Agapanthus 'Short Dark Seedlings'	Our latest hybridisation between 'Lilliput' and 'Hannah's Crosses'. Short and dark. Choose your favourite flower. It will be one of a kind!	14

<i>Allium chinense</i>	A culinary Asian herb that provides us with a very pretty lilac-pink autumn flowering onion. 25cm.	6.9
<i>Allium Ex Millenium</i> 'Pale Pink Seedling'	Slightly lighter in colour than the parent plant, which is noted for the quality of its pinkish-purple summer umbels over green strapped leaves. 40cm	6.9
<i>Allium lusitanicum</i> 'Summer Beauty'	A handy small growing onion for the border front with green, fleshy linear leaves and shallow domes of lilac-mauve flowers. 50cm.	6.9
<i>Allium senescens</i> subsp. <i>glaucum</i>	An excellent border front candidate, the twisted glaucous foliage topped with domed heads of lilac-pink flowers on 20cm spikes.	6.9

<i>Alstroemeria psittacina</i>	A Brazillian exotic with narrow trumpet flowers in crimson tipped with apple green, the interior decorated with dark guidelines in preparation for an insects' ball. Mulch in winter. 60cm.	7.5
<i>Althaea cannabina</i>	From a tight rootstock, twiggy stems grow to 1.8m or more supporting through summer 2cm wide palest pink hollyhock like flowers backed by green calyces. Charming and easy given good drainage.	6.9
<i>Althaea officinalis</i> 'Alba'	Dainty white cupped flowers over a long summer season on this lofty grey leaved perennial. Excellent with grasses. 2m	6.9

Bergenia stracheyi 'Alba'	Very neat, small leaves, produces short spikes of white flowers that fade to palest pink. Charming. 25cm.	6.9
Berkheya purpurea 'Zulu Warrior'	An exciting newcomer, Its spiky leaves and stems are topped with large silver-lilac daisy flowers. A South African plant requiring good drainage. 60cm.	6.9
Betonica macrantha 'Superba'	Formerly Stachys, whorls of good sized rose-purple flowers over handsome, leafy clumps. A first class, bomb-proof plant suitable for lazy gardeners. 50cm.	6.8
Betonica officinalis 'Alba'	Formerly Stachys, a pretty short white favourite, and pert enough for the border front. 60cm.	6.8
Betonica officinalis 'Blush'	Formerly Stachys, tight clumps of crimped leaves topped with clusters of blush pink flowers. Very pretty, even in winter with its pert, preserved seed heads. 35cm.	6.8
Betonica officinalis 'Hummelo'	Formerly Stachys, plantsman Ernst Pagels' fine selection with spikes of lilac-purple flowers in mid-summer. 35cm.	6.8
Briza media 'Limouzi'	This 'Quaking grass' always steals hearts with its rustling, dark flowers on wiry stems. 45cm.	6.9
Bunium bulbocastanum	The native 'Great Pignut'. A pretty white umbel with delicate foliage. The tubers and foliage are edible. Great on chalk. 45cm.	6.8
Calamagrostis brachytricha	A truly beautiful soft grass from Korea, the plumes emerge smokey purple. Sparkles in the autumn dew. 120cm. AGM.	7.8
Calamagrostis varia	A European Reedgrass. The flowering purple stems fade to the colour of wheat and arch beautifully. Full Sun/ Part Shade. 60cm.	7.8
Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Karl Foerster'	A vertical thrust of a plant, this bleached biscuit grass is like an exclamation mark in your borders! 180cm.	7.8

Chamaenerion angustifolium 'Album'	The ethereal white flowers of 'Rose-Bay Willow-herb' always draw favourable comments unlike its terror striking running roots. Whatever - Bon courage! 1.5m	6.9
Chamaenerion angustifolium 'Stahl Rose'	The prettiest form of Rose-Bay Willow herb we think, pale pink with crimson calyxes. Exquisite – but how it runs! 1.6m	6.9

Deschampsia cespitosa 'Tardiflora'	A Karl Foerster selection of the tufted hair grass, flowering more tardily than most, from July. 75cm.	7.2
Dianthus 'Telhouet'	Plucked (with permission!) from a friends Breton garden where it made grey mounds covered in spiced clove scented vibrant pink flowers, semi double. An old French variety ?– who knows? 25cm	6.8
Dianthus 'Tatra Fragrance'	A low growing habit and striking red wheel spoke pattern to otherwise fragrant white flowers make for a charming pink. 25cm.	6.8

Dianthus carthusianorum 'Tall Form'	Considerably taller than the type, but with grey foliage and the same startlingly bright pink flowers. 90cm.	6.8
Dianthus deltoides 'Leuchtfunk'	Saturated crimson flowers, like splashes of blood over a mat of deep green foliage. 20cm.	6.8
Dianthus monspessulanus	Fringed pale pink flowers with a knockout scent. Good drainage and a sunny spot please! 50cm.	6.8
Diascia 'Emma'	Narrow leaved suckering clumps and a profusion of dusky deep pink flowers. Exactly what we expect of these marvellous, hardy plants. 30cm	6.9
Diascia intergerrima 'Blush'	A long flowering Twinspur. White with a pale pink centre and a trailing habit. Perfect in pots. Full Sun. 30cm	6.9

Eryngium giganteum 'Silver Ghost'	The best and most silvery selection of this species collected in the Pontic Alps of Turkey. Biennial. AGM. 80cm.	6.9
Eryngium pandanifolium	Of great architectural presence, in September flowering trunks rise to 2.5 metres over sword shaped leaves terminating in a branched network of small maroon-purple flowers whose scent, once encountered is not easily forgotten.	7.2

Eupatorium purpureum maculatum 'Orchard Dene'	Stood out like a sore thumb in the Wisley trials, with its huge heads of showy flowers and dark stems and deservedly awarded an AGM. 2m+	7.5
Euphorbia cornigera	A border stalwart. A long succession of vibrant lime green flowers appear on branching heads. This form is upright on wonderfully dark stems. 90cm.	6.9

Euphorbia donii	The refined line and detail of this Himalayan spurge together with its long flowering period lifts it, we think, above its peers. 120cm.	6.9
Euphorbia donii 'Amjillasa'	Emerging tight clumps of gold & green spring foliage, followed by large heads of bright golden lime bracts . Originally a Kew collected seed strain, this a mid-border must-have. 1m.	6.9
Euphorbia epithymoides 'Midas'	Not difficult to imagine the bracts and flowers of this brilliant spring flowering plant having been touched by King Midas' hand and consequently turned to Gold. 45cm.	6.9
Euphorbia griffithii 'Fern Cottage'	A very good form with decorative fiery reddish-orange flower bracts. Would liven up any late spring border. 90cm.	6.9
Euphorbia seguieriana ssp. niciana	The attractive Medusa-like mound of fine glaucous leaves and wirey stems is enhanced by a long season of small heads of chrome yellow flowers. A showy front liner but craves good sun. 45cm	6.9
Eurybia divaricata	Wiry black stems support a shower of small narrow rayed, white daisies. Gertrude Jekyll liked it too – so there! 40cm.	6.9
Filipendula vulgaris 'Multiplex'	Over cut, carrot like basal foliage, stems carry creamy-white clouds of tiny double flowers. A charming plant of Cottage Garden character. 45cm.	6.9
Foeniculum vulgare 'Smoky'	Bronze Fennel. A good deep bronze seed strain with a marked bloom to the young stems. 1.5m	6.9

Fuchsia magellanica 'Thompsonii'	Wonderful in its full glory in late summer. The slender red and purple flowers held on arching stems associate beautifully with blue Agapanthus. 150cm +.	7.2

Geranium 'Sabani Blue'	Brilliant violet blue notched flowers over strict clumps of softly hairy leaves. Fanfares the start of the Cranesbill season in May. 30cm.	6.8
Geranium clarkei 'Kashmir White'	In spite of its age remains a superlative Cranesbill. Large, white with mushroom-pink veining. 30cm.	6.8
Geranium macrorrhizum 'White-Ness'	Easy sun or shade creeping groundcover. Apple green emerging foliage and the purest white flowers. 30cm	6.8
Geranium phaeum 'Lisa'	Sulphur yellow and white zonal leaf markings in early spring. Flowers being typically violet-purple. 60cm.	6.8
