Safety first. Visitors to the gardens are asked to be healthy, wear cloth face masks, keep 6 feet of separation from other family groups and limit to 10 people in a garden at a time. If the maximum number of 10 has been reached, you may wait by your car until someone leaves and you can take their place. Visitors are asked to bring cameras and share pictures / videos for the website. Plan to bring a lunch or get fast food. Hosts may provide bottled water.

If you can't attend open gardens, Peggy Nerdahl will plan to make a video of all the open gardens and upload to YouTube within a few days of the open gardens. We will add the link to the front page of the website as soon as it is uploaded to YouTube. ### 2020 Spring Bulb Sale - Barbara J Ronningen

The 2020 Spring Bulb Sale was an enormous success – despite all the hurdles that were thrown in the way. First, there was this pandemic, then Bachman's closed, and finally, customs and USPS took a long time to get one of our biggest orders to Minnesota from Canada.

I am so impressed with the work of the Bulb Sale Committee – Forrest Peiper, Bill Bauer, Jenn Lanz, Tracey Nelson and Mary Wickersham. These folks put in hundreds of volunteer hours, and the result was a highly successful sale. Let's have a virtual round of applause for their work.

By the numbers, 1,186 bulbs were sold – we sold out! 88 orders were received from 70 members (no sales this spring to the general public). Average order size was 12 bulbs. This year because of the online approach 5 members outside the metro area opted to have their bulbs shipped to them. Thank you to all the members who embraced this sale and made it a big success!

The second day, we drove south of Christchurch towards Dunedin, first to Geraldine, to Dave and Lois Atwoods' home. Dave is pictured with Timaru City, one of



Des Paulson's registered lilies. Dave had gorgeous lilies, but also Rhododendrons, species fuschia (native to New Zealand) and some unusual trees including a claw foot maple. He is a collector of a wide variety of plants, rare plants and also many species. Rick Rodich would be in his element with Dave Atwood.

Jim and Bev Kane in Timaru were our next stop - pictured with Peggy below. Jim started growing lilies later in life, just 4 years ago. You would never dream it, because he has such a gorgeous lily collection.



He and Bev Winter started growing lilies about the same time and it didn't take them long to fill their gardens with our favorite flower along with many other beautiful plant materials.

His roses had not a blemish due to a regular spraying schedule. I enjoyed a yellow lily- really prolific. Jim said he would send me some seed. And look at the size of the lilies Jim grows!



Our last stop of the day was at the home of renowned lily hybridizer, Des Paulson. He had a *kellogii* blooming, a western U.S. species lily - quite hard to grown, but we saw it!! He shared some pollen with me from one of his trumpets. When we first met him in 2014, Des had done some hybridizing with the MN hybrid, 'Louise' and came up with a lily that he named 'Leoni'. Des's orange trumpet was on the cover of the North Star Lily News last month.



There is more to tell, so you will have to ask me if you are interested. It is such a pleasure to meet lily gardeners where ever we are in the world. They are wonderful people.

Backhouse and Claude Shride. Species include tsingtauense (eaten), alba, albiflorum, dalhansonii (eaten), hansonii (appears to be blind).
