Mylan plant workers share their stories of uncertainty

MORE COVERAGE

THIS IS THE FIRST story in a three-part series. Subsequent stories will appear in Wednesday's and Friday's editions.

Employees at the Viatris Morgantown Mylan plant are staring

into a pit of uncertainty as the July 31 plant closure looms.

A number of United Steelworkers Local 8-957 workers shared with The Dominion Post their stories about how that uncertainty is affecting them. Today we hear from Dawn Golden and Chad McCormick.

The recently issued Viatris WARN notice says 1,431 employees will be laid off or separated.

The initial July 31 separation will involve 482 non-union workers and 764 union workers — a total of 1,246 — leaving 185. Further separations are expected Aug. 31, Oct. 31, Dec. 31 and next March 31.

Dawn Golden

Golden has been with Mylan for 23 years. "I'm still with

Mylan. I don't consider myself working for Viatris."

She's married; her husband was injured some years ago and no longer works. She has an adult daughter who's married and has two kids; her son-in-law also works at the plant.

To explain how she feels now, she looked back to 2005, when she

Economy is growing as workers are lacking

WASHINGTON — The U.S. economy is sparking confusion and whiplash almost as fast as it's adding jobs.

Barely more than a year after the coronavirus caused the steepest economic fall and job losses on record, the speed of the rebound has been so unexpectedly swift that many companies can't fill jobs or acquire enough supplies to meet a pent-up burst of customer demand.

"Things exploded — it was like a light switch," said Kirby Mallon, president of Elmer Schultz Services, a family-owned Philadelphia firm that repairs and maintains kitchen equipment for restaurants and other clients. "The labor market is just out of control. We ramped up so quickly, the supply chain wasn't ready for it."

Economic forecasters, with little historical precedent to guide them through the aftermath of a global pandemic, are pondering questions they can't answer with any confidence:

Does robust consumer spending reflect economic strength and resiliency?

Was an April run-up in consumer prices a temporary blip? Or an ominous sign of accelerating inflation?

Are two months of middling job growth the result of too much of a good thing — employers want to hire more than they can? Or a hint that the labor market isn't as strong as economists think?

In many ways, the news has been cause to cheer: The economy grew from January through

Homeownership out of reach for many in Morgantown

Ask young people in Morgantown why they don't put down roots here and many will tell you the same thing: They can't afford it.

"I don't know when we'd be able to buy a house," Melanie Raleigh said. "At the very least, like if we're looking in Morgantown, probably never."

Raleigh moved to West Virginia when she was a child and would have been willing to live elsewhere, but she stayed because of her partner's "pure stubbornness," she said. "He likes West Virginia."

It took Raleigh's parents 20 years to save a down payment for a house. She thinks she's doing

a little better, but even then, she said they are still saving for that down payment.

Raleigh, 33, is working toward a master's in psychology and her partner, who is 38, works in accounting. They've saved for a while, but their budget remains tight at \$100,000 maximum. At this point, Raleigh said they'll have to set their sights elsewhere.

"It seems like ... anything that's decently close to town is out of our price range," she said. "There are houses all around me right now that are up for sale. The house right next to me just got purchased for more than a quarter of a million dollars."

"So we've been looking at other places like Grafton."

Married couple Meagan Szorady, 29, and Nick Szczecinski, 31, transplanted to Morgantown from Cleveland at the start of the pandemic, when Szczecinski accepted a job with West Virginia University. They settled into a \$300,000 home in South Park.

"Back in Cleveland," Szorady said, "a house like this would maybe be like \$150,000 or \$200,000."

The snapshot statistics

According to Melissa Hornbeck, a broker with White Diamond Realty LLC, housing prices in Monongalia County are, in general, "higher than the national median, as well as our neighbors to all sides of us, including Pennsylvania. Morgantown proper is higher than parts of the county but comparable to others such as Cheat Lake."

White Diamond Realty regularly publishes a real estate snapshot for the greater Morgantown

Retirement facilities try to get to 'normal'

Some still struggle with COVID-19

Local retirement communities faced hardship at the unexpected onset of the COVID-19 pandemic as they worked to determine the best ways to protect their residents and staff.

Now, those same facilities are in better places and are beginning to experience some normalcy reminiscent of what they had prior to the pandemic.

Donna Tennant is the admission and marketing director at Sundale Nursing Home on JD Anderson Drive. She said Sundale had to contend with an outbreak of COVID-19 in its facility in March 2020. The outbreak affected about 30 residents as well as some staff members.

"We weathered it well with the assistance of Dr. [Carl] Shrader and an amazing team here at Sundale, working with the residents to keep them well and cared for," Tennant said.

Since then, the facility has been extremely cautious. Some staff at Sundale have tested positive for COVID-19 over the past year, but the facility has not had any residents contract COVID-19 since that initial outbreak.

The facility is proud of that fact, as staff and administrators at Sundale worked hard to reach that point.

"Sometimes it is difficult for families to understand why we're so protective, but we did lose five residents that they determined [passed] because of COVID. We've been determined that we won't lose any more," Tennant said.

Families can now visit loved ones at Sundale as long as they are scheduled. If they have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19, they must still wear masks in the facility. Unvaccinated individuals or individuals with quarantined loved ones are still required to wear full PPE gowning.

The staff at Sundale continues

Biden rebuffs GOP infrastructure offer as he cites broader objectives

WASHINGTON — President Joe Biden has dismissed a fresh Republican infrastructure proposal that offered modestly more spending but fell short of “his objectives to grow the economy,” the White House said.

His reaction Friday cast further doubt on the two parties’ prospects for striking compromise on one of the administration’s chief legislative priorities as deadlines slip and time runs out to make progress toward a deal.

The White House released the statement after Biden spoke by phone with West Virginia Sen. Shelley Moore Capito, the chief GOP negotiator. Both sides said the two

GOP well short of the \$1.7 trillion that Biden is seeking.

In a further sign that a deal with Capito was seeming increasingly less likely, the White House said Biden told Capito that he would “continue to engage a number of senators in both parties in the hopes of achieving a more substantial package.”

For weeks, the president has been engaged in talks with GOP senators trying to strike a compromise on Biden’s top legislative a priority, the big infrastructure investment package. While the two sides appear to have narrowed the price gap between his initial \$2.3 trillion proposal and the GOP’s \$568 billion opening bid, they remain far apart on the scope of the deal and how to pay for it.

Biden wants to raise corporate taxes to generate revenues for the infrastructure investments, a non-starter for Republicans. The GOP senators propose tapping unspent COVID-19 relief aid to pay for the roads, bridges and other projects, an idea rejected by Democrats.

Earlier in the day, after the release of a modest May jobs report, Biden made the case for his robust investment package to push the economy past the COVID-19 crisis and downturn and into a new era.

would speak again on Monday, but Biden’s team made clear the president will be casting about for talks with other senators.

“The President expressed his gratitude for her effort and goodwill, but also indicated that the current offer did not meet his objectives to grow the economy, tackle the climate crisis and create new jobs,” White House press secretary Jen Psaki said.

A Capito statement provided no detail about their discussion or the new offer.

Making the pitch for Republicans, Capito had suggested around a \$50 billion boost above the previous Republican offer of \$928 billion, the White House said, still leaving the

New England’s success against COVID-19 could be the model

BOSTON — For Dr. Jeremy Faust, the moment he realized the pandemic no longer dominated his workday came over Memorial Day weekend, when he didn’t see a single coronavirus case over two shifts in the emergency room at Brigham and Women’s Hospital in Boston.

Kerry LaBarbera, an ER nurse a few miles away at Boston Medical Center, had a similar realization that same weekend, when just two patients with COVID-19 came through her unit, one of the busiest in New England.

“The past year and a half has been like going through a tornado or

something terrible,” she said. “You’re holding on for dear life, and then you get past it and it’s like, ‘What just happened?’”

Massachusetts and the rest of New England — the most heavily vaccinated region in the U.S. — are giving the rest of the country a possible glimpse of the future if more Americans get their shots.

COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations and deaths in the region have been steadily dropping as more than 60% of residents in all six states have received at least one dose of the vaccine.

The Deep South states of Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi, in comparison, are the least vaccinated at around 35%,

and new cases relative to the population are generally running higher there. Nationally, about 50% of Americans have received at least one shot.

In Massachusetts, health officials this past week determined none of the state’s cities and towns are at high risk for the spread of COVID-19 for the first time since they started issuing weekly assessments last August.

In Rhode Island, coronavirus hospitalizations have hit their lowest levels in about eight months. And Vermont, the most heavily vaccinated state in the U.S. at more than 70%, went more than two weeks without a single reported coronavirus death.

Maine’s blueberry crop faces peril

PORTLAND, Maine — Maine’s beloved wild blueberry fields are home to one of the most important fruit crops in New England, and scientists have found they are warming at a faster rate than the rest of the state.

The warming of the blueberry fields could imperil the berries and the farmers who tend to them because the rising temperatures have brought loss of water, according to a group of scientists who are affiliated with the University of Maine.

The scientists analyzed 40 years of data and found that the state experienced a 1.98 degrees Fahrenheit increase in average temperature, but the blueberry fields of Down East Maine experienced an increase of 2.34 degrees Fahrenheit.

That seemingly small difference is significant, because rising temperatures could lead to water deficits that put the blueberries at risk, said Rafa Tasnim, a doctoral candidate in ecology and environmental science at UMaine and the study’s

lead author. Lack of water could result in smaller crop sizes and blueberries that are less likely to survive to be harvested.

“What we are expecting is the temperature is going to increase a lot and we will not get as much rainfall in the summertime especially,” said Tasnim, who led a research team that published the study in the research journal Water earlier this year. “What that will mean for the wild blueberry plants is they will be water stressed.”

March at a red-hot 6.4% annual pace. And in the current quarter, that pace is thought to be accelerating to nearly double-digits.

Employers last month added 559,000 jobs on top of 278,000 in April. Those would ordinarily be healthy numbers. Some economists had envisioned the recovery from the pandemic recession driving monthly job growth of 800,000, 900,000, even 1 million or more.

What explains the shortfall? Economists point mainly to what they call a short-term mismatch: Companies are posting job openings faster than applicants can respond.

Some say the labor shortage is nothing that can’t be solved the old-fashioned way: By raising pay and offering more generous benefits and working conditions. In fact, that process appears to have begun: Average hourly wages rose solidly in April and May.

lost the lower part of a leg in a motorcycle accident.

When she awoke and realized what had happened, she said, "I didn't cry." People were amazed. But she knew the Mylan culture. It was a family. "Until you go through something like this, you don't know what it's about."

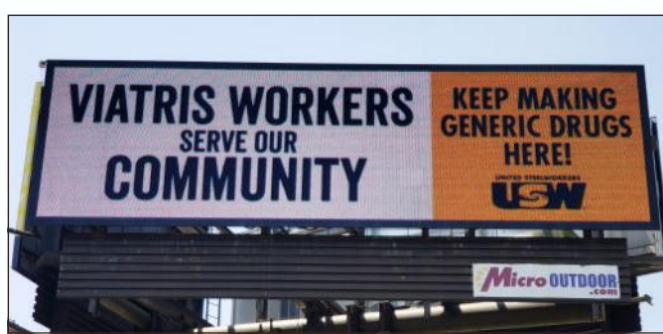
She knew she was going to walk again. And her supervisor came to the hospital, she said, and told her that her job was waiting. "That was Mylan. Now we have Viatris ... We as a union are sitting there, still waiting on what our severance is going to be."

"You're talking about

men and women who have worked in that powder and breathed that powder and worked in that raw material, and that doesn't mean anything to them? It's because of these people that they have what they have ... It's sad that they don't respect us the way that we respected our company. We gave them everything. We bled blue."

Golden can live and work on \$12 an hour, a fraction of her current pay, but health insurance is a big factor in what she decides to do, she said. Insurance may run her \$800 a month. Will she return to her side job as a hairdresser? What will she give up?

Back in 2005 after the accident, "I never went into that dark hole." Now, "This

is really causing problems for a lot of people."

Golden is one of many who said the company culture, the family atmosphere, changed when Mylan founder Milan Puskar retired as board chairman in 2009. Puskar was there in the building; He was hands-on.

She recalls that she faced a few red tape hurdles when she went to return to work after her accident.

"It was Mike who made the phone call and said, 'Hey, this little girl wants to come back to work. You find her a place.' He said, 'I walk these halls all the time. I know there's jobs here for her.'"

The next day she got the return-to-work call. "Mike was all about, if he made money, everybody right down to the janitor made money. When Mike left, that went with him."

At one time, she said, Mylan was the top generic

company in the U.S. "We were the mother ship. We enabled them to build all of what they've built in other countries." And now Viatris is closing the plant.

She recalls that on the day Mylan became Viatris, employees were watching what was going on at other plants around the world on big-screen TV's.

"They were all celebrating. They had cake and were releasing balloons outside. As we're sitting there watching, going, 'Where's our balloons? Where's our cupcakes ... Now we all know why we didn't get cupcakes, why we didn't get balloons. Because we were closing ... I'm just disappointed. Very disappointed.'"

Golden is 59, too young to retire, she said. But she's not looking at leaving. She hopes her daughter and her husband stay, too. But that will depend on what job he finds.

"God's got this. He closes one door; they say He opens

another. I've given a lot to God before. He's got this to take care of as well."

Along with working for just over 20 years at the plant, McCormick is recording secretary for USW Local 8-957.

The news of the plant closure was a surprise, he said. He had a weird feeling the night before the December closure announcement when people were sent home. And they had been seeing fewer doses going out the door, less work at the plant.

"We were probably expecting bad news in the form of a layoff, but as far as a plant shutdown, that was a complete surprise."

Severance package talks with the USW are currently stalled. The quality of the severance will directly affect employees' opportunities, McCormick said. A longer severance package will allow more time to get educated, retooled, reschooled. A shorter severance will force them to return to work faster.

For himself, "It's going to be really hard to take a \$35 an hour job and lose it and replace it in the area." He expects to make half that or less.

McCormick is a high school graduate exploring his education options.

"My whole adult life has been at Mylan Pharmaceu-

ticals. I assumed that when I started at Mylan at 22 years of age that those days were over, that this was my career: I'm going to get paid a good, quality wage to do a good, quality job of high responsibility."

He worked his way up to day shift and was approaching five weeks of vacation. "I'm where I want to be in life. I'm in my happy place, I guess you could say. Now that's being yanked out from underneath of me. I don't know what I'm going to do."

He knows he won't move, he said. His family and his wife's family are both from here. His wife works, so they're not facing a total loss of income, but a severe reduction.

"There's going to be some lifestyle changes. It's going to affect the recreational activities we do as a family. It's going to affect our travel. We're obviously going to be able to eat and survive."

Like Golden, he reflected on Puskar's values and legacy and what Viatris has decided to do.

"I'm very upset that these jobs are going overseas," he said, where looser regulations and lower wages will help maximize profits.

"The sick to my stomach part comes from not knowing what I'm doing next."

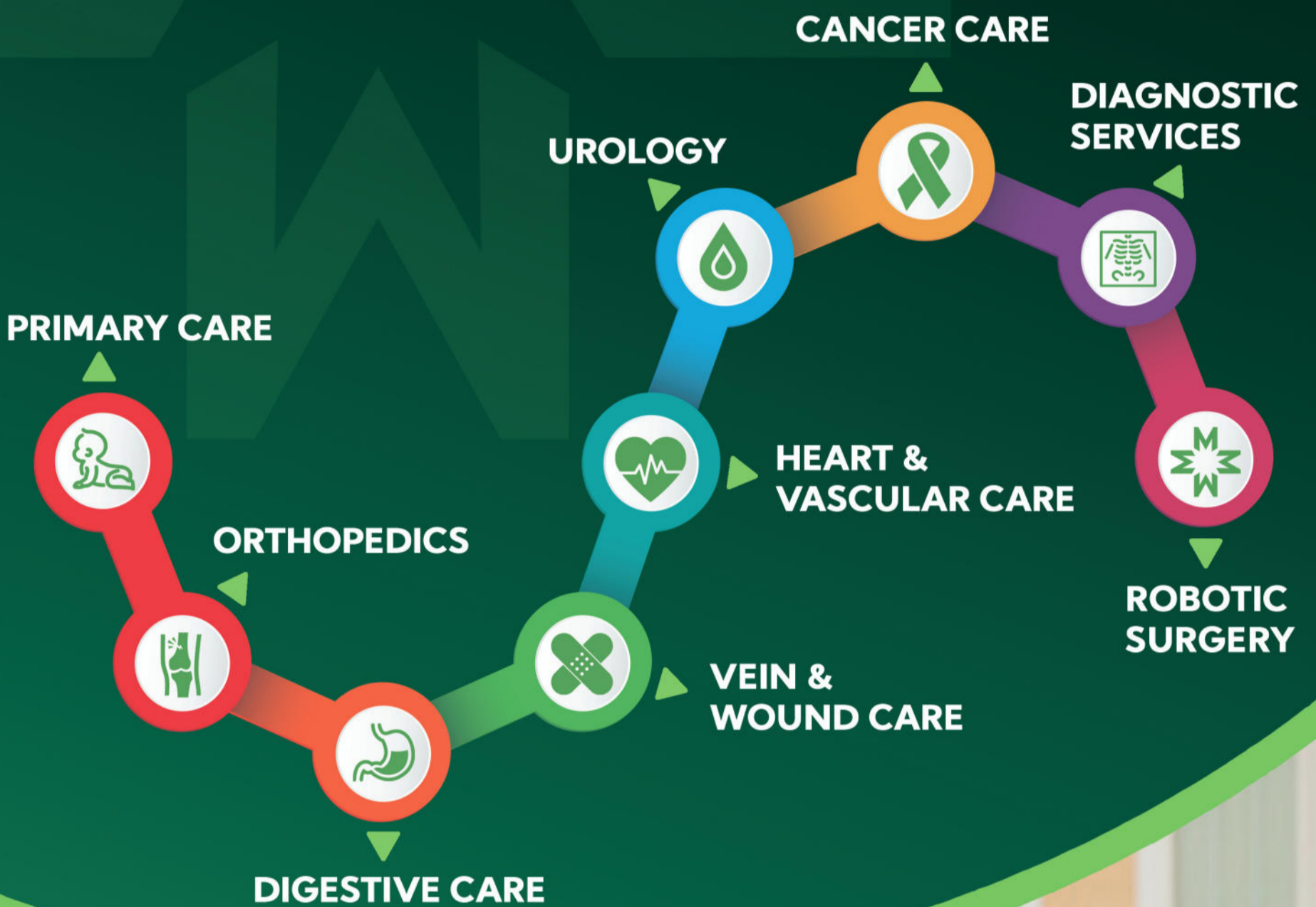

to be swabbed and tested for COVID-19 each week. Up until last week, all staff underwent testing twice a week. The recent change mandated staff who have been fully vaccinated only need to be swabbed once a week, while unvaccinated staff needs to continue to undergo testing twice a week.

Residents are swabbed and tested on an as-needed basis.

"We continue to do that to make sure that we do not get COVID here in this facility again," Tennant said.

She said an estimated 90% of residents and 60% of staff at Sundale are now fully vaccinated against COVID-19. Since the vaccinations, administrators at Sundale have started to feel more comfortable allowing residents to gather together, participate in activities, enjoy communal

dining and venture outside when the weather permits.

"We're starting to see a whole different world, and we love it," Tennant said.

Harmony

Mark Terry has been the executive director of Harmony at Morgantown on Point Marion Road for three weeks, but he has knowledge of the history of the facility and how it handled the pandemic.

He said Harmony is not unique in that COVID-19 took the entire world by surprise. Assisted living facilities typically keep small supplies of PPE and disinfectants on hand for general use and minor health conditions but not the extensive supply the pandemic demanded.

Residents who were accustomed to thriving in a social environment had to face changes in everyday lifestyles as the pandemic hit the state. Visitation was restricted; only essential staff members, namely doc-

tors and nurses, were permitted in the facility.

"That was a necessary step. Because of those steps, we were able to keep COVID out of the community. We're very happy to report that none of our residents through this entire pandemic ever contracted the COVID-19 virus," Terry said.

Terry said the facility slowly "ramped up" its method of protection against the pandemic. The company had to jump through hoops to ensure that staff and residents had access to appropriate PPE. The materials eventually came, but they weren't readily available in March 2020.

He said throughout the pandemic, the facility followed CDC guidelines.

"Today, we find ourselves in a [situation] much different than it was a year ago," Terry said. Just two weeks ago, the facility reopened its dining facilities so residents could enjoy dinner with each other again. The facility has also

regained a sense of normalcy regarding its activities and programming as it allows entertainers to come into the community and residents to gather in groups and socialize.

"We're slowly but surely returning back to a pre-COVID time, but we're still very cautious," he said. Anyone coming into the facility must still have their temperature taken, and masks are still required for staff and visitors. Residents are encouraged to wear masks in common areas.

All residents at Harmony are fully vaccinated against COVID-19. The facility is asking new residents to also receive COVID-19 vaccinations. Also, 95% of the staff has been vaccinated.

Evergreen

Meanwhile, Assisted Living at Evergreen on Collins Ferry Road didn't experience a COVID-19 outbreak until January.

Administrator Lori Rankin said the facility completely shut down in

late March 2020 and reopened in June with visitor restrictions. Each resident was permitted up to two visitors for one hour, made by appointment. No more than four visitors were permitted in the building at a time.

Visitors were required to wear masks, complete a COVID-19 questionnaire, have their temperatures checked and meet their loved one in designated locations if their loved one shared a room with another resident. Social distancing was also required. Hand sanitizer stations were — and still are — available throughout the facility.

Masks are still required in the facility regardless of whether an individual is fully vaccinated. This applies to both visitors and staff.

Evergreen had an outbreak from Jan. 10 to Feb. 14.

"It started in one corridor, went right to the next and it came downstairs to a

corridor and came right across," Rankin said.

She said all the residents' temperatures were in normal ranges. They experienced mild congestion. According to Rankin, this outbreak occurred after many residents had received their first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.

Last week, one Evergreen resident tested positive for COVID-19 at a nearby hospital. The resident remained at the hospital for a brief period before being released back to the facility. The resident is through their 10 days now, but Evergreen will remain shut down until it conducts its second PCR testing.

"If all of those tests come back negative, then we are able to reopen to visitors, and residents can go on outings," Rankin said.

She said out of 31 residents, 30 are vaccinated. Out of 27 staff members, six are vaccinated.

area. According to Hornbeck, "The average selling price for a single-family detached home in 2020 was \$326,253, while attached was \$192,396."

The snapshot's statistics for 2021 show the average price for a detached home is over \$329,000, and the average price for a townhouse or condo is around \$215,000.

Carolyn Brown, 31, and her boyfriend rent a townhouse, and while they've looked at buying a house, she knows her credit score will be a major barrier to securing a mortgage.

"[The credit's] not even awful; it's just, I know how banks can be," she said. "I know that right now, a bank will just kind of laugh me out of the room."

A true "townie," Brown faces another struggle many young Morgantown residents share.

"I know housing gets a

little bit cheaper the further away from Morgantown you get. But we have our families here," she said. "It's also expensive to move away ... Everything, when it comes to moving, just costs so much money that you get kind of stuck in a situation that you might not want to be in."

The rental trap

Raleigh and her partner have been in the same apartment for over 10 years. Their apartment building still has steam heating, which she said won't be found in a building less than 100 years old, and most of the electrical outlets aren't grounded.

"This place is kind of falling apart," Raleigh said, "but it's also only \$700 a month, and it includes utilities."

According to Victoria Shuman with Howard Hanna Realty, rent in Morgantown ranges from around \$400 to \$1,000. Cen-

sus data from 2015-19 puts Morgantown's median rent at \$851, making Raleigh's apartment one of the most affordable.

The rent for a house is much steeper. Shuman said a townhouse can rent from anywhere between \$1,200 to \$2,500 per month, and a detached house can run from \$1,000 to \$3,500 per month.

"Rents are pretty high in Morgantown," said Shuman. "If your plan is to stay in the area for more than two to three years, I would always suggest buying, especially with interest rates being favorable."

Hornbeck agrees. "More often than not, your mortgage payment will be less than your rent payment."

This is true for Brown, and her boyfriend, who rent a townhouse for \$950 a month, plus utilities. As they've looked into buying, they've considered keeping their monthly mortgage payment similar to what

they currently pay in rent and could afford a house upwards of \$200,000, she said — about the average price of a townhouse.

"I did the math one time, and if my rent was a mortgage payment, like a 30-year mortgage payment, this place would be valued at like \$307,000, which is ridiculous."

Shuman said the advantages of renting including having no maintenance and nothing to sell when you're ready to move. Pros of owning your own home, though, include "putting your money toward an investment, being able to make alterations" and it could be profitable if you sell the house later.

Hornbeck also points to other financial pros of homeownership, such as the tax benefits and appreciation of value/growing equity. "When you own your own home, the benefits of owning far outweigh the cons."

When Szorady and

Szczecinski made the move to Morgantown, they decided to take the plunge and purchase a house instead of renting as they had before.

"We kind of knew that if we rented, we wouldn't stop renting," Szorady said. "There's never a good time to put down a bunch of money. So we kind of looked at townhomes, but we sort of wanted our own place, our own yard."

For Szorady and Szczecinski, the draw of homeownership was primarily in the freedom of it.

"In the place we had lived in before in Cleveland Heights, the landlord was stretched thin," said Szorady. "And so things really didn't get maintained in the way you want them to be. And so we wanted to be able to say, 'Oh, there's something wrong with this.' We can just call someone and have it fixed."

"Or how we power-washed this porch a couple

days ago," Szczecinski added. "It was awesome. Yeah, we rented the thing, we blasted away the dirt and we didn't have to wait or ask permission or look at garbage peeling paint like we used to."

Dylan Sheldon, 28, and his wife bypassed renting altogether and bought their first home in Bridgeport, an 850-square-foot fixer-upper. They now live in a home in South Park — also a fixer-upper.

"I thought before we bought our first house, we would probably end up renting," he said. "So, it really was just by chance that we ended up buying. But looking back, I was convinced renting [was] my only option. But I think my perspective has changed."

"I've seen some rental rates here in Morgantown, and they can be pretty pricey. And my mortgage is nowhere near most of them."

Virginia Dems to decide: Return McAuliffe or chart a new path?

RICHMOND, Va. — Former Virginia Gov. Terry McAuliffe's signature exuberance was on full display as he campaigned on Memorial Day weekend in downtown Petersburg, cracking jokes in a beauty salon, leading a rousing rendition of "Happy Birthday" and breaking into a dance on a sidewalk.

"I want everybody to know we are back here in Virginia, and we're going to be stronger than we've ever been. We are going to lead the nation out of this COVID crisis," he told a crowd of supporters and spectators that began chanting his name.

In his quest for a second term, McAuliffe heads into Tuesday's five-way Democratic primary with an undeniable lead in public polling,

name recognition, endorsements and money. But the question facing voters in the primary election is whether the political veteran with decades of experience is the right man for the moment in a state and nation deeply divided and in the throes of unsettling change.

In Virginia, Democrats assumed full control of state government in 2020, two years after McAuliffe left office, and pushed through sweeping change, from gun control to police reform to marijuana legalization to an increase in the minimum wage, transforming what was once a reliably red state into an outlier in the South.

McAuliffe is an old-school politician who cut his teeth working on President Jimmy Carter's re-election campaign and later led the Democratic

National Committee. If he wins the nomination, he'll face a tough GOP challenger from Northern Virginia who has the endorsement of former President Donald Trump and vast personal wealth to boost his campaign.

That's not a matchup in tune with the times or that bodes well for Democrats, say McAuliffe's two leading primary opponents — a well-respected veteran state senator and an energetic former state delegate both looking for a shot to become the nation's first Black woman governor.

Virginians deserve better than two "millionaire out-of-touch politicians" at the top of the ticket, Jennifer Carroll Foy, who stepped down last year from her state House seat to focus on her run for governor, said in an interview.

GOP aims to revive its Fauci attacks after email trove released

WASHINGTON — Dr. Anthony Fauci has been a political lightning rod since the early days of the pandemic, lionized by the left and villainized by the right.

But with the release of a trove of Fauci's emails this past week, Republicans' political attacks on the nation's top government infectious-diseases expert have gone into overdrive.

On conservative news channels, President Joe Biden's pandemic adviser has been baselessly pilloried as a liar who misled the American people about the origins of COVID-19 to protect the Chinese government. There's no evidence of wrongdoing, but Republican calls for his resignation have grown louder, as have demands for new investigations into the origins of the virus.

"Given what we know now, I don't know how any-

one can have confidence that he should remain in a position of public trust and authority," said Republican Sen. Josh Hawley of Missouri, a potential presidential hopeful who is calling for Fauci's resignation and a full congressional inquiry.

The political moves by Republicans represent a new effort to find a reliable foil in the first few months of the Biden administration, as they have struggled to turn public sentiment against the new president. So far, Biden has enjoyed widespread job approval, buoyed by the public's broad backing of his handling of the pandemic, which 71% of Americans support, according to a recent Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research poll.

Fauci, who has a security detail because of ongoing threats and who did not respond to a request for comment for this story, has

repeatedly defended his work, saying he received thousands of emails and has never ruled out any theory.

"I still believe the most likely origin is from an animal species to a human, but I keep an absolutely open mind that if there may be other origins of that, there may be another reason, it could have been a lab leak," Fauci said Thursday on CNN.

The doctor's newly released emails, which span the early days of the pandemic and were obtained by BuzzFeed News and The Washington Post, show no evidence of any kind of coverup about the origin of the virus. Indeed, many of the discussions reflect the science at the time. But Republicans, including former President Donald Trump, have seized on the emails as proof of a conspiracy to obscure the source of the virus.

'There is stuff': Enduring mysteries trail the U.S. report on UFOs

WASHINGTON — The blob, captured on distant, fuzzy video by Navy pilots,

seems to skitter just above the ocean waves at improbable speed, with no discernible means of propulsion or lift. "Oh my gosh,

man," one aviator says to another as they laugh at the oddity. "What ... is it?"

Is it a bird? A plane? Super drone? An extraterrestrial something?

The U.S. government has been taking a hard look at unidentified flying objects like this one. A report summarizing what the U.S. knows about "unidentified aerial phenomena" — better known as UFOs — is expected to be made public this month.

There won't be an alien unmasking. Two officials briefed on the report say it found no extraterrestrial link to the sightings reported and captured on

video. The report won't rule out a link to another country, according to the officials, who spoke on condition of anonymity because they weren't authorized to discuss it.

While the broad conclusions have now been reported, the full report may still present a broader picture of what the government knows. The anticipation surrounding the report shows how a topic normally confined to science fiction and a small, often dismissed group of researchers has hit the mainstream.

Worried about national security threats from adversaries, lawmakers

ordered an investigation and public accounting of phenomena that the government has been loath to talk about for generations.

"There is stuff flying in our airspace," Republican Sen. Marco Rubio of Florida, one of the senators who pressed for the probe, recently told Fox News. "We don't know what it is. We need to find out."

Congress late last year instructed the director of national intelligence to provide "a detailed analysis of unidentified aerial phenomena data" from multiple agencies and report in 180 days. That time is about up. The intelligence office

wouldn't say this past week when the full document will be out.

The bill passed by Congress asks the intelligence director for "any incidents or patterns that indicate a potential adversary may have achieved breakthrough aerospace capabilities that could put United States strategic or conventional forces at risk."

The chief concern is whether hostile countries are fielding aerial technology so advanced and weird that it befuddles and threatens the world's largest military power.

Judge overturns 32-year ban on assault weapons

SACRAMENTO, Calif. — A federal judge has overturned California's three-decade-old ban on assault weapons, calling it a "failed experiment" that violates people's constitutional right to bear arms.

U.S. District Judge Roger Benitez of San Diego ruled on Friday that the state's definition of illegal military-style rifles unlawfully deprives law-abiding Californians of weapons commonly allowed in most other states and by the U.S. Supreme Court.

Under no level of heightened scrutiny can the law survive," Benitez said. He issued a permanent injunction against enforcement of the law but stayed it for 30 days to give state Attorney General Rob Bonta time to appeal.

Gov. Gavin Newsom condemned the decision, calling it "a direct threat to public safety and the

lives of innocent Californians, period."

Protest erupts again over man killed by cops

MINNEAPOLIS — Protesters faced off with officers in Minneapolis early Saturday over the shooting death of a man by members of a U.S. Marshals task force.

Photos from the scene following a vigil for Winston Boogie Smith Jr., 32, showed dumpster fires in the street and a line of officers standing guard. It was the second night of protests in response to the fatal shooting Thursday in Minneapolis' Uptown neighborhood.

Authorities said Friday that Smith was wanted on a weapons violation and fired a gun before two deputies shot him while he was inside a parked vehicle. Members of the U.S. Marshals Fugitive Task Force were trying to arrest him on a warrant for allegedly being a felon in possession of a gun.

Family and friends described Smith as a father of three who was often

harassed by police. They are demanding transparency in the investigation and have asked that anyone who might have video footage to come forward.

Police said some people vandalized buildings and stole from businesses after the shooting Thursday. Nine people were arrested on possible charges including suspicion of riot, assault, arson and damage to property.

The fatal shooting comes as Minneapolis has been on edge since the death of George Floyd just over a year ago and the fatal shooting of Daunte Wright by an officer in nearby Brooklyn Center in April.

DOJ says it'll no longer seize reporters' records

WASHINGTON — The Justice Department said Saturday that it no longer will secretly obtain reporters' records during leak investigations, a policy shift that abandons a practice decried by news organizations and press freedom groups.

The reversal follows a

pledge last month by President Joe Biden, who had said it was "simply, simply wrong" to seize journalists' records and that he would not permit the Justice Department to continue the practice. Though Biden's comments in an interview were not immediately accompanied by any change in policy, a pair of statements from the White House and Justice Department on Saturday signaled an official turnabout from an investigative tactic that has persisted for years.

Democratic and Republican administrations alike have used subpoenas and court orders to obtain journalists' records in an effort to identify sources who have revealed classified information. But the practice had received renewed scrutiny over the past month as Justice Department officials had alerted reporters at three news organizations — The Washington Post, CNN and The New York Times — that their phone records had been obtained in the final year of the

Trump administration.

The latest revelation came Friday night when the Times reported the existence of a gag order that had barred the newspaper from revealing a secret court fight over efforts to obtain the email records of four reporters. That tussle had begun during the Trump administration but had persisted under the Biden Justice Department, which ultimately moved to withdraw the gag order.

Priest refuses bishop's demand to resign

MADISON, Wis. — The Rev. James Altman calls himself "a lowly priest" serving a blue-collar city in western Wisconsin. But when his bishop demanded his resignation — after a series of divisive remarks about politics and the pandemic — Altman refused to oblige and has since raised more than \$640,000 from his conservative supporters to defend himself.

While not unprecedented, a Catholic priest's refusal to abide by a

bishop's call to resign is certainly rare. Altman's case, which has garnered national attention and made him a celebrity of sorts among conservative Catholics, has further fueled the divide between them and those urging a more progressive, inclusive church.

Altman, pastor of St. James the Less Roman Catholic Church in La Crosse, first came into prominence before the 2020 election with a fiery video on YouTube.

"You cannot be Catholic and be a Democrat," said Altman, admonishing people to "repent of your support of that party and its platform or face the fires of hell."

He reiterated that sentiment recently while also criticizing vaccination efforts and restrictions on church gatherings related to COVID-19.

On May 23, Altman announced during a homily that the Diocese of La Crosse's bishop, William Patrick Callahan, had asked for his resignation.

Mine-sniffing rat Magawa ends working in Cambodia

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia — After five years of sniffing out land mines and unexploded ordnance in Cambodia, Magawa is retiring.

The African giant pouched rat has been the most successful rodent trained and overseen by a Belgian nonprofit, APOPO, to find land mines and alert his human handlers so the explosives can be safely removed. Last year, Magawa won a British charity's top civilian award for animal bravery — an honor so far exclusively reserved for dogs.

"Although still in good health, he has reached a retirement age and is clearly starting to slow down," APOPO said. "It is time."

Magawa has cleared more than 1.5 million square feet of land, the equivalent of some 20 soc-

cer fields, sniffing out 71 land mines and 38 items of unexploded ordnance, according to APOPO.

While many rodents can be trained to detect scents and will work at repetitive tasks for food rewards, APOPO decided that African giant pouched rats were best suited to land mine clearance because their size allows them to walk across mine fields

without triggering the explosives — and do it much more quickly than people. They also live up to eight years.

Magawa is part of a cohort of rats bred for this purpose. He was born in Tanzania in 2014, and in 2016, moved to Cambodia's northwestern city of Siem Reap, home of the famed Angkor temples, to begin his bomb-sniffing career.

Before the final verdict, Mladic's legacy is divisive

SARAJEVO, Bosnia-Herzegovina — Fikret Grabovica wants to see at least some remorse from wartime Bosnian Serb military commander Ratko Mladic when U.N. judges deliver their final verdict for genocide and other war crimes committed during Bosnia's 1990s ethnic carnage.

Grabovica's 11-year-old daughter, Irma, was among the 10,000 civilians killed in the relentless shelling and sniping that Serb troops under Mladic inflicted on the Bosnian capital of Sarajevo.

But an apology is unlikely from the general known as the "Butcher of Bosnia" for his ruthless campaigns of mass murder and expulsion.

Nearly three decades after Europe's worst conflict since World War II, a U.N. war crimes court in The Hague, Netherlands, is

set on Tuesday to close the case against Mladic, the most notorious figure in the 1992-95 war that killed more than 100,000 people and left millions homeless.

"If only he would admit that he made a mistake, that he was wrong," said Grabovica. "But that won't happen."

The tribunal sentenced Mladic in 2017 to life imprisonment, after convicting him of masterminding crimes throughout the 1992-95 Bosnian War, including genocide in the eastern enclave of Srebrenica in 1995, where his forces murdered more than 8,000 Muslim Bosnian men and boys.

Mladic appealed, but the case has been repeatedly delayed by his ill health and, more recently, by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Many hope the final ruling will bring closure for the victims' families and drive home the message that there is no impunity

for war crimes.

Sofia Stolk, a researcher at the T.M.C. Asser Institute in The Hague, said the final verdict is important because it closes the tribunal's last key case and because it concerns genocide, the deliberate killing of people from a particular nation or ethnic group with the aim of its destruction.

Stolk said the reaction in the Balkans to this and other war crimes trials is predictably mixed.

"It's both received as having an impact on transitional justice and to contribute to justice for the victims of the crimes committed there and ... it's also been regarded as a political trial ... mastered by the West," Stolk said.

Diametrically opposing views over Mladic's wartime legacy reflect deep ethnic divisions that still exist in Bosnia so many years after the war ended with a U.S.-brokered peace agreement.

Transgender Salvadoran killed despite long search for safety

AN MIGUEL, El Salvador — Rejected by her family, Zashy Zuley del Cid Velásquez fled her coastal village in 2014, the first of a series of forced displacements across El Salvador. She had hoped that in the larger city of San Miguel she could live as a transgender woman without discrimination and violence, but there she was threatened by a gang.

She moved away from San Miguel then back again in a series of forced moves until the 27-year-old was shot dead on April 25, sending shockwaves through the close-knit LGBTQ community in San Miguel, the largest city in eastern El Salvador.

"Zashy was desperate; her family didn't want her because of her sexual preference and the gangsters had threatened her," said

Venus Nolasco, director of the San Miguel LGBTQ collective "Pearls of the East." "She knew they were going to kill her. She wanted to flee the country, go to the United States, but they killed her with a shot through her lung."

One day after Del Cid's murder, U.S. Vice President Kamala Harris identified anti-LGBTQ violence in Central America as one of the root causes of migra-

tion in the region during a virtual meeting with the president of neighboring Guatemala, Alejandro Giamattei. She is scheduled to visit Guatemala and Mexico this week.

Transgender migrants were present in the Central American caravans that attempted to reach the United States border in recent years, fleeing harassment, gang extortion, murder and police

indifference to crimes against them. Even in those large migrant movements say they faced harassment.

Things had been rough during Del Cid's first stint in San Miguel. She and Nolasco had been living in a neighborhood where, as in many parts of the country, the MS-13 gang was the ultimate local authority. Gang members began to harass her, then brutally beat her, breaking her arm

in 2015, Nolasco said.

"They warned her to leave, but she didn't listen," Nolasco said.

Instead of leaving, Del Cid moved in with Nolasco in the same neighborhood. One day, the gang grabbed Del Cid again.

They took her, they wanted to kill her," Nolasco said. "I begged them not to kill her, to let her go and she would leave the neighborhood."

Burkina Faso says at least 100 civilians killed in attack on village

NIAMEY, Niger — Gunmen killed at least 100 people in a northern Burkina Faso village, the government said Saturday, in what was the country's deadliest attack in years.

The attack took place Friday evening in Solhan village, in the Sahel's Yagha province, government spokesman Ousseni

Tamboura said in a statement blaming jihadists. The local market and several homes were also burned down in the area toward the border of Niger, he said.

President Roch Marc Christian Kabore called the attack "barbaric."

This is the deadliest attack recorded in Burkina Faso since the West African country was overrun by

jihadists linked to al-Qaida and the Islamic State about five years ago, said Henri Nsaibia, senior researcher at the Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project.

"It is clear that militant groups have shifted up gears to aggravate the situation in Burkina Faso, and moved their efforts to areas outside the immediate reach of the French-led counter-terrorism coali-

tion fighting them in the tri-state border region," he said.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack.

Despite the presence of more than 5,000 French troops in the Sahel, jihadist violence is increasing. In one week in April, more than 50 people were killed in Burkina Faso, including two Span-

ish journalists and an Irish conservationist. More than 1 million people in the country have been internally displaced.

A local who did not want to be named, fearing for his safety, was visiting relatives in a medical clinic in Sebba town, approximately 12 kilometers from where the attacks occurred. He said he saw many wounded people enter the clinic.

"I saw 12 people in one room and about 10 in another. There were many relatives caring for the wounded. There were also many people running from Solhan to enter Sebba... People are very afraid and worried," he told the Associated Press by phone.

The government has declared 72 hours of mourning.

D-Day spirit of remembrance lives on

CARENTAN, France — In a small Normandy town where paratroopers landed in the early hours of D-Day, applause broke the silence to honor Charles Shay. He was the only veteran attending a ceremony in Carentan commemorating the 77th anniversary of the assault that helped bring an end to World War II.

Amid the coronavirus pandemic, this year's D-Day commemorations are taking place with travel restrictions that have prevented veterans or families of fallen soldiers from the U.S., Britain and other allied countries from making the trip to France. Only a few officials were allowed exceptions.

Shay, who now lives in Normandy, was a 19-year-old U.S. Army medic when he landed on Omaha Beach on June 6, 1944. Today, he recalls the "many good friends" he lost on the battlefield.

Under a bright sun, the 96-year-old Penobscot Native American from Indian Island, Maine, stood steadily while the hymns of the Allied countries were played Friday in front of the monument commemorating the assault in Carentan that allowed the Allies to establish a continuous front joining nearby Utah Beach to Omaha Beach.

Shay regretted that the pandemic "is interrupting everything." He is expected to be the only veteran at Sunday's anniversary day ceremony at the Normandy

American Cemetery of Colleville-sur-Mer.

"We have no visitors coming to France this year for two years now. And I hope it will be over soon," he told The Associated Press in Carentan.

Shay's lone presence is all the more poignant as the number of survivors of the epochal battle dwindles.

G-7 back steps to deter tax dodging by firms

LONDON — The Group of Seven wealthy democracies agreed Saturday to support a global minimum corporate tax of at least 15% to deter multinational companies from avoiding taxes by stashing profits in low-rate countries.

G-7 finance ministers meeting in London also endorsed proposals to make the world's biggest companies - including U.S.-based tech giants - pay taxes in countries where they have lots of sales but no physical headquarters.

British Treasury chief Rishi Sunak, the host, said the deal would "reform the global tax system to make it fit for the global digital age and crucially to make sure that it's fair, so that the right companies pay the right tax in the right places."

U.S. Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen said the agreement "provides tremendous momentum" for reaching a global deal that "would end the race-to-the-bottom in corporate taxation and ensure fairness for the middle class and working people in the U.S. and around the world."

Nations have been grap-

pling for years with the question of how to deter companies from legally avoiding paying taxes by using accounting and legal schemes to assign their profits to subsidiaries in tax havens - typically small countries that entice companies with low or zero taxes, even though the firms do little actual business there. International discussions on tax issues gained momentum after U.S. President Joe Biden backed the idea of a global minimum of at least 15% — and possibly higher — on corporate profits.

The meeting of finance ministers came ahead of an annual summit of G-7 leaders scheduled for June 11-13 in Cornwall, England. The endorsement from the G-7 could help build momentum for a deal in wider talks among more than 135 countries being held in Paris as well as a Group of 20 finance ministers meeting in Venice in July.

Cruise ships restart in Venice, bringing protests

VENICE, Italy — The first cruise ship since the pandemic wended its way Saturday through the heart of Venice, escorted by triumphant water-spouting tugboats and elated port workers as it traveled down the Giudecca Canal but also protested by hundreds on land and a small armada of wooden boats waving "No Big Boats" flags.

The battle for Venice's future was stark as the MSC Orchestra set sail with some 1,000 passengers. The voyage heralded

the return of cruise ships to the Italian city after more than 18 months, but the vessel reignited an anti-cruise movement that for more than a decade has opposed the passage of the enormous ships through the fragile lagoon city due to environmental and safety concerns.

Italian Premier Mario Draghi's government pledged this spring to get cruise ships out of the Venice lagoon, but reaching that goal will take time. Even an interim solution rerouting ships away from the Giudecca Canal is not likely before next year. Ridding the lagoon of the ships, which run more than 250 yards in length and weigh over 90,000 tons, could take years.

Venice has become one of the world's most impor-

tant cruise destinations over the last two decades, and in 2019 served as a lucrative turnaround point for 667 cruise ships carrying nearly 700,000 passengers, according to the association Cruise Lines International.

Passengers arriving Saturday for the week-long cruise aboard the 92,409-ton, 16-deck MSC Orchestra, with stops in southern Italy, two Greek islands and Dubrovnik, Croatia, were greeted at the port with signs reading "Welcome Back Cruises."

Antonella Frigo from nearby Vicenza had her departure date delayed multiple times due to the pandemic and was excited to finally be leaving on vacation. But she also sympathized with activists who want the huge ships moved

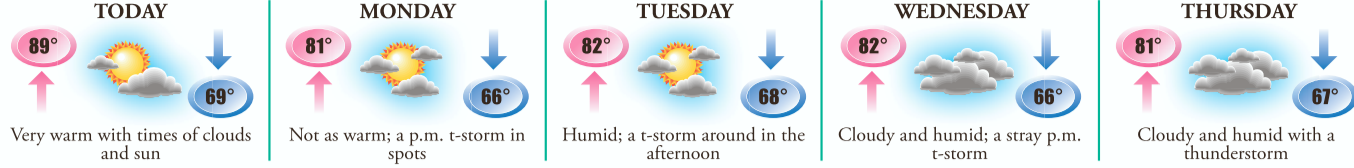
out of the center of Venice.

"I have always said that they should be moved, but I'm sorry, I need to depart from Venice, since I am from nearby," Frigo said after a companion had dropper her off at the cruise terminal. "But I hope they can be rerouted. I ask myself, 'Is it not possible to come up with another solution, so they don't pass where they shouldn't?'"

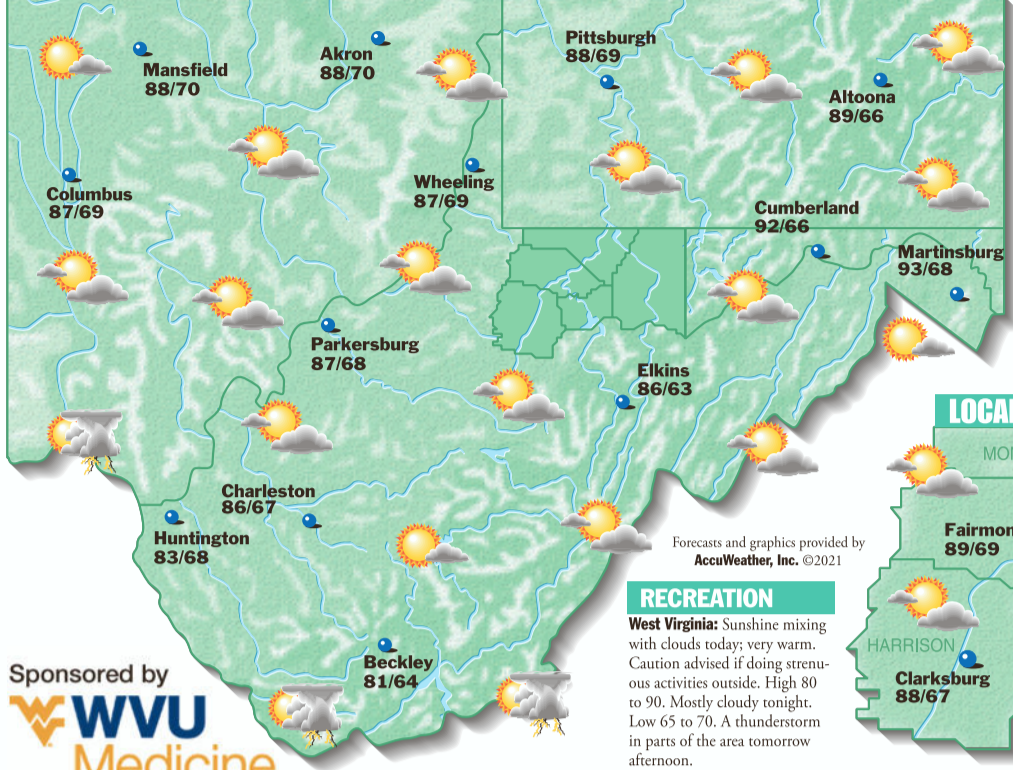
The message for passengers taking in Venice from the ship's decks was mixed as the ship navigated the Giudecca Canal. Hundreds of Venetians gathered at a noisy canal-side protest to demand an immediate halt to cruise ships moving through the lagoon, citing a series of past decrees they say were never enforced.

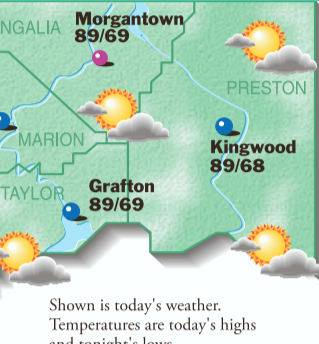

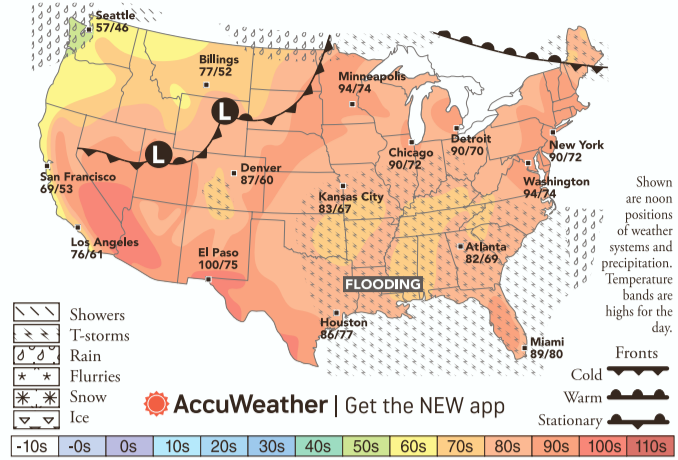

Elementary school gets mosaics of W.Va.'s four seasons

Falling autumn leaves in a scene that just means home, if you were born here or moved here and liked it.

Swirling snow, touching hills and hollows, with soon-to-be-followed spring flowers in bloom.

A proud black bear, foraging in a river, dappled by the summer sun.

West Virginia's four seasons were in full glory on the day before

the last day of school, two weeks ago at Mylan Park Elementary.

That's when the crew from City Neon rolled up to affix the four massive, cut-glass mosaics — each depicting the change of seasons in the Mountain State — at the school on Chaplin Hill Road.

That's when Sarah Billotti was giving a little smile like the Mona Lisa.

DIY OUTDOOR FOOD COVERS

This DIY food cover will keep bugs and debris off your plate so you can enjoy a meal in the great outdoors with friends and family.

Enjoy a meal in the backyard — without bugs or debris as a garnish

'Tis the season for socializing outdoors. Gatherings with friends and family often center around a meal.

Whether you plan a more formal meal with outdoor seating, spread a blanket on the lawn for a picnic or set some appetizers out to nibble, you don't want bugs or unidentified debris landing in your food.

With a few supplies and a little crafting time, you can make food covers to keep everything from snacks to main dishes safe from accidental garnishes.

To make food covers, you will need:

- tulle fabric
- thread
- scissors
- wire and pliers and cutters
- decorative trim (optional)

First, determine roughly the size and shape cover to best suit your needs. To make a dome with a circular base, cut four to six wires long enough to reach the diameter you want with extra for the curve.

To make a food cover similar to the one shown in these photos, cut three wires about 29 inches long. Curve them so each one spans between 16-20 inches from end to end — they should all be roughly identical in their curves.

Time to catch up on checkups and screenings

THERE IS SO MUCH going on in June. It heralds the arrival of summer, with swimming, grilling out and traveling on many people's agendas.

It's also the month when Father's Day is celebrated — which this year is shared with West Virginia Day and the summer solstice.

That's why Men's Health Week is observed in the week leading up to Father's Day. The general theme is that men might not be as likely to schedule checkups and routine testing as women.

Not so coincidentally, Women's Health Week falls in May, around the same time as Mother's Day. Because of COVID-19 events, that celebration slipped by this column space.

But let's face it — because of the pandemic, many people are behind on routine health screenings. So let's address those now.

Here are some guidelines for women and men:

- Physical exam: Every year if you are 50 and older, two years for 40 and older and three years for 20 and older.
- Blood pressure: Every year for all adults.
- Tuberculosis skin test: Every five years.
- Blood panel and urinalysis: Same as physical exams.
- Tetanus booster: Every 10 years.
- Hemocult: Screening for minute amounts of blood in the stool, every year ages 40 and older.
- Colonoscopy: Screenings usually began at age 50, but those with symptoms and/or family histories of colon cancer should discuss this with their health care provider.
- Sexually transmitted diseases: All sexually active people should be tested for STDs at least

Trinity Christian gets STEM grant

TCS also to host summer coding class

Trinity Christian School was awarded a STEM grant from the Society of Amateur Radio Astronomers and will also offer a coding workshop this summer.

In March, Marcus Fisher, an adjunct teacher at TCS, submitted a proposal to SARA for a STEM grant that provides a kit to build a hydrogen line radio telescope.

The grant covers the necessary hardware and software for building the telescope that will be mounted on the school and used by the science classes.

"Our computer science class is going to build the telescope and program it," Fisher said. "Our other science classes will use the

data that comes from the antenna and do science experiments."

The antenna will be tuned to detect the radio frequency the element hydrogen gives off in the universe. When a sample of the radio in the universe is taken, students can map how much hydrogen is seen and be able to read and look at the Milky Way Galaxy.

"This is huge," Fisher said. "It's cutting-edge. You don't see middle and high schools building a telescope in order to conduct experiments on the Milky Way Galaxy."

Fisher was looking into diversifying TCS's science classes by adding a project that isn't a traditional engineering and cybersecurity project.

"This grant is an example of the momentum that is building in the school's computer science program. It is so rewarding to see our faculty's vision come to fruition," said TCS Superintendent Michelle Stellato.

COVID-19 has a way of cutting into art like that.

Art, interrupted

This visual and viral (in the clinical sense) odyssey began in March 2020, when Billotti's school received some dollars from Your Community Foundation of North Central West Virginia, the Morgantown-based outreach organization that supports artistic and intellectual pursuits.

The ink was barely dry on the check from the foundation's Stephen D. Tanner Children's Enrichment Fund Grant when Gov. Jim Justice ordered all schools in the state shuttered, due to the then-pending pandemic.

Which put the project on hold.

As it was an interactive project using a then-unfamiliar media for the art teacher — cut and polished glass pieces — the vision had to stay in her head until the start of the 2020-21 school year.

With the students back, the art could commence. First, a road trip was required to Paden City, West Virginia's glass-making headquarters.

All the marbles

For a while in the early 1900s, the little town that bisects Wetzel and Tyler counties had a big name in glass.

How big? Well, Paden City was once known as the biggest

maker of marbles in the world, back when youngsters were shooting those tiny glass spheres for fun in the precision game.

The town had multiple glass factories. The Paul Wissmach Glass Co., which supplied the colored sheets of glass for the Mylan Park Elementary project, has been in business since 1904.

With the glass ordered and shipped, Billotti went to work, cutting it and polishing it, after thorough instruction.

So did teachers and the school's older students.

Then, everyone would drop by to affix the glass pieces to panels, as per Billotti's sketches.

Teachers would drop in on their planning periods. Kids would devote recesses to the work. Staffers would come by early or during their break time.

It's yours

And slowly, wondrously, those four panels, depicting those four seasons, began to come into clear-cut focus.

The mountains, the leaves. And the bear, also.

once. Discuss with your health care provider if you should get tested more often.

The checklist for women also includes:

- An annual clinical breast exam for ages 20 and over; an annual mammogram beginning at age 50. Once again, those with a family history of breast cancer should discuss this with their health care providers.

- Self-exams: Monthly for 20 and over for breast, skin and oral abnormalities.

- Begin getting Pap tests at age 21. If it's normal, your health care provider might say you can wait three years before getting the next one.

- Bone health density test: Beginning at age 50.

The checklist for men also includes:

- PSA blood test: Men at average risk of prostate cancer should begin discussing the prostate-specific antigen test with their health care providers at age 50, according to Cancer.org. Men at higher than average risk should have the discussion around ages 40-45.

- Self-exams: Monthly for 20 and over for testicles, skin, oral and breast abnormalities.

- Bone health: Screen-

ing is recommended at age 60 but discuss with your health care provider if this is the right choice for you.

- Testosterone screening: Low testosterone can lead to low sex drive, fatigue and depression. You can discuss screenings with your health care provider. Screenings usually begin at age 40.

In any given year, Monongalia County Health Department would remind adults there are other vaccines to consider: An annual influenza vaccine, a measles vaccine if one were not given them as a child, Shingrix for shingles at age 50 and pneumococcal at age 65, unless an individual's health indicates it should be given earlier.

You can make an appointment for those vaccines at MCHD Clinical Services by calling 304-598-5119. MCHD also conducts free STD testing and provides women's health exams and mammogram referrals.

And this wouldn't be 2021 if MCHD also didn't encourage anyone who hasn't gotten a COVID-19 vaccine to sign up for one today at Vaccine.WVUMedicine.org or by calling 833-795-SHOT (7468).

SARA, the Society of Amateur Radio Astronomers, was organized in 1981 and is an international society of dedicated enthusiasts who teach, learn, trade technical information and do observations of the radio sky. It is a scientific, nonprofit group founded for the purpose of supporting amateur radio astronomy.

TCS's coding workshop this summer is open to any public, private and home-school students 6th through 12th grades, as well as teachers and parents.

The workshop is for students wanting an introduction to coding or to mature their coding skills, as well as educators who are interested in learning how to code and offer coding at their home institution.

The coding workshop will teach students and educators programming in Python, a free, open-source programming language that anyone can use. Anyone attending the workshop will learn the basics of data structures, problem-solving, python language, development tools and the Pygame development modules.

"We are so excited to offer this new program to local educators and students," said Jeannine Kelly, director of School Advance-

ment. "We are excited to give local educators and students the opportunity to develop their coding skills over the summer."

The cost for the workshop is \$150. Attendees will receive copies of the material suitable for their own classrooms. Need-based scholarships will be awarded on an individual basis.

The workshop is a three-day program from 8:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m. June 28-30 at 200 Trinity Way, in Trinity Christian School Advanced Makers Laboratory.

The workshop is offered as a class at TCS, but Fisher wanted to create a summer workshop for those who don't attend TCS and are interested in learning about coding and problem-solving.

"We should be teaching computer science and cybersecurity in every school in West Virginia, but the biggest challenge in teaching it is that there is no one teaching it," said Fisher. "The only way we can get there is if we start equipping new and current teachers with the knowledge, skills and tools so that they can teach it."

Justice claims bank deceived his family

CHARLESTON, W.Va. — In a new court filing, West Virginia Gov. Jim Justice blamed a bankrupt U.K. bank for fraudulently inducing him into personally guaranteeing \$700 million in loans that were taken out by his companies.

In the amended complaint filed Friday, Justice's family and coal companies claim that Greensill Capital U.K. "perpetrated a continuous and highly profitable fraud."

Justice told reporters Tuesday that the loans are "a burden on our family beyond belief." Justice's Bluestone Resources Inc., which is involved in the business of mining metallurgical coal used for steel making, sued Greensill in March in federal court in New York.

The business troubles of the Republican governor, who Forbes recently took off its list of billionaires because of mounting debt, have been publicly aired over the past week. In addition to the \$700 million owed to Greensill, Justice revealed in a separate lawsuit that he is personally on the hook for \$368 million to Virginia-based Carter Bank & Trust.

The latest filing in the case against Greensill in U.S. District Court in New York shows that the governor and his wife, Cathy Justice, and son Jay Justice personally guaranteed payment on the loans for Bluestone. The com-

plaint alleges that the London-based bank deceived them into signing on by hiding its own financial risk.

Greensill, a supply chain finance firm based in London, went under in March over allegations of fraud. The Financial Conduct Authority, Britain's financial regulatory body, has announced a formal investigation into Greensill's collapse after receiving allegations that it said were "potentially criminal in nature."

Greensill began lending to Bluestone in 2018. The company sought financing after a period of decline under the ownership of Russian mining and metal company Mechel, according to court documents.

"When the Russians had Bluestone, what happened to Bluestone? It absolutely just melted down to nothing," Justice said at a news conference Tuesday. The company had outstanding obligations to vendors and tax liabilities when the Justice family took it back over in 2015.

The lending from Greensill was supposed to help rebuild the company, but bank officials by November 2020 began seeking early repayment of the loan and additional fees, according to the complaint.

The Justice family says it only personally signed onto the loans with the understanding that repayments would begin at the earliest in 2023, at which point Bluestone would have had years to rebuild

and generate cash flow. Justice and his companies are seeking damages from Greensill in their suit.

At his Tuesday news conference, Justice briefly addressed his other loan from Carter Bank in Virginia by saying he always personally guaranteed the loans for his companies.

"I did personally guarantee the loans," he said. "The loans have always been personally guaranteed when they flowed from Carter Bank through Greensill to other banks along the way. That's been the case for a very, very, very long time."

Special session called to discuss COVID funds

CHARLESTON, W.Va. — West Virginia Gov. Jim Justice has called a special session of the legislature aimed at allocating federal COVID-19 relief funding and increasing funds for road improvements.

Justice announced that the session will begin Monday at noon. Lawmakers were already scheduled to be in Charleston for June committee meetings, he said.

The legislature will consider allocating federal relief funds to the Department of Health and Human Resources and the Department of Education, Justice said in a statement. The funding was received after the end of the regular legislative session, he said.

He also wants lawmakers to consider allocating \$150 million from the state's general fund to the

Division of Highways for road projects.

Justice said it would fund 702 miles of road paving and projects on 40 bridges across all 55 counties.

West Virginia's aging infrastructure often receives a failing grade. Voters approved a \$1.6 billion bond measure called Roads to Prosperity in 2017 that the governor championed to improve public works.

West Virginia runner to represent in Boston

SHINNSTON, W.Va. — Shinnston resident James Coulter had a goal to be in the best shape of his life by age 40. He set his sights on the Boston Marathon, and by 40, he achieved that goal and qualified for the iconic race.

Now at age 41, he will run the race, scheduled to be held Oct. 11.

"For a runner, it's the biggest stage in the entire world," Coulter said. "I had a goal of being in the best shape of my life by the time I was 40, and I just wanted to be able to perform on the biggest stage in the entire world just to kind of show you're never too old to give up on your dreams. I don't want age to define what I can do. I just wanted to work hard and achieve something huge."

Coulter grew up around running near Martinsburg. His father ran competitively in high school and college. At 61, he, too, will compete at the Boston Marathon alongside his

son after qualifying for the first time.

The two will train together when they're in the same city.

Coulter has been running since high school, where he was part of Hedgesville High School's competitive track program. He then ran cross country at Fairmont State.

"I've been running since high school. I did two marathons when I was in college, but after high school, I kind of just became a casual runner and not really a competitive runner. At the end of 2017, I decided I wanted to take running seriously again, so that's when I started training a lot harder and then trying to qualify for Boston," he said.

"I never really stopped my training. I've been training steadily since basically June of 2017."

According to Shinnston Mayor Pat Kovalick, it's a common sight in Shinnston to see Coulter out training.

"I think it's great to have Shinnston represented in such a prestigious race," he said. "I know James will make us proud."

Personal injury lawyer dies in I-79 crash

CHARLESTON, W.Va. — A personal injury lawyer who had served as legal counsel to the news outlets, including the Charleston Gazette-Mail has died in an interstate crash.

An Interstate 79 crash Thursday killed Sean McGinley near the Frametown exit in Braxton County, according to West Virginia state police Capt. Shallon R. Oglesby. He was returning from a hearing in Morgantown. He was 55.

McGinley was a partner at DiPiero Simmons McGinley & Bastress PLLC, he was traveling to Charleston from a hearing in Morgantown before he died, his law partner Lonnie Simmons said.

"Sean was a brilliant lawyer," law partner Tim DiPiero told the Gazette-Mail. "Just amazingly talented. Had a keen sense of right and wrong and seeking justice."

Along with being a longtime respected personal injury lawyer, he worked with many media companies on cases regarding the First Amendment and other issues.

Doug Reynolds, managing partner of HD Media, which publishes the Gazette-Mail and the Herald-Dispatch, called his death devastating.

"His long association with the Charleston Gazette-Mail was based not only on his great skill as a lawyer but on the friendship he formed with all those with whom he worked, not only the leadership of our company but also many of our journalists now and over the years," Reynolds said.

McGinley is survived by his wife and two sons.

Bend the ends of the wire into curls, so the ends of the wire won't scratch a table or snag a tablecloth.

Stand them up on a work surface, crisscrossing at their centers to make the dome frame of your food cover. Cut another wire about eight inches in length and intertwine it around the frame wires to hold them together. At this point, the frame will still be wobbly.

Cut the tulle into gussets to fit the spaces between the wireframe. Get ready to use some basic math skills.

If you are using three wires each with a length of 28 inches (29, minus half an inch on each end for the curled foot), and they curve to create a diameter of 17 inches, each of six gussets must be isosceles triangles with a base of nine inches and each leg should be 14 inches.

If you are doing a custom

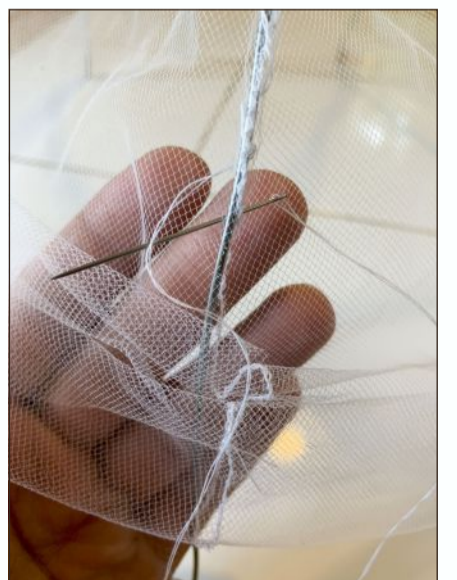
size, calculate the gusset size: Measure the distance between one of the wires' curves — this is your diameter. Multiply by π (3.14...) to get the circumference. Divide the circumference by the number of gussets you need. For example, if you use four wires, you will need eight gussets.

Measure the full length of a wire (minus the feet curve), and divide by two. This is the length of the long sides of the triangle.

Cut the gussets out of your chosen mesh. Finer mesh will keep smaller bugs off — you could even use a gauzy fabric. Chose a color to match your decor or serving dishes. You can use multiple colors and even multiple fabric types.

With a sewing machine or by hand, sew the long sides of the gussets together to form a dome. You don't need any seam allowance for this. Zig-zagging over the edge works well.

Fit your fabric dome over your frame. By hand,

attach the fabric to the frame by sewing loops around the wire along the seams in the fabric.

Once the fabric is secure, add ribbons or other decorative trim.

You can also make a rect-

angular food cover, by curving two longer wires across each other with a shorter wire going across in the middle for extra support.

If you want to skip the wires, you can make a food cover to span individual

dishes or your whole table by cutting a square of tulle and edging it with a more solid fabric. To keep it from blowing away, add weights to the edging. Simply drape it over your spread.

Food covers can make

your outdoor meals look extra special, and you will enjoy the company of dear ones even more without having to worry about bugs in the food.

Some things are hard to imagine

It's hard to imagine that people are releasing feral cats into the wild to eat rats, but some say that is happening. A group called Tree House Humane Society has released 1,000 feral cats in Chicago to help with the city's rat problem. I went to their website to see what they are about. It says that "Hundreds of thousands of cats live on the streets of Chicago. Some are stray or abandoned. Many are feral. All need care to be healthy and thrive. Tree House provides multiple programs to make sure that these cats have what they need."

It's a bit confusing, but, apparently, this organization has a "Cats at Work" program that takes feral cats, not house cats, that have to be relocated for some reasons (that I can't quite figure out from the information given on the website) from where they live in the wild. These cats are spayed, neutered and vaccinated then released back into the wild. Ten to 12 feral cats a month have been relocated since 2012. They

are placed in or near cat colonies near caretakers who provide food and water. Apparently, there are hundreds of cat colonies around Chicago where these cats live in the wild.

In 2007, Cook County passed the Managed Care of Feral Cats Ordinance that permits the formation of cat colonies where groups of feral cats live. Apparently, the "rat" part of this story stems from interviews with citizens who state that they had lots of rats before they got these Cats at Work cats. The website does discuss the problem with feral cats killing birds but they indicate that even so, the cats and birds are better off because of their various programs. Check out the Tree House Humane Society website for some interesting reading.

Rattlesnakes in West Virginia

Some things are hard for some to imagine, but the facts are that you cannot kill, capture, or keep rattlesnakes in West Virginia. Since 2016, Frank Jernejcic, retired DNR biologist and resident of Cheat Lake, has been studying rattlesnakes at Coopers Rock State Forest. Others are involved including a master's degree graduate student from Marshall. His report shows that there have been 21 rattlesnakes killed on roads within Coopers Rock State Forest since 2016.

The West Virginia Department of Highways installed six signs on roads within Coopers Rock to slow traffic and make vehicle drivers more aware of the snakes. Data shows that many rattlesnakes are encountered on those roads and traffic waits till the snakes are safely across. Apparently, the information signs are helping.

BLACKSVILLE — Recent Clay-Battelle graduate Sydney Wilson has put on quite a performance this softball season.

Wilson is the recipient of the Ohio Valley Athletic Conference 2A Player of the Year award. Over the course of the season, she has spent her time on the mound every game, appearing day in and day out.

"It's definitely a great honor and I'm very excited for myself and my future," she said.

Not only that, but Wilson helped lead the Cee-Bees to the Class A Region I, Section 2 championship Saturday, knocking off Doddridge County 4-1 to advance to the regional tournament.

No surprise, Wilson tossed a complete game and had 11 strikeouts in the win.

Wilson has also been productive at the plate with her favorite memory this season being, "When we beat Magnolia at their field and I hit the walk off home run to win the game."

Being the ace pitcher of a team can be nerve racking and Wilson admitted to struggling with confidence in the past, but now she credits her ability to stay focused to her father, Travis.

"I tend to calm down and be more within myself when I find my dad in the stands," she said. "He gives me that reassurance that I'm fine and I can do it."

Wilson doesn't work alone when pitching a game and like most pitchers, there is an accompanying great catcher. Behind the plate for her is another all-star player, Ronda Petrucci.

"I'm definitely more comfortable with my catcher, Ronda, behind the plate. She makes it 10-times easier knowing that she's back there the whole time," Wilson said.

Head coach David Joyce knows the value of Wilson to his team both on the diamond and in the dugout.

"This team is predominantly younger and the kids look up to her for instruction and advice. She leads by example," he said. "As a pitcher in softball, you can go an awful long way and Sydney has carried about all of our weight. Offensively, she is a powerhouse. She's been as strong up to bat as she has been on the mound and she is a force on the mound."

Joyce also said that Wilson has been on the mound almost 90% of the time this season. Additionally, she has considerably aided the team's offense with the home-run ball. Being the do-it-all of the team doesn't come overnight, though.

Zebulon Lewis, Erica Manor think boys' volleyball can be successful in West Virginia

Guess which is one of the fastest growing sports in the country.

Here's a hint: It's played all over the world, in the Olympics...and in West Virginia...sort of.

If you guessed boys high school volleyball, you've probably had a conversation with Preston girls volleyball coach and volleyball fanatic Zebulon Lewis.

"It's just as big as girls volleyball in many areas of the country," he said, "and more and more high schools and colleges are adding the sport, and there's no reason why we shouldn't have boys playing the sport in West Virginia. There are 75,000 boys playing high school volleyball right now, and that will increase to 100,000 plus in six years. I think West Virginia should be a part of that wave."

For the last few years, Lewis has been

doing his part to get the ball rolling, and he had some initial steps in place until COVID-19 hit, but he remains confident that things can quickly get back on track post-pandemic.

"It's all about introducing the sport and generating interest," he said. "It's a spring sport, so it won't interfere with girls' volleyball or football, and it's a great complimentary sport, especially for the body mechanics of basketball. It's a fast-twitch muscle sport, so it increases explosiveness and quickness."

"There should be little overlap with gym usage, and the cost to the school districts to develop the sport is essentially zero. So it's just a matter of finding the coaches — and I have coaches interested at MHS, UHS, Buckhannon-Upshur, Grafton, the Fairmont schools, Bridgeport and Clarksburg — and generating student interest. I'm convinced that once they learn the basics, they're gonna fall in love with the sport like I did."

Stallings' hit lifts Pirates, Marlins' 8th loss in row

PITTSBURGH — Jacob Stallings hit a game-ending single in the 12th inning that lifted the Pittsburgh Pirates over Miami 8-7 on Saturday and extended the Marlins' longest losing streak in six years to eight games. Automatic runner Adam Frazier advanced to third on Ke'Bryan Hayes' flyout leading off the 12th against Adam Cimber (1-2). Bryan Reynolds was intentionally walked, and Stallings lined a single to center.

Clay Holmes (2-0) pitched a perfect 12th. Miami has lost eight in a row for the first time since May 15-22, 2015, and has lost nine of 10, dropping a season-low nine games under .500 at 24-33. Pittsburgh has won the first three games of the four-game series.

Jesús Aguilar tied the score 6-6 with an RBI single off Richard Rodriguez, who blew a save for the second time in nine chances. Miami's Isan Díaz and Pittsburgh's Gregory Polanco hit sacrifice flies in the 10th.

Pittsburgh trailed 5-2 before a four-run eighth helped by pitcher Anthony Bender's error. Bender relieved Anthony Bass and forced in a run with a bases-loaded walk to Kevin Newman, then hit Ka'ai Tom with a pitch. With the bases loaded and two outs, pinch-hitter Michel Perez hit a soft ground ball to

the right of Aguilar at first. He tossed to the pitcher at first, but Bender missed the ball as Polanco scored from third and Kevin Newman from second. Aguilar hit a two-run homer in the fourth off Chase De Jong and Jazz Chisolm Jr. hit a solo shot as Miami took a 3-2 lead.

Jorge Alfaro, who had four hits, made hit a two-run homer in the fifth, a 432-foot drive to the shrubbery in the batter's eye in center in the fifth.

De Jong allowed five runs and seven hits in five innings.

Miami starter Trevor Rogers gave up two runs and four hits in six innings, retiring 13 of his

final 14 batters.

Roster moves

Miami selected the contract of RHP Zach Thompson from Triple-A Jacksonville, placed RHP Cody Poteet on the 10-day IL with a sprained right medial collateral ligament and transferred RHP Elieser Hernández to the 60-day IL with a right quadriceps strain. Hernandez had just returned on June 3 after missing two months with a blister issue and has played in just two games this season.

Trainer's room

Marlins: INF/OF Garrett Cooper did not play with back stiffness.

Pirates: RHP JT Brubaker will re-join the starting rotation during the three-game series with Los Angeles that starts Tuesday, manager Derek Shelton said.

Up next

Marlins RHP Sandy Alcantara (2-5, 3.68 ERA) will start Sunday's series finale after allowed a season-high nine hits in his previous start against Toronto. Pirates RHP Chad Kuhl (0-2, 6.41) will make his second start since missing six weeks with a right shoulder injury. He went four innings and allowed three runs in his return May 31.

Durant, Irving carry Nets in opener after Harden hurt to cruise past Bucks 115-107

NEW YORK — Kevin Durant scored 29 points, Kyrie Irving had 25 and the two superstars carried the Brooklyn Nets after James Harden's early injury in a 115-107 victory over the Milwaukee Bucks on Saturday night in Game 1 of the Eastern Conference semifinals.

Harden didn't even make it through a minute before leaving with a right hamstring injury, an injury that forced him to miss two losses to the Bucks in May. But the Nets beat Milwaukee when it mattered most without him, getting 19 points from Joe Harris and 18 points and 14 rebounds from Blake Griffin.

And they got a solid defensive effort despite giving up plenty of size, limiting the Bucks to 13 points below their NBA-leading average.

Durant grabbed 10 rebounds and Irving had eight assists, throwing some spectacular passes as the Nets moved the ball

around quickly and had the Bucks a step or more behind all night.

Giannis Antetokounmpo had 34 points and 11 rebounds, but the Bucks were just 6 for 30 from 3-point range and lost for the first time in the playoffs after storming past Miami in a first-round sweep.

Brook Lopez scored 19 points for the Bucks and Jrue Holiday had 17 points and nine rebounds. Khris Middleton finished with 13 points and 13 rebounds but was 6 for 23, missing all five 3-pointers.

Game 2 is Monday night.

A series that had talent all over the rosters started on a down note when Harden had to come out of the game after just 43 seconds, walking to the back after the Nets called timeout before they had even scored.

Harden predicted a day earlier this series would be a showdown.

His show might already be over. The Bucks led 32-30 after

one but the Nets sprinted past them with an 8-0 run for a 47-42 lead. Another run of eight in a row pushed it to 59-48 on Irving's layup with 3:22 left in the half, but Milwaukee closed well to get within 63-61 at the break.

The NBA's two highest-scoring teams played at a dizzying pace, where look down after a basket and they might already be shooting at the other end by the time you looked up.

The pace favored the Nets, who pulled away for good in the third quarter.

Durant picked up his fourth foul with 1:36 left in the period, quickly waving his hands toward Nets coach Steve Nash that he didn't want to come out of the game. Lopez made the two free throws to cut it to nine, but Durant then scored seven straight points, with his 3-pointer pushing it to 98-82 with 5.1 seconds remaining.

Tip-ins

Bucks: Milwaukee gave P.J. Tucker his first start of

the playoffs. He had seven points. ... Milwaukee was 4 for 19 on 3s in the first half. Bryn Forbes missed all four of his attempts before making one late in the game.

Nets: Brooklyn remained without F Jeff Green for a fourth straight game because of a left foot injury. Nash said Friday he would be considered day to day after Game 1. ... The Nets announced a sellout of 15,750 — featuring Beyonce and Jay-Z — with 98% fully vaccinated. ... Mike James had 12 points after playing less than 10 minutes in the first round against Boston.

Hurting Harden

The right hamstring forced Harden to miss 18 straight and 20 of 21 games late in the season. He missed games on April 1 and 4 with what was called tightness, then returned April 5 but made it through just four minutes before leaving again, with that injury termed a strain. He didn't play again until May 12.

Kucherov, Stamkos shine, lift Lightning over Hurricanes 6-4

TAMPA, Fla. — Nikita Kucherov and Steven Stamkos each had two goals and an assist, and the Tampa Bay Lightning beat the Carolina Hurricanes 6-4 on Saturday to open a commanding lead in their second-round playoff series.

The defending Stanley Cup champions improved to 10-0 in games following a playoff loss over the past two postseasons. They lead the Hurricanes 3-1 in the best-of-seven series heading into Game 5 on Tuesday night at Carolina.

Each team scored four goals in the second, with the Lightning turning a 4-2 deficit into a 5-4 lead. Stamkos and Kucherov scored on the power play and Tyler Johnson also beat Petr Mrazek in the final 5:22 of the period.

Teuvo Teravainen, Jesper Fast, Dougie Hamilton and Jacob Slavin scored in the second for the Hurricanes, who hurt themselves by taking bad penalty after bad penalty while giving the Lightning five power-play opportunities in that period alone.

Tampa Bay finished 3 of 6 on the power play, and it has scored five times with the man advantage in the last two games.

Carolina had its highest scoring game of the series, but the Hurricanes were 0 for 2 on the power play and struggled after going up 4-2 on Slavin's goal at 12:41 of the second.

Vezina Trophy finalist Andrei Vasilevskiy weathered the Hurricanes' scoring barrage and didn't allow another goal the rest of the way. He finished with 21 saves.

Kucherov, who has 17 points in 10 playoff games this year, began the comeback with a power-play goal. Johnson made it 4-4 before Stamkos netted his second power-play goal of the period.

Kucherov scored off a nice pass from Ondrej Palat for a 6-4 lead just over six minutes into the final period.

Mrazek stopped just 20 of 26 shots after making his first start of this postseason and getting a 3-2 overtime win in Game 3.

Slow starters

The Hurricanes yielded the first goal for the eighth time in 10 games this postseason. Carolina went six straight games giving up the first goal until taking a 2-0 lead against the Lightning in Game 3.

The Lightning are 7-1 when they scored first this postseason, and 0-2 when they don't.

Still missing

The Hurricanes played again without center Vincent Trocheck, who was injured during Game 2 when he collided with teammate Warren Foegele and limped off the ice. Nino Niederreiter remained sidelined, too, meaning Carolina was without its second- and third-leading goal scorers from the regular season.

Foegele did play Saturday after suffering an upper-body injury in a collision with Lightning defenseman Erik Cernak. Meanwhile, Tampa Bay defenseman David Savard was back in the lineup after missing three games with an undisclosed upper-body injury.

Brad Cox-trained Essential Quality rallies to win the Belmont Stakes

NEW YORK — Brad Cox insisted he wasn't sitting around waiting or worrying about whether a disqualification of Bob Baffert's Kentucky Derby winner would give him his first victory in a Triple Crown race.

Essential Quality won the Belmont Stakes on Saturday to make sure Cox wouldn't have to wait a second longer to be a Triple Crown-winning trainer.

The striking gray who was bet down to the 6-5 favorite passed early leader Hot Rod Charlie around the final turn and charged ahead to the wire to win the 1 1/2-mile \$1 million race.

Cox could be a Derby champion with Mandaloun if Baffert-trained Medina Spirit is disqualified for failing a postrace drug test. Two samples have confirmed the presence of the steroid betamethasone, though Kentucky officials have not yet announced the horse's disqualification, which would elevate Mandaloun to the top spot.

But Cox was able to enjoy this one with Essential Quality beating Hot Rod Charlie by 1 1/4 lengths. He did so in 2:27.11, taking advantage of an unexpected hot pace set by Hot Rod Charlie.

"I thought it benefitted our horse," Cox said. "Hot Rod Charlie ran a tremendous race and I thought (with) the hot pace we were in a good spot where they would come back."

Essential Quality, who opened as the 2-1 favorite, paid \$4.60 to win, \$3 to place and \$2.60 to show. Preakness winner Rom Bauer was third and Known Agenda fourth.

"That was a long way

around there a mile a half, but it was exciting," Cox said. "It looked like the horse on the inside, he still had run left. I knew it was going to be a battle down the lane."

Essential Quality finished fourth as a beaten favorite in the Kentucky Derby because of a rough trip. Essential Quality showed in the Belmont why he has long been considered one of the top 3-year-olds in the country.

"In the Kentucky Derby we were so confident that we're gonna win that race," said jockey Luis Saez, who won a Triple Crown race for the first time. "He was ready for the race. But we have a little unlucky start ... Today the main thing was try to break clean, and the rest I know he's gonna do it."

Backdooring his way to becoming the first Louisville-born trainer to win the Kentucky Derby wouldn't allow Cox the same joy of victory as the Belmont, which the up-and-coming star will likely remember as his first true Triple Crown triumph.

And Cox saw this coming. He predicted last summer that Essential Quality would be his horse for the Belmont, and that proved true in beating a tough field of seven other horses.

"Luis did a fantastic job of getting him in position turning for home and he was able to really show his stamina late," Cox said.

It was something of redemption for Saez, who thought he had his first Triple Crown win finishing first in the 2019 Derby with Maximum Security. But Maximum Security was disqualified for impeding other horses.

There was no DQ this time.

"This is my second home," Saez said. "This was the race I wanted to win."

But the victory also comes with a shadow hanging over United Arab Emirates ruler Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, who owns Essential Quality. Sheikh Mohammed faces scrutiny of human rights issues after a judge in England ruled that he orchestrated the abductions of two of his adult daughters.

Talking only about his ownership and not the situation in Dubai, Cox made it a point to mention Sheikh Mohammed moments after the Belmont.

"Sheik Mohammed, he's been supporting us the last two years and this is a tremendous organization, world-class organization and we wouldn't be here obviously without this horse and his support, so I just wanted to really thank him," Cox said.

The race was run without a horse trained by Baffert, who was banned by the New York Racing Association after Medina Spirit tested positive and ran third in the Preakness.

Churchill Downs suspended Baffert for two years after a second sample from the Derby came back positive for betamethasone, which is prohibited at any level on race day in Kentucky, Maryland and New York.

Cox was confused why he kept getting asked about the pending Derby DQ.

"I don't wait at all," Cox said this week. "I can't control the outcome of that, so it's something I give very, very little thought to."

Normalcy returned to the Belmont after a topsyturvy 2020 that featured the race leading off the Triple Crown at a nontraditional 1 1/8-mile distance at an empty racetrack. The race was back in its traditional spot as the third leg of the Triple Crown five weeks after the Derby and three after the Preakness, was back to its "test of the champion" distance and had thousands of mostly maskless fans roaming the vast grandstand at Belmont Park.

Packers CEO: Fans divided on Rodgers situation

GREEN BAY, Wis. — Green Bay Packers CEO Mark Murphy says he believes the uncertainty surrounding MVP Aaron Rodgers' future has divided the team's fan base.

"The emails and letters that I've received reflect this fact," Murphy said in a monthly column on the Packers' website in which he answers questions from fans.

Rodgers hasn't participated in the Packers' voluntary organized team activities, a change from his usual offseason routine. The Packers begin their mandatory minicamp Tuesday.

ESPN reported in the hours leading up to the draft that Rodgers doesn't want to return to Green Bay, where the three-time MVP has spent his entire career.

Packers coach Matt

LaFleur and general manager Brian Gutekunst have both said they want Rodgers back. Gutekunst has said he won't trade Rodgers, who has three years left on his contract.

Rodgers detailed his frustrations with the organization while remaining noncommittal about his future in an ESPN interview that aired May 24.

"I think sometimes people forget what really makes an organization," Rodgers said at the time. "History is important, the legacy of so many people who've come before you. But the people, that's the most important thing. People make an organization. People make a business, and sometimes that gets forgotten. Culture is built brick by brick, the foundation of it by the people, not by the organization, not by the building, not by the corporation. It's built by the people."

Coronavirus knocks Rahm out of Memorial after 6-shot lead

DUBLIN, Ohio — Jon Rahm walked off the 18th green at the Memorial after tying the 54-hole record and building a six-shot lead, leaving him on the cusp of joining Tiger Woods as the only repeat winners.

Moments later, he doubled over behind the green and said in anguish, "Not again!"

Rahm was notified he tested positive for the coronavirus, knocking him out of the tournament.

A command performance, that included a hole-in-one Saturday morning to complete his second round and an 8-under 64 to tie two tournament records, went to waste.

The PGA Tour said the Spaniard had come in close contact with a person who was COVID-19 positive, meaning he could play provided he was tested daily. Every test came back negative except the one after his second round, which was completed Saturday morning.

The positive test was confirmed, the results

returned as he was playing the 18th hole, knowing nothing except no one was close to him on the leaderboard.

The tour said Rahm remained asymptomatic.

By tour policy, he was withdrawn from the Memorial. That left Patrick Cantlay and Collin Morikawa tied for the lead at 12-under 204.

"It's kind of the worst situation for something like that to happen and he played awesome today and it's just, it's really a shame," Cantlay said.

It was a shocking turn of events given the timing. Rahm was close to perfect on the back nine, running off six birdies in an eight-hole stretch to turn a one-shot lead into a six-shot cushion, tying the Memorial record for largest 54-hole lead set by Woods in 2000.

His 18-under 198 tied the record set by Scott Hoch in 1987.

Now it's erased, and the No. 3 player in the world is required to go into self-isolation for 10 days. That ends on June 15, the Tuesday of the U.S. Open at Torrey Pines, where Rahm captured his first

PGA Tour victory four years ago.

The second round did not finish until Saturday morning because of rain delays earlier in the week. Rahm returned to make a hole-in-one on the 16th hole to take the lead, and he finished off a 65 to build a two-shot lead.

The tour said his test came back positive at 4:20 p.m., about the time Rahm began to pull away. The tour's medical advisor asked for a confirmation test on the original sample, and that was returned shortly after 6 p.m.

Two officials were waiting for him as he walked off the green.

Rahm was the fourth player to test positive during a tournament since the tour returned to competition one year ago in Texas.

He was the first positive asymptomatic case as part of the tour's contact-tracing protocols.

It was not clear with whom Rahm had contact that led to the tracing. He lives in Scottsdale, Arizona, where his wife in April gave birth to their first child. Rahm has not played since the PGA

Championship two weeks ago.

While playing in the pro-am on Wednesday, Rahm was walking toward the 16th tee when a spectator asked for an autograph. "I'm sorry, I can't," he said. "I'm in contact tracing."

He did not mention it the rest of the week while building his six-shot lead.

Cantlay and Scottie Scheffler, who played with him in the third round, both said they already have had the coronavirus.

Scheffler didn't see Rahm behind the green and wasn't sure what was going on when he walked into the scoring room to sign his card. He said Rahm looked frustrated.

"He just goes, 'Good luck tomorrow,' and I'm like, 'Thanks, man. You play good, too.' I was just really confused," Scheffler said. "He's like, 'No, man, I just tested positive.' My heart just sank. It's terrible that happened."

With a victory, Rahm could have moved closer to recapturing No. 1 in the world, along with earning over \$1.67 million.

From 2016 to 2019, the public encountered 287 rattlesnakes at Coopers Rock. It is now illegal to kill rattlesnakes in West Virginia, but we still have people who don't get it. Six snakes were purposely killed from 2017 to 2020. Two were killed by two Maryland men on June 16, 2017, at Ravens Rock. One was killed at the Henry Clay Iron Furnace on June 28, 2018. Efforts to apprehend those criminals were unsuccessful. In August of 2019, and June of 2020, dead rattlers with the rattles removed were found on the Rock City Trail and in June of 2020 a snake was found dead with the rattles removed

has been simmering for years, and she's 100% behind the effort.

Circus ring: Mayweather returns to fight YouTube sensation Logan Paul

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. — The rebranding of Floyd Mayweather Jr. takes another unconventional turn Sunday night.

Mayweather is a retired five-division world champion and perhaps the best boxer of the past 30 years. But his life after boxing, mostly as the head of his promotional company, did not quite satisfy.

The allure of the ring is not easily put aside.

Consequently, at age 44, he returns to the ring under conditions that will not recall any of his great exploits in the ring. He will face YouTube personality Logan Paul in an exhibition at Hard Rock Stadium, home of the Miami Dolphins.

"I don't look at it as a fight; I think my opponent looks at it as a fight," Mayweather said during a media gathering Thursday in Miami Beach. "I look at it, for one night, I'll be entertaining the people. I do it when I want to. We're going to go out there have fun Sunday and give the people what they want to see."

The enviable pay-per-view stripes Mayweather earned during his unblemished 50-fight career and Paul's reported 29 million followers on his social

media platform helped move the event to a football stadium. The Mayweather-Paul marquee is supported by additional bouts involving former world champions. TV and other viewing options will require a \$50 price tag.

Mayweather and Paul are to box eight, three-minute rounds. There will be no scoring. Each can win only by knockout, technical knockout or disqualifica-

tion.

Another feature is the floating weight limit. Paul will be allowed to weigh as much as 190 pounds. The heaviest Mayweather weighed for a boxing match was 151 pounds for his super welterweight title fight against Miguel Cotto in 2012. The 5-foot-8 Mayweather began his career in the 130-pound junior lightweight division.

"You never worry about

height or size, it's about skills," Mayweather said. "And that's one thing about Floyd Mayweather is I've got skills."

The exhibition has drawn predicted outcries from boxing purists. But Mayweather admirers and younger audiences, who don't care about the nuances of the sweet science, are generating enthusiasm.

"This whole thing is sur-

real, everything about it," Paul said. "I told my manager and we kind of had an inside joke that until I get in the ring with him, I didn't think this fight was happening."

"But I think it's safe to say that I can believe it now. I think it's happening. It's fight week. I can't imagine Floyd would back out now, but who knows? Old man fakes an injury, gets scared of the big kid. I'm excited."

Paul, 29, has one previous boxing exhibition. He lost a split decision against fellow YouTube personality KSI (Olajide Williams Olatunji) in November 2019.

Mayweather won world titles in the super featherweight, lightweight, super lightweight, welterweight and super welterweight classes during his 21-year career. He defeated Manny Pacquiao, Oscar De La Hoya, Shane Mosley and Saul "Canelo" Alvarez. Many boxing experts consider Alvarez the sport's best pound-for-pound fighter.

After stopping UFC star Conor McGregor in 2017, Mayweather retired. Mayweather, who recently became a grandfather, has no intentions to upgrade ring appearances beyond exhibitions. Pacquiao, 42, will return after a two-year

absence to fight welterweight champion Errol Spence Jr. on Aug. 21 in Las Vegas.

"Am I proud of Manny Pacquiao? Absolutely," Mayweather said. "But he has to fight. I've made sound investments. I'm able to put myself in a position where I don't have to fight anymore."

The Mayweather-Paul event headlines a card that will feature a second exhibition involving retired NFL wide receiver Chad Johnson.

"I've been using boxing to prepare for football throughout the years, but I've never done it to this magnitude," said Johnson, who will face Brian Maxwell. "To prepare for an actual fight, is something new. I'm facing a guy who does this for a living, so I'm not taking this lightly at all."

Also on the card are former super welterweight champion Jarrett Hurd and ex-super-middleweight titleholder Badou Jack. Hurd will face Luis Arias while Jack will fight Dervin Colina. Jack originally was scheduled to face former light heavyweight champion Jean Pascal before Pascal tested positive for a banned substance.

Federer needs 4 tight sets to reach French Open's 4th round

PARIS — Roger Federer was honest with himself, and everyone else, before the French Open, saying he knew he didn't have any chance of winning the title. He arrived in Paris, after all, having played just three matches over the preceding year-plus following two knee operations.

Still, neither he, nor anyone else, probably expected Federer to have such a hard time getting out of Week 1 at Roland Garros. Eventually, he avoided what would have been his earliest loss there since 2004 by pulling out a 7-6 (5), 6-7 (3), 7-6 (4), 7-5 victory over 59th-ranked Dominik Koepfer that began Saturday night and ended as 1 a.m. approached — with no crowd present because of a COVID-19 curfew.

"He was a tough nut to crack, really," Federer said.

"My fighting spirit, for once, got me over the line. ... I tried to be really motivated, and see what could be done."

Federer, a 20-time Grand Slam champion who turns 40 on Aug. 8, was last bounced from the French Open in the third round 17 years ago; since then, his successes there included winning the 2009 trophy and getting to four other finals (losing to Rafael Nadal each time).

But Federer couldn't hit through the court or always successfully employ attacking tactics across the more than 3 1/2 hours, with temperatures in the low-60s Fahrenheit (teens Celsius) that created cooler, heavier conditions than in recent days.

He never quite could wrest complete control against Koepfer, a 27-year-old left-hander from Germany with zero tour-level

titles, a losing career record, a best ranking of No. 50 and only one run as far as the fourth round at a major.

Adding to the oddness of it all was the lack of spectators, who almost assuredly would have tried to offer a boost to Federer, who might not have many — any? — more French Open appearances in him.

Scheduled night matches are new this year at Roland Garros, and ticket-holders are ushered out before 9 p.m. as part of pandemic precautions.

So applause at Court Philippe Chatrier was limited to the handful of players' guests.

"First time (with) no fans in a long, long time — or ever in my career," Federer said. "That was definitely very unique in many ways."

Certainly was unusual to hear the clang of Federer

hitting balls off advertising signs between points or muttering at himself after some of his 63 unforced errors — 23 more than Koepfer.

Koepfer's serving became increasingly effective in the middle sets, yes, but the biggest issue for Federer was his own propensity for mistakes.

The second-set tiebreaker illustrated that well: From 2-all, four groundstroke errors by Federer gave set points to Koepfer, who played college tennis at Tulane. A wide backhand ceded the set.

"I wasn't sure after the second set," Federer said, "how much was left in the tank."

In the third, Federer fell behind by a break but managed to recover. When his drop shot drew a wide reply to end that tiebreaker, he shook his right fist. On the other side of the net,

Koepfer grabbed his own throat. Koepfer showed more frustration in the fourth, when he disagreed with a line call, walked over to the ball mark, then leaned over to spit at it.

That drew a point penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct.

"Can't spit. ... COVID rule," Koepfer said he was told.

Down a break, he broke back and extended the fourth set until Federer broke in the next-to-last game, then served out the victory.

"However old he is, and he's still crazy fit," Koepfer said.

Federer reached the round of 16 at a major for the 68th time, extending his men's record — ahead of Novak Djokovic, with 54, and Rafael Nadal, with 50.

They are all in the same half of a Grand Slam draw for the first time, and all

face Italians on Monday: No. 8-seeded Federer vs. No. 9 Matteo Berrettini, No. 1 Djokovic vs. Lorenzo Musetti, and No. 3 Nadal vs. No. 18 Jannik Sinner.

Federer made plain last month that he viewed this event as more of a way to prepare for a title bid at Wimbledon, which begins June 28, than any kind of opportunity to break his tie with Nadal for the most Slam trophies for a man.

"I'm just realistic and I know I will not win the French — and whoever thought I would, or could, win it is wrong," Federer said at the time. "Of course, crazier things might have happened. But I'm not so sure in the last 50 years at the French Open, somebody just walked up at 40 years old, being out for a year and a half, and just (went) on to win everything."

Thompson uses flawless round to take lead at US Women's Open

SAN FRANCISCO — Lexi Thompson needed to get her mind right before she could her golf game back and now is in position to win her first second career major.

Thompson shot a bogey-free 5-under 66 on Saturday to take the lead into the final round of the U.S. Women's Open for the first time in her career with a one-shot edge over teenager Yuka Saso.

"I haven't played to my standards and what I need and I just realized that I needed to change my mindset," Thomson said. "It was only hurting me. Obviously, I needed to work on some technical things in my game and everything, but the mental side was really getting to me. I was just taking it way too seriously and thinking that Lexi depended on my score."

Thompson said she's been working again with performance coach John Denney about not dwelling on mistakes although she made few Saturday when she was the first player all

week to make par or better on every hole in the round.

That had her in the lead at 7 under heading into the final round of a major for the first time since 2017, when her edge after 54 holes at the ANA Inspiration was erased on Sunday when she was penalized four strokes after a viewer saw that she had misplaced her marked ball during the third round.

Thompson still managed to make it into a playoff against So Yeon Ryu but she lost and was unable to add to the 2014 ANA Inspiration title she won for her first major.

Thompson played a nearly flawless round Saturday in search of her first U.S. Women's Open title in her 15th try after first competing as a 12-year-old amateur in 2007. She has four top 10 finishes at the U.S. Women's Open, including a runner-up two years ago in Charleston.

Charleston has been lurking around the leaderboard all week, shooting 69 on Thursday and 71 in the second round before shooting the low round of her

career at this tournament on Saturday.

She started to make a run with three birdies, including one on No. 9 after hitting her tee shot into the second cut of rough. She still managed to get on the green and made a 20-foot putt to get to 5 under.

Thompson added another long birdie putt on No. 14 and reached the green at the par-5 17th in two shots before two-putting for birdie and the lead. She saved par with a 3-foot putt at 18 after hitting her tee shot into the rough and her approach behind

the green.

"I struck it well all day, made a few good putts out there," she said. "It's all about patience out on this golf course because there's going to be bad shots made and you're going to miss some fairways, so you just have to get bogey at worst and get off the hole and go on to the next."

Saso made back-to-back bogeys on the back nine to fall out of the lead before recovering with a birdie at the par-5 17th to get back to 7 under. She missed a 12-foot par putt on 18 and ended the day a stroke back.

New Jersey high school amateur Megha Ganne shot a 72 and was tied for third at 3 under with 2019 champion Jeongueun Lee6 of South Korea.

China's Shanshan Feng was fifth at 2 under, with Japan's Nasa Hataoka and American Megan Khang the only other players under par at 1 under.

Saso, who has never finished better than sixth in an LPGA Tour event, will play in the final group on

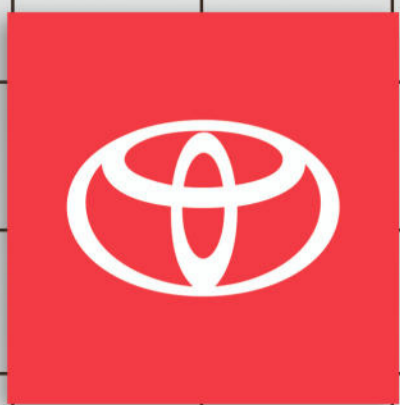
Sunday with a chance to join South Korea's Inbee Park as the only teens to win this tournament. Park did it at 19 years, 11 months, 17 days in 2008, which will be Saso's exact age Sunday.

The 17-year-old Ganne was a crowd favorite at the course and kept her composure early with a couple of early par saves and birdies on the fifth and ninth holes to get within a shot of the lead at 5 under. Back-to-back bogeys to start the back nine knocked her down the leaderboard before she steadied herself with seven straight pars to end the day.

"It was really mentally a grind out there and I've never had to just perform from such bad lies and situations hole after hole and still believe that I was going to do it again on the next hole," she said. "So it was a lot, but I'm confident in how I'm playing."

Lee6 got to 6 under with a birdie at No. 4 but fell off when she hit her tee shot into the deep rough at No. 5 and ended up with a double bogey.

RIP Jan. 6 commission

Senate Republicans killed the Jan. 6 commission.

Sen. Shelley Moore Capito was one of 35 senators to deliver the death blow to a bipartisan, independent body that would investigate how a rally evolved into a riot — and the subsequent breach of the Capitol — and make recommendations for tightening security so it can never happen again.

To say we are disappointed is gross understatement.

Capito's continued failure to put her vote where her mouth is makes her calls for bipartisanship ring hollow.

HR 3233, the bill that would have created the commission, was as independent and bipartisan as anything coming out of the national government can get. The commission would have 10 members: One chairperson appointed by the Speaker of the House and Senate Majority Leader; one vice chair appointed by the minority leaders of the House and Senate; and two members selected by each the Speaker of the House, the Senate Majority Leader and the House and Senate minority leaders for a total of five Democrat-appointed and five Republican-appointed members. In addition, individuals on the 9/11-style commission "may not be an officer or employee of an instrumentality of government." The bill's only true fault was its tight deadline: Final reports must be given to the president and Congress by Dec. 31, 2021.

Republican congressmen have tried to throw out various non sequiturs to justify their plain partisanship, one of which came from Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell. He claimed the commission would be useless and redundant because two Senate committees have their own investigations. However, the commission was designed to build off all pending investigations regarding the Jan. 6 attack. Instead of starting from scratch, it would collect and analyze all evidence and information that had already been unearthed, eliminating the redundancies while also given greater weight to any final conclusions because of the commission's bipartisan nature.

America needs this commission, if for no other reason than that 55% of Republicans strongly or somewhat agree that the Jan. 6 insurrection was committed by left-wing bad actors who wanted to make Trump look bad, according to a Reuters/Ipsos poll. A thorough, independent investigation could at least put those conspiracies to bed.

Sen. Joe Manchin said it well when he commented, "I am sorry that my Republican colleagues and friends let political fear prevent them from doing what they know in their hearts to be right."

Capito proved with her "nay" vote that party politics is more important to her than finding answers and justice for all the officers and innocents hurt and killed during the riot.

Manchin still hasn't budged on the filibuster, but perhaps the failure of the Jan. 6 commission will make him see that a Republican Senate minority led by McConnell will never allow Democrat-favored legislation to pass, no matter how bipartisan or publicly popular.

The AP reported Wednesday there's hope HR 3233 could come up for a second vote in the Senate. Maybe Capito will finally vote her conscience. Or maybe Manchin will change his mind about the filibuster. Or maybe we'll be disappointed yet again.

No end in sight to the cycle of gun violence in the U.S.

ONE SATURDAY NIGHT IN MAY 1993, ON 36TH STREET IN THE HEART OF HAMPDEN, TWO YOUNG GUYS — ONE WITH A PONYTAIL, THE OTHER WITH A "DUMB & DUMBER" PAGEBOY — GOT INTO A FISTFIGHT AFTER A WEDDING RECEPTION. I don't recall what sparked the brawl — a crack about hair maybe, or perhaps a tussle over the bridal bouquet — but it spilled into the street and ended with police arresting the guy with the pageboy.

On his day in court, when the defendant stood for sentencing, his lawyer, Steven Wyman, asked the judge to consider in mitigation something "refreshing" about the case.

"Refreshing?" District Court Judge Carol Smith asked.

"No guns," Wyman, a future judge himself, said. "A real fistfight like when we were kids."

And nobody died. In 1993, Baltimore ended up with 353 homicides, most of them by gun. It was the worst year for city killings in a decade of incessant violence. No wonder Wyman suggested that his client deserved credit for being unarmed.

That old story from Hampden shows how long Baltimoreans have been nostalgic for days when the nonsense that inevitably comes between people left only black eyes and busted teeth, not mortal wounds. That was back when the country had more people than guns; back when teenage boys would punch and wrestle, not load and fire; back when men had the guts to face other men with fists instead of Glock.

But that time is long gone. And while I wish I could offer some optimism about an end to our current misery — not

just in Baltimore but in many places, urban and suburban, across this troubled country — I don't see it. I don't know what would cause the cycle to end. I'm as pessimistic as I've ever been about it. There are just too many guns already. More are being sold every day, legally and illegally, and it's happening in the aftermath of the violent attack on the U.S. Capitol and amid super-charged political divisions.

Mass shootings already are commonplace. The one in San Jose last week left 10 people dead, and there have been at least nine since then, according to the Gun Violence Archive. (The nonprofit GVA, an online resource center, defines a mass shooting as one having "a minimum of four victims shot, either injured or killed, not including any shooter.")

In Baltimore, most of our homicides occur one at a time so we don't think of them as mass shootings — the sudden killing of people

in groups at work, at school, at prayer or play. And yet, the Baltimore homicides have a cumulative effect, over time, on the municipal psyche. We become inured to violence as part of everyday culture; it partly defines the city. It is so incessant, we either don't think about it unless it directly affects us or we think about it fleetingly as a kind of civic obligation.

In the 45 years I've lived and worked here, crime has been a wind that never stopped. There were times when it dropped to a light breeze, but mostly the wind was ceaseless; you felt it every day.

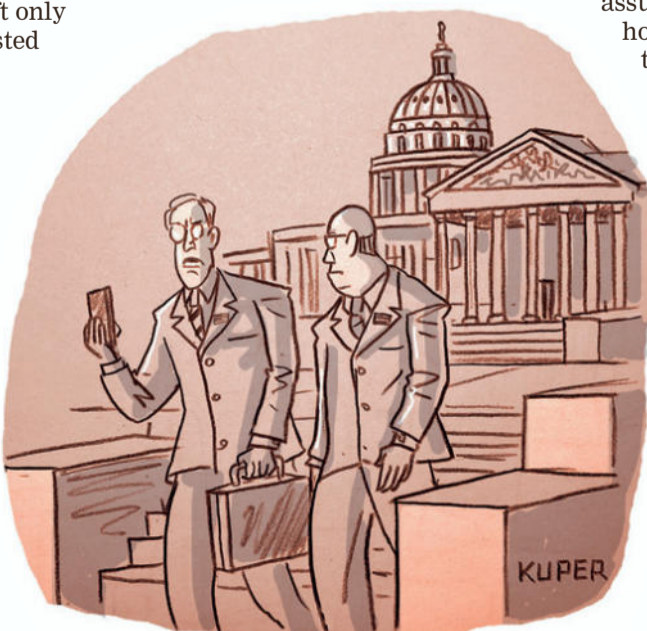
Trying to stop gun violence on the scale that's needed seems like a hopeless exercise. Even when police make homicide arrests, the shootings continue.

There were nine men shot to death over Memorial Day weekend, three of them in an apparent gun battle in Park Heights. As of Tuesday morning, there had been 136 homicides in the first 151 days of the year. Additionally, police reported 267 non-fatal shootings.

It's obvious that guns are readily at hand to resolve any bit of nonsense that comes between people.

For years, we were told — or, after a while, just assumed — that most homicides are related to the commerce in illegal drugs.

Heroin and cocaine have been around for decades. Crack hit Baltimore in the late 1980s, and it was linked to the high rates of homicides through most of the 1990s. So it's natural to assume that the high rates of homicide these last six years are related to fentanyl sales: competition for customers, low-

Charter schools are the answer

BUNDLE UP AMERICA'S CURRENT ARRAY OF DEVASTATING PROBLEMS, PICK OUT THE MOST IMPORTANT, AND ONE IS BOUND TO BE PUBLIC EDUCATION that does not educate, at least not adequately. There's an answer to what the standardized tests tell us, a simple answer, an answer the majority of Black Americans agree with, but not teachers unions.

It's more reliance on wonderfully innovative charter schools, which also happen to be public schools. Charter schools are paid for through taxes and are free to students. A chief purpose is to experiment with different teaching techniques, to find improved instructional methods. A student doesn't have to have a shining record to be accepted because admission is by way of individual choice or, if applications outnumber openings, by lottery.

For negative outlooks on all this, turn to teachers unions and deferential white Democrats. For facts and logic, turn to Thomas Sowell.

A Harlem child and a Harvard student before going to graduate schools and becoming an economist, columnist and think tank fellow, Sowell has a clear, logical, realistic outlook on the world. The main thing is that he doesn't play intellectual games the way the unions do in comparing test scores of those charter schools teaching students from down-and-out homes with those public schools teaching the offspring of the affluent and highly educated.

Instead, he goes to a place like New York City where it's possible to compare charter and public-school students with the same socioeconomic backgrounds, living in the same neighborhood and maybe even learning in the same buildings. Charter schools win big time.

Charter schools, please understand, don't just appear out of nowhere. Sponsored by private groups, they are examined by school authorities before being allowed to set up shop, and they can be terminated if they fail. When a student goes from a public school to a charter school, money goes with him or her; but so do costs. Charter schools by and large do not have unions, and for those who adore these politically able organizations, it might be interesting to look at the huge cost of their resistance to in-person teaching during the COVID-19 crisis.

In his book, "Charter Schools and Their Enemies," Sowell deals with all the kinds of cultural issues that can make some students perform worse than others and then says this is no excuse for public schools to say they can't do anything about it. Education is a great provider. If not always, it can again and again overcome, affording life opportunities that are hard to obtain in any other way.

Sowell is not saying that all charter schools are great or that all public schools flunk but that we have a model of charter school networks in New York City that should be considered as a crucial means of solving one of our nation's most pressing issues.

Destroying land won't ensure economic growth

I'm proud to call myself a native West Virginian, with roots dating to at least 1734. Times have changed, but some truths remain: 1) West Virginians take care of each other, and 2) when you hear of a plan to bulldoze a hilltop or fill in a stream in the name of economic growth, think twice before going along with it.

A perfect example is the proposed Morgantown airport expansion and I-68 Commerce Park.

On June 2, my family received a letter stating we have until June 10 to comment on a proposal to acquire, blast and fill in 58 acres of land just over the hill from Sabraton, Woodburn and Jerome Park, for a slightly longer airport runway and commerce park. To date, the project does not appear to have any commitments to actually use either. It is pure, taxpayer-funded speculation: If we build it, we hope they will come.

How many times has this type of boondoggle been foisted on us? How long will it be before we realize that without thoughtful planning, no misguided effort to aggressively reshape the land will have a positive impact? We need to sink our money into quality of life and information infrastructure, not cheaper flights to Myrtle Beach and empty parking lots. We need to attract people and businesses who actually want to stay, not just visit.

Our Appalachian landscape is not an expendable resource. We already have an embarrassing number of commercial sites that we've developed and abandoned. Why aren't we redeveloping these or, in the case of the airport, targeting former strip mine sites for a bold reimagining of the region's transportation infrastructure, requiring less radical reshaping of the land?

Again: 1) If someone tells you everybody's going to get rich if we blast and bulldoze yet another hilltop and fill in yet another stream, ask some hard

questions before you swallow their story. 2) Let's take better care of each other and our region: Submit comments to U.S. Army Corp of Engineers Regulatory Division at Cassandra.P.Forsyth@usace.army.mil before June 10.

Rep. McKinley sets standard for Congress to follow

WHEN NEWLY ELECTED MEMBERS OF CONGRESS ARE SWORN IN, THEY ARE CALLED ON TO TAKE AN OATH OF OFFICE. This is not a pledge of fealty to their political party or the president, but a commitment to uphold the Constitution and act as both a leader and representative for their constituents.

Rep. David McKinley upheld this oath by voting in favor of a bill (HR 3233) to create an independent and bipartisan commission that will investigate the events of Jan. 6, 2021. In voting yes, McKinley stood with the Capitol Police, congressional staff and all those who were put in harm's way that day.

Jan. 6 was a dark day for American democracy. When a violent mob attacked the U.S. Capitol, they threatened the lives of congressional members and staff, including Vice-President Pence.

Because of this violence, a Capitol Police officer lost his life and many of his colleagues were left with significant injuries and lasting trauma. In the hours that followed, House Minority Leader Kevin McCarthy condemned these actions as "un-American" and called that day the "saddest" he'd ever had in Congress. "Mobs don't rule America. Laws rule America," McCarthy said.

We know such an attack must never be allowed to happen again, but we don't yet know the entire story. The assault raised questions about our nation's capacity to anticipate and react to domestic terror attacks. It highlighted major security and intelligence-gathering concerns, including about the preparedness of the Capitol Police and Sergeants at Arms. The thin margin of escape for many members and staff forces us to consider whether Congress would have been able to

convene a quorum of the legislative body had the worst occurred.

The commission created by HR 3233 is uniquely tailored to address these questions. This bipartisan bill was crafted by House Homeland Security Committee Chair Bennie Thompson (D-MS) and Vice Chair John Katko (R-NY), who modeled their proposal directly on the bipartisan 9/11 Commission. The Jan. 6 commission would be selected and staffed by both parties, with each party having the ability to make or reject subpoena requests.

No current members of Congress can serve on the commission, a design that will insulate the commission's investigation from partisan interference. These elements will help ensure all Americans have faith in the commission's investigation and the recommendations it produces

at its conclusion.

This structure has been endorsed by the chairmen of the 9/11 Commission, former Republican Gov. Thomas Kean and former Democratic Congressman Lee Hamilton. These leaders knew an independent and objective review was necessary in the wake of 9/11 to protect our country, advance government-wide national security reforms and help heal a deeply wounded nation. These same steps are needed today. That is why Gov. Kean and Congressman Hamilton have called on both parties to put the security of our country first by supporting a Jan. 6 commission.

McKinley has answered this call. By seeking a complete picture of exactly what happened and what went wrong that day, he prioritized our nation's security and the safety of the Capitol Police. While the Senate has so far failed to move forward on the

House-passed bill, McKinley should be commended for his willingness to put country first and pass this bipartisan legislation.

By voting to create an independent commission, McKinley did his part to help the country get one step closer to ensuring the Jan. 6 attack never occurs again.

level dealers being robbed and shot, customers being shot for not paying their bills.

But it's clear that guns are not merely used by drug dealers. They are used by husbands and boyfriends who abuse women. A lot of gunfire comes from the retaliation contagion; guns are used to settle personal scores — guys dissing other guys, guys facing fire over some old beef when they come out of prison.

I've pushed intervention efforts in this column — helping at-risk kids, giving jobs to ex-offenders, supporting Safe Streets conflict interrupters, convincing repeat offenders to drop out of the cycle of criminality before they get killed or go back to prison. I declared the war on drugs a failure and advocated that we open more hospitals for the treatment of addictions and mental illness.

But all of those efforts seem overmatched or offset by the easy access to guns and the violence they make possible. We're in a cycle, allowing the same conditions year after year to spawn the same horrors year after year. It defies all logic.

Osaka brave to put well-being ahead of job

NAOMI OSAKA IS AS MUCH A BLACK LIVES MATTER ACTIVIST AS SHE IS A TENNIS PLAYER. IN THESE CONFRONTATIONAL TIMES, IT IS HARD TO BE BOTH.

Osaka abruptly withdrew from the French Open tournament this week, citing mental health concerns. Though she did not explain what is going on in her life, it would not be surprising if today's tense racial climate contributed to her decision.

People of color have endured a great amount of stress the past year, particularly Black women. The pandemic alone, which disproportionately impacted African Americans, was enough to test our mental stamina but added on top of it was the George Floyd murder, the killing of Breonna Taylor and the constant cries for America to see us and hear us, often to no avail.

Though she made a career choice to represent Japan on the tennis courts, Osaka walks through life as a Black woman. Her mother is Japanese, and her father is Haitian. Though she embraces both cultures, she grew up in her Haitian grandmother's home in New York, so she knows what it means to be Black.

Over the past year, Osaka has been very vocal about the social and criminal injustices that Black people face in America and in Japan, where she was born.

She has lived all but three of her 23 years in this country, and she fully understands its issues. She has fearlessly used her unique public platform to call for change.

She withdrew from the Cincinnati Open in 2020 to raise awareness for the police shooting of Jacob Blake. At last year's U.S. Open, she wore masks onto the court displaying the names Floyd, Taylor, Ahmaud Arbery, Trayvon Martin, Tamir Rice and other African Americans who were senselessly killed.

Shortly before withdrawing from the French Open, Osaka decided that talking to the media was simply too stressful. She's extremely shy to begin with, and the added pressure of having to answer questions about her abilities as a tennis player seemed overwhelming.

So, she bowed out, and was fined \$15,000 and threatened with suspension. That prompted her to take a break from tennis.

She was brave to put her personal well-being ahead of her job. She chose to take care of herself because no one in the industry was going to do it for her.

Osaka joins other high-profile Black women who recently decided to take care of themselves by letting go, at least temporarily. Atlanta Mayor Keisha Lance Bottoms chose not to seek a second

term. Chicago Public Schools CEO Janice Jackson is leaving her "dream job" at the end of this school term.

Brava for all of them. Other Black women should consider doing the same if they are feeling overwhelmed — and can afford it. But too often, we don't. Black women generally don't see stepping away from opportunities as an option.

The workplace has long presented unique challenges for Black women, who sometimes feel as though they are held to a higher standard than their white peers. Northwestern Medicine psychologist Inger Burnett-Zeigler calls it "impostor syndrome."

"Black women, particularly in corporate environments, feel like they don't belong, and it intensifies when people question their right to be in a place," she said. "Despite evidence of success, achievement and credibility, there is still this nagging fear or worry of not being good enough."

The No. 2 ranked Osaka has excelled in a sport that is overwhelmingly white, but signs of despair have long been there. After winning early matches at the 2018 Charleston Open, Osaka expressed doubts about herself to the media.

"I was able to win two matches, but I feel like that doesn't really

say I can play well on clay," she said. "I'm just an OK player who was able to play OK."

Being asked repetitive questions by the media exacerbates self-doubt, said Burnett-Zeigler. But many women feel it's easier to suffer in silence than to walk away.

"Much of the backlash Osaka has received falls in line with the unspoken belief that women should just do what they have to do and put up with things that are harmful to them in order to pacify others, be agreeable and keep their 'good jobs,'" said Burnett-Zeigler, who researches Black women's mental health.

By deciding to step away, Osaka set clear boundaries for herself and prioritized her needs over the opinions and agendas of others, she said.

Most Black women don't have Osaka's fame and \$55 million earnings, though. The average white woman earns 82 cents for every dollar earned by white men, but Black women earn only 66 cents, according to the Economic Policy Institute.

Still, amid this socially stressful time, Black women can take this lesson from Osaka. There's absolutely nothing wrong with looking out for No. 1.

HBO's 'Mare' puts renewed social life back on hold

A FEW WEEKS ago I waxed longingly about the day when I would have something to write about besides TV.

In actuality, that has become at least slightly the case, as I've done my best to get out and catch up with the people I missed during all that pandemic quarantining.

But COVID-19 or no COVID-19 (and no, it is not gone by any means), I cannot resist a good limited series —that goes double if there are crime procedural elements involved.

And so it is that despite the world opening back up a bit, and my social calendar finally having a few entries these days, I managed to still find time to obsess over HBO Max's "Mare of Easttown" for the past couple of months.

If you haven't watched it, don't worry — I'm not going to spoil it for you here. I will, however, tell you that you're in luck. You don't have to wait a full week between episodes, like I did. You can happily binge it in one sitting, should the mood strike you.

OK, well, maybe "happily" isn't the correct word — it's not exactly a laugh riot of a program.

What it is, though, is a solid, hard-boiled detective drama with one of the best performances I've seen in ages, provided by a flawless Kate Winslet as the show's main protagonist, Mare Sheehan.

The show's been getting a good bit of press, so chances are you've already heard some of the critical raves and reviews. Or, at the very least, some of the buzz the characters' accents have been getting. Even SNL parodied the show, its setting and its dialect a few weeks ago.

As a person whose mother grew up right outside Philly, I can attest — the accent is weird. And real. My mom somehow doesn't have it, but all of her brothers and sisters do. Everyone drinks "wooder" and pronounces "home" like "hoom."

And yes, they eat a lot of hoagies. (And tomato pie, which is essentially a pizza without cheese, but that's another story.)

But this series is more than a study in very specific dialects and small town tragedy. It ponders whether we really ever know what's going on with the people we're close to, and the depths we'll go to protect the ones we love — sometimes with terrible results.

And the acting is damn fine. Along with Winslet, Jean Smart (a national treasure) and Julianne Nicholson also hit it out of the park. Though none of the cast is the least bit shabby.

I can't talk much about the ending, as I promised not to ruin any of the plot surprises. But I will say I genuinely liked it — not praise I frequently find myself giving these days, when writers often seem to put having a shocking twist above plausibility and decent storytelling.

I guess the best I can do is just tell you to watch it. Marvel at Winslet's work, get a craving for a cheesesteak, try your hand at solving the mysteries Mare's after.

Then venture back out into the daylight and find those friends again. Bright side: You'll have something new to talk about.

I don't know about you, but that's a skill I'm still working on after so much time spent alone. I'll take all the material I can get.

Website offers photos from more than 2,200 campgrounds

DULUTH, Minn. —This has probably happened to you, too: You head out on a camping vacation with visions of your destination — a wooded, private campsite, perfectly level with a great view and not too far from the bathrooms.

But when you arrive you find out the place looks more like a Target parking lot, with few trees and many RVs and tents crammed together like sardines.

If only you could have seen a photograph of the site before you made your reservation.

Well now you can. It's called CampsitePhotos.com and the website already has photographs of nearly every site at more than 2,200 campgrounds nationwide. Information on hundreds of other campgrounds are listed even if there aren't any photos yet.

The website is the brainchild of Eric Edwards, a Californian who would tour regional campgrounds and write down the best campsites for his own personal use in the future.

"I was thinking, why doesn't somebody have this information online? I checked, but nobody did. ... So in 2000 we went online with it," Edwards said.

The site does accept some verified submitted photos but most of the site photos are from freelance photographers that Edwards hires to make sure the pic is of the true campsite numbered.

"We started out West, and that's probably where 60% of our listed sites are," Edwards noted. "But we're all over the country now. We now have most of Minnesota's state parks, Florida, the Northeast. I have a photographer that will be doing just privy campgrounds this summer."

Edwards hopes to start adding Canadian campsites in 2022.

CampsitePhotos.com is adding more photos for more campgrounds constantly and now includes many national parks, state parks, U.S. Forest Service, city and private campgrounds nationwide.

You can search by name if you know it or click the map view to see either private or public campgrounds in whatever state you choose. (The search by map option is great if you know a general area you want to visit but aren't sure of which campground you want to try.)

Search for a campground and up comes a full page with photos of the sites, lists of amenities,

fees, directions and a link to make a reservation. There are also comments and reviews by real people who have actually camped there and much of it good advice on the reality of the place.

There's even a new feature to click if all your campground choices are sold-out — called Campsite Assist — that will use a computer program to constantly check if there have been any cancellations for the campground you want. The site will automatically notify you when there's an opening so you can hurry and reserve the open site.

There's a fee for the text-alert Campsite Assist system, but all of CampsitePhotos.com's other services and information are

free. They will even accept listings from private campgrounds for free. (The website makes money by selling ads.)

We checked out several Northland state park campgrounds like Gooseberry Falls, Tettegouche and Jay Cooke State Park on the website and the pages appear to reflect the true flavor of the sites. Most popular Minnesota state parks already have been photographed and listed. But the site has few options for private or Forest Service campgrounds in the Northland.

Like anyone involved in the outdoor recreation business right now, Edwards reminds campers to book as far ahead of their trip as possible. For many federal sites available at Recre-

ation.gov, that means six months out. But even then you may have to pick alternate dates or a less-popular campground.

Edwards said visits to CampsitePhotos.com are up 40% this year over the long-term average.

"It's just crazy right now all over the country. It's a supply-and-demand problem and demand is way up," Edwards said, noting that reservations have become harder to get as both real people and bots — computer programs aimed at securing campsites the second they become available online — vie for a limited number of campsites, especially during the peak summer months. "You need to be online and ready at 8 a.m. the day your (camping dates) are bookable."

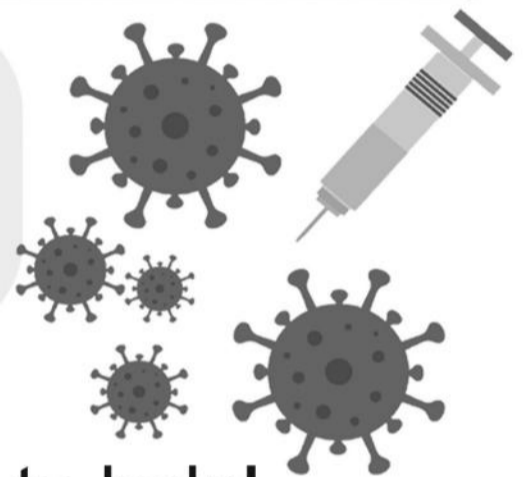

COVID-19 Vaccines: What Older Adults Need to Know



The risk of getting very sick from COVID-19 increases with age. **CDC recommends that adults 65 years and older receive COVID-19 vaccines** to help prevent getting sick from COVID-19.

Key Information about COVID-19 Vaccines:

- You can help protect yourself and people around you by getting a COVID-19 vaccine.
- Studies show that COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective in preventing severe illness from COVID-19. You can't get COVID-19 from the vaccine.
- Depending on which COVID-19 vaccine you get, you might need a second shot 3 or 4 weeks after your first shot.

After getting the vaccine, some people have pain, redness, or swelling where the shot is given. Full body symptoms include tiredness, headache, muscle pain, chills, fever, or nausea. These side effects may affect your ability to do daily activities, but they should go away in a few days. They are normal signs that your body is building protection against COVID-19.

After you are fully vaccinated against COVID-19, you may be able to start doing some things that you stopped doing because of the pandemic.

We're still learning how vaccines will affect the spread of COVID-19. So, you should keep taking these precautions in public places until we know more:

- Wear a mask

The federal government is providing the vaccine **free of charge** to all people living in the United States, regardless of their immigration or health insurance status. COVID-19 vaccination providers **cannot**

- Charge you for the vaccine, vaccine administration fees, copays, or coinsurance, but they can charge an administration fee to your health plan or program, or COVID-19 Uninsured Program.
- Deny vaccination to anyone who does not have health insurance coverage or is out of network.
- Charge an office visit or other fee if the only service provided is COVID-19 vaccination.
- Require additional services for a person to receive a COVID-19 vaccine.

How can I get a COVID-19 Vaccine?

New eyewear lenses require precision measurements

Q: I just got my second pair of glasses online, and still feel like my eyes are not “working together” and wonder how I can know if these are right?

A: Most people have very little idea what goes into making your new glasses perfectly for you. The problem today often begins with the eyewear salesperson not really trained to take the proper measurements so your new prescription lenses align perfectly with your eyes. Getting these precisely — in the new frame you select — is essential for the optical laboratory to grind the lenses exactly as your eyes will align through your lenses.

Now, imagine you order online, as you did — who took the measurements for the prescription design? You likely

used the online “fitting tool” to get some dimensions, but how good are those? In truth, not very good. For the simplest, mild prescription this method may be “close enough.” As your prescription power goes up, and if you have other complications like astigmatism and/or progressive lenses for reading, the accuracy is increasingly critical. Both the measurements to order, and the precision of the optical laboratory to actually

produce what you need are essential to end up with a well fitted pair of glasses, with the optics perfectly aligned with your eyes.

The American Optometric Association reviewed hundreds of online eyewear orders, and found that less than 50% actually had the correct prescription as written by the eye doctor, and commonly the lens misalignments made even “correct” powers uncomfortable to wear. I tell our patients, honestly, it is very difficult to be a good consumer in eyewear. There are countless details that make or break a perfect prescription. There are over 300 progressive lenses sold for those of us over 40 — each a little different in design! How can a layperson possibly know how to select a lens design?

To get you started in solving this issue, you should call your eye doctor’s office and schedule to see one of the opticians in the office. This professional can “read” the prescription in your glasses, and determine if the powers are accurate, and if the lens design is accurate for your eyes. There may be a fee for this service. If the eyewear is found to be incorrect, ask your eye doctor’s office to generate a new prescription for you. You may have a fee for that service. If you are due for your eye exam, do that.

You could then contact the online supplier to see how, or if, they will remake your glasses to accurately match your doctor’s specifications. Frankly, I would recommend having the professionals in the office take

the measurements best for today’s digital lenses, and have them make your glasses. You may pay more than online, but your likelihood of getting accurate eyewear for you is excellent this way. Seriously, you will wear your glasses about two years. What else do you buy and use every day, for over 700 days? Invest in accurately measured and precisely made optics. Usually, these professionals are also well trained to guide your choice in frames to the shape and size that complements your facial appearance, and accommodates your new lenses attractively.

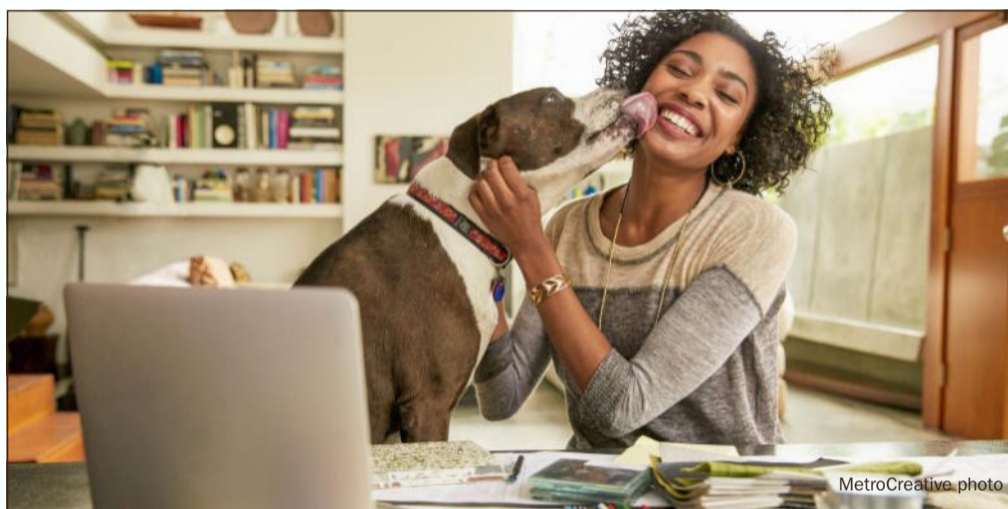

Dog-friendly office? Tips for taking your furry friends to work

For our dogs, spending time in a new environment such as your office can increase socialization skills and get them used to new people, smells and experiences. There is also a calming, soothing effect that dogs can have on humans. Studies have shown that having dogs in the workplace increases productivity, decreases stress levels and even lowers employee absenteeism.

As offices slowly start to reopen, even more dogs may join their owners for the workday. Before your dog’s first day at the



office, it’s important to make sure you’re properly prepared. The American

Kennel Club offers the following tips for people planning to take their

dogs to work:
 ■ Get permission. Ask for permission from your

boss and human resources department beforehand to make sure your building is pet-friendly. You should also ask if any of your co-workers are allergic to or afraid of dogs. Give them a heads-up that your dog will be joining you. In addition to your dog being comfortable, you want to make sure your colleagues are comfortable too.

■ Analyze the surroundings. Before bringing your dog to the office, look around to be sure there is a pet-friendly space for him. Secure all cabinets and any trash cans that may contain food. Remove any small objects from your dog’s reach that can be a choking hazard. Be sure to cover exposed electrical cords or outlets to prevent injury or electrocution if chewed.

■ Be on your best behavior. Your dog should be well-trained and house-broken before coming to the office with you. He should also be well-socialized and safe around strangers. If your dog becomes anxious due to changes in the environment or social situations, the attention and noises

associated with an office may cause him unnecessary stress.

■ Be mindful of health and hygiene. Leave your dog at home if he is under the weather. The last thing you want to do is have him get other dogs visiting the office sick as well. It’s also important to make sure all his vaccines are up to date before bringing him to work. Make sure he is clean and well-groomed before his day at the office. A dirty dog may cause complaints from co-workers.

■ Be prepared. Bring the necessities with you, including food and water bowls, chew toys, treats, clean-up bags and a leash. Be sure that he always has fresh water available.

■ Be a responsible dog owner. Supervise your dog at all times. Be mindful of his behavior and make sure that he is not getting overwhelmed or nervous throughout the day. If you plan on leaving your workspace for a meeting, make sure to have a trustworthy co-worker on hand who doesn’t mind watching your dog while you’re away.

Approach coparenting like it’s a business relationship

Q: I don’t really know my son’s father. We met at a party and I don’t remember much else. Fast forward, our son, Ian, is 4. Both of our lives are now very different — he is married with another child. I am a single mother. How do you problem-solve and coparent with someone you don’t really know?

A: Although not know-

ing your co-parent seems like a huge obstacle, knowing someone prior to having a child does not guarantee smooth sailing.

The biggest red flag I see is that you and your son’s father have had four years to improve your communication, and you’ve done nothing about it.

There’s a practical model for problem-solving when you can’t get along with someone. You approach it like a business relationship: You’re co-CEOs.

You start out by calling a meeting. You do your research so if there are any questions, you can answer with facts, not emotion. You sit down together and discuss the pros and cons with the goal being an agreement to keep the company healthy. You keep the welfare of the company in the forefront during your discussions and make your decisions accordingly. As you work together, it gets easier. You start to look to each other for support because you both want your company to flourish.

For example, you agree that the first person you reach out to for help will be your co-CEO. They care about the company as much as you do.

You are never spiteful or hold grudges because that will interfere with negotiations.

And if you can’t completely agree, you look for the compromise.

Things to do once you have a closing date

Your insurance agent should be contacted to schedule for the cancellation of your homeowners' policy. We always recommend having it set to cancel a few days after closing in case something would happen.

The West Virginia DMV requires you to change your address on your license within 20 days to avoid any fines.

The human resources department, for your employer, will also need to know your new address. These may be places we do not always consider.

Go through your files and leave any appliance manuals for the new buyer. Ask your Realtor if the buyer would want leftover paint that you have used in the home. Any materials that pertain to your house should be left in the garage or attic. This could include shingles and siding or any supplies you have used.

The warmer months offer the ideal environment for outdoor work. Because of this, many professionals get booked up quickly. Think about these top summer home improvement projects, and call your pro before they get too busy.

Repair or replace your roof: \$350-\$1,500 to repair; \$5,400-\$12,000 to replace

Many roof repairs are best done during the summer, which may make it hard to find a pro this time of year. Still, if your roof needs fixing, this is the right time to do it. Many roofing materials require higher temperatures to seal, and the summer sun offers the perfect source.

If you've had recent storms or damaging bad weather, hire a roof inspector to check it out and catch problems early. You'll pay an average of \$200 for this service, but it's well worth it to avoid the major issues that can come from a faulty roof.

Re-stain deck and fence: \$550-\$1,300

Keep your deck and fence looking like new! Protect exterior wood from the elements with a new stain and finish. Experts recommend reapplying stain or finish every few years for the overall health and longevity of your deck and fence. Staining and sealing protects wood by repelling damaging water while allowing the wood to breathe. Invest in quality sealant — the lower-priced options tend to be thinner and less durable.

While you're at it, inspect your deck for extruding nails, broken boards or loose railing, and look for loose or damaged panels in your fencing. Fixing these problems now will help avoid more extensive repairs in the future.

Power washing: \$200-\$400

Power washing offers a great way to quickly blast dirt and grime from exterior surfaces, such as your house, driveways, siding and decks.

Sometimes the term "power wash" is used interchangeably with "pressure wash," but they're not quite the same thing. Driveway/sidewalk repair: \$800-\$2,600

Sooner or later, any asphalt, concrete or cement surface develops cracks. Moisture, freezing and other weather damage will wear it down. For smaller jobs, you can DIY with crack sealer. However, if the cracks are big or numerous, call a pro. Unskilled application of sealants can cause further damage or leave the driveway or sidewalk looking messy. Install a ceiling fan: \$100-\$2,000 including labor and fan

Repair or replace siding: \$300-\$1,300 to repair; \$5,000-\$16,000 to replace

Examine your siding to see if any of it has loosened or started to rot. Fixing damaged siding as quickly as possible will help keep moisture from turning into mold.

If you're thinking about completely replacing your siding, summer is the best time to bring in a local pro to give your home a face-lift.

Canton china decorations have meaning

CANTON CHINA with its blue and white decoration has been a popular collectible for many years, but few can distinguish it from the other early or modern Chinese blue and white china. It has been popular for centuries partly because cobalt blue coloring was safe to use when decorating dishes. Red ware and pewter contained dangerous lead.

times a color is added over the blue designs. This adds color to the piece but often covers the original blue decorations.

Q: Is a Marie Osmond toddler doll, with all the extras, worth something, or should I let my great-granddaughter play with her? The doll has never been taken out of the box, but the box is kind of beaten up and somewhat shabby.

By 1710, the Chinese made at least four patterns of Chinese export porcelain that included landscape designs. Two of the most popular were Nanking (1770-1820) and Canton (1785- 1853). Nanking was decorated with a willow tree, boat, teahouse, birds and a fence. Canton had symbolic decorations including a border band of blue and white scallops representing rain and clouds, a bridge, water, rocks, a pagoda, scholar, water-wheel, riverboats or sampans, two kinds of orchid leaves, and a willow tree. Each symbol had a meaning reflecting endurance, harmony in nature, movement, the old leading the young, or life.

There are other unnamed blue and white patterns from the same period and even a similar English willow pattern. Later Canton pieces are thicker, heavier and have less detailed decorations. There are 92 known shapes of Canton including chamber pots, slop pots, plain pitchers, cider jugs, oyster bowls, patty pan bowls (used to bake crust), helmet pitchers, butter dishes, butter pats (five shapes), and hot water plates. Some-

A: Marie Osmond "Toddler" dolls were designed by Marie Osmond, a singer, entertainer and talk show host. They are part of a series of collector dolls designed by Osmond, first made in 1991 by Knickerbocker Creations of Rancho Santa Margarita, California, and sold on QVC. Part of the proceeds were given to the Children's Miracle Network, a charity Osmond helped establish. Later the dolls were sold in stores, online, and through mail order catalogs. Knickerbocker Creations went bankrupt in 1999. Osmond's husband bought the company in 2001, and it was renamed Marian LLC. He sold the company in 2004, and it became Charisma Brands LLC. The last Toddler dolls were made in 2013. The dolls have porcelain heads, arms and legs

and stuffed cloth bodies. They were "limited editions" meant for collectors, not to be played with. The porcelain parts often break. A doll in good condition sells for \$25 to \$45. Mint in the box, like yours, should bring over \$75.

Q: Can you help me identify the marks on a pottery jug I have? The mark is an irregular shape with a lion standing on a crown in the middle. Printed in a wide border is "Chelsea Royal Pottery, Burslem, H & G, England." Who is the maker, and how old is the jug?

A: This mark was used by Hollinshead & Griffiths at its Chelsea Works in Burslem, Stoke-on-Trent, England. The pottery made china and earthenware. "Royal Chelsea Pottery" and "Chelsea Art Pottery" were trade names used by Hollinshead & Griffiths. The pottery was in business from about 1887 to 1910.

Q: I have an old blue Pyrex bowl with what looks like Amish people on the side. Can you tell me anything about it?

A: Your bowl is from 1957 and is a pattern called Butterprint. It has an Amish farmer and his wife surrounded by various crops. It is one of the most collectible Pyrex patterns. It is also available but much harder to find in pink Butterprint and yellow Butterprint. Collecting Pyrex is popular right now, probably for its nostalgic value.

Q: My grandmother, Olive Urquhart, was an antiques dealer and bottle expert. She was the author of the book "Bottlers and Bottles, Canadian." I was given her "stock" of glass bottles and a few glass vases, stuff she stored in her basement and sold. There are about a hundred boxes of newspaper-wrapped goodies. I'm not

sure how to deal with it. I assume some would be of great value. A few pieces are marked, but I haven't been able to identify the makers. How can I determine what is valuable?

A: Unfortunately, this often happens when a collector-dealer leaves a large collection for the heirs. If you collect, leave instructions for your heirs with the names of friends who collect similar items or dealers that you have worked with in the past. In this instance, this is too big a job to tackle by yourself. You need an expert for a collection this large. Contact bottle auctions to see if they would want to sell all or part of the bottles. Talk to members of the local bottle club. Maybe you can locate some of your grandmother's friends who also collected and would be willing to help. Contact a charity that could hold an auction and give the heirs a tax deduction. Be sure to tell

whoever you contact that your grandmother wrote a book on bottles. It will add provenance to the items and to the value.

Luxury home sales soar as U.S. recovery favors wealthy buyers

Luxury home sales in the U.S. are soaring faster than lower-cost segments as remote work, brimming stock portfolios and rising listings give wealthy buyers an edge.

In the three months through April, purchases of high-end homes increased 26% from a year earlier, according to a report by the brokerage Redfin. Sales of the most-affordable properties — in high demand by first-time buyers, downsizers and property investors alike — rose 18%. Mid-priced homes gained 15%.

The rich are best-positioned to buy real estate, now that vaccines bring the pandemic's end into view and the inventory crunch begins to ease. Listings of high-end homes in the three-month period rose 19% from a year earlier, outpacing a 14% gain for affordable properties and a 9% increase for mid-priced listings, Redfin said.

"So far, the economic recovery from the pandemic has disproportion-

ately benefited Americans with bigger bank accounts," Redfin Chief Economist Daryl Fairweather said in the report. "This means a lot of the demand for homes is coming from folks who are well-off, while many lower-income Americans sit on the sidelines because they've been priced out of the housing market due to surging prices."

Redfin divided U.S. residential properties into three equal-sized buckets based on the homes' market values. The year-over-year changes for prices and inventory were somewhat exaggerated because pandemic lockdowns froze transactions for a couple months starting in April 2020.

San Francisco led the surge in expensive home purchases, with an 82% jump, according to Redfin's analysis of the country's 50 most-populous metropolitan areas. Following were neighboring Oakland, with a 72% gain, and Miami, where high-end sales rose 70%.

Former housekeeper recalls stain that 'looked like blood' in Robert Durst's New York cottage after first wife went missing

A former housekeeper told jurors Thursday that she saw a blood-like substance inside Robert Durst's cottage in New York's Westchester County after the real estate tycoon's wife went missing nearly 40 years ago.

"I was at the house, Bob's house, and two officers came to the door and held up a newspaper that she was missing," Elizabeth Jones testified, referring to Durst's first wife Kathie, who vanished the night of Jan. 31, 1982, and is presumed dead.

"There was something on the dishwasher — looked like blood. It looked like blood," she told the Los Angeles jury now deciding whether Durst killed his best friend Susan Berman in 2000 because he

allegedly worried she might implicate him in Kathie's disappearance.

Asked Thursday if the blood-like stain appeared new and "fresh," Jones said it did.

She also described another observation she made inside the lakefront home in South Salem, New York, that day.

"In the dining room there was ... there was hidden panels above a closet, and I noticed fingerprints on them," she said, agreeing that it looked like the panels had "been opened."

Jones said she pointed out the mark on the dishwasher as well as the panels to the troopers, but they spent less than five minutes in the house.

"They just came in, looked at what I showed them, and then they left," she said. "They didn't seem interested."

She said "a couple of weeks" later, she noticed something else odd at the house.

"I came in another day to clean, and the front hall had hundreds of rolls of toilet paper," she said. "It was bags and bags of toilet paper throughout the front hall. ... And then the following week it wasn't there."

During cross-examination, defense lawyer Dick DeGuerin focused on Jones' young age at the time she spoke to the state troopers.

"At 23 years old, you saw a stain and you thought it looked like blood ... But you showed it to the troopers, and they didn't take a sample of it?" he asked.

"No they did not," she said.

"Did that indicate to you that they didn't think it was blood?" he asked.

"That's correct," she said.

Durst, 78, has pleaded not guilty to Berman's murder, with his lawyers saying he has no idea who shot the 55-year-old writer execution-style inside her Los Angeles bungalow in December 2000.

The lawyers say Durst also has no idea what happened to Kathie.

The multimillionaire murder suspect was arrested in the Berman case at a New Orleans hotel on March 14, 2015, a day before the finale of the blockbuster HBO true crime series "The Jinx," which documented his life.

The jury now deciding Durst's fate heard excerpts last March from the final "Jinx" episode, shortly before the trial was adjourned for more than a year due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Real estate Q&A: What are my rights after a neighbor's dog bit my pooch?

Q: I was walking my little pooch when a neighbor's dog ran out of his yard and attacked my little guy. He was bitten several times, and I had to take him to the vet for his injuries. The neighbor is downplaying it and refusing to do anything about it. What are my rights? — Albert

A: Animal owners have to keep their pets from hurting someone else or damaging property.

As much as we love our pets, the law considers them to be the property of their owner, so this duty extends to keeping their dog from hurting your dog.

If your neighbor's negligence or inattention led to his dog getting loose, he would have to repay you for your veterinarian bills. Had the attack been fatal, he would have to reimburse you the cost of replacing your pet.

While having your dog attacked can be very traumatic,

you cannot be compensated for the emotional distress except in very rare circumstances where the dog's owner acted with extreme maliciousness.

Had you been bitten, you could also be compensated for your injuries.

These cases are very fact-specific, and it will often come down to the details and location of the attack. If you were both walking your pups on a leash and they fought while you were passing each other, it will be challenging to figure out who was at fault.

Situations like yours, where the dog rushed at you without a leash, are easier to determine fault. You should take notes and photographs and save your receipts as with any legal matter. Make a police report shortly after the incident and get a copy of your vet's records.

If your neighbor continues to deny responsibility, you may need to take him to court to get reimbursed for the expenses he caused.

Mortgage borrowers' credit scores rise to new record high

Americans with near-perfect credit scores are reaping the rewards of record-low mortgage rates, a trend that underscores the economic divide created by the coronavirus recession.

The typical credit score for mortgage borrowers rose to 788 in the first quarter, a record high, the Federal Reserve Bank of New York said in a quarterly report. That's the highest level in at least two decades. During the era of loose lending that led to the Great Recession, the median credit score of mortgage borrowers fell as low as 707.

Meanwhile, only a quarter of borrowers who

landed home loans during the January-through-March period had credit scores of less than 742. Just 10 percent had credit scores below 688, according to the New York Fed's data.

The numbers have been skewed upward in part by the large share of mortgage refinancings in 2020 and 2021. People who already own homes generally have higher credit scores than first-time buyers.

What's more, mortgage lenders grew more risk-averse during the coronavirus pandemic. In the early months of the recession, mortgage brokers described being required to complete near-obsessive verifications of borrowers' employment and incomes.

A symptom of the K-shaped recovery

Americans' fortunes have diverged widely during this recession. Those who can work remotely have continued to collect paychecks. Home prices have soared, and stocks have recovered the value they lost earlier in the year.

However, lower-wage workers struggle as restaurants, hotels and other service-sector employers continue to be battered by the pandemic. Economists have invoked the K-shaped recovery to describe the disconnect — affluent Americans' fortunes are rising like the top half of the letter, while the working classes are experiencing the downward slope of

the bottom half of the K.

"A symptom of the K-shaped consumer recovery is that those on steady financial footing or with higher incomes are able to buy a home or refinance the mortgage on an existing home," says Greg McBride, CFA, Bankrate chief financial analyst. "The pool of borrowers in 2020 seems to increasingly come from the upper leg of the K."

The highest possible credit score in the FICO system is 850. A score higher than 740 is considered excellent.

"A FICO score is not an indication of wealth," says radio host and author Chris Hogan, a personal finance expert. "It's more of an indication of how

you've dealt with debt."

Rising scores come with an upside for both lenders and borrowers: A homeowner with a credit score approaching 800 is exceedingly unlikely to default. For borrowers, that means little risk of a financially devastating foreclosure.

"If you sign on to buy a home before you're ready, it can be more of a curse than a blessing," Hogan says.

What you can do

Your credit score is the single most important factor in determining your mortgage rate. Here's how you can boost it — and what to do if your score won't go any higher:

Pay down credit card debt: If you have a choice

between tackling debt or scraping together a larger down payment, it's wiser to focus on the debt, because that should improve your credit score.

Pay monthly bills on time: Payment history plays the biggest part in your credit score. To keep from forgetting to write a check, automate your routine payments. To avoid a missed payment, build your emergency savings.

Consider an FHA or VA loan: Compared to conforming loans backed by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac, mortgages backed by the Federal Housing Administration and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs carry less stringent rules about credit scores. However, the upfront fees are higher.

Average mortgage rates flat to higher; 30-year at 2.99%

WASHINGTON (AP) — Mortgage rates were flat to higher this week. The benchmark 30-year home loan remained below the 3% mark amid continued positive indications of the economy's recovery from the pandemic recession.

Mortgage buyer Freddie Mac reported Thursday that the average for the 30-year rate rose to 2.99% from 2.95% last week. At this time last year, the average long-term rate stood at 3.18%.

The rate for a 15-year loan, popular among those seeking to refinance, was unchanged from last week at 2.27%.

In the latest economic news, the government reported that the number of Americans seeking unemployment benefits dropped last week for a fifth straight week, to 385,000, a new pandemic low and additional evidence that the job market is regaining its health as the economy further reopens.

With historically low mortgage rates prevailing, the U.S. housing market has grown so overheated as demand outpaces supply that prices keep hitting record highs — and roughly half of all houses are now selling above their list price.

Let the games begin: Game show trio premieres on ABC

With sunny summer days before us, it's time to have some fun. Enjoy a little lighthearted television as one network brings back three popular game shows featuring celebrities, nail-biting competition and plenty of laughs.

First, Steve Harvey ("The Steve Harvey Show") hosts as two teams of celebs compete to win money for charity in the season premiere of "Celebrity Family Feud," airing Sunday, June 6, on ABC. The network follows that up with the premiere of the sophomore season of "The Chase," a quiz show in which three contestants face off against an expert quiz master. Finally, host Anthony Anderson ("Black-ish") introduces a panel of celebrities who have to guess which participants are lying in "To Tell the Truth."

Game shows have been around since the dawn of television, easily capturing the attention of viewers as they watch contestants compete for cash and prizes. In "Celebrity Family Feud," as with its predecessor, "Family Feud," two teams consisting of five players try to guess the most popular answers to survey questions asked of the audience prior to the show. In the celebrity version, the famous contestants compete to win money for a charity near and dear to their hearts.

As traditional game shows go, "Celebrity Family Feud" ranks among the most popular with a loyal weekly audience. In the summer of 2020, the show was the No. 1 program in its time-slot in total viewers, and ABC is surely hoping for a repeat performance this summer.

The revival's ratings are, at least in part, thanks to the show's charismatic host. Given the state of the world and the stress of the past several months, we could all use a laugh right now, and Harvey is known for bringing the funny to prime time. Now an award-winning performer, comedian, TV host and author, Harvey started out on the standup comedy circuit before finding success as the host of

"Showtime at the Apollo" and landing his very own sitcom, "The Steve Harvey Show," which aired in the late '90s and early 2000s on The WB.

Of course, Harvey isn't the only star of "Celebrity Family Feud." Each week throughout the summer, the show features new teams comprised of big-name stars from the worlds of television, movies and sports. The Season 8 premiere features iconic actors Rob Lowe ("The West Wing") and Terrence Howard ("Hustle & Flow," 2005) and their teams.

While Harvey kicks off the evening with some laughs, the evening takes a more serious turn in the high-stakes game show "The Chase."

Based on the British TV program of the same name, "The Chase" features ordinary people competing for extraordinary prizes. American audiences were first introduced to the series thanks to

Game Show Network's 2013 version, which featured Brooke Burns ("Baywatch") as host.

"The View's" Sara Haines hosts the ABC revival of the trivia competition, which premiered in January and was

quickly renewed for a second season this summer.

Three contestants go head to head with a so-called "Chaser," who is described as "a ruthless quiz genius" in the show's official description. Game show fans may recognize the show's Chasers from another famous trivia series — "Jeopardy!" ABC has recruited "Jeopardy!" champions Ken Jennings, James Holzhauer and Brad Rutter to serve as the title quiz masters to beat. The three men faced off in the Greatest of All Time "Jeopardy!" tournament in January for a \$1-million prize, but now they're on the same team. In "The Chase," only one of them will play against the contestants at a time while the other two offer running commentary from backstage as the game plays out.

On stage, the contestants must stay

one step ahead of the chosen Chaser as they answer up to 166 questions to build their prize fund in the hopes of walking away with thousands of dollars. To keep the cash, they'll have to face off against the Chaser in another round of questions. In the final round, known as the Final Chase, they will have to answer even more questions before the Chaser can answer the same number of questions to catch the contestants.

Besting Jennings, Holzhauer or Rutter is easier said than done, making for an exciting competition.

Next up, Anthony Anderson introduces larger-than-life celebrities to people who try to fool them in "To Tell the Truth."

With all three contestants claiming to be the same person or to have the same talent, job or achievement, it is up to the stars to question the players to figure out who's telling the truth. While one player is sworn to tell the truth, the other two attempt to trick the panellists. It's a tried-and-true format that's been around since the 1950s when the show first premiered on CBS.

"To Tell the Truth" has been revived several times over the years in syndication and was also briefly on NBC in the 1990s before moving to ABC in 2016. Anderson has been at the helm of the ABC version from the very beginning, and his mom, Doris Day Bowman, a.k.a. Mama Doris, also appears on the show, often weighing in with entertaining commentary.

Unlike earlier versions of "To Tell the Truth," ABC's version runs for 60 minutes instead of 30 and features some bonus gameplay, including a Before You Go round featuring two imposters. While the first season of the ABC incarnation featured a fixed panel, subsequent seasons have featured a rotating roster of celebrities. Fans will have to tune in this summer to see which stars make the panel.

Whether you are looking for some silly fun, want to watch an intense quiz show or just want to see celebrities goofing around, ABC's new trio of game shows has something for everyone.

Don't miss the season premieres of "Celebrity Family Feud," "The Chase" and "To Tell the Truth," all airing Sunday, June 6, on ABC.

Late but great: UEFA Euro 2020 has arrived

UEFA Euro 2020 has finally arrived. Don't miss the European championship's opening weekend, featuring a game between Group B rivals Belgium and Russia on Saturday, June 12, live from St. Petersburg, Russia, on ABC and ESPN.

ABC and ESPN are home to Euro 2020, which, as its name suggests, was originally scheduled to take place last summer. Another quirk of the tournament is that the games will be played in 11 different countries across Europe, as opposed to the usual single host country (like that of 2016, which was held exclusively in France).

Favorites going into this tournament are France, Germany and Spain, the first of which is led by 22-year-old superstar Kylian Mbappé, who will be looking to avenge the team's loss in the final at home in the last tournament. While both Germany and Spain are going through transitional periods, they contain far too much talent in their squads to be overlooked.

Meanwhile, the Euros will be seeing two new teams on the pitch this year as both North Macedonia and Finland qualified for the games for the first time in their histories.

On Saturday, however, Belgium will be looking to capitalize on the talent of its players in a major tournament.

Led by one of the world's best players, Kevin De Bruyne, Belgium has entered the past few tournaments as the favorite but has so far been unable to translate that talent into team success (although it did finish third at the 2018 FIFA World Cup).

Russia will also be hoping to do better on Saturday than its previous Euro appearance.

In the 2016 tournament, Russia was unable to exit the group stage, although its 2018 World Cup appearance should give it some hope as it managed to reach the quarter-finals before being knocked out by eventual finalist Croatia. Led by striker Artem Dzyuba, Russia will be looking to get this year's tournament started brightly.

'This Is' it: NBC's multi-generational tear-jerker calls it quits

'This Is' it: It's official — NBC's top-rated and top tear-inducing drama, "This Is Us," will wrap after its sixth season airs in the 2021-22 season.

Understandably, the news has upset a lot of fans who aren't ready to say goodbye to the Pearson family — all generations of it — in the new year, but creator Dan Fogelman always intended "This Is Us" to be a limited series; in fact, that's how it was initially pitched to the network, though it's been hinted that, at one point, executives were hoping to extend its run.

Fogelman has repeatedly asserted that there has always been a predetermined six-season story arc, so it should reassure fans (somewhat) to know there's a solid plan to do right by these beloved characters.

Shortly after the network's announcement, Fogelman responded on Twitter: "Whoever casually first said, 'All good things must come to an end,' never had to end their favorite thing. While sad to have just [one] season left, also grateful to NBC for letting us end the show how, and when, we always intended. We'll work hard to stick the landing."

Cast member (and family matriarch) Mandy Moore shared Fogelman's message on Instagram, captioning it with "Officially official. One season left of my favorite job. You can bet we will be soaking in every single moment."

Fellow cast member Susan Kelechi Watson, who stars as Beth Pearson, similarly retweeted Fogelman's post and added "what a ride it's been ... what an incredible season to come."

No word yet on how many episodes

are left, though The Hollywood Reporter speculated that a count of 18 — the same number of episodes in every season except the last one — would carry it over the 100-episode mark and boost its chances at landing a very lucrative syndication deal.

It's a wrap-ish: If it feels like a lot of TV shows are in the news lately because they're ending or bouncing around, this is the usual time for these kinds of announcements as networks have been busy unveiling their fall lineups and deciding which shows will make the cut — a "luxury" they didn't have last year when animation was the only TV genre still in production.

Still, it doesn't make it any easier to accept bad news, such as the fact that "Black-ish" will soon be ending. ABC recently renewed the award-winning comedy for an eighth season, but sadly, it will be its last.

Creator Kenya Barris, who is still involved despite signing with Netflix in 2018, announced the renewal/cancellation on social media. He went on to explain what the show has meant to him.

"In this day and age it is rare to get to decide when your show should come to an end, and we are grateful along with ABC to be able to make this final season exactly what we'd hoped for — and to do it with the entire and AMAZINGLY STELLAR cast coming back to close this chapter out with us the right way!" Barris continued, "This show has changed my life in so many ways and I am so proud of the conversations we've started along the way. None of this would have been possible without our audience and supporters, who have championed the show every step of the journey; allowing us to change

not just the narrative of Black Families, but of Family, Culture, and the World in general. All the while allowing us to talk about things that people were not supposed to talk about period and especially on a network television comedy."

The renewal offers fans a silver lining, at least, but spinoff series "Mixed-ish" didn't fare as well: ABC opted to pull the plug on that series, which admittedly was not a strong performer in terms of ratings (it was actually one of the least-watched shows on ABC).

In an interview with Deadline, ABC and Hulu boss Craig Erwich indicated the network wasn't moving forward with "Old-ish," the planned spinoff built around Laurence Fishburne and Jenifer Lewis's characters.

Erwich did leave the door open for other "-ish" spinoffs in the future, but talk of a possible "Brown-ish" spinoff from Eva Longoria sparked a bit of a backlash on social media.

The devil you know: April Ludgate as the mother of the Antichrist? Not quite. But "Parks and Recreation" actress Aubrey Plaza has been added to the voice cast of "Little Demon," a new animated horror sitcom coming soon to FXX.

Plaza will be joined by another familiar name (and voice), that of Danny DeVito ("It's Always Sunny in Philadelphia"), as well as DeVito's real-life daughter, Lucy DeVito ("Deadbeat").

Behind the scenes, "Community" creator Dan Harmon will serve as executive producer.

Written by Darcy Fowler ("Louie"), Seth Kirschner ("Lipstick Jungle") and Kieran Valla ("Stop the Bleeding!"), "Little Demon" centers on the relationship between the Devil (voiced by Danny DeVito), a mother (Plaza) and her, well, um, Antichrist daughter (Lucy DeVito). Plaza's character and her daughter are trying to live an ordinary life in Delaware, but their efforts are constantly thwarted by monstrous forces, including the Devil, who wants custody of his daughter's soul.

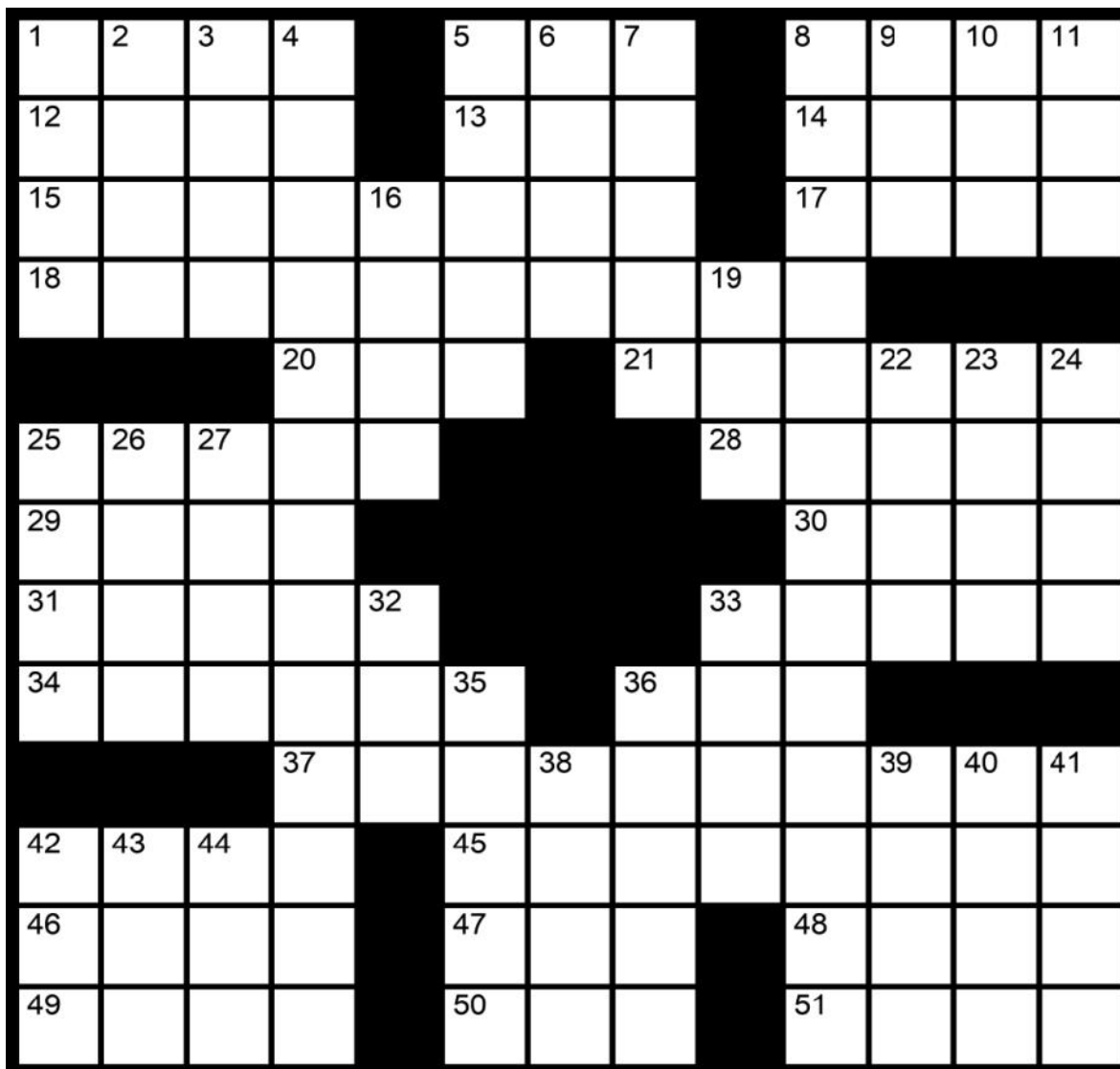

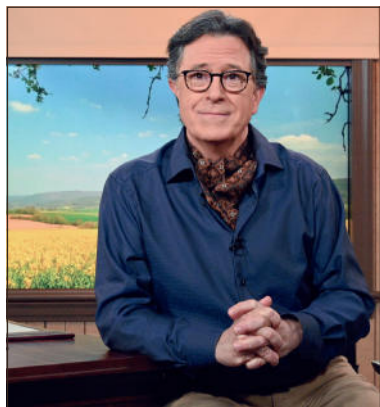

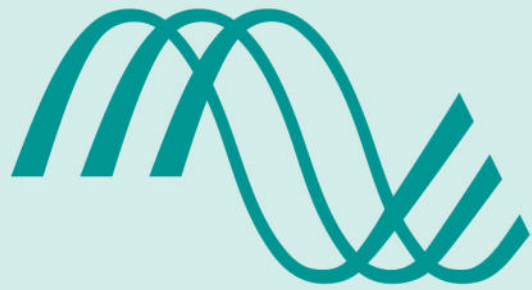
