

Tulips are not the very first harbingers of Spring after a long dreary winter but certainly the most colorful, cheerful specimens which pop up out of the ground. By forcing them into flower earlier than their natural blooming time, the season is extended.

Tulips were and remain very popular.

Conrad Gesner first described the Tulip in 1559.
Hence, the genus GESNERiana.

Tulipa gesneriana c.v. *Triumph Tulip 'Lustige Witwe'*.

It was the beginning of what would become an industry in itself.

Tulip production burgeoned, and after nearly 500 years is a major agriculture commodity.

Last year

- * 7 billion Tulips were grown; more than half are used as cut flowers.
- * There are close to 8,000 registered varieties.
- * Many Tulips are used in other applications as well i.e. landscape, etc.

This Catalog lists about 280 varieties which can be used for Cut Flowers from early winter until late spring.

Planting Tulips

In order to be successful, growers should determine which **Groups** they want to use for which type of program. For early season, use early groups. For outside planting, taller varieties can be used, etc. See also "Where" on page 4 and carefully read the Brochure on **"Tulips for Cut Flower Production"**.

Groups

In this Catalog, the Groups are NOT listed alphabetically, but rather according to their natural flowering times e.g. Single Early Tulips bloom before Single Late Tulips.

Within each group, the varieties are listed alphabetically.



Single Early

page 5

These generally bloom first. Plants are more compact and therefore have shorter stems. Many are fragrant. Easy varieties to force in all programs.



Double Early

pages 6 - 9

These bloom before the Double Late varieties. They are either semi-double or fully double, but have a minimum of 12 petals. Most are more compact than the Double Late varieties.



Darwin Hybrid

pages 10 - 12

These are slower to start when forced as they bloom after the earlier groups. Do not use for early forcing. Because of their heavy foliage, plants need more space and therefore fewer bulbs should be planted per square meter or yard.



Triumph

pages 13 - 20

This group has the largest color selection. Plants are average height and some of the best and easiest forcing varieties. Can be used in all different programs.



Double Late

pages 21 - 25

These are also called Peony Tulips because most flowers are fully filled with petals. Besides blooming later than the Double Early varieties, most are taller as well.



Single Late

pages 26 - 28

These taller varieties are also called "French Tulips" because of their height. Since they are not grown in the warmer French climate, they bloom later than the true French Tulips.

Lily-Flowering

page 29

These graceful, dainty flowers bloom later and most of them are taller. Carefully check the comments by each variety. Do not force early! Except one, not recommended to grow hydroponically.



Parrot

pages 30 - 32

These unique flowers have feather-edges and somewhat twisted petals. They are very popular for cut flower production. Most bloom later and should not to be used for early forcing.

- Inside or outside.
- In soil or on water (Hydroponically).
- Using cooling facilities or not.
- In crates, ground beds or raised beds.
- In cold climate or warmer climate.

We hope to have more detailed planting instructions in our upcoming booklet.



Forcing Cut Tulips is explained in simple language. Get your digital or hard copy from Ball Seed...

For those who plant in soil, two reminders:

1. *Tulips need AMPLE water while growing (forcing); drip-tape does not suffice!*
2. *Tulips when grown outside in colder areas need AMPLE winter protection from ALL sides... Not only 6" (15 cm.) of soil on top of the bulbs, but also on the sides of the raised beds to avoid frost damage!*

Since growing in soil is handled in the "Tulips for Cut Flower Production" only Tulips grown Hydroponically is handled on this page.

Growing Tulips Hydroponically

Many Tulips are grown in water with the use of special trays* with fit in the shipping trays the Tulips are shipped in (see pictures).



Please note that when growing Tulips Hydroponically, close attention must be paid to the minerals such as Calcium and Nitrogen. Even though they are important for all Tulips, growing in (moving) water is much more important. When the "standing" water method is used, water must be refreshed every 4 days, while checking the E.C.

* Water trays can be ordered through Ball Seed.



Not all varieties are suited for this method of growing. On pages 33 and 34 we marked those varieties with a "water drop" in the column H₂O.

Double Early

Tulips are mostly double or semi-double, meaning they have a minimum of 12 petals. They are somewhat shorter; remember this when selecting varieties!

As the name indicates,
best NOT used for later forcing.

Flowers may open a different color
than the buds.

Darwin Hybrid

flowers are among the largest Tulips. They have wider leaves; therefore, plant fewer bulbs per square yard or meter compared to other Tulips. They are also taller than most other forcing varieties. Because they need extra cooling, they start flowering later.


9°C Single Late Tulips

are generally not recommended for indoor forcing. However, for growers in warmer climates, the **9°C** can be used to assure the total number of weeks of cooling needed when planted outside in ground beds. This will force the flowers into bloom earlier than normal as well.




