Imperata Red Baron

- Striking mid-green leaves which turn blood red from the tips downwards
- White flower spikes appear throughout the Summer
- Clump-forming

Miscanthus Zebrinus (*M. sinensis*)

- Tall, graceful grass for use at the back of the border
- Leaves are dark green with cream stripes
- Bronze-pink flower blooms turn silvery-white in Autumn

Ophiopogon Nigrescens (*O. planiscapus*)

- Clump-forming, spreading perennial with jet-black, short leaves
- Can produce short spikes of pale lilac flowers in Summer

Uncinia Rubra (*U. uncinata*)

- Reddish-bronze leaves, arching up and out from its base, with tiny, bullrush-like, hooked flowers





Cordyline

Ato Purple (*C. australis*)

- Slow growing, evergreen, palm-like tree with arching, lance-shaped linear leaves, 30-90cm long. The green leaves have a purple flush at their base and on the main veins beneath the leaves
- Half-hardy perennial

- Two-toned cherry-pink leaves arch gracefully as the plant matures

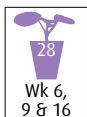
- Slow growing, evergreen palm-like tree with arching, lance-shaped red/crimson leaves that are 30-90cm long

- Half-hardy perennial

Torbay Dazzler (*C. australis*)

- An excellent dwarf evergreen shrub with unusual attractive green leaves with white speckles, tinged pink when young
- A showy focal plant with an upright habit
- Half-hardy perennial





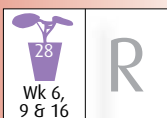

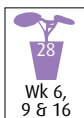
- A strong growing Phormium with very dark bronze/purple, arching foliage

- Half-hardy perennial



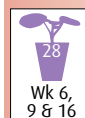

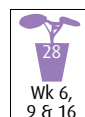
