As previously, we think you will find our Catalogue a little different from any other catalogue produced for the general gardening public. Firstly, there are only a few pictures. Our website (www.chilternseeds.co.uk) does include pictures of lots of the plants we offer and we are adding to these all the time. In our descriptions, we have tried to be informative and accurate. Secondly, we have arranged the list in alphabetical order rather than trying to slot individual plants into somewhat artificial categories such as "Annuals", "Greenhouse Plants", "Succulents" and so on. The reason for this is that many of the plants listed (as indeed most plants) can have more than one horticultural use, and one can be blinded of this fact if a certain plant has been categorised.

At the risk of losing your business, we have used those apparently unpopular Latin names throughout. The advantages are many. If you know, or have noted the botanical name, you can find it again easily both in the catalogue or gardening book; the name is used throughout the world. The plant only has one Latin name (although taxonomists do their best to confuse things by changing names with annoying frequency) whereas it can have a multitude of English names. But the main reason is simple – most of the plants listed just don't have an English name. Where we know of one, we have indicated it. We have, however, steadfastly refused any attempt to coin any new English names. One thing we have done which we think may assist is to give, where meaningful, English translations of the Latin names.

Lastly, we should like to point out that although our Catalogue lists around 2,500 items; this is, you might say, an active list: the items are not assembled like a stamp collector makes up a stamp collection but are all seeds from the latest harvest. At any one time, we reckon to have no less than 96% of the listed items in stock with fresh, latest harvest seed. So you are assured of (a) receiving the seeds you order and (b) the seeds are viable.

Why from seed?

You may never have thought of raising many of the listed plants from seed, perhaps dismissing the idea feeling that it would take too long or would be too difficult. However, starting from seed has several advantages, the two principal ones being (a) seeds very rarely transmit diseases and so the resulting plants can be relied upon to be healthy; (b) many of the plants offered are on the borderline of hardiness and their chance of survival is increased if they spend their entire life in the one environment rather than starting life in a nursery only to be moved to a new home a hundred miles or more away when two or three years old. And it's cheaper from seed. As regards time, you'll be surprised how quickly you can have flowers from seed, in some cases just a couple of months. Larger specimens may well take a little longer, but you'll find they're worth waiting for.

Open Pollination

"It is a wise father that knows his own child." We should like to point out that, as will of course be realised by the majority of our customers, except where indicated, all seeds offered are (as indeed the vast majority of seeds available anywhere) the result of open pollination, and it must therefore be appreciated that just very occasionally hybridisation will take place and the resultant seedlings will not be true to type. You can be assured, however, there can be many pleasant surprises amongst these.

Poisonous Plants/Seeds

Our attitude to the problem of poisonous plants/seeds, about which subject a lot has appeared in the press over recent years, is quite simple:- TO BE SAFE, unless it is known with complete confidence that a plant (or part of it) is edible, it MUST, WITHOUT EXCEPTION, be assumed to be poisonous. Before attempting to eat a previously unknown plant thought to be edible, regardless of source, it is essential that (a) the plant's true identity be verified and (b) in case you are unlucky enough to be allergic to that plant, in the first instance only a small sample be tried. In the case of seeds, it is simpler still:- any seeds bought for the production of plants must, WITHOUT EXCEPTION, be (a) treated like medicines and kept out of the reach of children and pets and (b) NEVER eaten; this in particular applies to otherwise edible seeds which might just possibly have been treated, say, with a fungicide or otherwise rendered inedible.

On a more cheerful note we should point out that not only are the vast majority of plants NOT poisonous, but a great number (we in fact only mention a small proportion of them) are actually edible. Furthermore, apart from those plants whose poisonous qualities are household knowledge (such as Foxgloves, Yew and Rhubarb leaves), there are others the average gardener is quite happy to handle in perfect safety unaware of their poisonous potential (in part or whole) such as Lily-of-the-Valley, Iris, Daffodils and Runner Beans. Whilst on this subject, this might be the place to suggest that, although many will scoff, wherever possible all plants be handled wearing gloves – somewhere there will be someone allergic to almost every plant we list; likewise to everyone reading these lines, there will be a plant somewhere to which they will be allergic.

GREEN MANURING PLANTS

The planting of seeds for "green manure" is one the best, most ecologically friendly ways to improve the quality of your soil. They will add nutrients and organic matter, naturally improving all soil conditions, helping to suppress weeds and even protecting the soil from erosion by adding structure. These seeds are all guick growing (2-3 months) and can be sown from March through to August/ September for over-wintering in all but the coldest areas. The resultant crop should be dug in before flowering when it is fresh and green.

Before re-planting the area, the plant material should then be left for about a month to enable it to break down into rich organic matter, allowing nutrients to be released slowly over a period of time.

Growing Legumes will also provide other benefits by virtue of crop rotation which improves the chemical, biological and physical characteristics of the soil, resulting in better growth of succeeding crops.

Each packet contains sufficient seed for an area of very roughly 10m² (perhaps a little less for the lupin, perhaps a lot more if you sow more thinly!)

Blue Lupin (Lupinus angustifolius) £2.25

Lupins are probably the best nitrogen fixers of all the Legume family. Maximum soil improvement will be achieved if the entire growth is turned under prior to full bloom when the nitrogen levels are highest. Though the blooms are so pretty you can always leave one or two to flower! 3ft (90cm) HHA

5010G £2.95 Crimson Clover (Trifolium incarnatum)

One of the best nitrogen fixers and very fast growing. This is also an excellent weed suppressant and provides a rapid boost to soil fertility. Tolerant of all soils, but best for sandy or light soils. If a few plants are retained and not cut-down, the flowers produced attract bees and other beneficial insects. 11/2ft (50cm) HHA

Named after Alexander von Nordmann (1803-1866), Professor of Botany at Odessa, this is a noble and highly ornamental tree native to the Caucasus mountains with shining green needles densely arranged on the shoots. It is one of the most attractive of the fir species, often grown for Christmas trees, holding its needles well. Hardy throughout the British Isles. **195ft (60m) HTr**

ABUTILON – Malvaceae. Indian Mallow

6W £2.95 A. hybridum maximum, Giant Flowering Mixed BEST SELLER Very rewarding (and popular) plants these, and very easy to raise from seed – you can expect to see their exotic-looking, chalice-shaped flowers in many different pastel shades in only a few months from sowing. Grow them in pots and put some in your borders for the summer months where they will flower profusely. **3ft (90cm) HHSh**

6M £2.95 A. vitifolium (syn. Corynabutilon vitifolium) (= vine-leaved)

This is a rather lovely, deciduous shrub from Chile with downy, greyish, vine-shaped leaves. Fast growing (over 10 feet in only 18 months from seed) and, if left to its own devices, eventually large and handsome, it bears from a fairly early age copious numbers of pale to deep mauve large flowers described variously as saucer, bowl or other kitchen utensil-shaped. Although most profuse in late spring or early summer, blooms can be found as late as October. Likes a warm position. **10ft (3m) HSh**

ACACIA – Leguminosae/Fabaceae

A genus of over 500 species scattered over the warmer regions of the world, but most abundant in Australia to where most of these species are endemic. Although the colour of the flower varies but little, there is great variety in habit and shape of leaf, and many have the delightful perfume of the florist's "Mimosa" (A.dealbata). Fortunately, although some species are of considerable size (the heights given refer to the size attained in nature), they can be successfully and easily grown in pots. The species listed have been specially selected as being best suited for cultivation in this country, requiring little more than protection from frost, and perhaps hardy in the very mildest parts of the country. Try them – some of the most beautiful of greenhouse plants. Acacia seed germinates freely if placed in a cup of boiling water and allowed to stand 2 days before sowing.

7 £2.45 A. baileyana. Cootamundra Wattle RHS

Graceful, very leafy tree with beautifully glaucous doubly pinnate foliage. Hardy in milder parts of the UK. 25ft (8m) H/HHTr

The best known, doubly pinnate foliage. One of the hardiest. 40ft (12m) TSh

ACAENA – Rosaceae

ACANTHUS – Acanthaceae

ACER – Aceraceae. The Maples

Large genus including in its number some of the most decorative of foliage trees and shrubs.

One of the most beautiful of all small trees, suitable for gardens of all sizes, is this species from China. The dark green, trifoliate leaves, densely covered beneath with blue-white downy hairs, colour splendidly in autumn turning the whole crown deep crimson or red. A great choice for urban areas as it is reputedly very tolerant of pollution. **80ft (25m) HTr**

This tree's claim to fame (as its name perhaps suggests) is its use in maple syrup production. Other species can be used, but this, along with the Black Maple (A.nigrum), allegedly makes the best! However, even if you are not planning on making your own maple syrup, choose this tree for its spectacular autumn colours - yellow, orange through to proper flag-of-Canada red. This deciduous tree is native to hardwood forests of north-eastern North America, typically reaching 80-110ft at maturity (this will take a while though - after 10 years, expect about 15ft of tree!) and is happy in most soils except sand and is the most shade tolerant of large, deciduous trees. 80ft (25m) HTr

ACHILLEA – Compositae/Asteraceae

This relative of the Poppy will attract all the bees in the vicinity. It bears huge, silky, saucer shaped, white flowers that contrast beautifully with the grey-blue foliage but do beware the prickles when picking! An excellent drought tolerant plant and easy to grow annual. 1½ft (40cm) HHA

ARIOCARPUS – Cactaceae

129B £2.95 Ariocarpus, Mixed Species. Cactus

A small but very interesting genus of most unusual Cacti with stout, Carrot-like roots, and rounded, flat, greyish-green bodies composed of triangular tubercles, giving them the vague appearance of dried out Agaves made of granite – indeed in their natural, stony habitat, the plants are very difficult to find. These seeds have been collected from a number of hybrids and whilst, of course, they will not breed true, you can nevertheless expect a fascinating variety of blooms from your packet in shades of redurge and violet-blue and also white. What's more, you don't have to have a name of or years to see the results of your work. Give your butterflies a treat! 16ft (5m) HSh

BUPLEURUM – Apiaceae/Umbelliferae

Some species will appear in only a few days, others will take much longer. Seed mixtures are an excellent way to build up a collection of these plants, provided, of course, you don't insist on accurate identification of them.

This is a beautiful hardy perennial with long, slender spikes of large, nodding, papery, bell-shaped flowers from June to August. Excellent for cutting.

From Japan comes this attractive small tree or, in Britain, more often than not, dense bush, with most satisfying vivid blue or sea-green, heart-shaped leaves that actually emerge bright pink. The tree is remarkable for the range of autumn colours it may decide to reveal: depending on the weather and the age of tree, scarlet, crimson, pale yellow, pale pink, smoky-pink, gold and plum-purple are all possible. The insects are fooled into thinking that the long, red, gland-tipped hairs are good for nectar and are trapped. These same hairs, aided at times by the leaf, then make a neat little parcel of their visitor and, by means of proteolytic enzymes and ribonucleases, digest him. Horticulturally, they are all very attractive little plants and are easily grown in a mixture of peat and sphagnum moss with good drainage and plenty of light. Germination requires no special treatment. And when you're bored, think of the fun you can have feeding them bits of rump steak to which they are partial!

EUCALYPTUS – Myrtaceae

A remarkable genus of over 500 species nearly all natives of Australia, ranging from small shrubs to the tallest of all broad leaved trees. One of the most interesting aspects of the Eucalypts is that the adult leaves are usually completely different in form from the juvenile leaves, which themselves are frequently of a most unusual and attractive appearance. They have many horticultural uses. Many species make very fine trees that are both ornamental and very fast growing, some reaching 3 or 4ft. the first year, and over 20ft in five years. They are amongst the finest sources of cut ornamental foliage for the foral artist, and for this purpose they should be grown as stooled (coppiced) or pollarded specimens. For these all the previous year's growth is pruned; down to ground level for stooled specimens and a short stem 1 or 2ft. long retained for pollarded specimens. The resulting annual growths, always of juvenile foliage, can reach 7ft. in the case of some species and it is these that are so excellent for cutting, lasting, as they do, a considerable time in water. Many Eucalypts treated as above make most beautiful shrubs when the young leaves, continuing to unfold from spring to summer, can be more colourful than many flowering shrubs. Eucalypts make excellent foliage of many species is agreeably aromatic when crushed and the smoke from a bonfire of prunings is said to be delightfully scented.

This is one of those plants that just don't need picture or description in a seed catalogue; let's face it, after the festivities of Christmas, the one thing we all look forward to is the appearance of the first Snowdrops. **4ins (10cm) HBb**

GALEGA – Leguminosae/Fabaceae

607E £2.35 G. officinalis. Goat's Rue, French Lilac

A wild flower introduced from southern Europe, and found by road-sides and waste ground mainly in the south of England. A vigorous plant forming bright green leafy clumps of pinnate foliage, and bearing in summer and early autumn long-stalked clusters of numerous pale lilac or rarely white, pea-like flowers. **5ft (1.5m) HP**

GALIUM – Rubiaceae

607F £2.25 G. verum. Lady's Bedstraw

A native wild flower of grassland throughout the British Isles. Needs, we hope, no introduction; only to say that no garden should be without some, if only to supply the house with constant cut flowers. The more you pick, the more they produce and a vase of Sweet Peas is a welcoming sight - and perfume - in any room. Although a great deal of energy has to be expended growing blooms for exhibition purposes, lesser mortals will achieve satisfying results by little more than the sow and forget technique - insert forefinger about one inch into the soil (for our purposes here worry not as to its condition), drop in a single seed, cover and rush indoors to pop the kettle on!)

Old-Fashioned Sweet Peas

Rather surprisingly, for such a well-known flower, the origins of Lathyrus odoratus are shrouded in mystery and its country of origin is not known. The flower was first introduced into this country from Sicily in 1699 where wild specimens have also been collected relatively recently. In addition, similar plants have been collected in South America, but all these are suspected of being garden escapes. From these "original" plants were developed what were known as the grandiflora but are now generally called the Old-Fashioned Sweet Peas. Grow them and we think you will agree that they thoroughly justify a place alongside the modern varieties - although the flowers are smaller, they are more dainty and are borne in profusion - once flowering starts, some can be picked every day, even sometimes until October (provided you don't let them go to seed). Their colours are more intense and glowing, and their scent - strong and heady - is in a different league. Fairly hardy throughout the British Isles.

Although very similar species had been known to paleobotanists who studied their fossil remains from strata as old as ecocene (70 million years old) beds in coal mines in Manchuria, such species were not thought still to exist in the living state. In what, therefore, has been described as one of the most remarkable botanical discoveries of the century, a Chinesee Professor of Forestry quite by chance spotted a specimen in a village called Mou-tao-chi in Szechwan province in China. This was in the winter of 1941 although it was not until 1946 before details of the discovery were published. At that time the tree was on the verge of extinction with only three survivors remaining in Szechwan and a further 1000 scattered in neighbouring Hupeh, and the natives still felling them for their timber. Fortunately for us, however, this beautiful tree, the probable ancestor of the American Sequoias, has proved to be very amenable to cultivation, and is strong-growing, vigorous, hardy and, always an asset, the seed germinates in only a couple of weeks or so. It is a most attractive, deciduous tree, conical-shaped when young, with bright-green, feathery foliage growing rapidly in its early years. Indeed, even ignoring its fascinating history, it is a tree worthy of a place in every garden. Hardy throughout the British Isles. **80ft (25m) HTr**

MILIUM - Poaceae/Gramineae

With slightly bluish-green leaves, it bears on long slender stalks umbels of very lovely, lampshade-shaped (sounds so much nicer than funnel-shaped!) flowers strawberry-pink to wine-red and violet in colour. These are said to be scented of fruit drops: this, however, is one fact, we feel, definitely not worth hanging about at 19,000ft to verify. Summer. **1½ft (40cm) HP**

PROTEA – Proteaceae

Named after Proteus, the Greek sea-god, in allusion to the diversity of the species, these evergreen shrubs have fascinating flowers and enjoyed great popularity in this country 150 years ago. With their present attraction to flower arrangers, it would seem they are once again coming into vogue. They certainly merit any time and effort spent on their cultivation. Generally speaking, they are cool greenhouse shrubs best grown in large pots or tubs and moved outdoors in summer and exposed to all the sun and air they can get. Given perfect drainage, the species listed will survive slight frost. It is also one of the best species for cut flowers.

1048B £3.35 P. magnifica (syn. P. barbigera). Giant Woolly Protea

A magnificent species, that will probably survive with the minimum of winter protection, with huge flowers as much as 8ins across that are like a luminous deep pink bowl filled with pale pink candy-floss. 5ft (1.5m) Packet of 7 seeds. HHSh %

PRUNELLA – Lamiaceae/Labiatae

One interesting point about this name is that, according to the rules of botanical nomenclature, it is an example of an error, once made, becoming enshrined in history: the name should in fact have been Brunella, after the German for quinsy, a disease the plants were said to cure. However, Linnaeus, in his formal description of the genus, boobed and spelled the word with a "P" and thus, for ever and a day, Prunella became the one and only correct spelling.

1055G £2.55 P. vulgaris. Self-Heal, Heal-All

From the horticultural point of view, this is a useful ground cover plant forming a mat of numerous leafy runners and producing in summer erect stems bearing heads of purple-violet flowers. As the common names suggest, the species has numerous medical uses, indeed, it's a positive pharmacy of a plant – you name it, it cures it – and as the dictionary puts it, "kind of plant named as enabling patient to do without doctor." But don't leave your G.P. just yet! **1ft (30cm) HP**

PRUNUS – Rosaceae

A large genus containing some of the most beautiful flowering shrubs for the temperate regions.

1055C £2.25 P. avium (= of the birds). Wild Cherry

With its clusters of white, cup-shaped flowers, each up to 1½in. across, borne in profusion in spring, followed by small, shiny, bright or dark red, edible fruits, this usually small tree (but it can sometimes reach over 80ft), the parent of many cultivated Cherries, is one of our most attractive woodland trees. Also useful for hedges. 80ft (24m) Packet of 12 seeds. HTr

1063B £2.15 P. spinosa. Sloe Blackthorn

A well known native, densely branched bush of hedgerows with spiny branches covered in spring with pure white flowers, followed in autumn by the small, Damson-like Sloes, excellent for Sloe gin and superb for home-made wine. A little known fact is the wood is favoured by the Irish for the manufacture of their shillelaghs! **10ft (3m)** Packet of 15 seeds. **HSh**

PULSATILLA – Ranunculaceae

This genus includes some of the loveliest of all flowering plants. From the time in early spring when their woolly, hairy flower buds first appear; through flowering-time when their beautiful flowers will attract paeans of praise from all that see them; through the time their enchanting, hairy, feathery seed-heads (good for flower arrangements) are formed; through summer to autumn when their feathery, hairy foliage always looks attractive, these plants are always a delight. Excellent either for the rock garden, border or cold greenhouse, their main requirement is a well-drained soil.

1075B £3.45 P. vulgaris. Pasque Flower RHS T

Now a very rare native species, this is a plant of exceptional beauty. With much divided, silky foliage, it bears in April and May lovely, violet-purple flowers. Hardy throughout the British Isles. **1ft (30cm) HP**

1075E £3.95 P. vulgaris, 'Heiler-Hybrids'

This is a superb cultivated strain of the Pasque Flower with blooms in a magnificent colour range: from dark red to bright red, pink, violet, blue, cream to pure white. **1ft (30cm) HP**

PUNICA – Punicaceae

1076A £2.95 P. granatum, 'Nana' кня 🍸

This is, as it were, a scale model of Pomegranate and as such, makes an ideal plant for pot culture. Indeed, it is now often offered as a house plant although it is, incidentally, possibly a hardier plant than P.granatum, and makes a good miniature shrub for the rockery. May be hardy outside in some regions with frost-free protection in winter. **3ft (90cm)** Packet of 10 seeds. **HHSh/TSh**

Pycnanthemum pilosum. See Mountain Mint in The VegBook

RADERMACHERA – Bignoniaceae

1084E £2.65 R. sinica RHS

Although in its native habitat this is a vigorous evergreen tree with panicles of large, yellow, bellshaped flowers, it is a very fine foliage pot plant that is rapidly finding increasing popularity. Fastgrowing, with its deep green, fern-like, bipinnate leaves, it quickly develops into a fine specimen. Very well worth a trial. **100ft (30m) GTr**

RANUNCULUS (= from the Latin for tadpole, or a diminutive frog (rana),

probably in reference to the plant's liking for damp places) – **Ranunculaceae Ranunculus asiaticus**. *Persian Buttercup*

Large, extravagant, ruffled double flowers with many layers of delicate but robust petals, these are loved by florists. The delicate looking blooms are more robust then they look and will last for ages in water.

RATIBIDA – Compositae/Asteraceae

Best grown as an annual but if you can't be bothered to shift them at the end of the year, don't worry, they're true perennials and will produce a crop of flowers yearly for as long as you want! **4ft (1.2m) HA/HP**

1085M £2.25 R. columnifera f. pulcherrima , 'Red Midget'

This is a delightful somewhat dwarf variety of the Prairie Coneflower. Like its larger sibling, this is an easy-to-grow plant flowering the first year from seed from summer into autumn, producing with ease and plenty its red-brown flowers with yellow tips. Another good cut flower. 1½ft (45cm) HA/HP

RAVENALA – Strelitziaceae

1086C £3.75 R. madagascariensis. Traveller's Palm

This is a giant – in its native Madagascar, a tree with a trunk up to 90ft tall with the very large, Banana-like leaves, up to 15ft long, spread out on top like an enormous fan. More modestly in this country, it must count as being one of the most superb of all foliage plants for growing in pot, tub or, best of all, in a warm greenhouse border. REBUTIA – Cactaceae

1086K £3.65 Rebutia, Mixed Species. Crown Cactus

Because they flower easily and prolifically, even when very small (with care when only 12 months old), these small, freely offsetting, globular Cacti are ideal for amateurs and beginners. The bright, funnel-shaped flowers come in a good variety of colours including various shades of red, lilac and yellow. **4ins (10cm) GP**

RED-HOT-POKER. See Kniphofia

REHMANNIA – Scrophulariaceae

1086D £2.65 R. angulata. Chinese Foxglove

Although well worth trying to grow this plant out of doors in the milder parts of the British Isles, it is otherwise a fine plant to grow in pots in a greenhouse, where its large, pink, somewhat Foxglove-like flowers of an exotic appearance can best be seen to advantage. **3ft (90cm) HHP**

RESEDA – Resedaceae

1086X £2.25 R. alba. White Mignonette

From coastal areas of southern Europe comes this attractive plant with deeply cut foliage and bearing for most of the summer impressive, long, slender, dense spikes of pale greenish-white flowers. Though not often seen, this makes a beautiful cottage garden flower with a lovely scent. **3ft (90cm)**

1086N £2.25 R. luteola (= yellowish). Sweet Reseda, Dyer's Rocket, Weld

A native wild flower with narrow, lance-shaped leaves and long, slender spikes of yellowish flowers. It was once much cultivated for the dye, flavone, used to colour textiles yellow. 5ft (1.5m) HB \clubsuit

Reseda odorata. Mignonette

Grown at some time or other in every garden for its sweet scented flowers, this well known plant needs no introduction. Please note that seeds and all parts of the plant for all Ricinus species are poisonous. Please handle with care and always wash hands after handling seeds or plants.

This is indeed a splendid variety. Not only is it a magnificent and decorative foliage plant with handsome leaves of a rich bronze-green colour carried on dark red stems, but, unlike other Ricinus varieties where both flowers and fruits go un-noticed, 'Impala' produces clusters of creamy-yellow flowers that are followed by spikes of brilliant scarlet-coloured fruits which, by the non-expert, will themselves be thought of as rather exotic-looking. A perennial plant found growing in mountainous areas around, in particular, the Mediterranean. Forming dense clumps of white woolly, velvety foliage, it bears in summer equally white woolly flowering stems with whorls of pretty yellow flowers. It is used to make the popular "Cretan Mountain Tea", said to have many healing properties. **2ft (60cm) HP**

SILENE – Caryophyllaceae

1173A £2.75 S. caroliniana var. pensylvanica (syn. S. pensylvanica)

This is a very beautiful species for the rockery or front of the border – indeed, our supplier considers it to be one of the most attractive spring-flowering subjects in their gardens. We wonder if Robin Hood had a chance to pause long enough to sniff this plant whilst being pursued by the sheriff as it was first found on the walls of that well known castle. Once abundantly flowering on the North American prairies, these distinctive pale lemon-yellow, daisy-like blooms on strong, downy branched stems are very long-flowering from summer until late autumn. A long-lived perennial, it is very low maintenance, drought tolerant and so superb for naturalistic landscaping and brilliant for pollinators. **5½ft (1.7m)** Packet of 10 seeds. **HP**

SILYBUM - Compositae/Asteraceae

1175E £2.45 S. marianum (= St. Mary's: recalls the legend that the leaves of this plant were mottled by the milk of the Virgin Mary).

Milk Thistle, St. Mary's Thistle, Blessed Thistle No! Don't dismiss this plant as just another thistle – it is a striking and most attractive foliage plant with flat rosettes of large, prickly leaves, most strikingly lined and marbled with broad white veins – indeed variegation probably not surpassed for beauty in any other plant – and bearing large heads of sweet-scented, rose-purple flowers. Not only that, but you can eat it: the roots boiled, the flower-heads like Artichokes, and the leaves in salads – which just leaves the prickles! **4ft (1.2m)** HA/HB

SINNINGIA – Gesneriaceae 6410 £2.95 S. speciosa, F1 Hybrid 'Avanti' Formula Mixed Colours.

Gloxinia

These F1 hybrid Gloxinias, bred specifically for the commercial pot flower market, have several advantages, too, for the amateur gardener, even those with only a window sill at their command. These are earlier flowering (in as little as five months from seed), of greater vigour and more compact plants combined with uniformity of growth – a 4 or 5 inch pot is all they ask. In addition, they have more tolerance to lower temperatures and are even easier to grow. SISYRINCHIUM – Iridaceae

SMILACINA – Liliaceae

Now, here's something rather different to ornament your border this summer! From tropical America, it is a most interesting and very showy plant with erect stems, deeply lobed leaves and sepals all ornamentally adorned with many yellow or orange spines. Extraordinarily freely flowering, it bears numerous clusters of pale blue or white flowers, each an inch and a half or so across. These are followed by bright red fruits. It also makes a splendid plant for flowering in pots in your conservatory – put them outside on the patio as a conversation point when you have a barbie! **4ft (1.2m) HHA**

SOLENOSTEMON (syn. Coleus) - Lamiaceae/Labiatae

The ever-popular pot plant, Coleus, that, with its brilliantly coloured leaves, really needs no introduction. One of the nice things about growing this plant from seed is that even the first pair of true leaves that emerge after germination shows signs of the colour to come.

379A £2.95 S. scutellaroides (syn. Coleus blumei),

'Fairway', Extra Dwarf Formula Mixed Ideal for window sill culture is this very fine Coleus strain, extra dwarf in habit, naturally basal branching (i.e. you don't have to go round your plants nipping out the stem tops to encourage this) and producing numerous short-stemmed branches bearing a most pleasing array of painted leaves attractively smaller than your average Coleus leaf. This mixture is a blend of about ten individual luxury colours including velvet-red, bronze and scarlet and all with the lovely markings one associates with this colourful race of plants. 10ins (25cm) TP

Solenostemon scutellaroides, Superfine Rainbow Coleus

SORBUS – Rosaceae

Wild Service Tree, Chequers

Surprisingly rare in cultivation is this most attractive and striking, deciduous tree with sharply lobed, almost Maple-like (the only member of the genus to have such foliage), polished lustrous dark green leaves that turn crimson and yellow in autumn. Downy corymbs of white flowers are borne in June followed by edible, russet-brown fruits rich in vitamin C. Also used for hedging. **40ft (12m) HTr**

SORGHUM – Poaceae/Gramineae

1185E £1.95 S. nigrum. Black Millet

A beautiful but rather underrated species, Black Millet is grown around the world as a crop plant, but it is extremely ornamental. A quite majestic and striking plant with large and robust, dark brown, plume-like inflorescences, it will add drama to your borders and is also excellent for drying. **3ft (90cm) HA**

SPILANTHES OLERACEA. See Acmella oleracea

SPOROBOLUS - Poaceae/Gramineae

1191G £2.55 S. heterolepis. Prairie Dropseed

This is the most elegant and refined of the North American prairie grasses and one that you will be very happy to have as an ornamental in your border. Slow growing, it produces a dense, flowing mound, 15ins tall, of the finest texture composed of the thinnest of thin, thread-like, glossy green blades. In autumn the clump turns a conspicuous deep orange before fading to a light copper for the winter. In late summer the plants bear, on very slender stalks high above the foliage, unbelievably delicate, graceful flower panicles, excellent for cutting. And a completely unexpected bonus: they are perfumed with a fragrance, delicate, sweet or pungent; a blend of coriander and slightly burnt buttered popcom! **2½tf (75cm) HP**

SPRUCE. See Picea

STACHYS - Lamiaceae/Labiatae

1192E £2.30 S. lanata (= woolly) (*syn.* Stachys byzantina). *Lamb's Ear*

A very popular plant with thick, soft, densely woolly, whitish leaves, and attractive, woolly spikes of small purple flowers in July. 11/2ft (45cm) HP

11920 £2.45 S. officinalis (*syn.* Betonica officinalis). *Betony, Bishop's Wort*

A native wild flower of open woodland, bearing all summer spikes of bright reddish-purple flowers. Long used in medicine, a physician to the Emperor Augustus Caesar wrote a book about it; another herbalist stated that it is one of the herbs that ought to be kept in every family! Amongst its many, many virtues, it is said, a decoction with wine gargled in the mouth eases toothache. **2ft (60cm) HP**

STATICE. See Limonium

STEPHANOTIS – Asclepiadaceae

1198 £2.45 S. floribunda (= flowering freely) RHS T

From Madagascar, this is one of the most popular greenhouse plants with its clusters of pure white, very fragrant, waxy flowers from May to July. Although at its best when planted in a bed – in which case they can reach a height of 30ft – they can, however, be grown successfully in pots when, if required, they can be trained in a circle. Requires heated glass (minimum 50°F (10°C). **30ft (9m)** Packet of 10 seeds. **GP(CI)**

STEVIA – see The VegBook

STIPA – Poaceae/Gramineae

1201F £2.95 S. arundinacea (= reed-like) (syn. Anemanthele lessoniana).

Pheasant Tail Grass

Like newly washed hair is how one writer describes the graceful, arching, drooping panicles of (presumably colour-rinsed!) purplish-brown flowers. The seed can be sown mixed with soil and pushed into holes in tree trunks and the like when resulting plants will arch down artistically over their support. It will tolerate very deep shade. Hardy throughout the British Isles. **3ft (1m) HP**

1201E £3.95 S. barbata, 'Silver Feather'

This is a fun plant! Grow it and you'll see what we mean. The plant produces the most enormous, decorative awns (they're the wispy bits you get on grasses). Each of these awns ends in a single, solitary, very large (for a grass) seed. Hence, regrettably, the very high price. A puff of wind and they blow everywhere and no-one can resist picking them up. STOKESIA – Compositae/Asteraceae

1202B £2.99 S. laevis (syn. S.cyanea). Stokes' Aster

A native of South Carolina and Georgia, this lovely plant is one of America's finest (or, to use a word popular in the trade but one, we think, we have avoided so far, choicest) horticultural exports. Various attempts have been made to describe the bloom by comparing it with other flowers like your common Aster, Cornflower or Chicory. None of these, however, do it justice: it has that certain, indescribable quality that puts it in a class of its own. Blue or purplish-blue and borne from late summer until the first frosts and, whereas in the wild these are only an inch or so across, it seems to take to cultivation and, with the right treatment, responds by producing blooms three or four inches across. Good for cut flowers. Needs a well-drained soil. **2ft (60cm)** Packet of 8 seeds. **HP**

STRAWBERRY. See The VegBook

STRELITZIA – Musaceae. Bird-of-Paradise Flower

These plants are unique in that they are the only ones known with flowers pollinated by birds' feet. In the banana family, they have very ornamental foliage and striking flowers.

1205A £4.65 S. juncea (= rush-like)

With flowers very like the popular S reginae but a far more compact plant with spike-like leaves and only growing to about 2ft, this is perhaps the best Strelitzia for cultivation in the smaller greenhouse. 2ft (60cm) Packet of 5 seeds. HHP

These are compact plants with a uniform habit yet will produce plants with all the Streptocarpus colours with the flowers veined and shaded in infinite variety – like snowflakes, each plant will be unique – as each comes into bloom you will inspect it closely and delight. 1207R £3.95 Streptocarpus, 'Dibley's Pink Bouquet', F1 Hybrid

From Dibley's, the UK holder of the National Collection of Streptocarpus, comes this lovely mix of these beautiful flowers in colours of every shade of pink from deep to pale, through to white. SUCCISA – Dipsacaceae

SUCCISELLA – Dipsacaceae

1212A £3.25 S. inflexa (= bent inwards), 'Frosted Pearls'

Developed from a species found in wet places in the southern Balkans is this fine perennial for your border guaranteed to arouse the curiosity of visitors. Forming a tidy clump of spatula-shaped leaves, it bears from June to September branching stems carrying innumerable spherical flower-heads. These are pink when in bud but open to reveal white petals with just the slightest touch of blue. These have great potential as cut flowers. **2½ft (75cm) HP** %≪

SUNFLOWER. See Helianthus annuus

SUTERA (*syn.* Bacopa) – Scrophulariaceae

1212C £3.95 S. cordata, 'Snowtopia White'

Pure white flowers on indispensable plants for the garden. Versatile around the garden, they are outstanding in containers and hanging baskets, overflowing with the greatest of ease – just like a pan of milk boiling over! Very weather tolerant, they are uniquely self-cleaning so no dead-heading means immaculate containers and they bloom for an amazingly long period. These have long attracted the attention of plant breeders, particularly in England, and around 1,000 named cultivars have been recorded – you may think of adding to the list from the best of the plants from this packet! With distinctive dark green, smooth and shiny foliage, you can expect some fine plants to supply you with some lovely flowers to cheer up your autumn garden. And, of course, super cut flowers. If you can, and have the space, grow lots of plants in a reserve border and select (and think of a name!) the ones you like best. Few, however, will disappoint. Average **5ft (1.5m) HP**

148M £2.99 S. oblongifolius. Aromatic Aster

Found growing on limestone glades, slopes and prairies of Missouri, this virtually unknown species is likely to become popular when folk get to see it. Easily grown, it is a bushy, stiff, compact plant with rigid, oblong (how did you guess), 4-inch blue-green leaves, fragrant (again, how did you guess) when crushed. In late summer and autumn it bears a mass (so many indeed they can sometimes tend to weigh the plant down) of one-inch flowers in shades of violet-blue. These are enjoyed by butterflies and flower arrangers. **2ft (60cm) HP**

SYMPHYTUM – Boraginaceae

1215P £2.95 S. officinale. Common Comfrey, Alum BEST SELLER This is a handsome native wild flower with attractive drooping clusters of blue, purple, pink or cream, bell-shaped flowers in early summer. Well known for centuries as a medicinal plant, but the leaves are now regularly used as a compost activator helping the breakdown of other compost materials. Comfrey is also often used as a mulch or as a liquid green manure. 4ft (1.2m) HP ♠

TACCA – Taccaceae

£4.25 T. chantrieri. Bat Plant 12204

This weird plant has created a considerable amount of interest in recent years. When this plant was first introduced into cultivation from the depths of Far Eastern forests at the turn of the century, it was probably grown as a rather splendid, Anthurium-like, foliage plant. However, nowadays it is for the strange heads of dark brownish-purple, almost black in fact, flowers that the Bat Plant is grown. Sombre enough to be out of place even at a funeral, these strange and sinister flowers, with their almost grotesque, 12in. long, shoe-lace-like attachments, are quite unlike any other and are going to excite, at the very least, curiosity in all that see it. 2ft (60cm) Packet of 15 seeds. TAGETES – Compositae/Asteraceae. Marigold

This genus includes some of the commonest and most popular annuals grown. In spite of their common names, they all originate from Mexico. All are easy to grow and are useful for cutting.

Tagetes patula (= spreading). French Marigold

This well-known, small bushy annual, flowering continuously all summer (even longer if you bring in and pot a plant or two for a window-sill), is as near as you can get to an instant flower, the first buds appearing in a very few weeks from sowing. For this reason, always have a packet to hand - if all else fails, a packet sown in June will quickly cheer up an otherwise bare patch. May be hardy outside in some seasons with frost-free protection in winter.

If this were a rare and exotic plant, how we would all seek it out to plant in our gardens - few plants can equal the sheet of chrome-yellow produced by a group of them in full bloom. So well known there is really no need to say more about it except emphasise that there are not many months in the year when a few flowers cannot be found on it - indeed as the saying goes "When gorse is out of bloom, kissing is out of season"! Does best on poor, dry, acid soil. Useful for hedges. 6ft (1.8m) HSh
