

	<p>Maiden Hair Fern</p>	<p><i>Adiantum aethiopicum</i></p>	<p>Attractive native maidenhair which quickly forms dense clumps. Prefers some sun & abundant moisture. Tolerates heavy clay soils.</p>	<p>up to 50cm</p>

	King fern	<i>Angiopteris evecta</i>	One of the largest ferns in Australia. Fronds extending out to 5m. Slow but hardy, prefers moist protected well drained site with full or part shade. Q'ld & NSW.	6m
	Birdsnest Fern	<i>Asplenium australasicum</i>	Can grow on ground or be attached to tree. Features for trees, habitat for frogs, lizards and other reptiles. A striking alternative is the Staghorn (<i>Platycerium superbum</i>).	1m
	Silver Lady (Fern)	<i>Blechnum gibbum</i>	A hardy fast growing fern for shady spots in the garden. Its a great filler plant which is sure to add a touch of the tropics to your garden.	up to 1m

	Cunjevoi Lily	<i>Alocasia brisbanensis</i>	Huge succulent, glossy leaves with a white/yellow flower spike and showy red fruit in summer. Warning: this plant is poisonous if ingested.	1m



	<p>Bolwara</p>	<p><i>Eupomatia laurina</i></p>	<p>Heavily scented flower in summer and edible fruit in autumn/ winter. Bushfood. Attracts wildlife</p>	<p>3m</p>
	<p>Orange Thorn</p>	<p><i>Pittosporum multiflorum</i></p>	<p>Spiny; cover for small birds; white flowers, edible berry</p>	<p>1.5m</p>
	<p>Hairy Psychotria</p>	<p><i>Psychotria loniceroides</i></p>	<p>Delicate white flowers in summer. Fruit attracts birds</p>	<p>3m</p>

	Smooth Psychotria	<i>Psychotria daphnoides</i>	This is a dense bushy shrub whose fruit attractbirds such as Lewins Honeyeaters.	4m

	Blue Tongue	<i>Melastoma Affine</i>	Prolific mauve flowers; edible fruit pulp	2m
	White Melastoma QLD	<i>Melastoma Affine - Alba</i>	Attractive bushy shrub to 3m x 2m with showy white flowers & pinkish edible fruit that stain the mouth. Fast & adaptable, prefers moist-wet sites. Light frosts. Sun/shade.	

	<p>Yellow Pittosporum</p>	<p><i>pittosprum revolutum</i></p>	<p>A large shrub, growing to around 3 metres tall and 2 metres wide, it has small yellow flowers in spring which are strongly perfumed.</p>	<p>3m</p>
	<p>Holly Fuschia</p>	<p><i>Graptophyllum ilicifolium</i></p>	<p>Ornamental bushy shrub to 6m with stiff habit, shiny leaves & showy rich red bird attracting flowers. Slow growing, does best in well drained shady site. Endemic to CE & NE.Q'ld.</p>	<p>250cm</p>




	<p>Coastal banksia</p>	<p><i>banksia integrifolia</i></p>	<p>rough patterned bark and long green leaves with a silver underside. Pale yellow flowers are a cylinder shape can be seen in Summer to Winter the flowers can be up to 12cm long.</p>	<p>6m</p>
	<p>Swamp Banksia</p>	<p><i>Banksia robur</i></p>	<p>A dramatic & sculptural small tree/shrub with large flower spikes and fruits in autumn/winter lasting months</p>	<p>2m</p>

	<p>Silver Aspen</p>	<p><i>Acronychia Wilcoxiana</i></p>	<p>Spreading shade tree to 8m with large glossy green leaves. Often found on sandy soils near the coast. Decorative white globular fruit. Sun or shade in well drained soil.</p>	<p>5-7m</p>
	<p>Blueberry Ash</p>	<p><i>Eleaocarpus reticulatus</i></p>	<p>An elegant small tree with white or pink bell flowers in summer, flower spike resembling a bottlebrush followed by small, round blue fruit. Bird attractant.</p>	<p>6m</p>
	<p>Snow in Summer</p>	<p><i>Melaleuca linariifolia</i></p>	<p>Striking masses of white flowers born in summer with attractive paperbark trunk</p>	<p>2m</p>

	Pandanus	<i>Pandanus tectorius</i>	Sculptural tree with large orange fruit (female only), large strappy leaves and distinctive prop roots	10m

	Calicoma	<i>Calicoma seratafolia</i>	Bushy shrub to 8m with dark green serrated leaves with silver reverse. Cream wattle-like ball flowers in Spring. Fast, prefers a sheltered moist position, sun or light shade, frost hardy. SE.Qld to the Blue Mtns.	8m
	Brown Kurrajong	<i>Commersonia bartramia</i>	An attractive spreading tree to 12m with horizontal branches giving a layered effect. Showy white flowers. Full sun, well-drained site. Fast growing pioneer. Widespread from Clarence River to Cape York.	12m
	Long-Leaf Tuckeroo	<i>Cupaniopsis newmanii</i>	Slender tree to 6m with very showy red new flushes of serrated leaves. Hardy in sun or shade in well drained soils. Moderate growth rate. Border ranges of Q'ld & NSW.	6m

	<p>Glossy Laurel</p>	<p><i>Cryptocarya laevigata</i></p>	<p>Shrubby tree with glossy foliage and large red fruit in spring/summer. Attracts wildlife</p>	<p>6m</p>
	<p>Davidsonia jerseyana</p>	<p><i>Davidson Plum</i></p>	<p>An outstanding small tree that prefers warm conditions and some shade. Striking edible purple fruits that make excellent jam. Davidsonia jerseyana is the southern form, it fruits in the summer months and is generally a smaller plant than its the northern Davidsonia pruriens. The fruit form on the trunk of the tree and it is striking in full fruit.</p>	<p>2-5m</p>
	<p>Bopple Nut</p>	<p><i>hicksbeachia pinnatifolia</i></p>	<p>Slender ornamental shrub often multi stemmed. Red new growth. Well drained site in sun or light shade. Difficult to establish but hardy after that. Red edible nuts.</p>	<p>10m</p>

	Native frangipani	<u><i>Hymenosporu m flavum</i></u>	It is a rainforest tree native to Queensland and New South Wales and it's large, glossy leaves give it a tropical look.	8m
	Firewheel	<i>Stenocarpus sinuatus</i>	Handsome large tree for sub-tropical & tropical & Mediterrean gardens with large dark green glossy leaves and red spider flowers.	12m
Grasses				
	Tassel Rope Rush	<i>Baloskian Tetraphylla</i>	Erect, bright green perennial tussock with smooth stems, feathery appearance from repeated thread-like branching along the stem. Spreads from woolly, creeping underground stems. Moist to permanently wet soil along watercourses and in swamps, tolerating periods of drying out. Full sun, semi shade.	1.5m

	Jointed Rush	<i>Baumea articulata</i>	This is an attractive native sedge. It has drooping flowers/seed heads & bamboo-like stems on older growth. It is excellent for water features & is a great habitat plant for nesting bird life. It grows in water to 1m deep & likes either full sun or semi-shade	1.5-2m
	Tall Sedge	<i>Carex appressa</i>	Carex appressa is a hardy sedge for wet and dry zones. It is an ideal plant for Constructed Wetlands, Rain Gardens and general revegetation of riparian zones	1m
	Tassel sedge	<i>Carex fascicularis</i>	A species of sedge of the Cyperaceae family that is native to Western Australia. The monoecious and rhizomatous perennial grass-like sedge has a tufted habit.	1.5m
	Short-stem Sedge	<i>Carex maculata</i>	Densely tufted sedge spreading from short underground stems. Flowering stems erect, rounded to 3-angled in cross section, from 3-10cm high, shorter than leaves.	.4m

	<p>Fan Sedge</p>	<p><i>Carex gaudichaudiana</i></p>	<p>A native spreading grass with green, weeping ornamental foliage. Full sun to part shade. Permanently moist to wet soil or shallow water in swamps, slow-moving streams and fresh water to 30cm deep.</p>	<p>1.5m</p>
	<p>Dianella</p>	<p><i>Dianella caerulea</i></p>	<p>Great clumping grass. Lush, strappy leaves, dainty purple flowers & edible blue berries. Bushfood</p>	<p>0.8m</p>
	<p>Blue Flax Lily</p>	<p><i>Dianella longifolia</i></p>	<p>A tufted local lily to 1.5m in height with tuberous roots & erect stems, blue & orange flowers, blue berries. Hardy, long-lived & adaptable, prefers light shade or shade.</p>	<p>1.5m</p>

	Tall Saw Sedge	<i>Gahnia Clarkei</i>	Large sedge forming a thick tussock Gahnia is great as a screen plant for large gardens and can be used as a back drop for other foliage plants. Its large flowers are a feature while flowering and during seed set. It is perfect for wet and dry areas. 2.5m tall and 2 m wid	2.5m
	Red fruit saw edge	<i>Gahnia sieberiana</i>	Large, robust sedges with long, arching leaves. Found in damp areas or in areas subject to periodic inundation	3m
	Knobby Club Rush	<i>isopepis nodosus</i>	Perennial. Rhizome stout, horizontal. Leaves reduced to a basal sheath.	1m
	Lomandra	<i>Lomandra Hystrix</i>	Tussock growth, strappy leaves, branched flower spikes	1m

	Little pal	<i>Iomandra confertifolia</i>	Compact fine-leaved native grass for contrast planting in gardens, or erosion control on banks	.8m
	Kangaroo Grass	<i>Themeda australis</i>	Low maintenance tufting grass with reddish flower heads. Full sun to part shade.	.2m

	Swamp Orchid	<i>Phaius tankervillea</i>	Endangered terrestrial orchid forming large clumps, found in swampy grasslands, euc & paperbark forests & rainforest. Large pleated leaves, flower stems to 2m, showy flowers white on outside and brown with pale veins on inside, mauve & yellow tongue. Q'ld (now extinct in N.NSW).	2m

Hardy bushy fast growing shrub to 1m tolerating sun or shade. Prune in Autumn to look its best. Large terminal spikes of purple flowers are very showy. Considered to be anti-hypertensive, diuretic, anti-fungal, anti-bacterial, and anti-inflammatory.
