercises in Korea where he was meritoriously promoted to lance corporal.

In 1983, Hodge reported to Camp Lejeune, N.C. as a postal clerk, and about three months later, was meritoriously promoted to the rank of corporal.

A year later, Hodge was meritoriously promoted to sergeant and received a certificate of commendation and numerous letters of appreciation for his leadership and devotion to his duties.

During May 1986, Hodge received orders to the Drill Instructor School at Parris Island.

Although he worked long hours on the Drill Field, Hodge still found time off-duty to complete Marine Corps Institute Correspondence Courses in the Staff Noncommissioned Officers Career Course, The Basic School, Amphibious Warfare School and the Command and Staff College.

For his "leadership by example" and hard work, Hodge was meritoriously promoted to staff sergeant in 1988 and was sent to the Staff Noncommissioned Officers Academy at Quantico, Va.

Hodge reported here during August, 1989 as the SNCO in

charge of Unit One Post Office at the Main Exchange area. After units here deployed to Operation Desert Shield, Hodge was assigned to run the Parent Finance Section at the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade Main Post Office here during November 1989. He was later designated the custodian of postal effects during March 1990, where he keeps track of all monetary and other postal transactions.

"With so many people deployed to the Middle East, the workload has been great, but we work as a team and do what we must to keep the mission going," said Hodge.

# USO's 50th anniversary marks history of support

WASHINGTON The United Services Organization celebrates its 50th Anniversary on Feb. 4.

Responding to a call for action from President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1941, six nonprofit agencies pooled their resources to form a new organization the USO. The six civilian agencies were the Salvation Army, Young Men's Christian Association, Young Women's Christian Association, National Catholic Community Services, National Traveler's Aid Association and the National Jewish Welfare Board.

Throughout World War II, USO was the channel for community participation in the war effort. In more than 3,000 communities, USO centers were established to become the GI's "home away from home". Between 1940 and 1944, U.S. Troops grew from 50,000 to 12 million and their need for a variety of services grew accordingly.

With the United States entry into the Korean War, USO was on hand here and abroad. The ending of that conflict in 1953 had relatively little effect on decreasing need for USO services, more than 1 million service members remained stationed abroad. In the absence of overt conflict, the early 1960s were a difficult time for military personnel. The GI had become a forgotten figure and contributions to

the USO declined. A national ad hoc USO survey committee in 1963 reaffirmed the need for USO, "Not merely during wartime, but perhaps even more during peacetime."

USO played an especially important role for the troops in Vietnam, but in the early 1970s, with the ending of the draft, the question of the USO's mission resurfaced. In 1974 a report of United Way of America's Committee on National Agency Support questioned the need for continued financial support for the USO. United Way of America and DOI) Conducted a major review of USO programs and services.

After making on-site visits to USO operations and military bases around the world, committee members concluded, "If there were no USO, another organization would have to be created... isolation of the military from civilian influences is not, we believe, in the interest of this nation".

The study launched USO into a new era of peacetime service to the all-volunteer force. USO international headquarters was relocated from New York to Washington, D.C., and the USO was firmly established as an international agency serving the nation's armed forces around the globe.

As the 1980s unfolded, the composition of the U.S. armed

forces changed dramatically - no longer single and male, but male and female, young and married. More than 54 percent of today's military service members are between 18 and 25 and are married with children. They must handle frequent moves and long separations, often in isolated areas with or without their families on hand where they face the problems of culture shock, loneliness and lack of adequate on-base housing.

USO continues its close association with military leadership. This cooperation was re-emphasized in 1987 with the signing of new memorandum of understanding between the USO and DoD. The agreement names USO as a principal channel representing civilian concern for the U.S. armed forces worldwide, under the auspices of the President of the United States and the Secretary of Defense. It authorizes USO to play an active role in coordinating local civilian community resources and fostering general civilian interest in the welfare of armed forces personnel and their families.

Now operating at more than 160 locations overseas and stateside, USO continues to help bridge the differences between the military and civilian host community, fostering relations that reflect positively on all levels of community life.

# Hawaii Marines pass deployment 'gut check'

Saudi Arabia Flexibility and the ability to work with others are probably the two most important attributes of good Marines. Both require discipline and individual sacrifices for the good of the team.

Recently the Hawaii Marines of Brigade Service Support Group-1 had a chance to put these attributes to test when they were tasked to composite into 1st Force Service Support Group.

It was "gut check" time for the BSSG Marines and sailors in a dynamic, stressful environment. As soon as they landed, they received word they would be used to round out the 1st FSSG instead of being employed as a unit. It was a time for team players.

"Even though this was not the way we expected to be employed, everyone understood the necessity of compositing," said Lt. Col. Ernest Beinhardt, commanding officer of BSSG-1. "We knew that the best way to validate the BSSG and the MEB was to be the best team players

we could be, and we talked about that.

"I just have a tremendous sense of pride in the Marines and sailors who came here under very difficult circumstances and made a textbook (MPS) offload and composited," Beinhardt said.

Although challenged by the situation, the BSSG Marines and sailors are now an integral part of the system that supports Marines units across the vast desert kingdom.

Sgt. Lloyd Williams was the orders chief for the 1,000 Marines and sailors of BSSG. Now he is personnel chief and platoon sergeant in the Corps' largest consolidated administration office.

"It's a challenge," said Williams, "but it's exciting too.

We're doing something that's never been done before and I'm a part of it. I learn something new every day." Williams leads a platoon of 40 Marines and is responsible for more than 5,000 service record books. BSSG-1 Marines' impact is apparent at all 1st FSSG combat service support detachments. At

CSSD-111 in northern Saudi Arabia, supply chief Sgt. Jose Maldonado is responsible for keeping 34 different units of the 1st Marine Division moving with parts and supplies. Maldonado joined BSSG-1 from 1st MEB headquarters for Operation Desert Shield.

"We came in here not knowing each other, but it's working out pretty well," Maldonado said. "This is a good job because it's really teaching me a lot."

Cpl. Dennis Baker, a motor transport mechanic at CSSD-111, likes his job in the larger FSSG because of the volume and level of work.

I normally do mostly second echelon repairs," said Baker, who now repairs vehicles from all 1st Marine Division units. "Out here we get to do a lot more third echelon work because there's so much of it."

"Everywhere you go around here you'll find Hawaii Marines," Beinhardt said. "We would love nothing more than to go home with our colors out in front of us on parade. It was a great unit and it will be again."

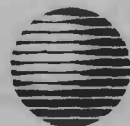

# K-Bay boxers slug way to top

Two Air Station Marine boxers have been invited to fight at the Amateur Boxing Federation National Championships March 2, at the Olympic Training Village in Colorado Springs, Colo. But the road to the nationals wasn't an easy one.  
Mark Young and Creinsaw Jones, both members of the Kaneohe Boxing Club, had to first make it through a host of talented boxers here in Hawaii. Two of many obstacles they faced were the Hawaii ABF State Championships Dec. 20-22 and the Hawaii Region 13 tournament Jan. 12 at BYU-Hawaii University.  
Young, a 119-pound Bantam-weight from Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron Ordnance, blazed through the state championships and the BYU-Hawaii box-off. At BYU, 24 of the best amateur boxers in the state of Hawaii were gunning for a shot at the big times.  
A local fighter by the name of Joe Fredrico stood in Young's

path to the nationals. This wasn't the first time these two have met in the ring.  
"The first time I fought Joe he used his aggressive style of boxing and I tried to keep up with him," said Young. "The fight came down to a decision luckily I won. The second time I fought him, I took the fight to him. I stopped him in the second round."  
Young, who dropped from featherweight to Bantam-weight, is confident he will take his weight class at the nationals, but feels he must stay focused.  
"There's a number of fights I must win before I actually fight for the national title," said Young. "I can't just think about one fight."  
That one fight he was talking about is with Sergio Reyes a Marine boxer said to be the world's best amateur Bantam-weight.  
"I think I'm one of the top fighters in the nation in my

weight class," said Young. "I know I will face him in the nationals. I'm ready physically and mentally."  
The other half of the Kaneohe-based Marine duo is Jones. Jones, attached to Brigade Service Support Detachment (BSSD) is no newcomer to the boxing ring either. Having proved himself in the civilian arena by winning several local bouts, including the U.S. Amateur Boxing Championships in Waianae, he feels he is seasoned and ready for the title shot.  
Jones has also fought on the All-Marine Boxing team as a 178-pound light heavyweight. He was also victorious in his fight at BYU. But, this win was quite different from Young's.  
His fight was going to be against Edwin Troyloli, another local fighter from Hawaii. Once again, this was to be a rematch between the two.

In the state championships, Jones handily defeated Troyloli and was named "Outstanding Boxer." When the Hawaii regionals at BYU came around, an unexpected twist came with it for Jones.  
According to Jones, Troyloli refused to fight him.  
"He (Troyloli) came up to me and said he didn't want to fight me, because I would probably beat him again anyway," said Jones. Jones, quite amused about the whole deal, figured it was in Troyloli's best interest also.  
Jones, who has been fighting for five years now, says he's very appreciative to the Marine Corps for allowing him to pursue his quest for boxing.  
"I'm dedicating my national bout to all of the Marines fighting in Operation Desert Storm," said Jones. "They are the real fighters and deserve all the glory."

## Controlling game's pace is critical to both teams

The Bills and Giants have reached Super Bowl XXV by perfecting very different styles, and the winner may well be the team that gets over its big-game jitters and into character first.

What's scary about this game is that it could be decided in the first 15 minutes of the contest.

Buffalo's no-huddle offense gave both the Dolphins and Raiders fits, amassing 95 points in the two playoff games. Bills quarterback Jim Kelly, in particular, has been on fire lately.

In the team's 51-3

conference championship victory over the Raiders last week, he completed 17 of 23 passes for 300 yards and two touchdowns.

If the Giants defense comes out tight, it could mean another offensive barrage by the Bills. Look for Kelly to go deep early and test the Giants' secondary.

The Giants, on the other hand, will try to avoid a shoot-out by using ball control. They mixed the run and pass well in their 15-13 conference championship victory over San Francisco last week, winning the battle of time possession 39 minutes to the 49ers' 21.

Giants' backup quarterback Jeff Hostetler,

who's done a nice job filling in for the injured Phil Simms, is the key for New York's offense. So far in the playoffs, he's completed 25 of 44 passes for 293 yards, with two touchdowns and no interceptions.

His strengths appear to be his ability to play error-free ball and avoid the rush, which has sustained many drives.

If New York keeps the score low and the ball out of Kelly's hands, Super Bowl XXV could be a "Giant success."

But the oddsmakers haven't been on the mark in the games leading up to the Super Bowl. The Bills were favored by seven points in their championship game against the Los Angeles Raiders, and the Giants were dismissed by many so-called experts as eight-point underdogs to the three-peat minded San Francisco 49ers.

The Bills made all of their supporters look like geniuses when they demolished the Raiders, making the boys in silver and black look about as menacing as a bunch of Camp Fire Girls.

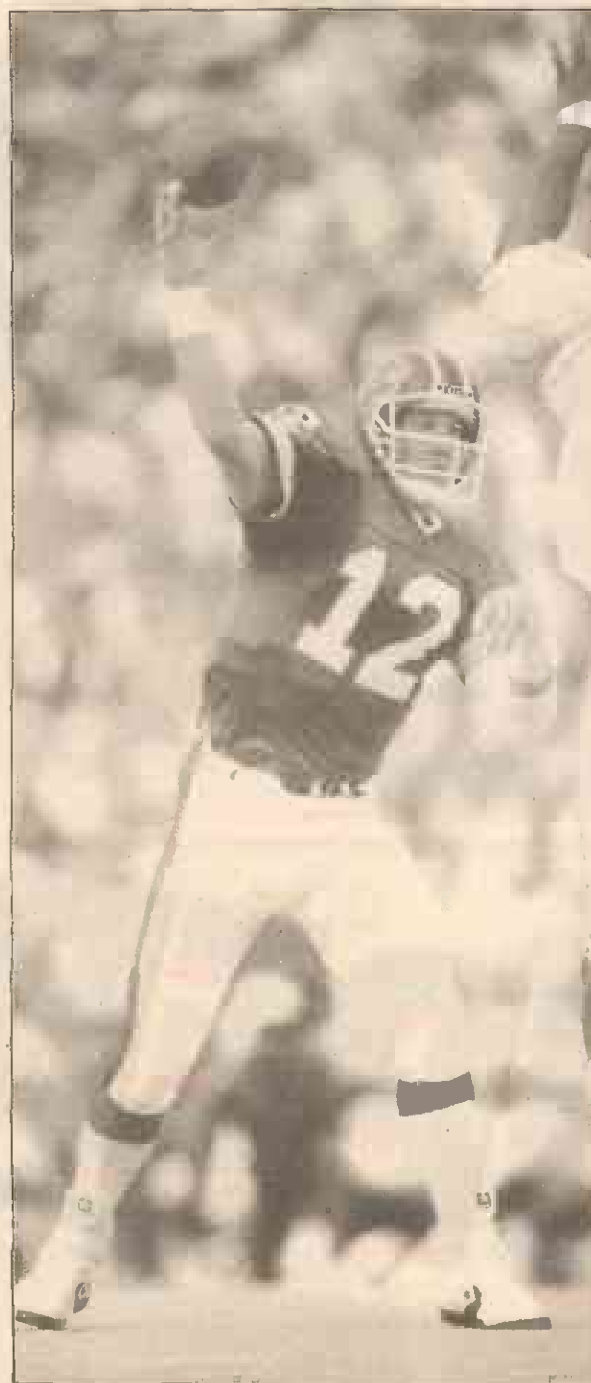
The Giants, incensed by rumors of their opponents already setting up camp in Tampa, proved just how wrong their detractors were when they defeated the 49ers.

The result is an all-East Coast match-up, which features two teams that routinely play in inclement weather meeting in the heart of the sunshine state for the football world championship.

The Giants have the second-ranked team in total defense along with being the eighth-best offensive team in the league. The Bills counter that by being ranked sixth in offense and eighth in defense.

Statistically speaking, the Bills have a slight edge on the offensive side of the line of scrimmage. But both defenses are strong.

The Giants ranked second in the league in total defense, giving up an average of 262.9 yards per game. The eighth-ranked Bills,

## Coaches predict who will win

To find out what knowledgeable local football fans expect from the all-New York match-up in Super Bowl XXV, sports editor Edward McLaurin and sports writer Bill Mossman contacted four varsity high school football coaches from the Sun Press distribution areas for their opinions. Following are their comments on Sunday's big game.

### Mark Kane — Castle

Mark Kane, Castle's varsity football coach, predicts a Super Bowl win by the New York Giants. Even with a back-up quarterback at the helm, Kane said, the Giants still should have the edge over the Bills.

"New York's got the defense and the experience to win the Super Bowl," he said. "Listen, if they can take it away from the 49ers, they can beat Buffalo.

"Plus, the momentum off the 49er game should help them," Kane

added. "It'll be close, though."

### Alex Kane — Kailua

Alex Kane of Kailua said he thinks defense will be the deciding factor, and New York will prevail because it will shut down the Buffalo passing and running attack much better than the Raiders did. But Kane said he also doesn't expect a runaway.

"The Giants will win because of their defense," he said. "It's hard for anyone to move the ball consistently against them, and the Bills won't have as easy a time moving the ball as they did against the Raiders.

"I think the final score will be close, with the Giants winning by a field goal."

### Darryl Smith — Kalaheo

Kalaheo head football coach Darryl Smith also expects a close game — but with Buffalo on the winning end. Smith said the Bills' brawny quarterback and hurry-up

offense will make the difference.

"They're both good teams, but I'm going with the Bills," he said. "It'll probably be a close game, but maybe Buffalo's no-huddle offense will confuse the Giant's defense.

"I also like quarterback Jim Kelly. He's built like a linebacker, but plays offense."

### Gary Clark — Lilehua

Lilehua varsity coach Gary Clark said he believes the Super Bowl XXV victory will go to the Giants — and it won't be all that close. New York's seasoned veterans will draw on past Super Bowl experience to blunt Buffalo's bid for a win, Clark said.

"I like the Giants, because they've been there before. Plus, they're a veteran team coming off a big win.

"The question for Buffalo is: Can they do it again? (A 51-thrashing of the Raiders.) I don't think so. I think the Giants will win by two touchdowns."
