Following a European-wide audition, ConTempo were appointed as the RTÉ String Quartet in Residence in 2013. They recorded the music for Tom Hanks & Steven Spielberg's 'Band of Brothers' and performed in front of world personalities such as Prince Charles, Pope John Paul II, Nelson Mandela, Nobel prize winners & Hollywood stars.

Aileen Cahill has won many prizes for solo piano, organ, chamber music, piano duet, as well as vocal and instrumental duo at feiseanna throughout the country. In masterclass, she has studied with esteemed teachers such as Bernard Roberts, Christian Favre, Barry Douglas, Jacques Rouvier, Marie-Francoise-Bucquet, Alexander Vinnitski and Gyula Stuller. She continues to compete internationally. Currently, Aileen is repetiteur and keyboard tutor at National University of Ireland, Maynooth and the Conservatory of Music, D.I.T.

Dónal Clancy is an acclaimed guitarist, singer and performer. His father and uncles of The Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem are often regarded as the first group to bring Irish folk song to a worldwide audience in the 1950s and 60s. Dónal grew up in a household and community steeped in music. He spent his early childhood in Canada and the US before his family settled back in An Rinn, Co. Waterford in 1983.

His father gave him his first guitar at the age of eight and he was playing professionally by his early teens. After returning from a residency at Delaney's Irish Pub in Hong Kong in the mid-nineties, he co-founded the group Danú but left soon after to join a trio with his father, Liam, and cousin, Robbie O'Connell. Their debut tour in 1996 took them across the US. They continued to tour together for a couple of more years and recorded two albums before they disbanded in the early noughties.

Later Dónal moved to New York where he became the go-to guitarist for many of the top Irish music acts. He contributed to albums and tours with Riverdance fiddler, Eileen Ivers and was guest guitarist with The Chieftains on their Tears of Stone Tour in Japan and the US in 1999. From 2000 – 2002 he was a member of the Irish-American super-group Solas and in 2003 he re-joined the group Danú who would go on to become one of the most successful Irish bands today

In 2009, Dónal returned to live in Ireland with his wife, Mary and their three children.

Dónal's latest album On the Lonesome Plain features a mix of seven vocal tracks and six guitar instrumentals, including two of his own compositions.

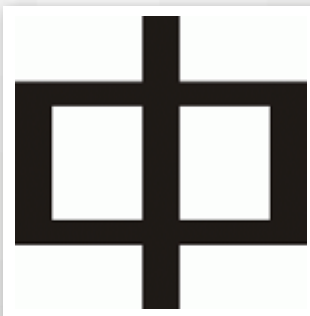
Bill had experimented with some oils but quickly developed a preference for acrylics with which he found he could achieve the same effect.

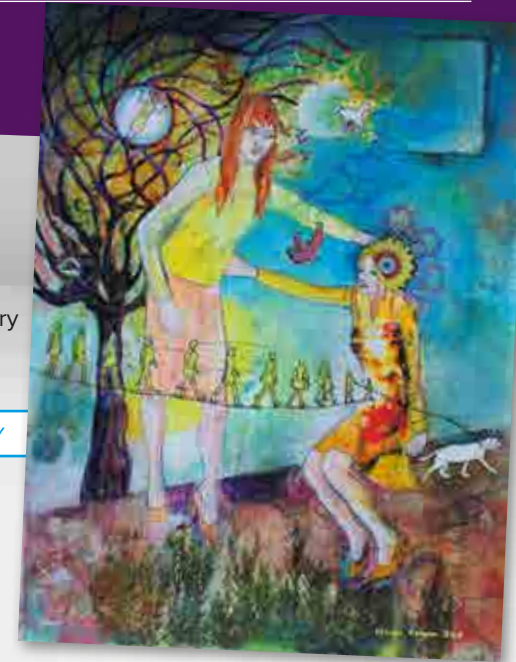

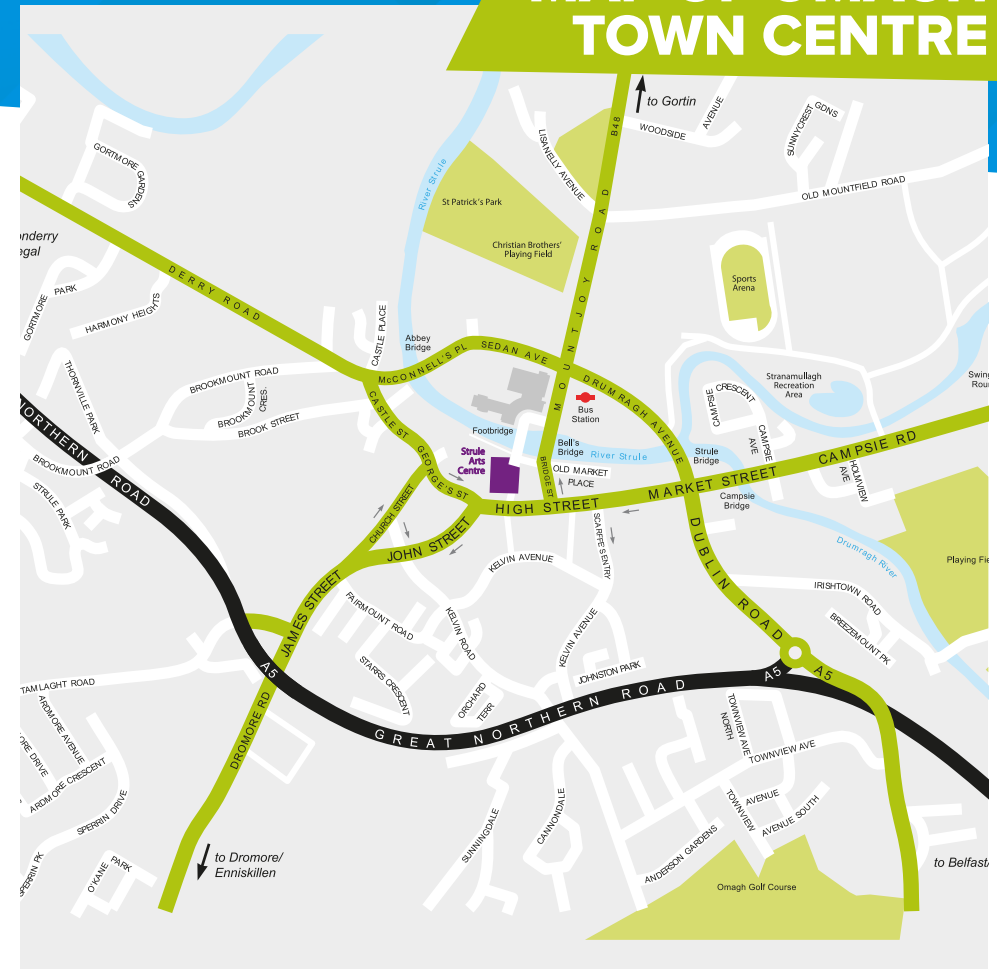
