

Annual – a plant that completes its life cycle in one year. Typically these are the flowers that will bloom the quickest (and often are the easiest to grow!)

Perennial – a plant that keeps on flowering year after year. May take a little longer to flower for the first time from seed (though some will flower in the first year) but will reward you with longevity.

Biennial – a plant that completes its life cycle in 2 years.

We only indicate seed counts here if it is 15 or fewer. All seed counts are on our website (or you can call us!).

Behind the Seeds

When we moved back to the Chilterns from the Lake District in 2012, we were very lucky to find offices in a beautiful barn conversion which suited us down to the ground. It's just a perfect match; the walls are wiggly, the beams are low and we have a resident spaniel asleep in the corner. An office as nature intended.

Visitors are surprised in equal measure by two things; how little space most of our bulk seeds take up and how much we do everything by hand.

When we say that we pick and pack all our seed packets by hand, we mean it. 48 years on from the conception of the business, we still use specially made metal scoops to measure most of our packets. Sourced from Sweden and near impossible to replace, these are our most precious possessions!

We still think this is the best way of doing things. We keep our packets and packaging simple; always recycled and 100% recyclable; and our customer service as friendly and knowledgeable as you'll find anywhere.

We have moved with the times though and now use technology in all sorts of clever ways, allowing us to have fast order turnaround and despatch and the very best stock control, ensuring we always have the freshest harvest and the reason our germination rates should always be the best.

Outside the front door, we have an ever-increasing line of pots, where we grow a small selection of our seeds – as much to see which things we like as it is to provide food for staff lunches!



Alongside our office barns, we also have a large, green plot on which we grow around 200 different items every year. It is an important space where we can both trial new varieties and grow old favourites. Everyone on our team gets involved in the preparation, sowing, and weeding so we all get a chance to spend some time away from our desks and gain hands-on seed sowing experience. It also means that the people who pack up your orders as well as those who answer your phone calls and emails get to see how things grow and exactly what the flowers look like!

Behind the Seeds; on our Plot

Whilst we start some of our seeds off indoors, our preferred method is direct sowing which saves on both space and time.

Over the years we have learned what works and what doesn't. Of course, it can be weather dependent; some things will thrive one year and then not grow so well the next but there are plants that will grow whatever you throw at them!

We tend to sow at the beginning of May and having prepared the ground so that it's weed free (last year we used Charles Dowding's No Dig approach), we simply make shallow lines with a hoe and go along these rows dropping the seeds in and then covering up with soil. Weeds may come up at a similar time but if the emerging seedlings are in neat rows, it makes them easier to see. They can be thinned out as necessary as they grow.

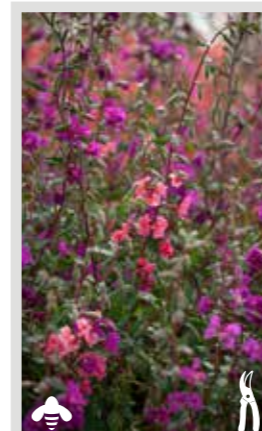
Eschscholzia californica, 533J

It's hard to pick a favourite Scabious but this is definitely up there with its dark and dramatic flowers.

Tom Brown at West Dean Gardens



We went to meet Tom Brown, Head Gardener at West Dean Gardens in Sussex and to look around the gardens where many of our seeds are growing. We were particularly inspired by the 'Dry Meadow' that Tom has created – an area planted with the most resilient plants.

How long have you been at West Dean and what was your remit when you took over?

I will have been at West Dean for five years and I absolutely love the scope and potential creativity that comes with the role. West Dean is principally an educational charity with the arts, conservation and design college at its heart. My remit when I started as Head Gardener here was to take the restored Victorian Kitchen Garden, and the grounds around the College, and evolve them into a space that would inspire students and visitors alike. Part of that remit is to be experimental and push boundaries, to inform the wider public. If gardens like West Dean stop experimenting and challenging the norm, that potentially will be a very sad day.



What was your inspiration for the Dry Meadow? How did you choose what to plant?

In recent years, I've become aware that certain styles of planting, and some old favourites like hydrangeas, roses and box are lacking buoyancy in the garden due to disease and weather conditions. The use of resources in the garden is also something we are mindful of, like water hungry plants in a greenhouse or how we manage our borders. With this in mind, we embarked on a new project to highlight a community of plants that not only could tolerate periods of drought but would also require little fertility and intervention. Our Dry Meadow plant list was created to celebrate perennials that met this remit and would tolerate wet winters too. 90% of the plants that we used were grown from seed, to achieve a more naturalistic look but also to work within a modest budget.

Tell us a bit about the other areas of the garden and your vision for them.

We've got a collection of very large glass houses at West Dean, as well as a large Kitchen Garden and Fruit Collection. There are a number of challenges that are associated with these areas, and we are tackling those issues head on as we garden in a time without chemical intervention, without the use of peat, and with a consciousness of increasing biodiversity within the Garden. Using biological control within the greenhouse, adopting a no dig method within the Kitchen Garden, and encouraging predators of orchard pests into the Walled Garden, to help control numbers are all things that we continue to experiment with.

Anything new in the pipeline?

A major project for 2024 will be the redevelopment of our Sunken Garden, where we take inspiration from the work of Peter Korn in Sweden with perennials grown in sand. This area will be planted with perennials that are tolerant of a sandy soil and can cope with periods of drought and times of excessive rainfall in a very similar way to our Dry Meadow.

Tomatoes

Whether a novice or a small holding grower, it's a vegetable available for every growing situation. Large gardens, greenhouses and polytunnel space will happily accommodate both bush (determinate) as well as upright vining varieties (indeterminate). A small balcony space will easily accommodate hanging basket varieties.



Cherry Tomato, 'Apero', F1 Hybrid 1803Q
Possibly the best tasting cherry tomato on the market? Rich red, slightly elongated fruits look as good as they taste. 6 seeds.

I found this vegetable does far better when it's direct sown in drills, sown in a semi-shade area that has the previous season's rich soil. Beetroot is very forgiving when I've neglected watering duties every now and again. Sow a short 30cm row every month from April to August and a fresh bountiful harvest is to be had until hard frost hits.

This is, of course, your cucumber designed for pickling use. High yielding, vigorous and easy to grow outdoors.

Bean

I'll intertwine the bean poles with a companion plant like Nasturtium (the peppery bright flowers are edible too). Then my direct sown dwarf French beans take their place mid summer to help continue fresh production. At this time the climbers have started to ripen to provide the dried bean harvest for winter stews.



Cavolo Nero, 'Black Magic' 1758C
Very popular British bred variety. Uniform and hardy with dark, narrow leaves. Also great for baby leaves.

Lettuce

A very forgiving plant when it comes to growing position; it loves partial shade but will cope with full shade in summer. Tuck the plants in the ground, containers or even hanging baskets. They are happy, as long as watering duties are not neglected. For an array of summer-long fresh harvests, I sow a selection of seeds every 4 weeks.



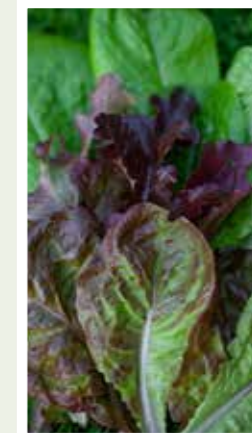

To grow or not to grow, will always utter my lips. Why? Because for 9 months starting late spring they grow in full sun, taking up nutrients and moisture putting on height and girth. During the winter they need staking and protection from birds and pests. However, with the first sign of warmth the following spring these plants produce the most delicious sprouting stems ever tasted. Now there's even a summer variety so we don't miss out!

Capsicum

Starting seeds early has the advantage of fruits arriving in early summer. Regardless of the spice-heat level, these self-pollinating plants will produce well when positioned under glass. Provide weekly high potash feed and harvests can be enjoyed until the start of winter. The question is, from this vast range, which varieties to choose?



Chilli Pepper, 'Jalapeno' 1355H
Prolific grower with glossy, green hot fruits, turning bright red. Best grown inside but try in a sunny spot outside.

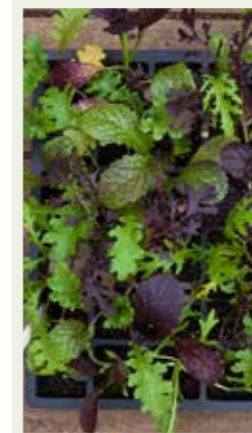

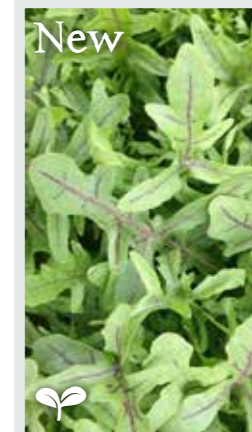
