Ideal conditions include full sun to bright shade, and fertile soil. They grow well near water, and require irrigation in hot, dry conditions.

## DORMANT PLANTS

In winter and early spring, you may open our boxes and find starters with brown leaves, or even no leaves. What's wrong? Probably nothing. Your plants are simply dormant.
Perennials rest in winter, storing precious energy in their roots, ready to push out new growth when warm weather returns. It's natural for foliage to turn brown or drop off. Examine the roots. They should be firm and fleshy, not soft and mushy
Most perennials benefit from a cold period, and some absolutely require it to flower. Vernalized plants often out-perform those that have had it too soft. If you're unsure, just wait. Keep your trays evenly moist, NOT sopping wet, in a warm, bright house. When clear signs of life appear, pot up as usual.

Don't frown at the brown. Brown is beautiful. Like the rest of the world, your starters will be lush and green again before you know it.
