

INTRODUCTION

Buttons have been issued in sets and series ever since the first celluloid pinbacks were manufactured in the 1890's. Indeed, the "series" antedate the pinbacks, since many of the early sets of celluloid buttons were simply an expression, in a new medium, of previous series of trade cards, tobacco silks, insert cards, etc. These had been collected avidly and widely, both in the United States and abroad, and it wasn't long before pinback buttons joined other collections as a serious hobby for Victorian gentlemen and ladies.

The first of these buttons—7/8" celluloids—were issued primarily by cigarette and gum manufacturers, most notably Sweet Caporal and American Pepsin. The buttons, packaged with the product, were colorful, topical, historical, well designed, well made, and free. Set followed set in endless profusion—actresses, baseball players, flags, the Yellow Kid, poets and presidents, ships, jockeys, snappy sayings, flowers, Indians, and on and on. They amused, instructed, entertained, and—we may be sure—sold the product. And they were collected. In the years since, buttons in sets have been produced on practically every subject imaginable.

This volume is an attempt to catalog these sets of buttons, from the first to the early 1970's. It is not a complete listing—at this late date a complete listing may no longer be possible. But we have started cataloguing additional sets for future volumes and we would welcome word of any sets or individual buttons we may have missed.

Listings of sets has been organized for ease of reference—first by broad categories (comics, sports, etc.), then, within each category, either by issuer (Kellogg's Pep, Sweet Caporal, etc.) or by subject (Mickey Mouse, The Wizard of Oz, etc.). The index offers a quick means of locating specific sets, subjects or issuers.

Note: Information for each set is given in this sequence as far as possible: Issuing Company. Date issued or approximate era. Size and type of button. Colors. Name of manufacturer. Additional pertinent descriptions. Number of buttons in set, when known, or number seen and verified. And, finally, a listing of the individual buttons that comprise the set. Minor varieties of the same button may be mentioned but are not counted in totals. Major varieties, however, indicative of separate printings, are counted separately. Incorrect spellings, inconsistencies in punctuation, abbreviations, etc., are copied from the buttons themselves—except when they are our own mistakes.

COMIC SAYINGS

These early buttons seem to have been the province of the cigarette companies, possibly because of the daring of some of the humor—O.U. Chicken!; Tickle Me; Am I The First; Mamie, Come Kiss Your Honey Boy; and so on. Anyway, we have found only one

non-tobacco company, Faultless Gum, that issued these sayings buttons, along with Perfection Cigarette, Sweet Caporal, High Admiral, Clix, Chesterfield, Obak, Favorite, Picayune, and American Oval Crimped Seal Cigarettes, and Red Lion Plug Tobacco. Most are 7/8" cell., but 13/16" and 31/32" celluloids with filled backs also appear, as well as a 1¼" litho set by Perfection. High Admiral also issued a series in German. All were two colors, either white on red, blue or green, or different colored type on white. They apparently enjoyed two periods of great popularity, first in the 1890's and again around 1912. Mfrs. include W&H, Phelps & Sons, Thos. Jay Gleason, Baldwin & Gleason, General Mfg. Co., and Aluminum Novelty Co. Including color varieties, more than 500 have been seen.

FLAGS



Probably the most popular subject for early button sets was flags, and the varieties were exhaustive. Flags—national flags, state flags, city flags, historical flags, college pennants—appeared in a variety of sizes, in celluloid and lithographed on tin, with open backs

and closed backs, in metal frames with a pin soldered on the back or with an easel back, as tabs, and die-cut from celluloid sheets. Most made a heroic effort to reproduce the colors of the original and to spell the sometimes exotic names correctly. Mfrs. included W&H, Bastian, Pulver, Green Duck, and even the City Button Works of NY. All the large users of buttons issued flag sets (Sweet Caporal, High Admiral, American Pepsin Gum), as did many others—Between the Acts and Duke Cigarettes, Weyman & Bros. Tobacco, Wrigley's Sweet 16 Gum, Wischmanns, Cameo Pepsin Gum, Earl Confections, MacFarlane Candy, Brunners and Wagner Bakeries, Sheffield Milk, Ware's Coffee, Nabisco Cereal. One enterprising manufacturer took the ultimate step and named his product Flagum.

No attempt has been made to catalog the many sets and endless varieties of flag buttons.

THE BUTTON BOOK REVISED PRICES

The following list revises the prices for each button illustrated in the 1972 edition of *The Button Book*. The prices are for buttons in extremely fine condition. Additional considerations used to arrive at prices are: 1) amount of collector interest in a particular button category, 2) the scarcity of the button, 3) the design quality, 4) whether the button is pictorial or just a slogan, 5) its age, and 6) its size. Buttons with obvious stains, scratches, cuts or rim splits are worth substantially less than full value.

The prices specified are nationwide average retail prices. This means most of the collectors for a particular button category would be willing to pay the prices indicated. Collectors with specialized interests, those trying to complete a set, and collectors in areas where there is much competition may be willing to pay a bit more. However, there is an equal number of collectors at the opposite end of the price spectrum.

In the case of buttons issued as a set, the price given applies only to the one example button illustrated in *The Button Book*. Usually, other buttons in the same set will have approximately the same value, but this is not always the case. For example, particularly popular comic characters or baseball players will command a higher price than the less popular characters or players in the set.

All values specified are approximations and the publisher shall not be held responsible for losses that may occur in the purchase or sale of items.


