

Leaves: Simple, opposite, toothed, 1" long,

pungently fragrant, tinged red in winter,

rough to touch

Flowers: Tight multicolored tiny flowers in clusters, in

summer and fall, red, orange, yellow,

purple, white

Fruit:

Bark/Twig: Woody, brown trunk, flexible green branches

Water Needs: Low - deep monthly watering in 6 hottest months.

Tight clusters of blue berries that turn black as

they ripen. Remove to promote more flowering.

Width: 2-8ft

Disease(s): Mildew

Pest(s): Aphids, Whitefly

(Refer to Disease and Pest Control chart for treatments.)

Special Points: Dies back in cold winters. Needs deep, infrequent watering and only light fertilizing.

Prune hard in spring to remove deadwood and prevent woodiness. Lantana montevidensis is a groundcover with lavender flowers. L. 'Spreading Sunset' has
