

Our President Jane welcomed all to the meeting, especially new member Trish Richardson. She then introduced our speaker for the evening - Gary Young Gee.

Speaker: Gary presented an illustrated talk on "Miniature Orchids – a Selection". This was a visual feast of beautiful images, and a challenge for the minute-taker! Gary defined miniature orchids as plants 10–20 cm tall with flowers 3–8 cm wide. He suggested that orchid growers can be attracted to growing miniature orchids in order to fit more plants into limited space. The presentation featured the following species:

Gary's tips for photographing miniature orchids were to use diffuse light (such as in a greenhouse), a ring flash, and a plain background. Use a high F-stop and long exposure to maximise depth of field.

Q & A

Ben Walcott asked whether others have similar experience to his where *Coelogyne flaccida* leaf tips always go brown although *C. cristata* doesn't do that. Some of Don Chesher's Coelogynes have done it too. No-one could explain why or how to avoid this issue. Jane reminded everyone of the need to start staking flower stems early so the flower presents well when mature. When benching plants, flower stems should be supported below the lowest flower - if it's a single flower, below the ovary. Some judges will want to remove the support to see how strong the stem is, so attachment to the stake should be easily released.

Show & Conference

The main subject of the meeting was the upcoming South & West Regional Show & Conference. It begins on Friday 4 October with set up and benching of plants followed by judging from 5pm. The layout of the venue was explained, including provisions for parking. Plants to be included in the society's display are needed as early as possible. Sandra Corbett and Karen Groeneveld are the chief organisers of the display. Plants not used in the display will be benched. Novice members were encouraged to enter plants. Registrations of entries should be submitted to Peter Coyne as soon as possible to enable subsequent processing to be completed.

Karen talked about catering and what is needed. Food will be kept relatively simple. Volunteers are needed to help run the café and for other tasks throughout the weekend. Lists at the front of the hall enable people to nominate specific times and tasks for their contribution.

The conference will include talks by our members, which most in this society have heard before. Hopefully our members will not feel they have missed out by not attending the talks and can help run the show instead. Conference participants will be able to tour the CSIRO orchid glasshouses on the Sunday 6 October, and a similar tour has been arranged for Canberra members at 1:30pm on Saturday 26 October.
