	Dense, silvery cushions with big rose/pink flowers ~10cm tall; from Kaz Dag, Turkey: 1600m.		
A322	Achillea oxyloba ssp. schurii	Sun	\$10
	Simple white daisy flowers (10-15cm high) on compact cushion of green, finely cut leaves. From the stony slopes of Bucegi Mts, Romania, 2300m; Pavelka collection.		
A072	Achillea x lewisii 'King Edward'	Sun	\$9
	Toothed, wooly, gray-green leaves form mats with 15cm flower stems that bear corms of pale yellow flowers, which age to cream.		
A344	Aconitum cf. brachypodum	Sun	\$11
	Spikes covered in purple-blue blooms, grows to about 40cm tall from a tuft of pinnatisect leaves. Jurasek collection from SW Qinghai at 4300m.		
A105	Adenophora takedae v. howozana	Part-sun	\$10
	Campanula relative from Japan; slender arching branches with narrow, toothed leaves. Blue violet bells in very late in August-September; 15cm.		
A291	Aethionema armenum	Sun	\$9
	Compact 10cm evergreen mound of soft pink blooms. Easy to grow and will gently self seed about. Jurasek collection from Turkey.		
A280	Aethionema saxatilis	Sun	\$9
	Blue-green, thick (almost succulent like) leaves form a low mat of 10-15cm. Flowers are usually pink, but there is variability with white and mauve as well. Jurasek collection, 1700m Greece.		
A198	Aethionema subulatum	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Compact tufts of woody stems with bluish leaves; large rose/pink flowers on short scapes.		
A345	Ajania khartensis	Sun	\$10
	A welcome bloom of yellow buttons in late summer on low, creeping silver leaves; 5-10cm in height. Holubec collection; limestone scree, grasslands, Baima Shan, Yunnan at 4300m.		
A147	Allium flavum v. minus	Sun	\$9
	Dwarf form from Turkey with umbels of bright yellow flowers; delightfully curled leaves, 12cm..		
A288	Allium kurtzianum	Sun	\$10
	Dense pinkish-purple clusters in summer. Grows to just 10cm high; excellent trough specimen. Rare endemic of NW Turkey; Jurasek collection.		
A362	Allium senescens ssp. glaucum	Sun	\$9
	The bluish-gray, flat, curling "cowlick onion" leaves just can't be ignored in any garden, including the rockery. Drought tolerant, deer resistant, and a much appreciated late summer bloomer of pink globes. Half the size of the species with leaves reaching 15cm in height.		
A307	Allium thunbergii alba	Sun	\$9
	Just when you think the garden is done for the season, this easy to please gem brightens the day. Forms tidy clumps; stems 20cm high hold clear white blooms until frost.		
A318	Allium thunbergii 'Ozawa'	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Just when you think all plants will have shut down blooming in the fall, this allium wakes up and gives you one last bouquet. And the flowers last for months, even after light frosts! Elegant 'Ozawa' flowers are held about 30cm high; rich purple with reddish undertones. Delicate, grassy leaves don't distract from the blooms. Very easy to grow, and the deer of course don't like them. From Gabriella Costea seed.

	A very dainty allium with thin green leaves in a neat tuft bearing blue/purple flowers in the autumn until frost. Lacking a name only adds to its allure. 10 cm		
A332	Alyssum aizoides	Sun	\$9
	Loose, low (5cm) spreading cushions of small obovate silver-green leaves. From Ala Dag, Turkey; Holubec seed.		
A363	Alyssum ochroleucum	Sun	\$10
	Cushions of silvery, narrow, linear leaves with yellow or white flowers; 5 to 10cm in height. Pavelka collection from gypsum hills in Sivas, Turkey.		
A324	Alyssum oxycarpum	Sun	\$9
	Mounds of tiny grey green leaves with profusion of yellow blooms in early spring.

	Dwarf, mat forming with silvery, downy leaves; white straw flowers in June; from Chola Shan, 4800m in Sichuan.		
A333	Anaphalis nepalensis	Sun	\$10
	The Nepal Pearly Everlasting; fuzzy lanceolate, silver-green leaves. Papery white flowers; 20cm tall. Sichuan, 3000m; grown from Pavel Krivka seed.		
A137	Andromeda polifolia Ft. Chimo	Sun	\$10
	A collection from northern Canada which has proven to be a good grower; needle like leaves of bluish green; pink flowers; 30cm.		
A058	Androsace barbulata	Sun	\$10
	Thick tufts of woody stems, wooly leaves, white flowers.		
A216	Androsace globifera	Sun	\$11
	Halda collected seed of this species in Upper Burma on Mali Kha in a high alpine pasture (4800m); stemless, bright pink flowers sit atop tight cushions of hairy leaves, resembling a miniature form of a. muscoidea, very choice introduction.		
A251	Androsace hedraeantha	Sun	\$11
	Clusters of 2-4 pink flowers on small green cushions, shiny, pointed leaves. 2400m; Sar Planina, Macedonia.		
A118	Androsace muscoidea	Sun	\$11
	Silvery green, stoloniferous mats; stemless lavender flowers; from drier regions of the Himalaya.		
A010	Androsace primuloides 'Sheppard'	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Large vigorous plant with many gray-green rosettes of elliptic leaves, each one producing, in May, a compact umbel of pink flowers with a yellow eye, lovely where given the room to form a solid carpet.		
A154	Androsace sarmentosa	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	From a wild collection at 3300m, Garwal. Soft cushions of lonate leaves, rose/pink flowers with a dark eye; spreads into larger mats.		
A014	Androsace villosa v. jacquemontii	Part-sun	\$11
	Originally from Ota Vlasak, this collection is stoloniferous and mat forming, but slow. Flowers are a vivid red-purple with greenish yellow eyes, quite striking.		
A189	Androsace x 'millstream'	Sun	\$10
	Linc Foster's selection of a tiny garden seedling with dark green leaves and pink flowers.		
A316	Andryala agardhii	Sun	\$9
	Lovely foliage plant with silver, wooly leaves; yellow dandelion like flowers in summer. Grown from Piatek's seed.		
A125	Anemone blanda 'enem'	Sun Part-sun	\$12
	Collected by Janis Ruksans in the North Caucasus and named for a nearby village. The true species covered with absolutely pure gentian blue flowers in April. Easy to grow in gravelly/woody soil.		
A274	Anemone cf. obtusiloba	Part-sun	\$12
	Large purple or white flowers. Jurasek collection from Litang, Sichuan; 4300m.		
A203	Anemone multifida v. tetonensis	Sun	\$11
	Late spring flower colour can vary from strawberry pink to purple and white. Lanate leaves with flower stems 10-20cm stems high.		
A346	Anemone narcissiflora ssp. crinita	Sun Part-sun	\$11
	From forest margins and alpine meadows in Siberia and Mongolia; large white flowers held 30cm high.		
A098	Anemone parviflora	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Dark green, basal leaves; short stems bearing bluish/white flowers.		
A145	Anemone x lesseri	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	A garden origin hybrid with shiny green, palmate leaves, to 15cm tall; many rose flowers about 2cm across.		
A298	Anemonopsis macrophylla	Part-sun Shade	\$14
	Incredibly elegant 'false anemone' that should have a place in everyone's shade garden. Nodding opalescent flowers resemble a cross between an anemone and a fuchsia, with light violet waxy outer sepals and an inner cup of infused deep violet. From woodland areas in central Honshu, Japan. Grown from a thick packet of seed Barrie Porteous sent!

	Solid hummocks with white flowers on 1 inch stems. A very tight, wonderful cushion.		
A028	Armeria juniperifolia	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Hummock forming Spanish Thrift, very compact; lot's of pink flowers on 5cm stems.		
A029	Armeria juniperifolia 'Alba'	Sun	\$9
	A white flowered version with more glaucous leaves and condensed habit. It does best in very dry sand and full sun.		
A135	Armeria scabra ssp. sibirica	Sun	\$9
	An oddity from the middle Rockies found on drier areas of alpine tundra; flat tufts of short, grassy leaves; opalescent spheres on short 10cm stems.		
A049	Armeria x 'Little Penny'	Sun	\$10
	A tiny armeria with stemless crimson pink flowers on a tight mound of red-purple foliage.		
A181	Artemisia frigida	Sun	\$10
	A high collection ~3300m, Utah; small woody crowned shrub with spreading branches of silvery blue/gray foliage; flowers are small yellow discs on 10cm stems.		
A056	Artemisia pedemontana v. assoana	Sun	\$10
	White, wooly mats, perfect to fill a vertical crevice. Yellow flower heads in June; 5cm; trough.		
A193	Artemisia 'tiny green'	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Unusual mat of green filigreed leaves in tiny marble sized balls.		
A222	Aruncus aethusifolius	Sun Part-sun Shade	\$9
	Native to Japan and Korea; low mounds of finely divided leaves with airy plumes of white flowers over a long period; tolerates dry, shaded sites.		
A032	Asarina procumbens compacta	Sun	\$9
	Miniature form with large flowers, all summer long. Trailing stems make it ideal for the edge of a trough or over the side of a wall.		
A079	Asclepias asperula	Sun	\$12
	Leaves are pale green, narrow and twisting; terminal flowers have purple hoods over yellow/green petals. Unusual as the stems lie prostrate; grows on lean, dry calcareous gravel. Alplains collection from Cache Co., UT, 1463m.		
A033	Asclepias tuberosa	Sun	\$10
	Our native milkweed with brilliant orange flowers on July; about 50cm. tall. Grow in sand.		
A053	Asperula daphneola	Sun	\$12
	Dense, small, grey-green mats with long, stemless, funnel-shaped pink flowers. Very choice; Pavelka collection from stony slopes of Nif Dag, Turkey.		
A044	Asperula gussonii	Sun	\$10
	Frosted hard dome topped with long tubular pink flowers.		
A054	Asperula nitida	Sun	\$10
	Long tubed pink flowers in head-like clusters amongst green mat forming foliage.		
A063	Asperula pontica	Sun	\$10
	Dense cushion of green curls with a touch of frost on the margins. Long tubes of dark pink; excellent for crevice or trough.		
A052	Aster alpinus	Sun	\$9
	Clumps of green leaves. 5cm violet-blue flowers held on 15cm stems.		
A240	Aster asterioides	Sun Part-sun	\$9
	Dwarf, tufted plant of West China and Tibet, 6cm tall; short sprays of lilac/blue flowers.

	Large, and extremely thin petalled purple daisy - that's what makes it striking. A taller alpine, at 20-45 cm. Jurasek collection, N. Qinghai, 3600m.

C195	Calluna vulgaris 'Firefly'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	New growth of bright lime green transforms to red/copper tones by September and remains so through winter. Tiny mauve flowers hug the stems in summer.		
C261	Calluna vulgaris 'Flamingo'	Sun	\$8
	Brightly contrasting spring foliage growth is pink/red; grows to about 25cm high. Late summer lavender blooms cover dark green foliage.		
C234	Calluna vulgaris 'Foxii Nana'	Sun	\$8
	Diminutive heather (10-15cm tall) with tidy dense foliage. Mauve flowers in fall.		
C259	Calluna vulgaris 'Fraser's Old Gold'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Gold foliage turns coppery orange in winter; grows to 30-45cm high; summer lavender blooms.		
C244	Calluna vulgaris 'Glenfiddich'	Sun	\$8
	Mauve flowers in August-September; coppery foliage that turns more orange in winter; 25-30cm tall.		
C243	Calluna vulgaris 'Humpty Dumpty'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Very dwarf, growing to no more than 10cm in height. Bright green stunted foliage, perfect for a rock garden. Though grown mostly for its miniature form, it does give many white blooms in late summer.		
C228	Calluna vulgaris 'J.H. Hamilton'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Deep pink double flowers late in the summer. Dwarf, dark green heather growing to just 15cm high. Needs to be planted in an acidic bed.		
C246	Calluna vulgaris 'John F. Letts'	Sun	\$8
	Only 10cm tall mat, with lavender blooms through autumn. Foliage is quite attractive with tonal changes throughout the seasons - from gold in summer to bronzey reds in winter.		
C272	Calluna vulgaris 'Kinlochruel'	Sun	\$8
	Said to be the best double white calluna! Compact bushes of bright green foliage; tips turn bronze in winter. Late summer bloomer; grows to about 30cm high.		
C265	Calluna vulgaris 'Leslie Slinger'	Sun	\$8
	Beautiful spring foliage, with coral pink branch tips! Dense, upright mat, just 20cm in height; mauve flowers in late summer.		
C240	Calluna vulgaris 'Martha Hermann'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Bright green foliage; white flowers with a shade of lilac sprout to 20cm high from late summer to early fall.		
C271	Calluna vulgaris 'Mick Jamieson'	Sun	\$8
	Long spikes of double deep pink flowers in late summer. Dark green leaves; grows to a height of 35cm. Raised by David Wilson.		
C212	Calluna vulgaris 'Peter Sparkes'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Double rose pink flowers on elegant long spikes blow in late summer through the autumn. Vigorous, dark green branching habit to 35cm.		
C213	Calluna vulgaris 'Red Favorit'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Dark green, low spreading and bushy heather (20cm); double dark red flowers. Foliage gets a tinge of bronze in the winter.		
C226	Calluna vulgaris 'Rock Spray'	Sun Part-sun	\$8
	Another lovely heather from Bunchberry Nursery; deep pink flowers on 20cm stems; woody spread of dark green foliage.
