	Dwarf form from Turkey with umbels of bright yellow flowers; delightfully curled leaves, 12cm.

	A diminutive species growing at 4500m on the rocky slopes of Beima Shan, Yunnan; big red/purple flowers on short stems.		
A288	Allium kurtzianum	Sun	\$10
	Dense pinkish-purple clusters in summer. Grows to just 10cm high; excellent trough specimen. Rare endemic of NW Turkey; J. Jurasek collection.		
A362	Allium senescens ssp. glaucum	Sun	\$10
	The bluish-gray, flat, curling "cowlick onion" leaves just can't be ignored in any garden, including the rockery. Drought tolerant, deer resistant, and a much appreciated late summer bloomer of pink globes. Half the size of the species with leaves reaching 15cm in height.

	Very desirable thin leaved, petite blue allium for rock garden and trough. A more than welcome bloom in August and September.		
A385	Allium sp. Rawu	Sun	\$10
	Pink flowered allium; from Jurasek seed collected in Rawu, E. Tibet at 4100m.		
A386	Allium sphaerocephalon	Sun	\$10
	Stems (60cm) hold dense, oval, drumstick flower heads, oddly resembling maroon-red clover. Grassy leaves are elegant, thin and about 40cm in height. M. Rejzek collection from Ereğ Dagi, Turkey at 2000m.		
A307	Allium thunbergii alba	Sun	\$10
	Just when you think the garden is done for the season, this easy to please gem brightens the day. Forms tidy clumps; stems 20cm high hold clear white blooms until frost.		
A318	Allium thunbergii 'Ozawa'	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Late blooming flowers last for months, even after light frosts! Elegant 'Ozawa' flowers are held about 30cm high; rich purple with reddish undertones. Delicate, grassy leaves don't distract from the blooms. Very easy to grow, and the deer of course don't like them. From Gabriella Costea seed.

	A very dainty 10cm allium with thin green leaves in a neat tuft bearing blue/purple flowers in the autumn until frost.

	A collection from northern Canada which has proven to be a good grower; needle like leaves of bluish green; pink flowers; 30cm.		
A119	Androsace bisulca v. aurata	Sun	\$14
New	Spiky, tight cushions of gray/green; large golden flowers on short stems. A wonderful new introduction from Sichuan, China.		
A232	Androsace bisulca v. brahmaputrae	Sun Part-sun	\$14
New	From rocky grasslands in NW China and Tibet this version has large rose/red flowers erupting from rounded, villous cushions. A beautiful plant suitable for trough planting; 5cm.		
A151	Androsace minor	Sun	\$12
	From 4200m Kangding , Sechuan; bright, lime green rosettes, very miniature in size; large white flowers.

	Low growing tuft with almost prostrate stems of white flowers when open, but distinctive purple undersides of petals are what really add the interest. Not showy, but very subtly attractive. J. Jurasek collection ex Sichuan in 2013.

	A garden origin hybrid with shiny green, palmate leaves, to 15cm tall; many rose flowers about 2cm across.		
A298	Anemonopsis macrophylla	Part-sun Shade	\$16
New	Incredibly elegant 'false anemone' that should have a place in everyone's shade garden. Nodding opalescent flowers resemble a cross between an anemone and a fuchsia, with light violet waxy outer sepals and an inner cup of infused deep violet. From woodland areas in central Honshu, Japan. Grown from a thick packet of seed Barrie Porteous sent.

A374	Aquilegia coerulea		\$11
	The Rocky Mountain Columbine - featuring large, showy blue flowers with white sepals and long spurs.

	Purple sepals and white petals; hooked spurs. Grows 10-20cm in height. J. Jurasek collection from Komovi, Montenegro at 1750m.

New	Large, fully purple blooms; plant forms a tidy and compact mound at 15-30cm high. From Barrie Porteous' garden.

New	Grows in the Laramie Mt. of Wyoming in rock crevices amongst subalpine conifers. Tiny plant (12cm), white flowers hang downwards just above the leaves- very dainty.

New	Short stems of sky blue spurred flowers, on dwarf tuft of mint blue foliage. Alplains collection from limestone formation in Garfield Co., UT, 2576m.		
A372	Aquilegia scopulorum Piute Co (UT)		\$14
	Minute 10cm plants of gray-green leaves; dwarfed by the large, blue and white, long spurred flowers. Choice Alplains collection from east-facing steep screes of dolomite in Piute Co., UT, 3338m.		
A373	Aquilegia scopulorum Sanpete Co (UT)		\$14
	Tight gray-green tuft, from a larger growing population. Sizable bi-colored blue and white blooms with long spurs. Alplains collection from south and east-facing screes of dolomite near timberline in Sanpete Co., UT at 3290m.		
A263	Aquilegia x micrantha	Sun Part-sun	\$10
	Hybrid collection from Colorado. Having the sticky leaves of a. micrantha, but the yellow corolla and peach coloured spurs speak of a. elegantula.

	Tidy, tight cushion of heavily tomentose leaves giving it a soft appearance. Covered in white flowers in spring.

	Clump forming with shiny green divided leaves; large pink flowers on 10cm stems from August to October. This particular form is slower and more compact; from Hokkaido, Japan.
