#### TWO PLANT COTTAGE GARDEN

Plant with abundance a combination of English Roses and English Lavender for an easy upkeep cottage style garden, packed with a profusion of color and scent. The simplicity in a narrow selection of plants should not be underestimated.

Here, Boscobel has been used for its warm pink tones but any rose will work, select your two plants and run with it. Upkeep is easy; feed your roses to promote health and strong growth and prune well to create solid shape and structure.

Create an idyllic picture book English cottage style garden by planting roses inspired by characters and landscapes from English novels, or take a step back in time with roses inspired by moments in British history.

Pictured above left: Boscobel™ (Auscousin) English Shrub Rose has a medium-strong myrhh fragrance and coral-pink rosette blooms. It is named after Boscobel House in Shropshire, UK, built in 1632. King Charles II famously took refuge here in 1651, hiding in an oak tree after fleeing for his life following defeat during the English Civil War.

Pictured above right: Eustacia Vye (Ausegdon) is named after the exotically beautiful yet flawed heroine in Thomas Hardy's famous English novel 'The Return of The Native' set on Egdon Heath, a fictional barren moor in southwestern England. English Shrub Roses from \$32.

### MIXED BORDERS

WITH ROSES



Mixed borders are not only the core of what makes an intimate and informal cottage garden but they are also the easiest way to use roses within a garden. There are no rules when it comes to mixing - combine textures, colors, styles and heights. Select what you like and plant freely, ideally grouping multiples of the same plant to create swathes of contrast and avoid a speckled look. Remember to place smaller plants towards the front and for a cottage kitchen garden touch, be sure to mix in a few herbs.

An obelisk in the center of a mixed border allows you to add height and interest by combining climbing roses with other companion plants in a relaxed manner, to achieve the informal cottage garden look. Alliums, delphiniums and other tall, punctuating plants work well surrounding a cottage style obelisk.



#### **CREATIVE CONTAINERS**

Get creative with your container choice. Choose a color to complement your rose or repurpose an unused barrel and turn it into something special. Unusual containers planted with roses can make a real statement. When a flowerbed may not be possible, use an extra large container and plant a couple of varieties together to create a raised bed. Alternatively, collect containers of all shapes and shades, filling each one with a different rose.

Pictured above left: Roald Dahl (Ausowlish) English Shrub Rose is ideal for planting in a pot. Particularly healthy, shade tolerant with few thorns, he will flower late into fall. Planted in a steel container, the grey blue offsets his beautiful apricot blooms and contrasting red buds.

Pictured above right: James L. Austin (Auspike) is not one to be overlooked, his deep pink rosettes are full of promise and character and will lift any space. Perfect on a patio planted in a pot, he will form a neat upright shrub with a delightful medium fruity fragrance. English Shrub Roses from \$32.



#### DECK IT OUT

Decking provides a perfect opportunity for planting an English Shrub Rose in a pot or container, creating a fragrant seating spot. For a rustic feel choose an aged wooden planter or repurpose a barrel.

#### Princess Anne (Auskitchen)

A particularly healthy English Shrub Rose with large, open, almost frilly blooms which fade from deep red-pink through to a rich purple-pink creating a wonderful effect when combined together. Forms a large shrub about 4ft tall with a medium Tea fragrance and highly polished foliage.

# PLANTING A ROSE IN A CONTAINER

Make the most out of a bright afternoon by sprucing up a hidden corner of the garden. Start by searching out a long-lost pot, or barrel - in fact any unused container will be glad of the job - then with your favorite rose to hand, you're all set to create something extra special.

So, let's get planting! If you've decided on a rose in bare root form, a little bit of prep work before you plant will go a long way. Soak her roots in a bucket of water for at least two hours; overnight is even better if you can wait that long. For a potted rose, a simple sprinkling with a watering can just before you plant will do the trick.

Your pot or container will need to have drainage holes as well as some packing to stop the soil from compacting at the bottom. Broken pieces of terracotta or polystyrene work well and will help to keep your rose healthy, ensuring that water can drain away easily.

Once prepared, you can start to fill your chosen container. Our Head Gardener, based in Shropshire, UK suggests using a 50/50 mix of potting compost and multi-purpose



compost. Fill up to about half way, lightly pressing down on the compost as you fill to reduce the risk of air pockets.

Before you get your rose settled, sprinkle David Austin Mycorrhizal Fungi over her roots to stimulate root growth and get her off to a fine start. Now you are ready to position your rose centrally in the pot, making sure the 'union' - where the stems and roots meet - is a couple of inches below the rim of your container. At this point you may want to wear gloves to hold your rose in position - these plants may be beautiful but can also be deceptively thorny. Now, gently fill the remainder of your container with the rest of the compost mixture.

When the soil level is just below the rim, firm in lightly with your hands to secure your rose into her new home. Finally give her a good watering so that the moisture penetrates the soil through to the roots. Roses are more than happy in pots that give them space to grow, though they will need more frequent watering than roses in the ground. Like other plants, they will flourish from any care and attention they receive.

Now that the hard work is done, you can sit back, relax, and enjoy watching your newly potted rose settle into its surroundings and begin to bloom come summertime.

Her fragrance is pure, strong and classic Old Rose in style. She is remarkable with the impact her medium blooms make in both fragrance and coverage.

#### HOW TO USE HER

Vigorous and upright, she will not only form a lovely, slightly wild looking hedge, but she will also be happily cut and displayed in a vase - watch out for her thorns though. A strong all rounder she will be equally happy in a bed, border or container. Bees love her, for her flat blooms and easy access pollen.






# GRAND REGENCY ROMANCE

Think 1920's Gatsby glamor with heady, sumptuous scents and classic color. Use fewer varieties in bigger sweeps to create a lavish display of single color and fragrance. A white rose will look particularly decadent.

A bee-friendly rose with single style blooms reminiscent of a primrose.

#### BLOOM

Her beauty is found in the simplicity of her single yellow flowers and the spectacular display they create when viewed en masse. Fun, friendly and uplifting, her blooms are favored by bees and are almost playful in the way they echo childhood favorites like buttercups or primroses.

#### HOW TO USE HER

Her simple flowers combine really well with other flowers in a mixed border and she is a great variety to attract beneficial pollinators to your garden. She will also combine well with fuller bloomed yellow roses, adding variance of style while keeping to a singular color scheme. Plant one for a little joy, or plant in multiples for a lot.

#### BEHIND HER NAME

Named to celebrate the 25th anniversary of English Cartoonist Annie Tempest's classic English Cartoon 'Tottering-by-Gently' which was first published in the UK magazine 'Country Life' in 1993. The tongue-in-cheek cartoon tells the story of eccentric English aristocrats Dicky and Daffy Tottering who live at their ancestral home Tottering Hall.
