Iroquois Beauty™ Black Chokeberry (*Aronia melanocarpa* 'Morton') – smaller, less upright than other Black Chokeberries. 3 x 4' after ten years. 'Professor Ed' (from the UW Arboretum) looks similar – maybe a bit taller.

Concorde Barberry (*Berberis thunbergii* 'Concorde') – better looking than 'Crimson Pygmy', highest rated in invasiveness trials.

Helmonds Pillar Barberry (Berberis thunbergii Helmonds Pillar) – unique columnar habit.

Gray Dogwood (*Cornus racemosa*) – tough, shade tolerant. Varieties to look for: Snow Lace® ('Emerald') – 6-8' x 6-8', Snow Mantle® ('Jade') – 16x8'.

Happy Centennial Border Forsythia (*Forsythia x intermedia* 'Happy Centennial') – dwarf habit, proven flower bud hardiness.

Golden Peep Border Forsythia (*Forsythia x intermedia* 'Courdijau') – big improvement over Bronx Forsythia. Smaller and more uniform, but not quite as flower bud hardy as 'Happy Centennial'.

Beaver Creek™ Dwarf Fothergilla (Fothergilla gardenii 'KLMtwo') – flowers, tight habit, great fall color.

Red Monarch™ (Fothergilla major) – larger than Fothergilla gardeni, with excellent red fall color.

May Bouquet™ (Fothergilla monticola) – largest flowers and leaves, yellow fall color.

Fothergilla x intermedia 'Blue Shadow' holds its remarkably blue color all through the growing season. Great fall color.

Endless Summer™ Hydrangea (*Hydrangea macrophylla* 'Bailmer') – promises more than it delivers? – proper siting is very important. (Other macrophylla (bigleaf) hydrangeas: Blushing Bride™; Twist 'n Shout™; Light O'Day™ -). 'Annabelle' and the panicle hydrangeas are much more reliable.

Hydrangea arborescens Invincibelle Spirit® - a pink flowering 'Annabelle'!!!

Limelight Hydrangea (Hydrangea paniculata 'Limelight') - non floppy, strong garden performer.

Quickfire™ Hydrangea (*Hydrangea paniculata* 'Bulk') – early flowering, compact habit.

Little Lamb Hydrangea (*Hydarngea paniculata* 'Little Lamb') – nice smaller, fluffy flower panicles, but what about flopping?

Pinky Winky™ Hydrangea (*Hydragea paniculata* 'DVPinky') – large, pink-white panicles – looks very good so far. (Some other new panicle hydrangeas of promise: Vanilla Stawberry™, 'Silver Dollar', Little Lime™(dwarf Limelight), Tickled Pink™ (dwarf 'Pink Diamond')

Snow Queen Oakleaf Hydrangea (Hydrangea quercifolia 'Snow Queen') – consider also H. quercifolia 'Snowflake' – better flower bud hardiness than some other varieties.

Ames St. Johnswort (Hypericum kalmianum 'Ames') – hardy native shrub with yellow flowers most of the summer.

Blue Velvet™ St. Johnswort (*Hypericum* x 'Cfflpc-1') – striking blue high quality foliage.

Diabolo™ Ninebark (*Physocarpus opulifolius* 'Diabolo') - the original purple ninebark, outclassed by its peers? Makes a good sheared hedge.

Summer Wine™ Ninebark (*Physocarpus opulifolius* 'Seward') – as of now, my favorite ninebark.

Coppertina Ninebark (*Physocarpus opulifolius* 'Coppertina') - striking amber toned new growth – 'Centerglow' is virtually identical.

Lady in Red Ninebark (Physocarpus opulifolius 'Lady in Red') - compact (4'?) habit. A winner?

Fine Line® Fernleaf Buckthorn (*Rhamnus* 'Ron Williams') – striking, unique plant – both in narrow plant habit and in leaf form - kudos to Mr. Williams. Sets virtually no viable seed – non invasive.

Tiger Eye Sumac (*Rhus typhina* 'Bailtiger') – gold foliage, bold texture – it will sucker, but you can use that to your advantage in mass plantings.

Tor Birchleaf Spirea (*Spiraea betulifolia* 'Tor') – sick of spirea? – 'Tor' is the cure!

Tree Peonies – 'Joseph Rocks', 'Leda'; 'Banquet' (foliage)

Korean Spice Viburnum (Viburnum carlesii and hybrids):

Cayuga Korean Spice Viburnum (Viburnum x 'Cayuga') – better leaf quality and plant habit.

Had some branch dieback at -25 in 2009, though, as did Spiced Bouquet.

Sugar 'n Spice™ Korean Spice Viburnum (Viburnum carlesii 'Select S') – heavier flowering; full, even plant form.

Spice IslandTM Korean Spice Viburnum (Viburnum carlesii 'Select A') – a better selection from 'Compacta'.

Spiced Bouquet[™] was the first of the series, let's see if these two new ones live up to that standard of excellence.

Little Joe™ Arrowwood Viburnum (*Viburnum dentatum* 'KLM) - tight and compact – delivers what Blue Muffin™ promised. Raspberry Tart™ is another Arrowwood of similar size.

My Monet® **Weigela** (*Weigela florida* 'Verweig') – small, but tougher and hardier than you'd think – certainly hardier than the dwarfy purple foliaged varieties like Midnight Wine and Dark Knight.
